



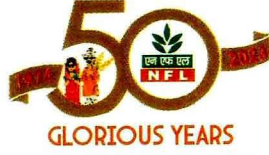

China to raise retirement age for first time since 1978

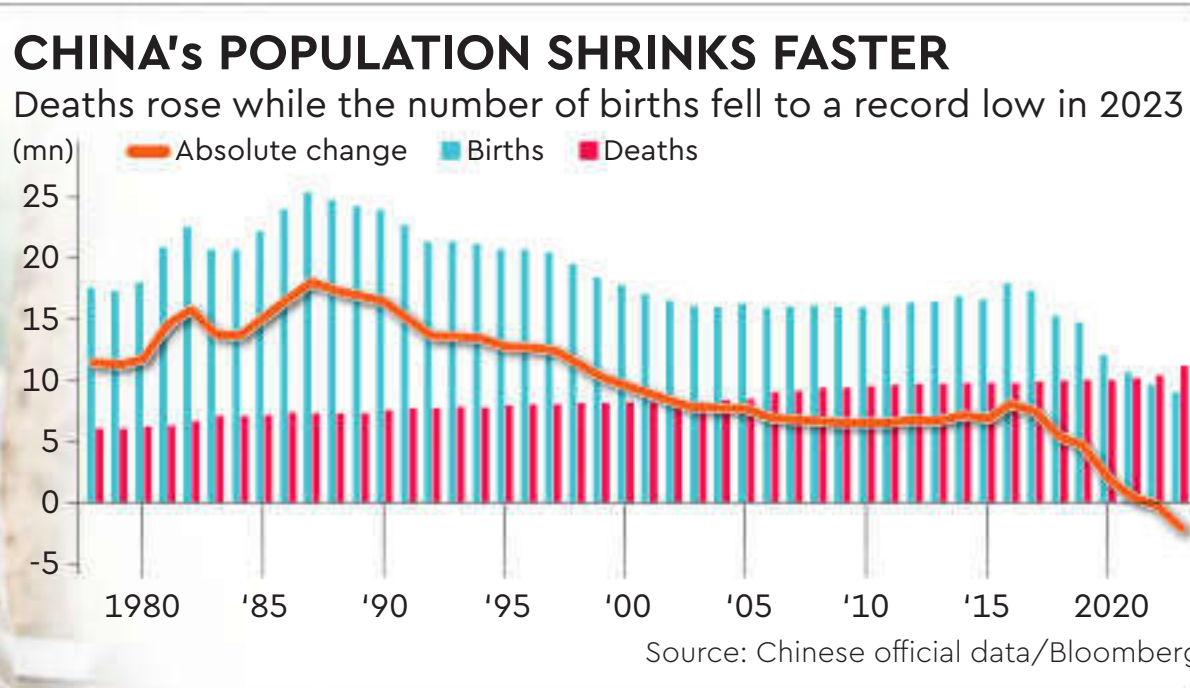
DENMARK'S DSV HAS agreed to buy Schenker, the logistics arm of German state rail operator Deutsche Bahn, for 14.3 billion euros (\$15.85 billion) in a deal that would make it the world's biggest logistics company.

Men will retire at 63 instead of 60; women at 55 instead of 50

CHINA WILL RAISE the retirement age for the first time since 1978, a move that could stem a decline in the labour force but risk angering workers already wrestling with a slowing economy.

Top lawmakers endorsed a plan to delay retirement for employees by as long as five years, Xinhua news agency reported on Friday. Men will retire at 63 instead of 60. Women will retire at 55 instead of 50 for ordinary workers, and 58 instead of 55 for those in management positions.



The change will take place over 15 years starting January, and will allow more people to work longer. This could boost productivity to address the challenges of an aging population, although it risks adding to public discontent with the economy growing at the worst pace in five quarters.

Shares of companies providing health and elderly care jumped, with Shanghai Everjoy Health Group rising by the daily limit of 10%. Chalkis Health Industry and Youngie Health gained more than 6%.

despite significantly increased life expectancy over the decades. A bigger tax base and delayed access to benefits will relieve the pressure on the government to fund pensions as the elderly population rapidly expands.

The hike is aimed at "adapting to the new situation of demographic development in China, and fully developing and utilising human resources," according to the decision by the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress.

The approval followed a July announcement by the ruling Communist Party that the retirement age will rise in a "voluntary, flexible manner." Previous efforts to raise the threshold had failed in the face of public opposition.

Boeing hits turbulence as workers go on strike

THOUSANDS OF BOEING workers walked off the job on Friday after rejecting a contract offer from the company, a potentially costly disruption as Boeing tries to increase airplane production after a safety crisis.

The strike, the first at Boeing in 16 years, is expected to bring operations to a halt in the Seattle area, home to most of Boeing's commercial plane manufacturing. The slowdown could also further disrupt the company's fragile supply chain.

Kelly Ortberg, the company's new chief executive, had urged employees to approve the deal. "A strike would put our shared recovery in jeopardy, further eroding trust with our customers," he said in a video statement on Wednesday.

Boeing plays a substantial role in the US economy. It employs almost 150,000 peo-

ple across the country—nearly half of them in Washington—and is one of the nation's largest exporters. The company, which also makes military jets, rockets, spacecraft and Air Force One, is a global symbol of America's manufacturing strength.

The union said the strike vote passed by 96%, well above the two-thirds required to initiate a walkout, after 95% rejected

In a statement on Friday after the vote, Boeing said it was "committed to resetting our relationship with our employees and the union." The company said it was "ready" to continue negotiations on a new labour contract. A vast majority of the 33,000 workers governed by the contract are represented by District 751 of the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers. Members of that union, Boeing's largest, mostly work on commercial airplanes in the Seattle area. The dispute also involves workers in the Portland, area who are represented by the union's smaller District W24.

The last Boeing strike, in 2008, lasted 50 days. If the current strike lasts about as long, it will cost Boeing at least \$3 billion, according to an estimate from Cai von Rumohr, a research analyst at the investment bank TD Cowen.

POLAND'S INTEL PLANT GETS EU GREEN LIGHT

THE EUROPEAN COMMISSION HAS given Poland a green light to support an Intel chip assembly and testing plant with more than 7.4 billion zlotys (\$1.91 billion) in state aid, the government said on Friday.

US locks in steep China tariff hikes

THE BIDEN ADMINISTRATION on Friday locked in steep tariff hikes on Chinese imports, including a 100% duty on electric vehicles, to strengthen protections for strategic domestic industries from China's state-driven excess production capacity.

The US trade representatives said many of the tariffs, including a 100% duty on Chinese EVs, 50% on solar cells and 25% on steel, aluminum, EV batteries and key minerals, would go into effect on September 27.

The USTR determination, published on Friday but first reviewed by Reuters, showed a 50% duty on Chinese semiconductors, which now include two new categories—polysilicon used in solar panels and silicon wafers—are due to start in 2025.

Adjustments to the punitive "Section 301" tariffs on \$18 billion worth of goods announced in May by US president Joe Biden were minimal and disregarded auto industry pleas for lower tariffs on graphite and

critical minerals needed for EV battery production because they are still too dependent on Chinese supplies.

Lael Brainard, the top White House economic adviser, said the decision was made to ensure that the US EV industry diversifies away from China's dominant supply chain.

She said such "tough, targeted" tariffs are needed to counteract China's state-driven subsidies and technology transfer policies that have led to over-investment and excess

production capacity. But Washington is investing hundreds of billions of dollars worth of its own tax subsidies to develop domestic EV, solar and semiconductor sectors.

"The 100% tariff on electric vehicles here does reflect the very significant unfair cost advantage that Chinese electric vehicles in particular are using to dominate car markets at a breathtaking pace in other parts of the world," Brainard said.

"That's not going to take place here under the vice president's and the president's leadership."

CHINA SUSPENDED THE operations of PricewaterhouseCoopers for six months and imposed a record penalty over lapses in its auditing of China Evergrande Group.

The accounting firm was fined 44.1 million yuan (\$62 million) for its auditing work on Evergrande's inflated financial reports from 2018 to 2020, statements by the ministry of finance and the China securities regulatory commission showed

Friday. The regulator also ordered the closure of PwC's branch in Guangzhou.

PwC has been under the spotlight after China launched one of the biggest investigations of financial fraud in history. Authorities have said developer Evergrande's main onshore unit Hengda overstated its revenue by 56.4 billion yuan in the two years through 2020.

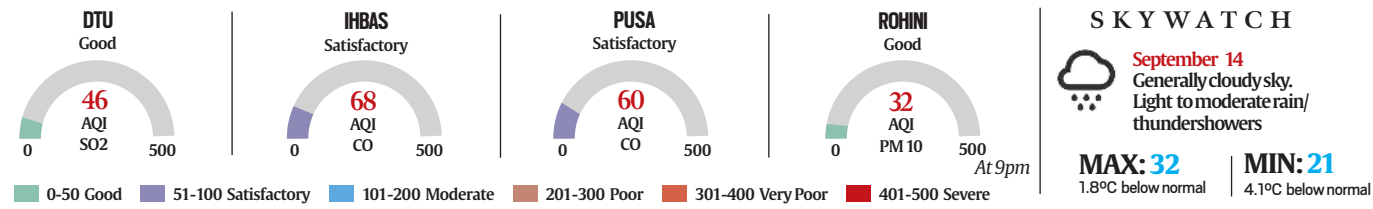
PwC "turned a blind eye" to Evergrande's fraud, the securities regulator said in a separate statement. PricewaterhouseCoopers

Zhong Tian, a Shanghai-registered firm that is part of PwC's global network, was Hengda's auditor during the period in question. PwC was Evergrande's auditor for more than a decade until it resigned in January 2023, due to what the developer said were audit-related disagreements.

The CSRC found that 88% of PwC's observation records on Evergrande's property projects in 2019 and 2020 were untrue, leading to "severely unreliable" audit working papers.

RAIN DISRUPTS LIFE ON DAY DELHI HAD CLEANEST AIR OF THE YEAR

Waterlogged roads, traffic snarls as NCR goes under, yellow alert today

Gurgaon, central and southern parts of Delhi brought to knees

INESSANT RAIN that began overnight leading to severe waterlogging and heavy traffic jams disrupted normalcy in Delhi-NCR, especially Gurgaon, Central and southern parts of Delhi Friday.

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) issued an orange alert for Delhi-NCR Friday, while its seven-day forecast has placed Saturday in the yellow alert category. The Met department expects a cloudy sky with light to moderate rain on Saturday.

Meanwhile, people in Delhi breathed the cleanest air so far this year as the Air Quality Index was at 52 — in the 'satisfactory' category — Friday, according to data from the Central Pollution Control Board.

South and Southwest Delhi districts saw intense rainfall as Palam station logged 61.2 mm, Safdarjung 45.5 mm, Ayanagar 45.2 mm, and Lodhi Road 42.2 mm as of 5.30 pm on Friday, the IMD data showed. Other stations in Central, East Delhi and North Delhi districts recorded relatively lower rainfall as Pitampura logged 7 mm, SPS Mayur Vihar 5

mm, Delhi University 4 mm, Ridge 3.8 mm, Narela 2 mm and Najafgarh 0.5 mm.

With severe waterlogging, the Delhi Traffic Police issued alerts for Mehrauli-Badarpur Road, Mathura Road, Aurobindo Marg, Madhu Vihar crossing, Najafgarh Phimi Road, SSN Marg, Satya Niketan Bus Stand, Anuvrat Marg, Guru Teg Bahadur Road, GT Karnal Road Industrial Area, Main Outer Ring Road, Main Kanjhawla Road, Lala Lajpat Rai Marg, Gurgaon Road - Parade Road and Rohtak Road.

A traffic advisory was also issued due to waterlogging at

Mundka. The Main Outer Ring Road saw traffic jams in the carriageway from Bhera Enclave Roundabout towards Peeragarhi, caused by waterlogging and an overflow of sewer water near Nagin Lake Apartments, Peeragarhi.

Informing the public about traffic disruptions due to waterlogging, the police posted photos and videos and advised people to avoid affected areas and take alternate routes.

Waterlogged streets and heavy traffic plagued Gurgaon as well.

At Narsinghpur — the first ca-

more than usual because rain coincided with Friday evening traffic," he said.

Around 70 staff were deployed for flood relief measures, cleaning water chutes, road gutters and drain openings to clear storm water from the master roads. In Narsinghpur, where water had entered the Delhi-Jaipur highway, the Gurugram Metropolitan Development Authority (GMDA) deployed 16 pumps.

Pumping machinery was also installed at Rajiv Chowk, Khandsa Chowk, near the city bus stand and Sector 67 opposite AIPL Mall to facilitate quick discharge of stormwater, said a GMDA spokesperson.

The rain on Friday brought down the maximum and minimum temperatures in Delhi-NCR. The maximum temperature was six degrees below normal at 27.6 degrees Celsius and the minimum was four degrees below normal at 21.4 degrees Celsius. The humidity level was recorded at 96 per cent.

The current rainfall has been attributed to the low-pressure area over northwest Uttar Pradesh and the neighbourhood due to which a cyclonic circulation has extended up to 7.6 kms above mean sea level. This is likely to weaken gradually into a low-pressure area during the next 12 hours, said the IMD in a weather inference issued at 5.30 pm, Friday.

COACHING CENTRE DEATHS

Pay ₹5 cr to Red Cross: HC interim bail for 4 basement co-owners

SOHINIGHOSH DELHI, SEPTEMBER 13

THE DELHI High Court Friday granted interim bail to four co-owners of the basement of Rau's coaching centre at Old Rajinder Nagar in Delhi where three UPSC aspirants drowned and died in July after getting flooded.

Justice Dinesh Kumar Sharma granted the interim relief until January 30, 2025 provided the four accused — Parvinder Singh, Tajinder Singh, Sarbjit Singh and Harvinder Singh — pay Rs 5 crore as cost to the Red Cross Society. "What the petitioners did is unpardonable. It is an act of greed," Justice Sharma remarked while pronouncing the court's decision.

Additionally, the court suggested the Lieutenant Governor (L-G) appoint a committee chaired by a former judge to ensure that coaching centres do not operate by violating norms and

regulations. Justice Sharma went on to suggest that the government may consider designating a specific place in the city from where the coaching centres can operate.

On August 2, a division bench of the High Court had transferred the probe in the case from Delhi police to the CBI, deeming the same to be necessary considering "the seriousness of the incident, to ensure that the public has no doubt" on the probe and considering the possibility that the incident "may involve corruption by public servants".

Desilting work in Palam: ACB lodges case into graft allegations

FOLLOWING directions from Lieutenant Governor Vinai Kumar Saxena, the Anti Corruption Branch (ACB) of Delhi has registered a case to probe allegations of corruption and misuse of public funds worth around Rs 80 crore involving the public works department (PWD) of South West Division in carrying out desilting work in Palam.

ACB chief Madhur Verma said the agency has registered a case under Prevention of Corruption Act. Officials said that PWD officials allegedly inflated bills, sought payments for non-existent work and violated the tender process. Over four years, it is claimed that around Rs 78.40 crore were improperly paid to a single contractor.

The desilting work was carried out at Southwest Road-I and Southwest Road-II divisions of the PWD in Palam.

St Stephen's moves HC blaming DU for stalling admission of minority candidates

FOLLOWING A tussle over the Delhi University (DU) allotting more students to St Stephen's College than it could accommodate, the college on Friday moved the High Court highlighting "inaction by DU" by not opening its fee portal for 19 Christian students who were approved by the college to be admitted for seats reserved for the minority in the college.

Expressing urgency, the college, through senior advocate Romy Chacko, requested the court of Justice Sanjeev Narula on Friday that the court issue a direction to DU for opening its fee portal for

the 19 students, as DU has announced September 15 as the last date of making online payments.

However, senior advocate Moninder Rupal, representing DU, objected to the request, and following instructions from the registrar of DU, submitted that the admission process shall remain open till September 30.

While recording DU's statement and submission, Justice Narula kept the matter for further consideration on September 17.

The college had sent its list of selected Christian candidates for its undergraduate programme to DU on August 24. Subsequently, DU had communicated with the college for information on the candidates, which was provided

by the college. Following this, the DU twice raised queries and sought certain clarifications, which too was provided by the college, as per the college's submissions.

Notably, upon moving the petition on September 12, the college highlighted that among the 66 candidates chosen by it for its Christian reserved seats, 47 admissions were processed promptly by DU.

The DU continues to dispute over the seat matrix, a bone of contention that was also debated upon during the hearing of petitions by seven aspirants who had moved HC earlier, blaming the college for leaving them in a limbo by not confirming their admission despite seat allocation by DU.

1984 anti-Sikh riots: Trial against Tytler to commence from Oct 3

AFTER HE pleaded not guilty in a 1984 anti-Sikh riots case, a Delhi court said on Friday that Congress leader Jagdish Tytler will face trial from October 3 for the killing of three men by a mob that torched the Pul Bangash Gurdwara in Delhi.



On August 30, Judge Rakesh Syal of the Rouse Avenue court ordered the framing of charges against Tytler (80) under sections of 302 (murder), 109 (abetment), 147 (rioting), 153A (promoting enmity between groups) and 143 (unlawful assembly) of the Indian Penal Code (IPC).

Charges have officially been framed and the examination of witnesses will begin on the next date of hearing. Lakhwinder Kaur, wife of Badal Singh — one of the three men who had died — is the first witness who will be examined 40 years after her husband was killed by the mob.

tion against the closure report that led to the case moving forward.

On two other occasions, in 2009 and 2014, CBI closed the case against Tytler but the court refused to accept the report. Last April, the agency said it had fresh evidence against Tytler — a corroboration of his voice sample with a particular speech he made 39 years ago, which allegedly connected him to the incident.

In its chargesheet filed last May, CBI accused Tytler of "inciting, instigating and provoking the mob" assembled near the Pul Bangash Gurdwara at Azad Market, Bara Hindu Rao, on November 1, 1984. A day earlier, the then Prime Minister Indira Gandhi was assassinated by her Sikh bodyguards.

Relying on the testimony of a witness, CBI also said that Tytler instigated the mob by shouting "Kill the Sikhs, they have killed our mother" — referring to Indira Gandhi.
