Issues at Ambattupalayam GLPS solved; grade 1 classes begin today

Protests by parents began after 5-year-old suffered eye injury after he fell down on July 3

THE 19-day-long tacit protest by the parents of Class I students at GLP School, Ambattupalayam, came to an end with the education department on Monday meeting their demands. With this, the first-grade classes at the school, established in 1961, will resume on Tuesday.

On Monday, the education department transferred the teacher who had been teaching Class I students to a nearby institute. Protests by the parents began after a five-year-old boy suffered injury on the side of his right eye after he fell down on July 3 morning.

According to the parents and department authorities, the

class teacher failed to give medical care to the student and also inform other teachers in the school. It was after the classes were over at 4 pm that other teachers noticed the injury and took the student for medical care.

From July 4, parents of all

eighteen Class I students decided not to send their wards to the school as they were worried about the safety of kids.

The parents raised the matter to the school head teacher, assistant education officer, Chittoor.

"We finally approached the

Palakkad district collector seeking a solution on July 12. Upon the collector's directive, the deputy director of education, Palakkad, intervened in the matter and visited the school on Wednesday. In between, we had to stage a silent protest outside the school along with our children and we even demanded the transfer certificate of our wards through a mass petition. We are happy and thankful to the authorities for settling the matter and ensuring the safety of our kids," the parents said on Monday.

Sources at AEO, Chittoor, said both the parents and the teaching staff at the school are happy now. Parents said that they would start sending their kids to school from Tuesday.

Revenue min vows to focus on resolving issues of Kole farmers

REVENUE MINISTER K Rajan said that he would focus on resolving the problems faced by Kole farmers in the district and ensure the conservation of Kole wetlands.

He was speaking at the annual general body meeting of Kole farmers and the Kole Padavu committees in Palakkad on Monday.

During the meeting chaired by District Collector Arjun Pandian, the minister said that as part of the Rebuild Kerala Initiative, a project worth ₹198.18 crore was underway in the Kole wetlands.

"This works include strengthening of the bunds in the Kole fields, mitigating flood situations, and overcoming challenges of drought," he said, announcing that a farming calendar for cultivation of crops in Kole wetlands would be released soon.

"By dividing the entire Kole region into different sectors, water used in one part can be reused in another, ensuring efficient water management in the region," he said.

He also highlighted the plan to reduce the usage of lime in the Kole lands, the minister said.

The meeting also discussed the need to shut the sluices at Chirakkathodu

and Puthanthodu, and construct ring bund at Enamakkal. The irrigation department was instructed to implement restrictions for using water in the Kole fields for irrigation purposes by the beginning of August.

The farmers urged the district administration to clear plants like hyacinths that clog the natural canals in the Kole fields to facilitate smooth irrigation.

The large population of these hyacinths also affects the dewatering process in the Kole lands. "We have also urged the state government to raise the paddy charges to ₹35 in proportion to the hike given by the central government. We also requested the government to ensure that the fund after the procurement of paddy reaches the farmer without delay," said K K Kochumohammed, who was re-elected to the Kole Advisory Council representing Cherpu region.

Moreover, the farmers sought support from the agriculture department to ensure the availability of quality seeds for paddy cultivation along with lime.

An 11-member Kole Advisory Council was formed in the meeting to monitor the activities in the region.

Murali Perunnellie MLA and Sub Collector Muhammad Shafeeq were present at the meeting. Irrigation Division Executive Engineer C V Sajith presented the report.

LDF allocated ₹6,000 crore in higher education in four years, says minister

THERE has been a student-centric change in the state's higher education sector and the government is providing maximum encouragement to students who come up with innovative ideas, Higher Education Minister R Bindu said on Monday.

Speaking after inaugurating the first floor of the academic block of Malampuzha IHRD College of Applied Sciences, Bindu also claimed that the LDF government had allocated ₹6,000 crore to the higher education sector in the past four years.

She said the government was providing up to ₹25 lakh as financial aid through the Young Innovators Programme (YIP) to empower students who innovate to bring new products, services or models to meet emerging requirements. "We emphasise on experiential learning and aim to convert more students into producers of innovative knowledge," Bindu said.

Saying that IHRD colleges had been able to attract students from ordinary families in coastal hilly

rural areas to science and technology, she maintained that the government will ensure all possible infrastructure and educational facilities for students.

"The state government contributed ₹31 lakh to the Women Engineered Satellite (WESAT), designed and built exclusively by an all-women team from Thiruvananthapuram.

Such aid will be provided in future too," she said. The building was constructed using ₹1.5 crore from the government's plan fund. Malampuzha MLA A Prabhakaran presided over the event, in which IHRD director V A Arunkumar, Malampuzha block panchayat president V Bijoy, principal in-charge A V Shalimam and others were present.

Murder case accused hacked to death in Thirissur; 3 held

A 48-YEAR-OLD man, who is an accused in murder cases, was hacked to death at Poochatty in Thirissur on Monday.

The deceased is Nadathara na-

tive Satheesh. Local residents found Satheesh in a pool of blood on the road near Poochatty school on Monday.

He succumbed to injuries while being taken to hospital. Three peo-

ple -- Jomon, Sijo and Sajin -- have been arrested in connection with the incident.

"Satheesh is an accused in the murders of goonda leaders Malankara

Varghese and Chapli Biju. He got into an argument with the accused people at a bar.

The trio might have killed Satheesh in retaliation to the murder of the goonda leaders," said a police officer.
