Shah & Associates, Chartered Accountants (Registration No. 117853W), were appointed as the Statutory Auditors of the Company at the Annual General Meeting held on 29th September 2022 to hold the office until the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting of the Company to be held for the financial year 2026-2027 but due to some health issues he is not able to continue as Statutory Auditor & resigned w.e.f 18th September 2023.

The Company has obtained written consent and a certificate from M/s M. L. Bhuwania & Co. confirming their compliance with the criteria specified under Section 141 of the Act for the appointment of auditors. Additionally, the Certificate also verifies that their appointment as auditors falls within the limits prescribed under Section 139 of the Act. On 9th November 2023 M/s M. L. Bhuwania & Co. appointed as Statutory Auditors of the Company upto the conclusion of Annual General Meeting & also as per Postal Ballot on 12^{th} January 2024 & now the board approved to appoint M/s M. L. Bhuwania & Co. subject to approval of shareholder for 1 year i.e 2024-25 .

The Auditors Report does not contain any qualification, reservation or adverse remark. The Notes on Financial statements referred to in the Auditors report are self-explanatory and do not call any further comments.

During the year under review, the Statutory Auditors have confirmed that a fraud was reported to the Audit Committee, in accordance with Section 143(12) of the Act in previous year. As a result, there are no detail to be disclosed under Section 134(3)(ca) of the Act. a fraud was unearthed, which was committed by the employee of the company, against the company, by using digital and other means to transfer/ withdraw various sums from the bank account of the company. The amount involved was Rs. 191.16 lakhs (which included Rs 22.48 lakhs for Financial Year 2020-21, Rs 67.77 Lakhs for Financial Year 2021-22, Rs 79.22 Lakhs for Financial Year 2022-23 and Rs 21.68 lakhs for Financial Year 2023-24) which was expensed out during the previous financial year ended 31st March 2023 itself. A FIR was lodged and investigation is in process. Previous year figures relating to Financial Year 2020-21 and Financial Year 2021-22 were not restated and provision for the fraud amount committed in Financial Year 2023-24 was also provided in the previous financial year ended 31st March 2023 itself, as a matter of prudence. The previous year profit is understated by Rs 111.93 Lakhs due to non-restatement and due to provision for fraud amount relating to Financial Year 2023-24. The current year profit is over restated by Rs 21.68 Lakhs as the amount was provided in the previous Financial Year. The Audit Report for the previous year was qualified due to the same. However, the closing equity for the Financial Year ending 31st March 2024 is after giving effect of all the above.

22. DETAILS OF FRAUD AS REQUIRED UNDER SECTION 134(3)(CA) OF THE COMPANIES ACT READ WITH RULE 13 OF THE COMPANIES (AUDIT AND AUDITORS) RULES, 2014.

- (a) Nature of Fraud with description: Financial Fraud. Transfer of funds from the bank account without authorization.
- (b) Approximate Amount involved: Financial loss of Rs. 19,115,549. Financials approval for 31st March 2023 and 30th June 2023 were also delayed which has resulted in a penalty levied by the Bombay Stock Exchange.
- (c) Parties involved: Nilkanth Patole; (Chief Accountant) and Unnamed Bank Officials.
- (d) Remedial actions taken.: Yes, FIR is registered. Auditors were also informed. The fraud happened by sheer negligence of the bank which did the transactions without authorization and documentation or any approval from the Company. All the banks have been reprimanded and informed that no transaction should take place without original authentic documents. The directors have also started to personally check Bank reconciliation statements on a regular basis

23. INTERNAL AUDITOR:

In terms of the provisions of Section 138 of the Act M/s S.M. Bhat & Associates Chartered Accountant are the Internal Auditor of the Company for Financial Year 2023-24. The Audit Committee, in consultation with the Internal Auditor, formulates the scope, functioning, periodicity and methodology for conducting the Internal Audit. The Audit Committee, inter-alia, reviews the Internal Audit Reports.

The Board of Directors of the Company, at their Meeting held on 27th May, 2024 have re-appointed M/s S.M. Bhat & Associates as the Internal Auditor of the Company for the Financial Year 2024-25 on the recommendation of the Audit Committee.

The company has already sold the land and building in the previous year. The management is exploring new opportunities to setup a manufacturing or trading business. In the meantime, the Company has enough cash flows to sustain its operations and part of the surplus funds have been invested into a Singapore entity. Hence, Company's financials have been prepared on going concern basis. Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matter.
- 2. Attention is invited to Note No. 47 of the Statement of audited financial statement which states that during the previous year ended 31st March 2023 a fraud was unearthed, which was committed by the employee of the company,

against the company, by using digital and other means to transfer/ withdraw various sums from the bank account of the company. The amount involved was Rs. 191.16 lakhs (which included Rs 22.48 lakhs for Financial Year 2020-21, Rs 67.77 Lakhs for Financial Year 2021-22, Rs 79.22 Lakhs for Financial Year 2022-23 and Rs 21.68 lakhs for Financial Year 2023-24) which was expensed out during the previous financial year ended 31st March 2023 itself. A FIR was lodged and investigation is in process. Previous year figures relating to Financial Year 2020-21 and Financial Year 2021-22 were not restated and provision for the fraud amount committed in Financial Year 2023-24 was also provided in the previous financial year ended 31st March 2023 itself, as a matter of prudence. The previous year profit is understated by Rs 111.93 Lakhs due to non-restatement and due to provision for fraud amount relating to Financial Year 2023-24. The current year profit is over restated by Rs 21.68 Lakhs as the amount was provided in the previous Financial Year. The Audit Report for the previous year was qualified due to the same. However, the closing equity for the Financial Year ending 31st March 2024 is after giving effect of all the above. Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matter.

3. Balances of Trade receivables, Trade Payables, Advances, and Bank balances are subject to confirmation and consequential adjustments, if any. Our opinion is not modified in respect of the above matter.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

1 Company Overview

The Company ("Envair Electrodyne Limited"), is an existing public limited company incorporated on 04/02/1981 under the provisions of the Indian Companies Act, 1956 and deemed to exist within the purview of the Companies Act, 2013, having its registered office at Office No 123, Wing A, Sohrab Hall, 21 Sasoon Road, Pune City, Maharashtra, India. The Company engaged in the business of manufacturing and Trading of Clean Air Equipment, Technical Furniture and Hydraulic Oil Cleaner. The equity shares of the Company are listed on BSE Limited ("BSE"). The financial statements are presented in Indian Rupee lakhs (₹).

2 Material Accounting Policies

This note provides a list of the material accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements. These policies have been consistently applied to all the years presented, unless otherwise stated.

2.1 Basis Of Preparation Of Financial Statement

i) Compliance with Ind AS

These financial statements Complies in all material aspects with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015 as amended and notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (the "Act") and other relevant provisions of the Act and other accounting principles generally accepted in India.

The financial statements were authorized for issue by the Company's Board of Directors on 27th May, 2024

ii) Historical cost convention

The Company follows the mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on an accrual basis. The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, except in case of significant uncertainties and except for the following:

- (a) Certain financial assets and liabilities (Including Derivative Instruments) that are measured at fair value;
- (b) Defined benefit plans where plan assets are measured at fair value.
- (c) Investments are measured at fair value.
- iii) Current and Non Current Classification.

All assets and liabilities have been classified as current or non-current as per the Company's operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current – non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

2.2 Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions in the application of accounting policies that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income and expenses. Actual results may differ from these estimates. Continuous evaluation is done on the estimation and judgments based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognised prospectively.

2.3 Financial Instruments

A financial instrument is any contract that gives rise to a financial asset of one entity and a financial liability or equity instrument of another entity.

(I) Financial Assets

(i) Classification

The Company classifies its financial assets in the following measurement categories:

- (a) at fair value (either through other comprehensive income, or through profit or loss); and
- (b) at amortised cost.

The classification depends on the entity's business model for managing the financial assets and the contractual terms of the cash flows.

- (a) For assets measured at fair value, gains and losses will either be recorded in profit or loss or other comprehensive income.
- (b) For investments in debt instruments, this will depend on the business model in which the investment is held.
- (c) For investments in equity instruments, this will depend on whether the Company has made an irrevocable election at the time of initial recognition to account for the equity investment at fair value through other comprehensive income.

The Company reclassifies debt investments when and only when its business model for managing those assets changes.

(ii) Measurement

At initial recognition, the Company measures a financial asset at its fair value plus, in the case of a financial asset not measured at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition of the financial asset. Transaction costs of financial assets carried at fair value through profit or loss are expensed in profit or loss.

(a) Debt instruments

Subsequent measurement of debt instruments depends on the Company's business model for managing the asset and the cash flow characteristics of the asset. There are three measurement categories into which the Company classifies its debt instruments:

Amortised cost: Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows where those cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest are measured at amortised cost. A gain or loss on a debt investment that is subsequently measured at amortised cost and is not part of a hedging relationship is recognised in profit or loss when the asset is derecognised or impaired. Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income using the effective interest rate method.

Fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI): Assets that are held for collection of contractual cash flows and for selling the financial assets, where the assets' cash flows represent solely payments of principal and interest, are measured at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVOCI). Movements in the carrying amount are taken through OCI, except for the recognition of impairment gains or losses, interest income and foreign exchange gains and losses which are recognised in profit and loss. When the financial asset is derecognised, the cumulative gain or loss previously recognised in OCI is reclassified from equity to profit or loss and recognised in other income or other expenses (as applicable). Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income using the effective interest rate method.

Fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL): Assets that do not meet the criteria for amortised cost or FVOCI are measured at fair value through profit or loss. A gain or loss on a debt investment that is subsequently measured at fair value through profit or loss and is not part of a hedging relationship is recognised in profit or loss and presented net in the statement of profit and loss within other income or other expenses (as applicable) in the period in which it arises. Interest income from these financial assets is included in other income or other expenses, as applicable.

(b) Equity instruments

The Company subsequently measures all equity investments at fair value. Where the Company's management has selected to present fair value gains and losses on equity investments in other comprehensive income and there is no subsequent reclassification of fair value gains and losses to profit or loss. Dividends from such investments are recognised in profit or loss as other income when the Company's right to receive payments is established.

Changes in the fair value of financial assets at fair value through profit or loss are recognised in other income or other expenses, as applicable in the statement of profit and loss. Impairment losses (and reversal of impairment losses) on equity investments measured at FVOCI are not reported separately from other changes in fair value.

(iii) Impairment of financial assets

The Company assesses on a forward looking basis the expected credit losses (ECL) associated with its assets carried at amortised cost and FVOCI debt instruments. The impairment methodology applied depends on whether there has been a significant increase in credit risk.

For trade receivables only, the Company applies the simplified approach permitted by Ind AS 109 Financial Instruments, which requires expected lifetime credit losses (ECL) to be recognised from initial recognition of the receivables. The Company uses historical default rates to determine impairment loss on the portfolio of trade receivables. At every reporting date these historical default rates are reviewed and changes in the forward looking estimates are analysed.

The Company uses 12 month ECL to provide for impairment loss where there is no significant increase in credit risk. If there is significant increase in credit risk full lifetime ECL is used.

(iv) Derecognition of financial assets

A financial asset is derecognised only when -

- (a) The Company has transferred the rights to receive cash flows from the financial asset or
- (b) Retains the contractual rights to receive the cash flows of the financial asset, but assumes a contractual obligation to pay the cash flows to one or more recipients.

Where the Company has transferred an asset, the Company evaluates whether it has transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset. In such cases, the financial asset is derecognised. Where the entity has not transferred substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset, the financial asset is not derecognised.

Where the Company has neither transferred a financial asset nor retains substantially all risks and rewards of ownership of the financial asset, the financial asset is derecognised if the Company has not retained control of the financial asset. Where the Company retains control of the financial asset, the asset is continued to be recognised to the extent of continuing involvement in the financial asset.

(II) Financial Liabilities

(i) Measurement

Financial liabilities are initially recognised at fair value, reduced by transaction costs (in case of financial liability not at fair value through profit or loss), that are directly attributable to the issue of financial liability. After initial recognition, financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using effective interest method. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash outflow (including all fees paid, transaction cost, and other premiums or discounts) through the expected life of the financial liability, or, where appropriate, a shorter period, to the net carrying amount on initial recognition. At the time of initial recognition, there is no financial liability irrevocably designated as measured at fair value through profit or loss.

(ii) Derecognition

A financial liability is derecognised when the obligation under the liability is discharged or cancelled or expires. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are substantially modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as the de-recognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability. The difference in the respective carrying amounts is recognised in the statement of profit or loss.

2.4 Financial guarantee contracts

Financial guarantee contracts are recognised as a financial liability at the time the guarantee is issued. The liability is initially measured at fair value and subsequently at the higher of the amount determined in accordance with Ind AS 37 Provisions, Contingent Liabilities and Contingent Assets and the amount initially recognised less cumulative amortization, where appropriate.

2.5 Inventories Valuation

Inventories are valued at lower of Cost and Net Realisable Value. Cost of traded goods is arrived at on FIFO basis.

There were no inventories during the year.

2.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents includes cash in hand, deposits with banks, other short term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value. For the purpose of presentation in the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents includes outstanding bank overdraft shown within current liabilities in statement of financial balance sheet and which are considered as integral part of company's cash management policy.

2.7 Income tax and deferred tax

The Income tax expense or credit for the year is the tax payable on the current year's taxable income based on the applicable income tax rate adjusted by changes in deferred tax assets and liabilities attributable to temporary differences and to unused tax losses. Current and deferred tax is recognised in the profit and loss except to the extent it relates to items recognised directly in equity or other comprehensive income, in which case it is recognised in equity or other comprehensive income respectively.

(i) Current income tax

Current tax charge is based on taxable profit for the year. The tax rates and tax laws used to compute the amount are those that are enacted or substantively enacted, at the reporting date where the Company operates and generates taxable income. Management periodically evaluates positions taken in tax returns with respect to situations in which applicable tax regulation is subject to interpretation. It establishes provisions where appropriate on the basis of amounts expected to be paid to the tax authorities. Current tax assets and tax liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to set off current tax assets against current tax liabilities and Company intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

(ii) Deferred tax

Deferred tax is provided using the liability method on temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements at the reporting date. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that future taxable income will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, unused tax losses, depreciation carry-forwards and unused tax credits could be utilised.

Deferred income tax is not accounted for if it arises from initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction other than a business combination that at the time of the transaction affects neither accounting profit nor taxable profit (tax loss).

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured based on the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

The carrying amount of deferred tax assets is reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect changes in probability that sufficient taxable profits will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered.

Deferred income tax assets and liabilities are off-set against each other and the resultant net amount is presented in the Balance Sheet, if and only when, (a) the Company has a legally enforceable right to set-off the current income tax assets and liabilities, and (b) the deferred income tax assets and liabilities relate to income tax levied by the same taxation authority.

Defered Tax: In the absence of virtual certainity of future taxable profits against which the net deferred tax assets can be realised, the Company has considered it prudent not to recognise the deferred tax asset in the books of account.

2.8 Property, plant and equipment

- (i) All property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes expenditure that is directly attributable to the acquisition of the items.
- (ii) Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable thatfuture economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. The carryingamount of any component accounted for as a separate asset is derecognised when replaced. All other repairs and maintenance are charged toprofit or loss during the reporting period in which they are incurred.
- (iii) Cost of Capital Work in Progress ('CWIP') comprises amount paid towards acquisition of property, plant and equipment outstanding as of eachbalance sheet date and construction expenditures, other expenditures necessary for the purpose of preparing the CWIP for it intended use andborrowing cost incurred before the qualifying asset is ready for intended use. CWIP is not depreciated until such time as the relevant asset is completed and ready for its intended use.
- (iv) Depreciation methods, estimated useful lives and residual value.
- (a) Property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation.
- (b) Depreciation is provided on a pro rata basis on the writen down method over the estimated useful lives of the assets which is as prescribedunder Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. The depreciation charge for each period is recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss, unless itis included in the carrying amount of any other asset. The useful life, residual value and the depreciation method are reviewed atleast at each financial year end. If the expectations differ from previous estimates, the changes are accounted for prospectively as a change in accounting estimate.
- (v) Property, plant and equipment which are not ready for their intended use on reporting date are carried as capital work-in-progress
- (vi) The residual values are not more than 5% of the original cost of the asset. An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount

Estimated useful lives, residual values and depreciation methods are reviewed annually, taking into account commercial and technologicalobsolescence as well as normal wear and tear and adjusted prospectively, if appropriate. Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These are included in profit or loss within other expenses or other income as applicable

2.9 Intangible assets

(i) An intangible asset shall be recognised if, and only if: (a) it is probable that the expected future economic benefits that are attributable to theasset will flow to the Company and (b) the cost of the asset can be measured reliably(ii) Computer software is capitalised where it is expected to provide future enduring economic benefits. Capitalisation costs include licence feesand costs of implementation / system integration services. The costs are capitalised in the year in which the relevant software is implemented foruse. The same is amortised over a period of 3 years on straight-line method.

2.10 Leases

The Company evaluates if an arrangement qualifies to be a lease as per the requirements of Ind AS 116. Identification of a lease requires significant judgment. The Company uses significant judgment in assessing the lease term (including anticipated renewals) and the applicable discount rate. The Company determines the lease term as the non-cancellable period of a lease, together with both periods covered by an option to extend the lease if the company is reasonably certain to exercise that option; and periods covered by an option to terminate the lease if the Company is reasonably certain not to exercise that option. In assessing whether the Company is reasonably certain to exercise an option to extend a lease, or not to exercise an option to terminate a lease, it considers all relevant facts and circumstances that create an economic incentive for the Company to exercise the option to extend the lease, or not to exercise the option to terminate the lease. The Company revises the lease term if there is a change in the non-cancellable period of a lease. The discount rate is generally based on the incremental borrowing rate specific to the lease being evaluated or for a portfolio of leases with similar characteristics.

2.11 Revenue Recognition

- a) Domestic Sales are accounted for when dispatched from the point of sale, consequent to property in goods being transferred.
- b) Export Sales are accounted on the basis on the dates of Bill of Lading/Other delivering documents as per terms of contract.

(I) Sales

(i) The Company recognizes revenue from sale of goods when:

- (a) The significant risks and rewards of ownership in the goods are transferred to the buyer as per the terms of the contract, which coincides withthe delivery of goods.
- (b) The Company retains neither continuing managerial involvement to the degree usually associated with the ownership nor effective controlover the goods sold.
- (c) The amount of revenue can be reliably measured.
- (d) It is probable that future economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Company.
- (e) The cost incurred or to be incurred in respect of the transaction can be measured reliably.
- (f) The company bases its estimates on historical results, taking into consideration the type of customer, the type of transaction and the specificsof each arrangement.

(II) Other Income

(i) Interest Income

Interest income from debt instruments is recognised using the effective interest rate method. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the gross carrying amount of a financial asset. When calculating the effective interest rate, the group estimates the expected cash flows by considering all the contractual terms of the financial instrument (for example, prepayment, extension, call and similar options) but does not consider the expected credit losses.

(ii) Dividend Income

Dividends are recognised in profit or loss only when the right to receive payment is established, it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the dividend will flow to the group, and the amount of the dividend can be measured reliably.

(ii) Income from Indenting Services:

- (a) The amount of revenue can be measured reliably.
- (b) It is probable that future economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the Company.
- (c) The stage of completion of the transaction at the end of the reporting period can be measured reliably.
- (d) The cost incurred for transaction and the cost to complete the transaction can be measured reliably.

2.12 Employee Benefit

(i) Short-term obligations

Liabilities for wages and salaries, including non-monetary benefits that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service are recognised in respect of employees' services up to the end of the reporting period and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled. The liabilities are presented as current employee benefit obligations in the balance sheet.

(ii) Other long-term employee benefit obligations

There is no long term employee Benefit Obligation as the company had only 1 employee during the Previous Year and the same employee has been charged for committing fraud.

The obligations are presented as current liabilities in the balance sheet if the entity does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement for at least twelve months after the reporting period, regardless of when the actual settlement is expected to occur.

No Provision for Employee Benfit has been made as the Company had only 1 Employee and the same person had committed fraud during the year.

(iii) Defined Contribution plan:

Contribution payable to recognised provident fund and superannuation scheme which is defined contribution scheme is charged to Statement of Profit & Loss. The company has not paid the contribution towards provident fund, as the former employee has committed fraud against the company. Company has only one employee during the year.

(iv) The Company has one employee in the payroll of the company. Employee has committed fraud during the year against the company.

2.13 Foreign currency translation

(i) Functional and presentation currency

Items included in the financial statements of the Company are measured using the currency of the primary economic environment in which the Company operates ('the functional currency'). The financial statements are presented in Indian rupee (INR), which is Company's functional and presentation currency.

(ii) Transactions and balances

Foreign currency transactions are translated into the functional currency using the exchange rates at the dates of the transactions. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translation of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies at year end exchange rates are generally recognised in profit or loss. All the foreign exchange gains and losses are presented in the statement of Profit and Loss on a net basis within other expenses or other income as applicable.

2.14 Borrowing Cost

- (i) Borrowings are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred. Borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Any difference between the proceeds (net of transaction costs) and the redemption amount is recognised in profit or loss over the period of the borrowings using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities are recognised as transaction costs of the loan tothe extent that it is probable that some or all of the facility will be drawn down. In this case, the fee is deferred until the draw down occurs. To the extent there is no evidence that it is probable that some or all of the facility will be drawn down, the fee is capitalised as a prepayment for liquidity services and amortised over the period of the facility to which it relates.
- (ii) Borrowings are classified as current financial liabilities unless the group has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for atleast 12 months after the reporting period. Where there is a breach of a material provision of a long-term loan arrangement on or before the endof the reporting period with the effect that the liability becomes payable on demand on the reporting date, the entity does not classify theliability as current, if the lender agreed, after the reporting period and before the approval of the financial statements for issue, not to demand payment as a consequence of the breach.

2.15 Earnings per share

(i) Basic earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing

- the profit attributable to owners of the Company; and
- by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the financial year, adjusted for bonus elements in equity shares issued during the year (ii) Diluted earnings per share

Diluted earnings per share adjust the figures used in the determination of basic earnings per share to take into account:

- the after income tax effect of interest and other financing costs associated with dilutive potential equity shares; and
- the weighted average number of additional equity shares that would have been outstanding assuming the conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

2.16 Impairment of Assets

Intangible assets that have an indefinite useful life are not subject to amortization and are tested annually for impairment or more frequently if events or changes in circumstances indicate that they might be impaired. Other assets are tested for impairment whenever events or changes incircumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value inuse. For the purposes of assessing impairment, assets are grouped at the lowest levels for which there are separately identifiable cash inflows which are largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets (cash-generating units). Non-financial assets that suffered impairment are reviewed for possible reversal of the impairment at the end of each reporting period.

2.17 Provisions, contingent liabilities and contingent assets

(i) Provisions:

Provisions are recognised when the Company has a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of a past event, it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation. The expense relating to a provision is presented in the statement of profit and loss.

(ii) Contingent liabilities:

A contingent liability is a possible obligation that arises from past events whose existence will be confirmed by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events beyond the control of the Company or a present obligation that is not recognised because it is notprobable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation. A contingent liability also arises in extremely rare cases wherethere is a liability that cannot be recognised because it cannot be measured reliably. The Company does not recognise a contingent liability but discloses its existence in the financial statements.

(iii) Contingent Assets: Contingent Assets are disclosed, where an inflow of economic benefits is probable.

2.18 Investments

Equity investments are measured at fair value, with value changes recognised in Other Comprehensive Income, except for those mutual fund for which the Company has elected to present the fair value changes in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

2.19 Trade receivables

Trade receivables are recognised initially at their fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, lessprovision for impairment

2.20 Trade and other payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Company prior to the end of financial year which are unpaid. Trade andother payables are recognised, initially at fair value, and subsequently measured at amortised cost using effective interest rate method.

2.21 Operating Cycle

Based on the nature of products/activities of the Company and the normal time between acquisition of assets and their realisation in cash or cash equivalents, the Company has determined its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of classification of its assets and liabilities as current and non current.

2.22 Rounding of amounts

All amounts disclosed in the financial statements and notes have been rounded off to the nearest Rupees thousand (upto two decimals), unless otherwise stated as per the requirement of Schedule III (Division II).

The amount involved was Rs. 191.16 lakhs (which included Rs 22.48 lakhs for Financial Year 2020-21, Rs 67.77 Lakhs for Financial Year 2021-22, Rs 79.22 Lakhs for Financial Year 2022-23 and Rs 21.68 lakhs for Financial Year 2023-24) which was expensed out during the previous financial year ended 31st March 2023 itself. A FIR was lodged and investigation is in process. Previous year figures relating to Financial Year 2020-21 and Financial Year 2021-22 were not restated and provision for the fraud amount committed in Financial Year 2023-24 was also provided in the previous financial year ended 31st March 2023 itself, as a matter of prudence. The previous year profit is understated by Rs 111.93 Lakhs due to non-restatement and due to provision for fraud amount relating to Financial Year 2023-24. The current year profit is over restated by Rs 21.68 Lakhs as the amount was provided in the previous Financial Year. The Audit Report for the previous year was qualified due to the same. However, the closing equity for the Financial Year ending 31st March 2024 is after giving effect of all the above.
