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Building Bridges: Communication Strategies for Parents with Adolescents

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KOTA. Fostering healthy relationships and promoting adolescent development require effective communication between parents and their teenage children. While they seek independence, they still value parental guidance. However, barriers to communication frequently occur, making genuine interactions between both sides difficult. Adolescents go through a unique growth stage that includes physical, emotional, and cognitive changes.

This era is often marked by a yearning for autonomy, which parents may misread as rebellion. Emotional intensity, perceived judgment, communication style incompatibilities, and technological distractions are all common obstacles to communication.

Adolescents have heightened emotions, which can lead to misconceptions, and they are sensitive to criticism, which can lead to defensive behavior. Furthermore, adolescents may prefer indirect communication, but parents may want straightforward interactions.

Active listening is one of the most important components of healthy communication. This entails giving your full attention to your adolescent, maintaining eye contact, and demonstrating



comprehension by reflecting on their remarks. Refrain from finishing their words or interjecting, as this can discourage an open conversation. Encourage your child's self-expression by asking open-ended questions. For example, rather than asking, "Did

you have a good day?" ask, "What was the best part of your day?" This encourages more in-depth answers and meaningful dialogue. Validating emotions is another crucial strategy. Recognize your adolescent's feelings without attempting to solve the issue right away. Sayings such as "I see you're upset" foster trust and demonstrate empathy. This can defuse tensions and improve the relationship between parents and children by making them feel heard and valued. Create a regular time for open discussions, such as during family dinners or car journeys. Make sure your children feel comfortable sharing their ideas and emotions in these judgment-free spaces. Consistency in these activities indicates that you are always available for genuine discussion. The use of nonverbal cues in

communication is important. Be mindful of facial expressions, tone of voice, and body language. Make sure your body language is friendly and approachable in order to encourage your adolescent to interact. Adolescents need clear boundaries in order to comprehend expectations. Set and maintain these boundaries in a composed manner. When rules are applied consistently, it reinforces a sense of security and fairness.

Another useful strategy is to promote problem-solving skills. Instead of providing immediate solutions, encourage your child to think critically and develop their own ideas. This can be accomplished by asking questions such as, "What do you think would be the best way to handle this?" This not only improves their problem-solving abilities but also demonstrates your trust in their judgment.

Building effective communication with adolescents takes time, effort, and adaptability.



It's important for parents to remain calm and patient during interactions, even when discussions become heated. Responding with composure helps model effective communication and conflict resolution skills. These approaches improve mutual understanding and provide adolescents with valuable communication skills for life.

It is a remake of Kongara's Tamil film Soorari Potru (2020), which itself was an adaptation of G. R. Gopinath's memoir 'Simply Fly: A Deccan Odyssey'.

The plot revolves around Vir Mhatre (Akshay Kumar) who lives in a village of Maharashtra with his mother (Seema Biswas). His dream is to start a low-cost airline for poor people. But no bank gives him a loan. Rani (Radhika Madan) meets him and tells that she will marry him only if he succeeds in his endeavor. Vir's inspiration is Paresh Goswami (Paresh Rawal) who runs Jaz airlines but Paresh also rejects his idea because he thinks his elite class passengers will not travel with the common man. Prakash Babu (Prakash Belawadi) of Fundflow Ventures supports Vir. What struggles Vir faces? Will he be able to fulfill his dreams? Will poor people get an opportunity to fly in aeroplane? The climax answers all these questions.

The direction by Sudha Kongara is wonderful. She tells an inspirational story in an effective manner and not many people are aware of it. She has maintained good balance between funny and dramatic moments. Writing by Sudha Kongara, Shalini Ushadevi and Pooja Tolani is motivating and a number of scenes are impressive. On the flip side the love story is been given a lot of importance and



the film should have been trimmed. Akshay Kumar is brilliant in his 150th film. He has continued the trend of doing meaningful films. Radhika Madan is captivating. Seema Biswas is outstanding. Paresh Rawal is superb. Prakash Belawadi and Irawati Harshe Mayadev leave an impact. R. Sharathkumar as Akshay Kumar's commanding officer is terrific. Anil

Charanjeett, Krishnakumar Balasubramanian and Saurabh Goyal as Akshay Kumar's friend lend able support. Ravi Khanvilkar, Rahul Vohra and Jay Upadhyay are good. Suriya adds star value.

The cinematography by Niketh Bommi is amazing. The music by GV Prakash Kumar, Suhit Abhyankar and Tanishk Bagchi disappoints. The production design by Arvind Ashok Kumar and Bindiya Chhabria is authentic. The editing by Sathish Suriya could have been better.

In short 'Sarfirea' is a well-made film and tells a fascinating story. Recommended.
