Global connectivity

The India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC), announced at the G20 summit in New Delhi last year, aims to become a cornerstone of global connectivity, External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar said on Friday, even as he called for greater connectivity and collaboration between India and the Mediterranean region.

Addressing the inaugural CII India Mediterranean Business Conclave, a new initiative by the MEA in collaboration with CII, the EAM said the strategic location of the Mediterranean, with approximately 600 ports that services 25% of global seaborne trade, establishes it as a crucial hub. He said India plays an equally vital role in the Indo-Pacific extending its reach westwards.

"Given both the location and centrality, and the levels of activity, it makes eminent sense to connect the two for mutual benefit." The EAM said that India's relationship with countries of the Mediterranean region has progressed in recent years, with trade reaching USD 77.89 billion in 2023.

"We have promoted investments in critical sectors, including infrastructure, energy, and technology." He called for deepening the defence and security connect with the Mediterranean region, including with more industry interaction through Make in India in the defence domain. He said the region's vast green hydrogen and green ammonia potential present new opportunities for collaboration with India, as well as for cooperation in the area of shipping and maritime infrastructure.

EAM also called for greater collaboration with the Mediterranean region in the realm of urban infrastructure, and said that India which builds two new metros and seven airports annually can be a serious partner in this.

"Today, India is the 5th largest economy that could become the 3rd largest by 2030. Given this momentum, we want to deepen our engagement with the Mediterranean region. Initiatives such as 'Make in India' and 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' are designed to empower potential investors and drive growth in India. We offer enormous opportunities for Mediterranean countries to invest, trade, collaborate on tech, and exchange mutual expertise," he added.

He said India's renewable energy sector, food processing industry and Sagarmala ports modernisation programme, are areas for collaboration.

Disruptions in shipping routes

Mentioning the ongoing Middle East conflict and the Houthi attacks on maritime traffic in the Red Sea region, he said: "The ongoing conflict in West Asia understandably has generated concerns about some of the contemporary initiatives. Disruptions in crucial shipping routes that have increased shipping costs and necessitated the rerouting of trade flows, have added to our collective worries.

"But if you reflect on these happenings, they only strengthen the case for derisking. As the three hubs of India, Europe and the Middle East step up their interactions, connectivity will be more needed, not less."

Uncrewed Starliner undocks from ISS; heads back to earth

Astronauts Sunita, Butch monitor departure

New York, Sep 7: Boeing's Starliner spacecraft departed the International Space Station (ISS) to begin its journey back to earth with no astronaut onboard.

The uncrewed spacecraft autonomously undocked from the ISS at approximately 6:04 p.m. Eastern Time Friday, to start its journey home, according to NASA livestream.

The separation burns and breakout turns for Starliner's departure went well, according to NASA engineers.

Starliner is headed for a deorbit burn at 11:17 p.m. Eastern Time. The spacecraft is scheduled to land at White Sands Space Harbour in New

Mexico at approximately 12:03 a.m. Eastern Time Saturday to conclude the mission.

NASA astronauts Butch Wilmore and Sunita Williams closed the hatch on Starliner for the final time at 1:29 p.m. Thursday. The duo were on deck to monitor the spacecraft's departure as it undocked from the forward-facing port of the Harmony module, according to NASA.

Wilmore and Williams launched aboard Starliner spacecraft on June 5 for its first crewed spaceflight, arriving at the ISS on June 6.

As Starliner approached the orbiting laboratory, NASA and Boeing identified helium leaks

and experienced issues with the spacecraft reaction control thrusters.

The astronaut duo were originally scheduled to stay at the ISS for eight days. Now they have spent three months in space.

Boeing conducted numerous thruster tests in space and on the ground over the summer, and was convinced its spacecraft could safely bring Wilmore and Williams home. But NASA disagreed and opted for SpaceX.

NASA ultimately decided that sending the two astronauts home onboard Starliner was too risky. The new plan is to have the two astronauts ride home in a SpaceX

Dragon spacecraft in February 2025, and have Starliner return to Earth uncrewed.

As veteran astronauts and retired Navy captains, Wilmore and Williams anticipated hurdles on the test flight. They've kept busy in space, helping with repairs and experiments. The two are now full-time station crew members along with the seven others on board.

A minute after separating from the space station, Starliner's thrusters could be seen firing as the white, blue-trimmed capsule slowly backed away. NASA Mission Control called it a "perfect" departure.

Flight controllers planned more test firings

of the capsule's thrusters following undocking. Engineers suspect the more the thrusters are fired, the hotter they become, causing protective seals to swell and obstruct the flow of propellant. They won't be able to examine any of the parts; the section holding the thrusters will be ditched just before reentry.

NASA's commercial crew program manager Steve Stich said earlier this week that teams have been so focused on Starliner's return that they've had no time to think about what's next for Boeing. He said the space agency remains committed to having two competing U.S. companies transporting astronauts.

Japan to elect new PM on Oct 1

Tokyo, Sep 7: An extraordinary session of the Japanese parliament, during which the country's new Prime Minister will be elected, may be held on October 1, the Kyodo news agency reported.

The ruling coalition of the Liberal Democratic Party (LDP) and the Komeito party is currently discussing the date of the extraordinary session of parliament with opposition parties, the report said on Friday, adding that the date is expected to be approved by the end of the month.

The ruling coalition has a majority in both houses of the parliament, therefore, the winner of the election of the next head of the LDP will become the 101st prime minister of Japan, the report read.

The election to choose a new head of the ruling LDP will be held on September 27. Incumbent Japanese Prime Minister Fumio Kishida will not run for reelection as the party leader.

India, Bhutan to deepen space S&T cooperation

Thimpu, Sep 7: India and Bhutan on Friday said they look forward to further "deepening collaborative activities" under the joint space initiative to harness space science and technology for societal good and the betterment of people from both countries.

At the first meeting of the Bhutan-India Joint Working Group held here, both sides reviewed the ongoing bilateral space cooperation and charted

out the way forward on the different areas outlined in the Joint Plan of Action (JPOA) on Space Cooperation, a joint press release said.

The JPOA - which provides a concrete roadmap for bilateral cooperation in the Space sector - was signed during the official visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to Bhutan in March 2024.

In consonance with the JPOA, signed by the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO)

and GovTech Agency of Bhutan, additional 16 MHz bandwidth was allocated to Bhutan on the South Asia Satellite by the ISRO, the joint press release said.

"India and Bhutan look forward to further deepening collaborative activities under the JPOA on Space Cooperation, to harness space science and technology for societal good and the betterment of our two peoples," it added.

India and Bhutan share

a dynamic partnership in the Space sector, which includes cooperation under the Memorandum of Understanding on Peaceful Uses of Outer Space, signed in November 2020.

The two sides jointly developed a satellite 'INDIA-BHUTAN SAT', which was launched in November 2022 by ISRO.

India has also extended capacity-building opportunities to Bhutanese engineers and experts, the release added.

Will not desert NDA again, pledges Bihar CM Kumar

Patna, Sep 7: Bihar Chief Minister Nitish Kumar on Friday pledged not to repeat the mistake for the third time of deserting NDA and joining Grand Alliance in Bihar.

Kumar publicly took the pledge at a function in the presence of senior BJP leader and Union Health Minister J.P. Nadda, who was here to inaugurate the newly constructed regional

ophthalmology unit in the premises of Indira Gandhi Institute of Medical Sciences (IGIMS), Patna.

While addressing the function, Kumar suddenly recalled his experience of working with RJD as a major partner of Grand Alliance when he had formed a government with them on two occasions in 2015 and 2022 after deserting NDA.

"During my association with Grand Alliance as

ruling coalition partner, they were not allowing me to work in the interests of Bihar," the Chief Minister said adding that he could not repeat the mistake of deserting NDA for the third time under any circumstances. He assured BJP leader Nadda that no such kind of development was going to take place.

Incidentally, Kumar had also affirmed again and again on so many

occasions of not returning to the fold of Grand Alliance when Prime Minister Narendra Modi was present on the dais during the campaign in recently held Lok Sabha elections.

RJD spokesman Shakti Yadav while reacting to the remark of Kumar, said that BJP was feeling insecure which prompted him to assure the saffron party not to desert it again. It was a reflection of the nervousness of the BJP over the next move of Kumar, he stated.

Meanwhile, Jeetan Ram Manjhi, Union Minister and patron of Hindustani Awam Morcha (HAM), a constituent of NDA, said that Kumar had expressed his good thoughts in larger interests of people. It was good that Kumar vowed to remain with NDA in the future as well, he remarked. Speculations are rife over the next move of Chief Minister Kumar after his recent meeting with RJD leader Tejaswi Prasad Yadav. The meeting, however, was organised to decide the appointment of Information Commissioner in Bihar.
