It may not be smooth sail for Rao Narbir as BJP sees revolt ahead of assembly polls

Gurgaon. Former Haryana minister Rao Narbir Singh clinched BJP's nomination from Badshapur assembly seat in Gurgaon despite pushback against his candidature within the party, but his battle is far from over. Fighting for a second term from Badshapur, a first for the MLA, Narbir Singh won't just have to fight off an electoral contest from rivals in other parties, but also within his own. Sources told TOI that there may be resentment on the ground from the supporters of BJP's district president Kamal Yadav and former state secretary Manish Yadav, both of whom were denied tickets from the constituency. Other than that, Narbir Singh's nomination was opposed by prominent BJP faces, including Union minister former MP Sudha Yadav, they said. According to a party source, Sudha Yadav had called for disciplinary action against Narbir for allegedly criticising his own party in recent years. Narbir Singh, ahead of the announcement of assembly election schedule in Haryana, had said at an event in South City that if denied a BJP ticket, he would consider running for Congress. Narbir Singh's path to get the ticket wasn't without its hurdles. In the 2019 assembly polls, BJP fielded Manish Yadav, who lost the election, though Narbir was backed by then chief minister Manohar Lal Khattar. Since then, Narbir Singh has remained consistently active in the constituency and engaged with the electorate.

It is this engagement that also makes him a strong favourite to win the seat. He is backed by Yadavs, a key voter base in Badshapur, and leads a team with strong organisational skills to run a campaign. His influence extends to both rural and urban areas, and during his tenure as a minister in the Khattar cabinet from 2014 to 2019, he gained a reputation for addressing issues flagged by common people. Badshapur's electorate has risen 35.5% over the past five years, with the constituency of 5.1 lakh registered voters now the largest in Haryana in this count. An increased voter turnout could play a crucial role in determining the outcome of the coming election.

Woman (23) strangled in pvt guest house, man arrested

Gurgaon. A 23-year-old woman was allegedly throttled to death by a 40-year-old man at a private guest house in Jharsa on Saturday evening following a dispute over payment. The accused, Anil Pahal, a customs broker, was arrested on Sunday for murder and rape.

According to police, the woman, originally from Uttar Pradesh, had come to the city two months ago to work as a consultant massage therapist but was also soliciting clients for sexual services online. Pahal had asked her to come over through the internet, agreeing to pay Rs 5,000. However, after the meeting, the woman reportedly demanded an additional Rs 2,500, which led to a heated argument. Police said, "Anil transferred Rs 5,000 to a man who dropped the woman at the guest house. After the dispute over extra payment, he strangled her and fled, taking her phone and locking the door." The guest house staff grew suspicious when Pahal hurriedly left, leaving the woman behind. Upon opening the room, they found her unconscious and immediately called the police. She was declared dead at the Civil Hospital in Sector 10.

"Through CCTV footage, room booking details, and call records, police were able to trace both the accused and the woman," said a Gurgaon police spokesperson. A case was registered against the accused under BNS sections 103 (1) (murder) and 64 (rape) on Sunday. The accused was arrested from yate Park on Sunday morning. "The stolen mobile phone has been recovered from the accused. He will be produced before court on Monday," the spokesperson said.

Roads riddled with craters, no lights: Residents protest, flag safety fears

Gurgaon. Scores of residents from Sector 109, drenched in rain and holding posters, staged a protest on Sunday against DTCP and MCG for failing to address their civic grievances. Their main concern is the deteriorating condition of a 24-metre internal road that connects major residential societies like ATS Tourmaline, Chintels Serenity, Brisk Lumbini, and Sobha Villas. The 500-meter stretch, laid by developers during construction, has been in disrepair for the past four years. Deep potholes, frequent waterlogging, and the absence of street lighting have made the road unsafe, especially at night. Despite multiple complaints, residents say the developers refuse to maintain the road, and DTCP and MCG have failed to take action. The MCG, in particular, has distanced itself, claiming the road is outside its jurisdiction, despite collecting house taxes from the residents.

"While we continue to suffer with unsafe and poorly maintained roads, the authorities and developers are simply shirking their responsibility," said Gaurav Prakash, a resident of Brisk Lumbini. Amit Vats, a resident of Chintels Serenity, added, "Despite assurances from DTP planning, there has been no meeting of all the stakeholders to address this issue. We are still waiting for the DTP to issue written directions to the developers." According to residents, the problem stems from policy loopholes regarding shared responsibility among developers, who each built portions of the road within their licensed areas. After project completion, these sections should have been handed over to the DTCP and local authorities, but this process is not properly enforced, leaving residents to deal with the consequences. NK Sharma, president of Brisk Lumbini RWA, called for immediate action: "It's been nearly a decade of suffering from poor infrastructure. We need a permanent solution, not a quick fix." Responding to the concerns, senior town planner Renuka Singh said, "We will call a meeting with stakeholders and developers to resolve the issue and ensure compliance."

Elongated tortoise spotted in Damdama for first time

Gurgaon. An elongated tortoise was spotted in Damdama area for the first time on Sunday. The reptile, known for its yellowish-brown to olive shell adorned with black blotches, was not documented to be present in the region under Wildlife Institute of India (WII) study conducted in 2016. The species is widely distributed across northeast India, Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan, Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, Laos, and Malaysia. Specifically, it is found in the Manas-Bhutan transboundary landscape, Corbett-Rajaji-Nepal Terai landscape, and northeast Myanmar and northeast Bangladesh transboundary landscape, with an isolated presence in Odisha. However, the species, which has the scientific name Indotestudo elongata, is not abundant in any region and is listed in Appendix II of the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Flora and Fauna (CITES).

Sunil Harsana, an animal enthusiast and wildlife researcher who encountered the tortoise in Damdama, along with his teammate Nitesh Kaushik, had deployed numerous cameras in and around the Asola Bhatti Wildlife sanctuary and the Aravallis in Mangar. Harsana is part of a

project, supported by the organisation Coexistence Consortium, that requires him to analyse animal movement around Damdama. "This is an incredibly rare find. An elongated tortoise has never been observed in the region before," he said, adding that it was found in a nearby waterbody and left undisturbed in its natural habitat. The path and colony of the tortoise remains unknown. Meanwhile, experts have emphasised the importance of connecting fragmented habitats of the species through increasing the number of community forests and participatory monitoring in the vicinity of the Aravallis for wildlife conservation. The species, also referred to as the Sal Forest Tortoise, typically inhabits open deciduous forest patches, including Sal (Shorea Robusta) and evergreen forest habitats, dry thorn forests, and savannah grasslands. Robin Panjekar, a wildlife biologist, herpetologist, and assistant professor at Delhi University, said, "Nowadays, people are exploring new territories, leading to spotting of more rare species." The sighting comes at a time when the population of elongated tortoise is declining, he added.

In India, the Sal Forest Tortoise is one of the

29 species (24 turtles + 5 tortoises) of freshwater tortoise and turtles and is listed under Schedule IV of the Wildlife Protection Act.

NBCC out with three-phase plan to ready 50k Supertech flats in 3 years

New Delhi. Providing a confidence boost to several thousand homebuyers, state-run NBCC has proposed a three-phase construction plan spread over three years to complete all the 50,000 apartments spanning across 17 projects of Supertech Ltd, which is being run by an insolvency professional and whose promoter is facing multiple charges including fund diversion and money laundering. The public sector construction company has sought the National Company Law Appellate Tribunal's (NCLAT) permission to enter as a project management consultant, a task it is performing at Amrapali. NBCC has estimated the cost of completing all the projects at close to Rs 9,500 crore and the receivables are pegged at Rs 16,000 crore, including Rs

14,000 crore that can be generated from unsold inventory of 10,000 apartments. The insolvency resolution professional had estimated the construction cost at Rs 6,406 crore. Tentative time period for completion of various projects shall vary from 12 to 36 months from 'Day Zero', it has proposed. Day zero includes everything from access to land to receipt of approvals and availability of funds. Underlining the availability of funds as a key, NBCC has sought an "unencumbered designated project account", where an initial Rs 100 crore will be required. Besides, it has sought the support of local authorities and from Supertech as well as homebuyers. NBCC proposes to charge a fee of 8% on the actual cost of work and 1% marketing fees.

Rain brings relief from humidity, max temperature drops by 5°C

Gurgaon. The city on Sunday witnessed a rainfall measuring 21mm until 8.30 am. The minimum temperature was recorded at 25.6 degrees Celsius, a marginal increase from the preceding day's 25.4 degrees Celsius. This temperature still surpasses the seasonal average by 24.5 degrees. The overnight precipitation offered a long-awaited respite from the stifling humidity; however, it also resulted in the accumulation of water in certain low-lying localities. The maximum temperature, recorded at 27.1 degrees Celsius, plummeted 5.3 notches from 32.4 degrees Celsius on Monday and remained at 4.2 degrees below the season's average. At 98, the city's average air quality index (AQI) improved but remained in the 'satisfactory' category on Monday. It was 72 the previous day. In New Delhi, The capital experienced a gloomy day with overcast skies and intermittent very light rain throughout the city

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) issued a yellow alert on Sunday. "The district is likely to experience sporadic light rain on Monday, but from Tuesday to Friday, the city will witness partly cloudy skies. On Saturday, it is likely to experience partly cloudy sky with the possibility of rain or thunderstorm," an IMD official said. Despite waterlogging in certain areas of the city, no significant traffic congestion was seen. The civic authorities deployed additional pumps to clear the waterlogged areas and advised people to refrain from venturing out unless necessary. Scattered light rain is likely to continue until Thursday. However, India Meteorological Department (IMD) has issued a 'yellow' alert for light to moderate rain for Friday and Saturday. The low clouds prevented the temperature from rising significantly. The maximum temperature was 29.6 degrees Celsius, four degrees below

normal. The minimum temperature was 25.2 degrees Celsius, which is around normal. The gap between the day's maximum and minimum temperatures was just 4.4 degrees Celsius. The maximum temperature on Saturday was 34.4 degrees Celsius. Met officials attributed the presence of low clouds in Delhi-NCR and parts of the city's lowest visibility was recorded at 900 metres around 10.30 am on Sunday. "Scattered very light rain was received across the city. Similar rain activity is expected for the next few days," said an IMD official. IMD said light rain is expected until Thursday, but no color-coded warning has been issued. Delhi's air quality remained in the 'satisfactory' category, with an air quality index (AQI) of 91 on Sunday, up from 70 a day earlier. It is likely to stay in the same category until Sept 11, according to the Air Quality Early Warning System for Delhi.

Protest at Adani Aangan over wall breach; co says rain slowing repairs

Gurgaon: Agitated over the continued neglect of their concerns, residents of Adani Aangan in Sector 89A staged a protest on Sunday against the developer for failing to resolve their "safety concerns" in the society.

The protest comes over a month after a portion of the boundary wall adjoining the main gate of the society settled, leading to rapid soil erosion that has now reached close to one of the towers in the residential complex. Despite repeated complaints to the developer, the residents allege that no corrective measures have been taken, leaving them feeling vulnerable and unsafe. "Initially, it was just a small area adjoining the boundary wall that settled, but now, with the soil erosion progressing rapidly, it has become a serious threat to the structural integrity of the tower. This is not the first time. Last year too, the area adjoining the boundary wall settled, damaging a car," said Manoj Kumar, one of the residents. Launched in 2016, possession of flats started in phases in 2021.

Dushyant Chautala, JJP workers fined for riding bikes without helmets in Faridabad

GURGAON. Former deputy CM Dushyant Chautala and 14 others were penalised by traffic police on Tuesday for riding two-wheelers without helmets in Faridabad. Dushyant was riding a motorcycle without a helmet as part of a bike rally in the NIT Faridabad assembly constituency
