NEET aspirant dies by suicide

Bhubaneswar: A class 12 student, who was preparing for medical entrance exam NEET at a private institute in Odisha's Bhubaneswar, allegedly died by suicide in her hostel room in Patia on Thursday, police said.

Her father alleged she died by suicide unable to handle the pressure of studies.

Kalyani Sahu, 18, was a native of the Salipur area of Cuttack district, police said.

She was preparing for NEET at a private institute in Bhubaneswar for 18 months. Her body was found hanging in her hostel room, police said. The hostel warden informed her father, Mahesh Kumar Sahu, following which he contacted the police.

"We have registered a case of unnatural death, and sent the body for post-mortem examination," the officer said.

SSB cop dies in UP girder fall

Gorakhpur: An inspector of the Sashastra Seema Bal (SSB) was killed and another seriously injured on Thursday when a girder of an under-construction rail overbridge fell on them at Chiluat in UP's Gorakhpur, police said.

The incident took place near a fertiliser factory when SSB inspector Vjendra Singh, 45, riding a motorcycle with fellow inspector Manje Kundu, 42, were passing through the area.

Police said the 10-quintal aluminium girder, meant for under-construction Nakhra overbridge, fell on the victims after the chain of a crane lifting it broke. Singh was directly hit by the falling girder and died on the spot while Kundu who sustained serious injuries was rushed to a local hospital, officials said.

Hailing from Haridwar, Uttarakhand, inspector Singh was stationed at SSB Headquarters in Chiluat since 2022. The crane operator fled the scene after the accident, police said.

CASTE BIAS MATTER | No hindrance, says SC

NCRB can collect data in prisons

The Supreme Court on Thursday said its direction to delete the "caste" column apart from any caste reference in undertrials or convicts' registers in jails will not impede the collection of data by National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB).

A bench of CJJ DY Chandrachud and justices JB Pardiwala and Manoj Misra made the clarification.

In a landmark verdict delivered on October 3, the apex court banned caste-based discrimination like division of manual labour, segregation of barracks and bias against prisoners of de-notified tribes and habitual offenders by holding as "unconstitutional" the jail manual rules of 10 states for fostering such biases.

"The 'caste' column and any references to caste in under-

trial and or convicts prisoners' registers inside the prisons shall be deleted," stated one of the directions in the verdict.

Senior advocate S Muralidhar, appearing for the petitioner on whose plea the verdict was delivered, said a prayer in the application sought non-hindrance to the exercise of the NCRB data collection by the direction of caste reference removal from the registers.

"That may be necessary," additional solicitor general Aishwarya Bhati weighed in.

When the bench noted that the NCRB ought to have moved the apex court for such a clarification, Bhati said she had instructions from the ministry of home affairs for its issuance by the court.

"... it is clarified that direction (iv) will not impede the collection of data by the NCRB," the bench said.

In its October 3 verdict, the top court observed that the

"right to live with dignity" extended "even to the incarcerated".

The Centre and the states were accordingly directed to amend their prison manuals and laws within three months and file compliance reports before the top court.

The top court was dealing with certain discriminatory provisions of jail manuals of UP, West Bengal, MP, Andhra, Odisha, Kerala, Maharashtra, Karnataka and Himachal when it set aside the same.

"Rules that discriminate among individual prisoners on the basis of their caste specifically or indirectly by referring to proxies of caste identity are violative of Article 14 on account of invalid classification and subversion of substantive equality," it had held.

The judgment was delivered on a PIL by journalist Sukanya Shantha who had written on the prevalence of caste discriminations in jails.

Bengaluru airport gets 4k sqft hydroponic green wall

Bengaluru: Many trips to nurseries in Bengaluru as well as the field trips to Western Ghats yielded him about 153 species of native plants to grow on the 30-foot-high, 160-foot-wide (2 walls each of 80 feet) installation called 'Tiger Wings' aka 'Patrick Wall' at the Terminal 2 of the Kempegowda International Airport, said Patrick Blanc, a globally renowned botanist on Thursday. The botanist is affiliated with the French National Centre for Scientific Research. According to him, India, where he has been doing vertical garden projects for 20 years, usually offers 10 to 15 species to work with. "It's a pity that we have to choose from plants grown in tropical America, Africa and Southeast Asia. There is a need to nurture Indian species that can be grown in vertical gardens here, not many propagate them," Blanc told PTI. In total, 'Tiger Wings' span 4,000 sqft and are home to over 15,000 plants across 153 species, added Hari Marar, MD & CEO of Bangalore International Airport Ltd (BIAL).

Nadda visits Sharda's house

Patna: BJP president JP Nadda on Thursday offered condolences to the bereaved family of Sharda Sinha, the renowned folk singer who breathed her last earlier this week. Nadda, who was on a day-long tour of the Bihar capital, visited the Rajendra Nagar residence of Sinha, who had died at the AIIMS in Delhi on Tuesday after a prolonged illness. The Union minister was accompanied by deputy CM Samrat Choudhary and BJP's state unit chief Dilip Jaiswal. They paid floral tributes to a portrait of Sinha.

Timber smuggler arrested

Rudrapur: Notorious timber smuggler Sangat Singh alias Sangi, who had escaped two months ago after allegedly firing on police personnel, has been arrested after an encounter in Uttarakhand. The encounter took place in Gadarpur late on Wednesday night, Udham Singh Nagar's SSP Manikant Mishra said on Thursday. The encounter ensued when Sangat Singh alias Sangi, riding a motorcycle, started firing at police party as they tried to stop him for checking. He was shot in the leg.

Probe report into samosas served to Himachal CM's staff instead of Sukhu dubbed 'anti government'

Shimla: A matter of refreshments getting served to the staff of Himachal chief minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu instead of the chief minister by mistake has assumed disproportionate dimensions following a CID probe that termed the goof up an "anti-government" act.

Due to a lack of coordination, three boxes of samosas and cakes were brought from Hotel Radisson Blue in Lakkar Bazaar for the chief minister who had gone to CID headquarters for a function on October 21. However, the eatables were served to the CM security staff, according to the

enquiry report conducted by a deputy SP rank officer.

The report said an officer of IG rank had asked a police sub-inspector to get eatables from the hotel for the CM's visit. The SI directed an assistant SI and a head constable to bring the refreshments.

The ASI and the head constable fetched the refreshments from the hotel in three sealed boxes and informed the SI. The police officers in their statement said when they asked the tourism dept staff on duty if the snacks were to be served to the chief minister, they said they were not included in the menu.

Jammu: Four people, including a girl, died and two were injured when a vehicle skidded off the road and rolled down into a gorge in J&K's Reasi on Thursday.
