1. USE OF FINANCIAL, INDUSTRY AND MARKET DATA AND CURRENCY OF PRESENTATION

Financial Data

Unless indicated otherwise, the financial data in this Information Memorandum is derived from the financial statements prepared in accordance with the applicable legislatures. The financial year commences on April 1 and ends on March 31, so all references to a particular financial year are to the twelve-month period ended March 31 of that year. In this IM, any discrepancies in any table between the total and the sums of the amounts listed are due to rounding off.

Industry and Market Data

Unless stated otherwise, industry data and the market data used throughout this IM have been obtained from industry publications, websites and other authenticated published data. Industry publications generally state that the information contained in those publications has been obtained from sources believed to be reliable but that their accuracy and completeness are not guaranteed and their reliability cannot be assured. Although, the Company believes that industry data used in this IM is reliable, it has not been independently verified. Similarly, internal company reports, while believed by us to be reliable, have not been verified by any independent sources.

3. ASSOCIATED RISKS

A. INTERNAL RISK FACTORS

1. We are dependent on our management team for success whose loss could seriously impair the ability to continue to manage and expand business efficiently.

Our success largely depends on the continued services and performance of our management, our technical team and other key personnel as our business is revolving around technical capabilities of our personnel's which is human approach to be precise with. The loss of service of the management, our technical team and key personnel could seriously impair the ability to continue to manage and expand the business efficiently. Further, the loss of any of the senior management or other key personnel may adversely affect the operations, finances and profitability of our Company. Any failure or inability of our Company to efficiently retain and manage its human resources would adversely affect our ability to implement new projects and expand our business.

2. If we are unable to manage our growth, our business could be disrupted.

The growth of our business depends on the operations to realize our vision of attaining size and to improve our cost competitiveness. In order to achieve such future growth, we need to effectively manage our new project, our resources and accurately assess new markets, attract new customers, obtain sufficient financing, control our input costs, maintain sufficient operational and financial controls and make additional capital investments to take advantage of anticipated market conditions and keep on learning and inventing on technology. We expect our growth to place significant demands on our management and other resources. Any inability to manage our growth could have an adverse effect on our business, financial condition and results of operations.

3. We have entered into certain related party transactions and may continue to do so.

We have entered into related party transactions with our Promoters, its promoter group members/ entities and Directors. While we believe that all such transactions have been conducted on the arms' length basis, however it is difficult to ascertain whether more favourable terms would have been achieved had such transactions been entered with unrelated parties. Furthermore, it is likely that we may enter into related party transactions in the future.

4. Changes in technology may render our current technologies obsolete or require us to make substantial new investments to seek to remain competitive.

The cost of implementing any new technologies could be significant and could adversely affect our business and financial condition. While we regularly upgrade our technology, the emergence of newer technologies could render our current technology ineffective or obsolete and may adversely affect the cost structure and competitiveness of our products and services. Changes in technology with which we are unable to keep pace, or which render our products and services less useful to customers and the market, could affect our growth, business, financial condition and results of operations.

5. We require a number of approvals, licenses, registration and permits for our business and failure to obtain or renew them in a timely manner may adversely affect our operations.

We may require several statutory and regulatory permits, licenses and approvals in the ordinary course of our business, some of which our Company has either received, applied for or is in the process of application. Many of these approvals are granted for fixed periods of time and need renewal from time to time. There can be no assurance that the relevant authorities will issue any of such permits or approvals in the time-frame anticipated by us or at all. Any failure by us to apply in time, to renew, maintain or obtain the required permits, licenses or approvals, or the cancellation, suspension, delay in issuance or revocation of any of the permits, licenses or approvals may result in the interruption of our operations and may have a material adverse effect on the business.

6.Delays or defaults in customer payments could result in a reduction of our profits.

We commit resources to projects prior to receiving advances or other payments from customers in amounts sufficient to cover expenditures on projects as they are incurred. We may be subject to working capital shortages due to delays or defaults in customer payments. If customers default in their payments on a project to which we have devoted significant resources or if a project in which we have invested significant resources is delayed, cancelled or does not proceed to completion, it could have a material adverse effect on our business, financial condition and results of operations.

7. If we are unable to source business opportunities effectively, we may not achieve our financial objectives.

Our ability to achieve our financial objectives will depend on our ability to identify, evaluate and accomplish business opportunities. To grow our business, we will need to hire, train, supervise and manage new employees and to implement systems capable of effectively accommodating our growth. However, we cannot assure you that any such employees will contribute to the success of our business or that we will implement such systems effectively. Our failure to source business opportunities effectively could have a material adverse effect on our business, financial condition and results of operations. It is also possible that the strategies used by us in the future may be different from those

presently in use. No assurance can be given that our analysis of market and other data or the strategies we use or plans in future to use will be successful under various market conditions.

8. Our ability to pay dividends in the future will depend upon future earnings, financial condition, cash flows, working capital requirements and capital expenditures.

We have paid dividends without break since 2005-06 but there can be no assurance that dividends will be paid in future. Our ability to pay dividends in future will depend on the earnings, financial condition, cash flow, working capital requirements and capital expenditure. Any future determination as to the declaration and payment of dividends will be at the discretion of our Board and will depend on factors that our Board deems relevant, including among others, our results of future earnings, financial condition, cash requirements, business prospects and any other financing arrangements. We cannot guarantee our ability to pay dividend.

9. Our Board of Directors and management may change our operating policies and strategies without prior notice or shareholders approval.

Our Board of Directors and Management has the authority to modify certain of our operating policies and strategies without prior notice (except as required by law) and without shareholder's approval. We cannot predict the effect of any changes to our current operating policies or strategies, on our business, operating results and the price of our Equity Shares.

10. Quality concerns for our products and services could adversely impact our business.

The business of our Company is dependent on the trust our customers have in the quality of our services and products. The products sold or services provided by us to our customers, which do not comply with the quality specifications or standards prevalent in the business segment, may result in customer dissatisfaction, which may have an adverse effect on our profitability.

11. We may not be successful in implementing our business strategies.

The success of our business depends substantially on our ability to implement our business strategies effectively or at all. There is no guarantee that we will successfully execute our business strategies on time and within the estimated budget going forward, or that we will be able to meet the expectations of our targeted customers. Changes in regulations applicable to us may also make it difficult to implement our business strategies. Failure to implement our business strategies would have a material adverse effect on our business and results of operations.

12. Rise in input costs may affect our profitability.

The input costs of the products/services of the Company may increase due to various reasons. In case the Company is not able to pass on such increase to the consumers because of competition or otherwise,

it may affect the profitability of the Company. Input cost also relies heavily on US Dollar, as nearly half of purchases are imported. Appreciation of US \$ increases input costs.

13. We face competition in our business from both domestic and international competitors.

Such competition would have an adverse impact on our business and financial performance. The industry, in which we are operating, is highly and increasingly competitive and unorganized and our results of operations and financial condition are sensitive to, and may be materially adversely affected by, competitive pricing and other factors. Competition may result in pricing pressures, reduced profit margins or lost market share or a failure to grow our market share, any of which could substantially harm our business and results of operations. There can be no assurance that we can effectively compete with our competitors in the future, and any such failure to compete effectively may have a material adverse effect on our business, financial condition and results of operations.

B. EXTERNAL RISK

1. Political, economic and social changes in India could adversely affect our business.

Our business, and the market price and liquidity of our Company's shares, may be affected by changes in Government policies, including taxation, social, political, economic or other developments in or affecting India could also adversely affect our business. Since 1991, successive governments have pursued policies of economic liberalization and financial sector reforms including significantly relaxing restrictions on the private sector. In addition, any political instability in India may adversely affect the Indian economy and the Indian securities markets in general, which could also affect the trading price of our Equity Shares.

2. Changing laws, rules and regulations including adverse application of tax laws and regulations-such as application of goods and service tax could adversely affect our business, results of operations and cash flows.

Our business and financial performance could be adversely affected by changes in law or interpretations of existing, or the promulgation of new laws, rules and regulations in India applicable to us and our business.

3. Our business may be adversely affected by competition laws in India and any adverse application or interpretation of the Competition Act could adversely affect our business.

The Competition Act, 2002, as amended (the "Competition Act"), regulates practices having an appreciable adverse effect on competition in the relevant market in India. Under the Competition Act, any formal or informal arrangement, understanding or action in concert, which causes or is likely to cause an appreciable adverse effect on competition is considered void and results in the imposition of substantial monetary penalties. Further, any agreement among competitors which directly or indirectly involves the determination of purchase or sale prices, limits or controls production, supply, markets, technical development, investment or provision of services, shares the market or source of production

or provision of services by way of allocation of geographical area, type of goods or services or number of clients in the relevant market or directly or indirectly results in bid-rigging or collusive bidding is presumed to have an appreciable adverse effect on competition. The Competition Act also prohibits abuse of a dominant position by any enterprise. The applicability or interpretation of the Competition Act to any merger, amalgamation or acquisition proposed or undertaken by us, or any enforcement proceedings initiated by CCI for alleged violation of provisions of the Competition Act may adversely affect our business, financial condition or results of operation.

4. Natural calamities and force majeure events may have an adverse impact on our business.

Natural disasters may cause significant interruption to our operations, and damage to the environment that could have a material adverse impact on us. The extent and severity of these natural disasters determines their impact on the Indian economy. Prolonged spells of deficient or abnormal rainfall and other natural calamities could have an adverse impact on the Indian economy, which could adversely affect our business and results of operations.

1. INDUSTRY OVERVIEW

INDUSTRY REPORT ON ELECTRONIC SECURITY

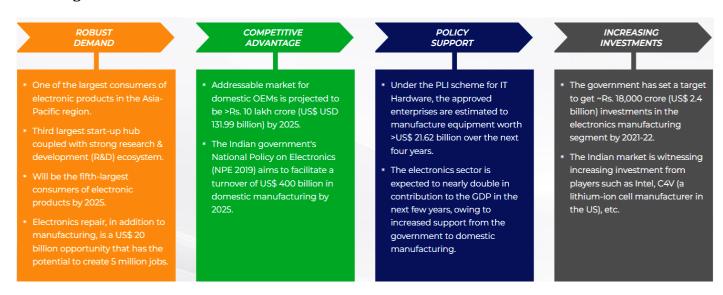
Introduction

India, considered a popular manufacturing hub, has grown its domestic electronics production from US\$ 29 billion in 2014-15 to US\$ 67 billion in 2020-21. The electronics sector of India contributes around 3.4% of the country's Gross Domestic Product (GDP). The government has committed nearly US\$ 17 billion over the next six years across four PLI Schemes: Semiconductor and Design, Smartphones, IT Hardware and Components.

Recently, the Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology released the second volume of the Vision document on Electronics Manufacturing in India, which stated that the electronics manufacturing industry will grow from the current US\$ 75 billion in 2020-21 to US\$ 300 billion by 2025-26. The major products that are expected to drive growth in India's electronics manufacturing are mobile phones, IT hardware (laptops, tablets), consumer electronics (TV and audio), industrial electronics, auto electronics, electronic components, LED lighting, strategic electronics, printed circuit board assembly (PCBA), wearables and hearables, and telecom equipment. Mobile manufacturing is expected to cross US\$ 100 billion in annual production growth from the current US\$ 30 billion by accounting for nearly 40% of the industry growth.

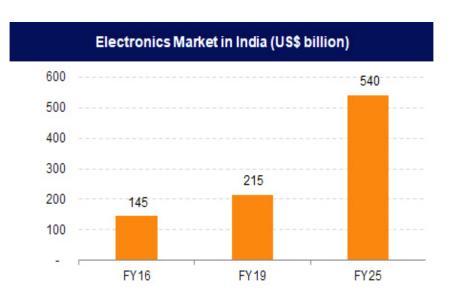
The IT sector in India is one of the largest contributors with a 9% contribution to GDP. The industry is around US\$ 194 billion and is expected to surpass US\$ 300-350 billion by 2025. India's IT industries and companies are majorly located in the southern regions such as Bangalore, Hyderabad, Chennai, Visakhapatnam, Trivandrum, Mysore, Mangalore, Kochi, etc. The country's major information technology hubs are Mumbai, Pune, Delhi, etc.

Market Size

The Indian electronics manufacturing industry is projected to reach US\$ 520 billion by 2025. The demand for electronic products is expected to rise to US\$ 400 billion by 2025 from US\$ 33 billion in FY20. Electronics mark et has witnessed a growth in demand with market size increasing from US\$ 145 billion in FY16 to US\$ 215 billion in FY19—the market witnessed a growth of 14% CAGR from 2016-19. Electronics system market is expected to witness 2.3x demand of its current size (FY19) to reach US\$ 160 billion by FY25



Electronics design segment, growing at 20.1%, was 22% of the ESDM market size in FY19; it is anticipated to be 27% of the ESDM market size in FY25.

Export Trend



exporting countries and accounts for about 56% of the global outsourcing market. The Indian Information Technology and IT enabled services (ITeS) exports were valued at US\$ 150 billion (excl. hardware exports), recording a growth of 2% over FY 2020. During 2020-21, IT services exports were valued at US\$ 81 billion, witnessing a growth of 2.6% over previous year, accounting largest share of the IT & ITeS industry exports. Business process management (BPM) exports are valued at US\$ 34 billion, growing 2.3% over the previous year. This growth in BPM is mainly driven by automation-led services in finance & accounts and human resources, increased adoption of robotic process automation (RPA) and analytics. BPM

India is among the largest IT and BPM services

is also witnessing an accelerated shift to platform solutions.

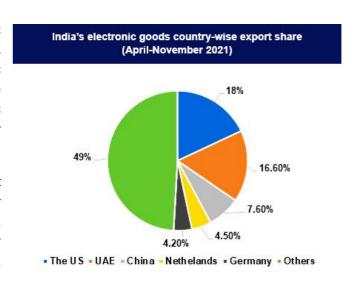
Over the last few years, engineering research and development (ER&D) services have recorded one of the fastest export growths driven by increasing adoption of software-led products and cloudification of equipment and devices. Exports for ER&D sector are valued at US\$ 31.1 billion in 2020-21. Software products witnessed 2% growth to reach US\$ 3 billion, mainly driven by the rise in demand for collaborative applications, application platforms, security software, system & service management software, and content workflow & management applications.

India's export of electronic goods rose by almost 88%, from US\$ 6.6 billion in 2013-14 to US\$ 12.4 billion in 2021-22. Mobile phones, IT hardware (laptops, tablets), consumer electronics (TV and audio), industrial electronics and auto electronics are key export products in this sector. As per the Ministry of Electronics & IT vision, India's electronics industry exports are expected to increase to US\$ 120 billion by 2026.

Major Export Destinations

The top 5 destinations for Indian electronic goods exports are: USA, UAE, China, Netherlands and Germany. USA is the largest importer of India's electronic exports followed by UAE, accounting for 18% and 17% of the overall exports, respectively. For mobile phones exports from India, South Asia, Africa and Middle East are key importing markets

For the IT-ITeS services of India, the top 3 export destinations of India are USA, UK and EU. The country also exports these services to Asia Pacific regions, Latin Americas and Middle East Asia and sees new opportunities emerging to expand services to continental Europe, Japan, China and Africa.

As per Reserve Bank of India (RBI) statistics, Software services exports to USA and Canada combined grew by 4.6% from US\$ 74.7 billion in 2019-20 to US\$ 75.1 billion in 2020-21, accounting the largest share at 56% of the overall exports. This is followed by Europe, with exports valued at US\$ 40.3 billion as compared to US\$ 35.5 billion in the previous year. UK is the largest importer of Indian software services within EU region, accounting for 48% of exports to EU. Asia region exports of Indian software services were valued at US\$ 9 billion, with a major share of East Asia exports valued at US\$ 6 billion.

Government Initiatives

With the growing need for electronic goods, the Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY) has implemented several production-linked incentives (PLI) to improve electronics production of India. The government has launched schemes such as the Manufacturing of Electronic Components and Semiconductors

(SPECS), Modified Electronic Manufacturing Clusters (EMC 2.0), etc., to promote the country's electronic goods industry. To further develop and increase the market share of the Indian BPO industry, the Government of India has implemented schemes such as Northeast BPO Promotion Scheme (NEBPC) and India BPO Promotion Scheme (IBPS).

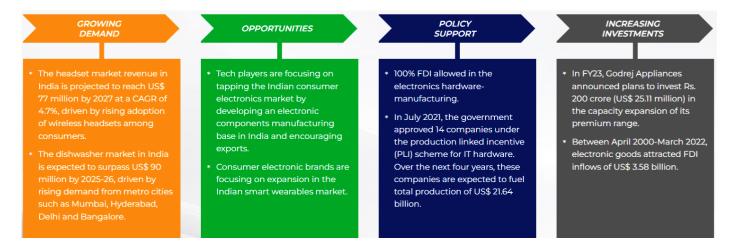

Introduction

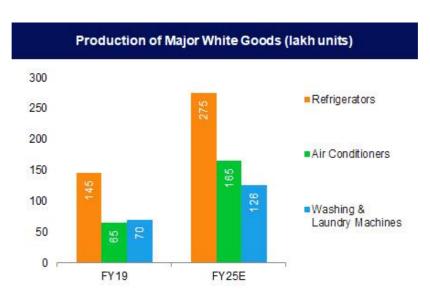

The growth in India's consumer market would be primarily driven by a favourable population composition and increasing disposable income.

- ☐ Indian appliances and consumer electronics industry stood at US\$ 9.84 billion in 2021, and is expected to more than double to reach Rs. 1.48 lakh crore (US\$ 21.18 billion) by 2025.
- Electronics hardware production in the country stood at US\$ 63.39 billion in 2021.



in FY20, IV penetration in India stood at 69%, driven by the DIH market.

The dishwasher market in India is expected to surpass US\$ 90 million by 2025-26, driven by rising demand
from metro cities such as Mumbai, Hyderabad, Delhi and Bangalore.
The flat panel television (LED, LCD, HD, and UHD) market in India was valued at US 9.05 billion in FY18 and
is expected to reach US\$ 16.24 billion by FY24, growing at a CAGR of 9.25%.
In 2021, TV shipments grew 24% YoY, with the smart TV market also registering 65% YoY growth.
According to RedSeer, India's consumer digital economy is projected to reach US\$ 800 billion by 2030, from
IIS\$ 85-90 hillion in CY20, driven by increase in online shopping

Investments

- According to Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade, between April 2020-March 2021 (FY21), exports of electronic goods from India stood at US\$ 11.1 billion. In May 2022, US\$ 1.34 billion worth of electronic goods were exported.
- o Between April 2000-March 2022, electronic goods attracted FDI inflows of US\$ 3.58 billion.
- o Following are some recent investments and developments in the Indian consumer market sector.
- Electrical appliances maker V-Guard Industries has announced plans to invest in new manufacturing plants. Over the next 12 months, the company will open four additional factories: two in Hyderabad, one in Vapi, and one in Uttarakhand.
- o In FY23, Godrej Appliances announced plans to invest Rs. 200 crore (US\$ 25.11 million) in the capacity expansion of its premium range.
- O Shipments of "Made-in-India" smartphones increased 7% YoY in Q1 2022 to reach over 48 million units, while over 190 million smartphones made in India were shipped.
- In November 2021, Tata Consumer Products (TCPL) signed definitive agreements to acquire 100% equity shares of Tata SmartFoodz Limited (TSFL) from Tata Industries Limited, for a cash consideration of Rs. 395 crore (US\$ 53.13 million). This move was in line with TCPL's strategic intent to expand into value-added categories.
- In September 2021, Blue Star Climatech, the wholly owned subsidiary of Blue Star, announced its plans to invest Rs. 550 crore (US\$ 73.45 million) over the next few years to set up a new manufacturing facility at Sri City in Andhra Pradesh's Chittoor district.
- o In September 2021, US-based consumer electronics brand Westinghouse Electric Corporation, forayed into the Indian market by launching a range of TV sets. The brand collaborated with its Indian licensing partner Super Plastronics Pvt Ltd (SPPL) and signed an exclusive licensing agreement with it.

- o In September 2021, Airtel Digital TV, the DTH arm of Bharti Airtel, introduced Made-in-India high-definition set-top boxes for customers. The boxes are being manufactured in Noida, Uttar Pradesh, by Skyworth Electronics. Airtel plans to fully transition to Made-in-India set-top boxes, including the high-end Airtel Xstream 4K Android TV box, by the end of 2021 and contribute towards local manufacturing and the Government of India's Atmanirbhar vision.
- o In August 2021, Lenovo announced that it is considerably expanding its local manufacturing capabilities in India across product categories such as PCs, laptops and smartphones, to satisfy rising consumer demand.
- o In August 2021, Philips announced an investment of Rs. 300 crore (US\$ 40.41 million), and plans to recruit 1,500 employees in India. The company announced plans to expand its Pune operations to increase manufacturing in India.
- o In July 2021, Godrej & Boyce announced their entry into the dishwasher market and the aim to capture 15% market share by FY22. The company is focusing on key markets such as Mumbai, Hyderabad, Bengaluru and Delhi, and plans to expand to tier-II cities.
- TCL Group announced, in June 2021, to start manufacturing handsets and TV display panels (from the fourth quarter) in Andhra Pradesh. The company plans to recruit 1,000 employees. This development was in line with the company's plan to invest ~US\$ 219 million to manufacture display modules in the country.
- o In April 2021, Godrej Appliances announced an investment of Rs. 100 crore (US\$ 13.6 million) across two of its manufacturing facilities—Shirwal in Maharashtra and Mohali in Punjab—to expand its production capacity for air-conditioners (to 800,000 units) by 2025.
- o In April 2021, Zetwerk Manufacturing, a B2B online marketplace, announced that it is entering the apparel and consumer durable sectors amid increased demand and supply chain disruptions after the outbreak of COVID-19.

Government Initiatives

- \triangle In November 2021, 42 companies were selected under the PLI Scheme for White Goods with a committed investment of Rs. 4,614 crore (US\$ 580.6 million), which is expected to create additional direct employment for 44,000 people.
- △ In April 2022, 19 companies filed applications for the PLI Scheme for White Goods in the 2nd round of applications, with committed investments of Rs. 1,548 crore (US\$ 194.79 million).
- △ In July 2021, the government approved 14 companies under the production linked incentive (PLI) scheme for IT hardware. Over the next four years, these companies are expected to fuel total production of >US\$ 21.64 billion.
- △ In June 2021, the government extended the production-linked incentive (PLI) scheme for large scale electronics manufacturing by a year (until FY26), giving a boost to the industry.
- △ The Indian government has been encouraging consumer durable brands in India to 'Make in India', thereby expecting they should be self-reliant for the future; consumer too is showing an affinity towards homegrown products.
- △ The National Policy on Electronics 2019 is targeting production of one billion mobile handsets valued at US\$ 190 billion by 2025, out of which 600 million handsets valued at US\$ 100 billion are likely to be exported.
- △ The Government of India has allowed 100% FDI under the automatic route in electronics systems design and manufacturing sector. FDI into single brand retail has been increased from 51% to 100%; the government is planning to hike FDI limit in multi-brand retail to 51%.

Smart Home Concept

In generic terms, a smart home is a residence that has a system (composed of a range of smart home appliances) or several systems that are connected to a network and can be controlled remotely or automated. Smart home solutions or systems enables the control and automation of lighting, heating, ventilation, air conditioning, and security, as well as home appliances such as washer/dryers, ovens, refrigerators/freezers and home electronics such as TVs and streaming devices.

Indian Smart Home Market

Home automation systems or smart home concept has witnessed an unprecedented growth in the recent years in India due to factors which mainly include increased concerns about safety & security (especially in urban areas) and penetration of product and services that enhances consumer experience by adding comfort and convenience. Moreover, factors such as increase in disposable income, penetration of smartphones, availability of internet connectivity at affordable rates and surge in awareness about smart systems have also boosted the adoption, thus driving the India home automation market growth.

Home automation systems or smart home concept has witnessed an unprecedented growth in the recent years in India due to factors which mainly include increased concerns about safety & security (especially in urban areas) and penetration of product and services that enhances consumer experience by adding comfort and convenience. Moreover, factors such as increase in disposable income, penetration of smartphones, availability of internet connectivity at affordable rates and surge in awareness about smart systems have also boosted the adoption, thus driving the India home automation market growth.

At present, most preferred smart home products/service for Indian consumers are related to home security.

- It is followed by the applications such as smart lighting and smart infotainment systems that primarily enhances comfort and convenience. Majority of the consumers are not opting for smart home automation systems primarily for energy saving. However, as most of the automation systems prevent idle running of energy consuming appliances and matches the operating parameters according to consumer needs, some extent of energy savings is being accrued to the consumer as a by-product of the smart home automation products.

 In current scenario most opted point of sale or distribution channel is through system integrator as level of awareness for selecting product type and configuration is still low for most of the consumers. In this scenario, system integrator provides end to end solution of selection, installation, configuration and maintenance.

 With regards to impact of building codes and green rating, about 55% of surveyed manufacturers/service providers indicated that there is no impact of mentioned policies on demand of their product and services.
- providers indicated that there is no impact of mentioned policies on demand of their product and services. 36% of the respondents have no opinion in this context and about 9% of the respondents agree that the mentioned policy have an impact on demand of their product and services.
- ☐ Home automation has been viewed as a luxury element in homes in India until recent years and use of such products was limited to elite population. However, with penetration of smartphones, availability of high-speed internet connectivity at affordable rates and increase in disposable incomes, middle class population

has also entered home automation market and now have a significant impact on market size and solutions being offered in this space. Along with positives mentioned above, there are some challenges in penetration of smart home automation systems which include non-availability of good quality and reliable power supply, lack of inter-operability of available products, limited options of system integrators etc. During the survey and interviews with relevant stakeholders several drivers, barriers and opportunities were identified, details about the same is provided in figure below:

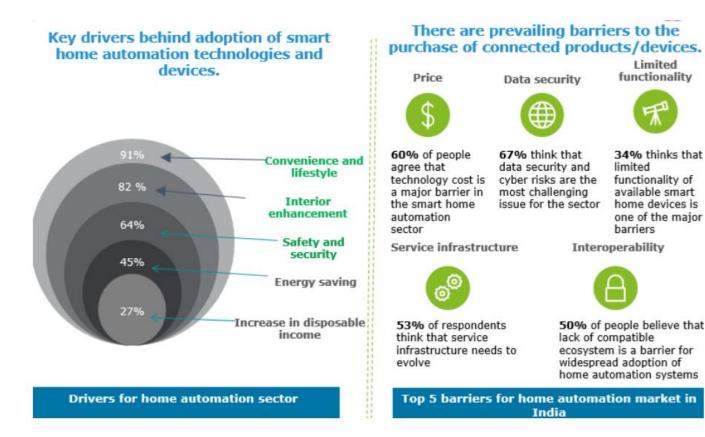

Results of market growth forecast

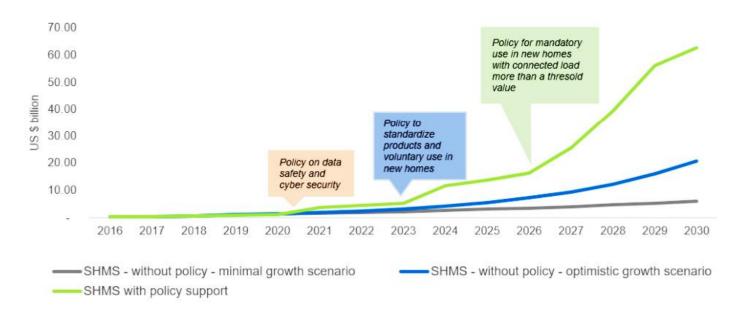
Based on the forecasting models developed as part of this report, the Indian smart home market size is expected to be in range of US\$ 6 to US\$ 20 billion by the end of 2030 without any major policy intervention.

Some of the key policies required to disrupt Indian smart home market identified based on the discussion with industry leaders and subject matter experts, include:

- Policy for data safety and cyber security to protect consumer privacy and to mitigate risk of data theft. 0
- Policy to standardize products for seamless integration of products of different make
- Policy to promote use of smart home in new and existing homes by voluntary or mandatory compliance.
- Scheme to promote development and implementation of demand response program

The figure indicating estimated growth of Indian smart home market size with and without policy intervention is provided in figure below:



Smart home market size – without policy intervention

In absence of any major policy interventions, the smart home market is expected to reach US\$ 20 billion in optimistic growth scenario and US\$ 6 billion in minimal growth scenario.

Smart home market – with policy intervention

Indian market may follow the trends like other developed nations, where the smart home market is expected to grow by 10 folds15 with implementation of some of the much-needed policies (listed above). Considering this factor and reduction in cost of technology with economies of scale, Indian smart home market size is expected to grow to about US\$ 62.8 billion by the end of 2030 (with regular policy interventions by concerned departments) and the penetration level (with reference to total number of households in 2030) is exacted to reach 28%.

On human resource and skill development front, smart home market is expected to add about 2.5 to 3 million new jobs by 2030. These jobs will be created with manufacturers, OEMs, data and service providers, system integrators, architects, consultants and with other related stakeholders.

- **6.** To purchase, manufacture, sell, supply, acquire, lease, install, commission, maintain, run and operate Solar and other type of Power Plants for generation of power of whatever form, whether from non conventional and/or renewable energy sources or not, in India and abroad and for that purpose enter into technical/financial business collaboration with such persons/firms/companies as may be required.

(a) The candidate possesses appropriate skills experience and knowledge in one or more fields of managerial/business/administrative/ legal/finance qualifications and experience over two decades;

- (b) The candidate shall be free from any disqualification as provided under Sections 164 and 167 of the Companies Act, 2013;
- (c) In the case of appointment of an Independent Director, the candidate meets the conditions of being independent as stipulated under Companies Act, 2013 and the SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirement)Regulations, 2015
- (d) The candidate also complies with the "Fit and Proper" criteria as laid down by the policy of the Company.
- (ii) Criteria for Selection of Senior Management Personnel

The term Senior Management shall have the same meaning as provided under the explanation to Section 178 of the Companies Act, 2013

The Committee shall, before making any recommendation to the Board for appointment, should ensure that the candidate has the attributes set forth below

- (a) The candidate should have a minimum experience of 10 years in any of the areas viz. electronic security related, financial management, legal, sales, marketing, procurement, research, technical operations or such other areas which in the opinion of the Committee are relevant for the Company's business; and
- (b) The candidate should possess qualities that demonstrate leadership skills, effective communication skills, hard work, commitment and such other attributes which in the opinion of the Committee are in the interest of the Company.

The Committee makes its recommendation to the Board if it finds that a candidate meets the criteria for appointment.

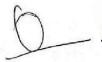
