4. Emphasis of Matter

- i) that there has been a survey by GST department on 7th July 2021 and all data of the company has been taken by them. We have checked the figures of unaudited standalone statement of the company from the copies of Invoices raised and purchases/services taken during the said period along with GSTR returns submitted seeing the active status of vendors on the date of signing this limited review report. Expenses such as salary, depreciation etc. has been checked from the details and supporting documents produced before us. Further all data of the Company has been taken by them hence Account Balances of Trade Payable, Trade Receivables, Loans and Advances, Borrowings, Fixed Assets & Inventories are subject to confirmation and the consequential effects of the same on the profits/losses, assets and liabilities of the company are not quantifiable. 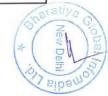

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting record in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities: selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgment and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and the design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial control that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting record, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Consolidated Financial result the give a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.
- 6. In preparing the consolidated financial results, the Board of Directors of the Company are responsible for assessing the ability of the Company to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.
- 7. The Board of Directors of the Company are responsible for overseeing the financial reporting process of the Company.

Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Consolidated Financial Results

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the consolidated financial results as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to

If we conclude that a material uncertainty exists, we are required to draw attention in our auditor's report to the related disclosures in the consolidated financial results or, if such disclosures are inadequate, to modify our opinion. Our conclusions are based on the audit evidence obtained up to the date of our auditor's report. However, future events or conditions may cause the Company to cease to continue as a going concern.



- Obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence regarding the Financial Information of entities within the group to express an opinion on the Consolidated Financial Results. We are responsible for the direction, supervision and performance of the audit of financial information of such entities included in the Consolidated Financial result of which we are the independent auditors.
- Materiality is the magnitude of misstatement in the Consolidated Financial results that, individually or in aggregate, make it probable that the economic decisions of reasonably knowledgeable user of the Consolidated Financial results may be influenced. - 10. We communicate with those charged with governance of the Company regarding, among other matters, the planned scope and timing of the audit and significant audit findings, including any significant deficiencies in internal control that we identify during our audit.
- 11. We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Other Matters

12. The Financial Results include the results for the quarter ended March 31, 2024, being the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of the full financial year and the published unaudited year to date figures up to the third quarter of the current financial year, which were subjected to limited review by us. As required under the Listing regulations.
