NEW DELHI: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday recalled the sufferings of people impacted by India's partition and reiterated the commitment to always protecting the bonds of unity and brotherhood in the nation.

On the Partition Horrors Remembrance Day, he said, "We recall the countless people who were impacted and greatly suffered due to the horrors of Partition. It is also a day to pay tributes to their courage, which illustrates the power of human resilience. A lot of those impacted by Partition went on to rebuild their lives and attain immense success."

He added, "Today, we also reiterate our commitment to always protect the bonds of unity and brotherhood in our nation."

Meanwhile, PM Modi will unfurl the national flag for the

11th time in a row on Thursday on Independence Day -- the centrepiece annual event where he lays out his government's agenda, presents its report card, makes important policy and programme announcements and speaks about burning issues.

will take him past Manmohan Singh, who unfurled the tricolour 10 times from the ramparts of Red Fort during 2004-2014, and place him behind Jawaharlal Nehru and Indira Gandhi, who did the honours 17 and 16 times respectively.

the crisis in Bangladesh, especially the targeting of minority Hindus, may find a mention in his speech, more so as Hinduva groups have strongly taken up the issue and hit the streets.

Modi may also speak about the mandate for his government for a third straight term, though with a reduced majority, and dwell at length on how reforms, development programmes and welfare measures rolled out in the last 10 years have impacted the lives of the people.

It will be eagerly seen if the prime minister announces any new initiative or expand the

ambit of some ongoing welfare programmes at a time when a combined opposition, at its strongest in the last 10 years, has pivoted to populist welfare promises to draw support.

Jammu and Kashmir has often figured in his August 15 speeches as the gov't has worked overtime to reconfigure the security and development paradigms in the erstwhile state, now a Union territory, since scrapping Article 370 in 2019.

Of late, the region, especially the Jammu division, has seen several terror incidents, leading to the deaths of several security personnel.

Colonel Manpreet Singh posthumously awarded Kirti Chakra

For the supreme sacrifice in Anantnag encounter

NEW DELHI: On the 78th Independence Day, the Indian Army's Colonel Manpreet Singh, who made the ultimate sacrifice during an operation against terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Anantnag district, was posthumously awarded the Kirti Chakra.

This prestigious award, India's second-highest peacetime gallantry honour, recognises his exceptional bravery, leadership, and unwavering devotion to duty in the face of overwhelming danger.

The operation that led to Colonel Manpreet Singh's supreme sacrifice occurred on September 13, 2023. He was leading a critical search and destroy mission in the rugged and densely forested hills of Anantnag district, a region notorious for frequent confrontations between security forces and militants.

The mission was pivotal, aimed at dismantling a terrorist hideout identified through



intelligence reports.

As the security forces approached the hideout, the terrorists, in a desperate bid to escape, unleashed a barrage of indiscriminate gunfire. Displaying remarkable courage and presence of mind, Colonel Manpreet Singh immediately returned fire, successfully neutralising one of the terrorists. However, the danger was far from over.

Realising that the remaining terrorists were attempting to flee, Colonel Singh swiftly reorganised his team, directing them to block all possible escape routes.

Despite the chaos and the imminent threat to his own life, he continued to lead from the front, coordinating his teams

actions and ensuring that the terrorists were kept under constant pressure.

In the ensuing gunfight, Colonel Manpreet Singh sustained a severe gunshot wound to the forehead. Even as he was gravely injured, his focus remained unwavering—he continued to command his troops, determined to prevent any terrorist from escaping. His leadership and tactical acumen were instrumental in ensuring that the terrorists were cornered and neutralised, with one being killed in the operation. The neutralised terrorist was later identified as a member of a proscribed terrorist group, further highlighting the significance of Colonel Singh's actions.

Tragically, Colonel Manpreet Singh succumbed to his injuries, leaving behind a legacy of extraordinary bravery and selflessness. His sacrifice has been widely mourned and recognised across the nation, with tributes pouring in from all corners.

RS bypoll: Cong nominates Abhishek Singhvi as its candidate from Telangana

NEW DELHI: The Congress on Wednesday named Abhishek Manu Singhvi as its candidate for the ensuing Rajya Sabha bypoll in Telangana.

The Election Commission had announced last

week that elections to 12 Rajya Sabha seats in nine states will be held on September 3.

Congress president Mallikarjun Kharge has approved the candidature of Singhvi for the by-election

to the Council of States from Telangana, the party said in a statement.

The Rajya Sabha bypolls are being held for 12 seats which include the two seats -- one in Telangana with K Kesava Rao resigning recently

from the House after quitting the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) to join the Congress and the other in Odisha after Biju Janata Dal (BJD) MP Mamata Mohanta resigned from her Rajya Sabha seat and primary membership

of the party. She later joined the BJP.

Earlier this year, Singhvi had lost the Rajya Sabha election from Congress-ruled Himachal Pradesh. BJP nominee Harsh Mahajan had won the February 27

election through draw of lots after both candidates secured 34 votes each.

However, Singhvi is likely to win the bypoll this time and enter the Upper House with the Congress having a majority in Telangana. MP05T

TMC hits out at Rahul Gandhi for remarks over Kolkata medic's rape-murder

KOLKATA: The TMC on Wednesday slammed Congress leader Rahul Gandhi for his remarks over the alleged rape and murder of a trainee doctor here, contending that he should keep in mind the "dismal track record" of women's safety during previous Congress governments at the Centre.

Gandhi, the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha, had earlier in the day said the attempt to save the accused instead of providing justice to the victim raises serious questions on the hospital and the local administration.

The entire country is shocked by the gruesome incident of rape and murder of the junior doctor in Kolkata, said the former Congress president, adding there is an atmosphere of insecurity among the doctors' community and women with the revelations about the manner of the cruel and inhuman act against her.

"The attempt to save the accused instead of providing justice to the victim raises serious questions on the hospital and the local administration," Gandhi said in a post on X in Hindi.

Trinamool Congress leader Kunal Ghosh dubbed the allegations as baseless.

"Before making such remarks, he should check and cross-check facts. He must not forget the dismal track record regarding women's safety during the Rajiv Gandhi (former PM) regime and (previous) Congress governments at the Centre," Ghosh said.

The body of the woman postgraduate trainee was found inside a seminar hall of the RG Kar Medical College and Hospital in Kolkata on the morning of August 9. A civic volunteer was arrested on Saturday in connection with the crime.

The Calcutta High Court had on Tuesday ordered the transfer of the probe into the alleged rape and murder of the trainee doctor from the Kolkata Police to the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) . MP05T
