Your Directors present their fifty-fourth Annual Report and Audited Accounts of the Company for the year ended 31st March, 2014.

- 02. During the year under review, the gross revenue of the Company has increased by 11.73 % at ₹ 791.98 Crores as compared to ₹ 708.85 Crores in 2012-2013. The profit before depreciation has decreased from ₹ 3568.00 Lacs to ₹ 1166.00 Lacs on account of uneconomic working of insulator division.
- 03. Although, the company has suffered loss yet, in view of comfortable order position of Cable and Conductor division and steps taken to improve the working of Insulator division, your Directors have recommended a dividend of Re.1/- per equity share for the financial year ended March 31, 2014, amounting to ₹ 16,88,104/- (inclusive of tax of ₹ 2,45,219/-). The dividend payout is subject to approval of members at the ensuing Annual General Meeting.
 - The dividend will be paid to members whose names appear in the Register of Members as on August 27, 2014; in respect of shares held in dematerialised and physical form, it will be paid to members whose names are furnished by National Securities Depository Limited and Central Depository Services (India) Limited, as beneficial owners as on that date.
- 04. The Consolidated Financial Statements prepared in accordance with the Accounting Standard-21 and are attached with the Annual Report, pursuant to Clause 32 of the Listing Agreement.
- 05. The name of the company was changed from Hindusthan Vidyut Products Limited to Hindusthan Urban Infrastructure Limited with effect from 24th February, 2014 after taking due approval from the shareholders of the company in the Extra Ordinary General Meeting and approval from the Ministry of Corporate Affairs. The same was under taken with a vision to diversify the business in new verticals of infrastructure.
- 06. During the year the company has been awarded for its Cable & Conductor division Integrated Management System (IMS) certificate by Bureau VERITAS U.K. comprising of ISO: 9001: 2008 (Quality Management Systems), ISO: 14001: 2004 (Environment Management System) and BS OHSAS: 18001: 2007 (Occupational Health & Safety Management System).
- 07. The company has taken effective steps to start Greenfield facilities for manufacture of conductors at Khurda, Near Bhubaneswar in the state of Odisha. It is expected to commence production during the current Financial Year.
- 08. The company is taking steps to develop its land at Bangalore into residential apartments by appointing various senior officials needed to implement the project.
- 09. During the year under review, the existing subsidiary namely Hindusthan Speciality Chemicals Limited (Formerly: Hindusthan Alkalies Limited) became wholly owned subsidiary of your Company with effect from 09.09.2013.
 - In accordance with the general circular issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs, Government of India, the Balance Sheet, Statement of Profit and Loss and other documents of the subsidiary company are not being attached with the Balance Sheet of the Company. However the financial information of the subsidiary company is disclosed in the Annual Report in compliance with the said circular. The Company will make available the Annual Accounts of the subsidiary company and the related detailed information to any member of the Company who may be interested in obtaining the same. The annual accounts of the subsidiary company will also be kept open for inspection at the Registered Office of the Company. The Consolidated Financial Statements presented by the Company include the financial results of its wholly owned subsidiary company.

DIRECTORS' REPORT (Contd.)

- 10. There has been decline in the margin in Cable & Conductor division due to competitive market conditions. Whereas the margin of insulator division is under pressure due to dumping from China. Efforts are being made to improve the working of both the divisions.
- 11. During the year the company has successfully executed export orders (including sale under global tenders in India) worth ₹ 125.22 Crores approximately as compared to ₹ 69.85 Crores during 2012-2013. We are continuously striving to increase our export order book and add more markets.
- 12. The availability of our prime raw material for cables & conductor division i.e. aluminium, remained satisfactory. However, there were fluctuations in prices both in the domestic and international market.
- 13. The availability of power improved except at Mandideep Works. The Company has been able to keep the factories running with the help of captive power generating capacity.
- 14. The order book position of Conductor remained satisfactory. Efforts are being made to secure more orders by participating in larger number of tenders.
- 15. Pursuant to Clause 49 of the Listing Agreement with Delhi Stock Exchange, a separate section titled 'Corporate Governance' is attached to this Annual Report.
- 16. Your directors would like to confirm that:
 - (i) In preparation of the annual accounts, the applicable accounting standards have been followed.
 - (ii) The selected accounting policies have been applied consistently and the judgements and estimates made are reasonable and prudent so as to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company at the end of the financial year and of the profit or loss of the Company for that period;
 - (iii) Proper and sufficient care has been taken for the maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting fraud and other irregularities:
 - (iv) The annual accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis.
- 17. Statement of the employees getting remuneration requiring disclosure under Section 217(2A) of the Companies Act, 1956 ("the Act") and Rules framed there under, is enclosed.
- 18. The Companies Act, 2013 provides for appointment of independent directors, Sub-section (10) of Section 149 of the Companies Act, 2013 (effective April 1, 2014) provides that independent directors shall hold office for a term of up to five consecutive years on the Board of a company, and shall be eligible for re-appointment on passing a special resolution by the shareholders of the company.
 - Sub-section (11) states that no independent director shall be eligible for more than two consecutive terms of five years. Sub section (13) states that the provisions of retirement by rotation as defined in sub-section (6) and (7) of Section 152 of the Act shall not apply to such independent directors.
 - Our non–executive (independent) directors (Shri. O P Shroff and Shri. Suman J. Khaitan) were appointed as directors liable to retire by rotation under the provisions of the erstwhile Companies Act, 1956. The Board of Directors has been advised that non-executive (independent) directors so appointed would continue to serve the term that was ascertained at the time of appointment as per the resolution pursuant to which they were appointed. Therefore, it stands to reason that only those non-executive (independent) directors who will complete their present term at the ensuing Annual General Meeting of the Company, being eligible and seeking re-appointment, be considered by the shareholders for re-appointment for a term up to five consecutive years. Accordingly, Sh. O P Shroff and Suman J Khaitan will retire by rotation in the ensuing Annual General Meeting and being eligible offers themselves for appointment as independent directors.
 - Non-executive (independent) directors who do not complete their term at the ensuing Annual General Meeting, will continue to hold office till the expiry of their term and thereafter would be eligible for re-appointment for a fixed term in accordance with the Companies Act, 2013.
- 19. M/s K M Agarwal & Co., Chartered Accountants, (Firm Registration No. 853N) Statutory Auditors of the company, hold office till the conclusion of the ensuing Annual General Meeting and are eligible for re-appointment.
 - The company has received letter from them to the effect that their re-appointment, if made would be within the prescribed limit under section 141(3)(g) of the Companies Act, 2013 and that they are not disqualified for re-appointment.
 - The Notes on Financial Statements referred to in the Auditors' Report are self-explanatory and do not call for any further comments.
- 20. The Company has appointed M/s J. K. Kabra & Co., Cost Accountants for conducting the audit of cost records of the Company for the financial year 2014-15.

Good Corporate Governance emerges from the application of best and sound business practices which ensure that the company operates within the regulatory framework. The Audit Committee meetings are held at Registered Office of the Company and all the meetings were attended by Chairman and members except Shri Subhash Madan who had attended three meetings. Statutory Auditors, Cost Auditor and Chief Finance Officer of the Company were also invited in the meetings.

The Committee is overseeing the company's financial reports and disclosure of its financial information and reviewing the adequacy of internal audit function. It recommends the appointment of Auditors and fixation of their remuneration and payment for any other services. The Committee also reviews Annual Accounts of the company. The previous Annual

General Meeting of the company was held on 30.08.2013 and was attended by Shri O.P. Shroff, Chairman and Shri Subhash Madan, member of the Audit Committee.

3. REMUNERATION COMMITTEE:

The Remuneration Committee has been reconstituted on 03.09.2013. The Remuneration Committee comprises three Non-Executive Directors namely Shri O.P. Shroff as Chairman, Shri Suman Jyoti Khaitan and Shri Subhash Madan as members. Shri M.L. Birmiwala is the Secretary of the Committee. There is no change in remuneration paid to Managing Director. No Remuneration Committee meeting was held during the year.

ANNEXURE TO DIRECTORS' REPORT

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

1. Industry Structure and Developments

The growth of Power Sector in India is strong and market is growing every year. Transmission & Distribution sector will entail an investment of USD 120 billion (₹ 7,20,000 Crores) in the 12th five year plan to evacuate 1,00,000 MW of power generation capacity being added in the country. India is targeting a gross domestic product (GDP) growth rate of 8-9% in the coming years. To enable this growth, the country's economy needs the support of its power sector.

2. Opportunities & Threats

Researcher's analysts forecast the Electrical Conductors market in India to grow at 13.56 percent over the period 2013-2018. One of the key factors contributing to this market growth is the increasing demand due to replacement activities in the country.

There are opportunity of more Porcelain Insulators sales due to higher investments planned in power sector resulting into subsequent higher demand.

The industry faces challenges both domestically and internationally. Low capacity utilizations, especially in the transmission & distribution (T&D) segment, and the growing threat of low cost imports are some of the key challenges.

3. Segment-wise or Product-wise Performance

There has been increase in production and sales of Cables and Conductors while there has been marginal increase in production and sale of Insulators. Efforts are being made to improve the performance of Insulators division including installation of LNG station in the plant and converted kilns in to dual fuels to use LNG as one of the fuel, LNG being cheaper fuel than Propane and HSD.

4. Future Outlook

The government has taken several initiatives for the growth and development of the sector such as setting up of ultramega power projects, encouraging private sector participation through PPPs electrification programme and allowing foreign investments upto a limit of 49% in power trading. The investment climate is very positive in the power sector with government permitting 100% FDI through automatic route. Due to surge in the sector, the power sector has witnessed higher investment flows than envisaged.

5. Risk and Concerns

Increasing imports from China, increase in cost of fuel and use of Polymer Insulators by major customers is major concern for Insulators division. Continuous efforts are being made to secure more and more export orders for Insulators to offset the declining domestic demand.

6. Internal Control Systems and their adequacy

The company is having adequate internal control systems and procedures commensurate with the size of the company. The company has appointed internal auditors instead of conducting internal audit departmentally which will ensure that the internal control systems are properly followed and no room is left for any fraud or embezzlement.

7. Financial/Operational Performance

The turnover has improved by about 11.73%, mainly due to Cables & Conductors division resulting in overall profit before Depreciation and Taxation of ₹ 12.31Crores. However, there is loss in Insulators division due to under utilization of capacity, increased competition and rise in cost of all inputs.

8. Human Resources/Industrial Relations

It is the company's belief that the Human Resource is the driving force towards progress and success of a Company. The company seeks to motivate and retain its professional by offering reasonable compensation and opportunity to grow in the organization. The total permanent employees strength of the company was 780 as on 31st March, 2014. The industrial relations in all Works remained cordial during the year.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND OTHER NOTES TO ACCOUNTS:- NOTE NO - 27

(A) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India and the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956, Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules 2006.

2. Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized, when it can be reliably measured and it is reasonable to expect ultimate collection. Revenue from operations includes sale of goods. Sales is net of taxes, rebate, discount, claims and other non recoverables. Dividend income is recognized when right to receive is established. Interest income is recognized on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and rate applicable.

3. Retirement Benefits

- (i) Expenses and Liabilities in respect of employee benefits are recorded in accordance with Accounting Standard 15 Employee Benefits (Revised 2005) issued by the ICAI.
- (ii) Short-term employee benefits are recognised as an expense at the undiscounted amount in the profit and loss account of the year in which the related service is rendered.
- (iii) Post employment and other long term employee benefits are recognised as an expense in the Profit and Loss account for the year in which the employee has rendered services. The expense is recognised at the present value of the amounts payable determined using actuarial valuation techniques. Actuarial gains and losses in respect of post employment and other long term benefits are charged to the Profit and Loss account.

4. Excise Duty

The excise duty liability in respect of closing inventory of finished goods is provided for and included as part of inventory. The amount of CENVAT credits in respect of materials consumed for sales is deducted from cost of materials consumed. Amount of custom duty paid on raw materials (including in transit) is included in the value thereof.

5. Research & Development

Revenue expenditure on Research and Development is charged to the Profit and Loss account in the year in which it is incurred. Capital expenditure is shown as depreciable fixed asset.

6. Tangible Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost net of recoverable taxes and includes amounts added on revaluation, less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss, if any. All costs, including finance costs till commencement of commercial production, net charges on foreign exchange contracts and adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable to the fixed assets are capitalised.

7. Intangible Assets

Intangible Assets are stated at cost of acquisition net of recoverable taxes less accumulated amortisation/ depletion. All costs, including financing costs till commencement of commercial production, net charges on foreign exchange contracts and adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable to the intangible assets are capitalised.

8. Depreciation and Amortisation

Depreciation is provided on straight line method as follows:- (i) On the original cost of fixed assets at the rates and in the manner prescribed in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956. (ii) On increase in value due to revaluation on the basis of remaining useful life as estimated by the valuer, the corresponding amount is directly transferred to General Reserve from Revaluation Reserve."

9. Impairment of Assets

An asset is treated as impaired when the carrying cost of asset exceeds its recoverable value. An impairment loss is charged to the Profit and Loss Account in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. The impairment loss recognised in prior accounting period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of recoverable amount.

10. Foreign Currency Transactions

- (a) Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction or that approximates the actual rate at the date of the transaction.
- (b) Monetary items denominated in foreign currencies at the year end are restated at year end rates. In case of items which are covered by forward exchange contracts, the difference between the year end rate and rate on the date of the contract is recognised as exchange difference and the premium paid on forward contracts is recognised over the life of the contract.
- (c) Non monetary foreign currency items are carried at cost.
- (d) Any income or expense on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translation is recognised in the Profit and Loss account except in case of long term liabilities, where they relate to acquisition of fixed assets, in which case they are adjusted to the carrying cost of such assets.

11. Investment

Investments are classified as long term or current based on the Management intention at the time of purchase. Long-term investments are stated at acquisition cost. Provision for diminution in the value of long-term investments are made only if there is a decline is other than temporary phenomenon. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and quoted/fair value, computed category wise.

12. Inventories

Inventories are stated at lower of cost or net realisable value. The cost for the purpose of valuation is computed on the basis of weighted average price in case of Conductors and Cables Division and in case of Insulators Division on the basis of First-in-First out (FIFO). The cost of work-in-progress (other than those lying at third party manufacturing sites which is valued at material cost) and finished goods comprises of raw materials. direct labour, other direct costs and related production overheads, but excludes interest expense. Net realisable value is the estimate of the selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the costs of completion and selling expenses.

13. Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalised as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to Profit and Loss account.

14. Government Grants

Grants received from the government agencies for the specific fixed assets are shown as deduction from the gross value of the asset concerned and thus recognized over the useful life of the depreciable asset by way of reduced depreciation charge. Capital Subsidy/Grants received from the government are considered as Capital Reserve as per Accounting Standard - 12. Revenue grants are recognised as Other Income or deducted in reporting the related expenses where such benefits have been earned by the enterprise and it is certain that ultimate realisability is certain.

15. TAXES ON INCOME

Provision for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provisions of the Income-Tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax as per Accounting Standard -22, resulting from "timing difference" between taxable and accounting income is accounted for using the tax rates and laws that are enacted or substantively enacted as on the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax asset is recognised and carried forward only to the extent that there is a virtual certainty that the asset will be realised in future.

16. PROVISIONS AND CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent Liabilities are not recognised but are disclosed in notes to Financial Statements. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in financial statements.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES AND OTHER NOTES TO ACCOUNTS:- NOTE NO - 27

(A) SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1 Components of Hindusthan Urban Infrastructure Limited

The Consolidated Financial Statements represent consolidation of accounts of Hindusthan Urban Infrastructure Limited and its subsidiary company as stated below:

Name of the Subsidiary Country of Incorporation Share Holding Percent

Hindusthan Speciality Chemicals Limited India 100.00%

2 Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the generally accepted accounting principles in India and the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956, Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (Accounting Standard) Rules 2006.

3 Principles of Consolidation:

The Consolidated financial statements relate to the Hindusthan Urban Infrastructure Limited with its subsidiary. In the preparation of these consolidated financial statements, investment in subsidiary has been accounted for in accordance with the provisions of Accounting Standard - 21 (Consolidated Financial Statements). The financial statement of the subsidiary company has been drawn up to the same reporting period as of Hindusthan Urban Infrastructure Limited. The Consolidated Financial Statements are prepared on the following basis:

- i. The financial statements of the company and its subsidiary company has been on a line-to-line basis by adding together the book values of the like items of assets, liabilities, income and expesses after eliminating all the significant intra-group balances and intra-group transactions and also unrealised profits or losses in accordance with Accounting Standard- 21 (Consolidated Financial Statements)
- ii. The Consolidated Financial Statements are prepared using uniform accounting policies for like transactions and other events in similar circumstances and are presented, to the extent possible, in the same manner as the Company's separate financial statements. The financial statements of the subsidiary company is adjusted for the accounting policies followed by the company.
- iii. The difference between the cost to the company of its investment in subsidiaries and its proportionate share in the equity of the investee company at the time of acqusition of shares in the subsidiary is recognozed in the financial statements as Goodwill or Capital Reserve as the case may be.

4 Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized, when it can be reliably measured and it is reasonable to expect ultimate collection. Revenue from operations includes sale of goods. Sales is net of taxes, rebate, discount, claims and other non recoverables. Dividend income is recognized when right to receive is established. Interest income is recognized on time proportion basis taking into account the amount outstanding and rate applicable.

5 Retirement Benefits

- (i) Expenses and Liabilities in respect of employee benefits are recorded in accordance with Accounting Standard 15 Employee Benefits (Revised 2005) issued by the ICAI.
- (ii) Short-term employee benefits are recognised as an expense at the undiscounted amount in the profit and loss account of the year in which the related service is rendered.
- (iii) Post employment and other long term employee benefits are recognised as an expense in the Profit and Loss account for the year in which the employee has rendered services. The expense is recognised at the present value of the amounts payable determined using actuarial valuation techniques. Actuarial gains and losses in respect of post employment and other long term benefits are charged to the Profit and Loss account.

6 Excise Duty

The excise duty liability in respect of closing inventory of finished goods is provided for and included as part of inventory. The amount of CENVAT credits in respect of materials consumed for sales is deducted from cost of materials consumed. Amount of custom duty paid on raw materials (including in transit) is included in the value thereof.

7 Research & Development

Revenue expenditure on Research and Development is charged to the Profit and Loss account in the year in which it is incurred. Capital expenditure is shown as depreciable fixed asset.

8 Tangible Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost net of recoverable taxes and includes amounts added on revaluation, less accumulated depreciation and impairment loss, if any. All costs, including financing costs till commencement of commercial production, net charges on foreign exchange contracts and adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable to the fixed assets are capitalised.

9 Intangible Assets

Intangible Assets are stated at cost of acquisition net of recoverable taxes less accumulated amortisation / depletion. All costs, including financing costs till commencement of commercial production, net charges on foreign exchange contracts and adjustments arising from exchange rate variations attributable to the intangible assets are capitalised.

10 Depreciation and Amortisation

Depreciation is provided on straight line method as follows:-

- (i) On the original cost of fixed assets at the rates and in the manner prescribed in Schedule XIV to the Companies Act, 1956.
- (ii) On increase in value due to revaluation on the basis of remaining useful life as estimated by the valuer, the corresponding amount is directly transferred to General Reserve from Revaluation Reserve.

11 Impairment of Assets

An asset is treated as impaired when the carrying cost of asset exceeds its recoverable value. An impairment loss is charged to the Profit and Loss Account in the year in which an asset is identified as impaired. The impairment loss recognised in prior accounting period is reversed if there has been a change in the estimate of recoverable amount.

12 Foreign Currency Transactions

- (a) Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction or that approximates the actual rate at the date of the transaction.
- (b) Monetary items denominated in foreign currencies at the year end are restated at year end rates. In case of items which are covered by forward exchange contracts, the difference between the year end rate and rate on the date of the contract is recognised as exchange difference and the premium paid on forward contracts is recognised over the life of the contract.
- (c) Non monetary foreign currency items are carried at cost.
- (d) Any income or expense on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translation is recognised in the Profit and Loss account except in case of long term liabilities, where they relate to acquisition of fixed assets, in which case they are adjusted to the carrying cost of such assets.

13 Investment

Investments are classified as long term or current based on the Management intention at the time of purchase. Long-term investments are stated at acquisition cost. Provision for diminution in the value of long-term investments are made only if there is a decline is other than temporary phenomenon. Current investments are carried at lower of cost and quoted/fair value, computed category wise.

14 Inventories

Inventories are stated at lower of cost or net realisable value. The cost for the purpose of valuation is computed on the basis of weighted average price in case of Conductors and Cables Division and in case of Insulators Division on the basis of First-in-First out (FIFO). The cost of work-in-progress (other than those lying at third party manufacturing sites which is valued at material cost) and finished goods comprises of raw materials. direct labour, other direct costs and related production overheads, but excludes interest expense. Net realisable value is the estimate of the selling price in the ordinary course of business, less the costs of completion and selling expenses.

15 Borrowing Costs

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalised as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to Profit and Loss account.

16 Government Grants

Grants received from the government agencies for the specific fixed assets are shown as deduction from the gross value of the asset concerned and thus recognized over the useful life of the depreciable asset by way of reduced depreciation charge. Capital Subsidy/Grants received from the government are considered as Capital Reserve as per Accounting Standard - 12. Revenue grants are recognised as Other Income or deducted in reporting the related expenses where such benefits have been earned by the enterprise and it is certain that ultimate realisability is certain.

17 Taxes on Income

Provision for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provisions of the Income-Tax Act, 1961. Deferred tax as per Accounting Standard -22, resulting from "timing difference" between taxable and accounting income is accounted for using the tax rates and laws that are enacted or substantively enacted as on the balance sheet date.

Deferred tax asset is recognised and carried forward only to the extent that there is a virtual certainty that the asset will be realised in future.

18 Provision and Contingent Liabilities

Provisions involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement are recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent Liabilities are not recognised but are disclosed in notes to Financial Statements. Contingent Assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in financial statements.
