Food is an essential to everyone on the planet. That is why food security is always a crucial issue. It is closely related to household resources, disposable income and socioeconomic status. Food safety is the level of safety and sanitation of foods from food borne illnesses, illnesses received from eating food that contains germs, bacteria, or viruses. Food safety is very important because there are people all over the world who have received illnesses by eating food that is not safe. There is fact said that food is enough for everyone in the world but because of the great changes which happened rapidly in the world the rate of food become less than before and it is difficult to secure it. Food security is very important to ensure that everyone has enough to eat and families can build their communities without worrying about securing their lives. India ranks 74 out of 113 major countries in food security index. Though

the available nutritional standard is 100% of the requirement, India lags far behind in terms of quality protein intake at 20% which needs to be tackled by making available protein-rich food products at affordable prices. Food security concerns can be traced back to the experience of the Bengal Famine in 1943 during British colonial rule, during which about 2 million to 3 million people perished due to starvation. India, currently has the largest number of undernourished people in the world i.e. around 195 million. To draw attention and inspire action to help prevent, detect and manage foodborne risks, contributing to food security, human health,

economic prosperity, agriculture, market access, tourism and sustainable development. Access to sufficient amounts of safe food is key to sustaining life and promoting good health. The five main issues of food security are accessibility; is the food accessible to people when they need it; stability; are there enough stable food sources to ensure food for future years; acceptability; is the food acceptable for every diet, culture and country; availability; is the food readily available when needed, and adequacy; is the food safe and nutritious and produced in environmentally sustainable ways. Foodborne illnesses are usually infectious or toxic in

nature and often invisible to the plain eye, caused by bacteria, viruses, parasites or chemical substances entering the body through contaminated food or water. It is estimated that 4,20,000 people around the world die every year after eating contaminated food and children under 5 years of age carry 40% of the foodborne disease burden, with 1,25,000 deaths every year. Food safety has a critical role in ensuring that food stays safe at every stage of the food chain - from production to harvest, processing, storage, distribution, all the way to preparation and consumption. Growth of population will affect on some countries ability to produce food especially in the poor developing countries, so improved nutrition is central to improved income generation, poverty reduction, and provide a good food quality. The right to food is a well established principle of international human rights law. It has evolved to include an obligation for state parties to respect, protect, and fulfill their citizens' right to food security. What we need is to adopt a policy that brings together diverse issues such as inequality, food diversity, indigenous rights and environmental justice to ensure sustainable food security. # How the race of artificial intelligence will define Cold War 2.0



One of the greatest mystics and thinkers of the world ever, Jiddu Krishnamurti began to use the term 'artificial intelligence' in the early 1980s. As long ago as the 1950s, he spoke of the human brain being programmed like a computer and, before that, thought of being mechanical. As the use of computers grew, Krishnamurti, as ever, reflected the phenomenon to ourselves, asking vital questions. What would be our place if computers and AI could do most of what we could do faster and more efficiently? What is the future of humanity? What is the

nature and place of thought? These questions, posed by Jiddu Krishnamurti, are more relevant than ever as the world finds itself embroiled in a new kind of geopolitical struggle that some are calling the 'AI Cold War 2.0'. The race for artificial intelligence (AI) supremacy has become the defining battleground of the 21st century, with the United States and China vying for dominance in a technology poised to reshape the global order. This strategic rivalry highlights the contest for economic and technological superiority and mirrors the ideological and geopolitical tensions some experts labelled 'AI Cold War 2.0'. China's transformation from a follower to a leader in AI is a story of ambition, strategy, and state-backed investments. Initiatives like the Next Generation Artificial Intelligence Development Plan (2017) and Made in China 2025 reflect Beijing's determination to lead the AI revolution by 2030. This vision is supported by a centralised approach that mobilises resources across government,

academia, and industry, enabling rapid advancements in AI research and application. Scholars like Chao Min and Yi Zhao from Nanjing University emphasise the role of mimetic isomorphism, where latecomers emulate global leaders while gradually innovating. This strategy, combined with weak data privacy regulations and vast data collection capabilities, has propelled China's AI sector to produce the highest volume of research publications worldwide since 2014. However, challenges remain in the quality of research, semiconductor technology, and breakthrough innovations. The United States has historically dominated AI development with its robust ecosystem of public-private partnerships, academic excellence, and pioneering tech companies like Google, OpenAI, and Microsoft. Government initiatives, including the National

AI Initiative Act (2020), have further strengthened the US' position as a global AI leader. The decentralised nature of the US research environment encourages innovation, allowing collaboration between government agencies, academic institutions, and private enterprises. However, growing competition from China and challenges in scaling AI education and workforce training underscore the US' need to maintain its edge.

## Three major decisions of GPSC for examinees

# Accused in Rs 52 billion betting scam to go to Dubai

Court grants Bharat Chaudhary a passport for 15 days, grants deposit of Rs 2 lakh and bail of Rs 50 thousand



Patan, The Patan Sessions Court has allowed Bharat Mumbhraj Chaudhary, an accused in a betting scam worth over Rs 52 billion and with Dubai connections, to go to Dubai for 15 days. Judge Prashant H. Seth has ordered the accused to surrender his passport along with a cash deposit of Rs 2 lakh and a surety bond of Rs 50,000 along with a surety bond of the same amount. Bharat Chaudhary, who was arrested from Patan on July 27, 2024 by the Bhuj-Cyber Police Range Cyber ?Crime Border, is currently out on bail. Chaudhary, a resident of Gota area of ?Ahmedabad and originally from Kamalpur, Radhanagar, had filed an application in the court through his lawyer D.B. Pandya. The accused had demanded the return of his passport for 90 days to make changes in the bank account and other agreements in Dubai. However, the court has granted permission for only 15 days. The accused will have to deposit his passport in the court immediately after returning from abroad and the period of the passport will have to be deposited in the court before going abroad. The accused had filed an application in the court through his lawyer. The details of this are that the accused Bharat Chaudhary, through his lawyer D.B. Pandya, had filed an application in the Patan Sessions Court seeking temporary modification of the two conditions laid down in his previous bail application, namely, depositing the passport in the court and not leaving the territory of India without the permission of the court, to return his passport for 90 days and allowing him to leave the territory of India. The application stated that since he needed to go to Dubai to make changes to his bank account and other agreements in Dubai, he should be given a passport for three months and allowed to leave the territory of India. The court has partially approved the application for 15 days and has ordered the accused Bharat Chaudhary to go to Dubai for 15 days and return his passport for that number of days. It is worth mentioning here that the accused Bharat Chaudhary was released on regular bail on 25-10-24. Accused accused of betting on cricket Bharat Chaudhary and other accused in this Patan betting scandal are accused of dishonestly and fraudulently using the computer-based Android application 99 EXCH and sending messages through WhatsApp to the persons logged in to the application, inviting them to bet on the loss of a cricket match and making financial transactions at the end of the match. A case was registered against the accused at Patan City B Division Police Station under Section 12 of the Gambling Prevention Act, Section 66(B), 66(C), 66(D) of the Information Technology Amendment Act, 2008 and Section 61, 111(2) (B), 113(3)(11)(A), 111(6) of the Indian Penal Code, 2023. The accused had demanded the return of his passport for 90 days to make changes in his bank account and other agreements in Dubai. However, the court has granted permission for only 15 days. The accused will have to deposit his passport in the court immediately after returning from abroad and a copy of the passport will have to be deposited in the court before going abroad.
