

No record of DDR against Jind school principal: SHO

HISAR, DECEMBER 23 After Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala allegations that the accused principal involved in the sexual harassment case of a Jind school was involved in similar incidents earlier also, the Uchana police in Jind district has not been able to find any daily diary report (DDR) of the incidents that allegedly took place in 2005 and 2012. The principal is in jail in connection with the sexual harassment of several girls students.

Deputy CM Dushyant Chautala during the previous Assembly session had accused Congress MLA Geeta Bhukkal, who was the Education Minister in 2012, of 'protecting' the accused principal. Bhukkal denied the allegations after which an in-House panel was assigned the inquiry into the allegations.

When contacted by The Tribune today, Uchana SHO Balwan Singh said they had not got any record of DDR regarding any alleged incident that occurred in 2012. Sources said the Uchana police had searched its records to trace any DDR about the incident which allegedly occurred in 2012.

Former sarpanch of the village where the principal was posted before 2013, Sudesh Rani, had told The Tribune that she along with a group of villagers had met Bhukkal to demand the transfer of the accused. Rani had confirmed that the accused had faced allegations of sexual assault. She denied registering of any FIR.

School heads to be sensitised on child protection

ROHTAK, DECEMBER 23

The Department of Education has come up with a special training programme for heads of government school, Assistant Block Resource Coordinators (ABRCs) and Block Resource Persons (BRPs) across the state in connection with the Child Protection Act. The programme will be organised in collaboration with the Women and Child Development (WCD) Department.

The move comes days after sexual harassment cases were reported in Jind and Kaithal schools.

Under the first phase, the ABRCs/BRPs will be imparted training for two days at the District Institute of Education and Training (DIET) concerned, while the day-long programme for principals/heads of government school would be organised at the block level under the second phase.

The DIET faculty and WCD officials will first train the ABRCs and BRPs, who will later carry out the programme at the block level. The presence of Block Education Officers will be mandatory during the training of school heads.

"This is for the first time that the school heads, ABRCs/ BRPs will be imparted special training regarding the Child Protection Act. Usually, selective teachers from all schools are called to the DIET con-

cerned once during an academic session for a sensitisation programme on child protection," said an official of the Education Department on anonymity.

He said during the training, the participants would be made aware about the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) Act and the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act (POCSO), and special steps to be taken to check such incidents in schools.

A school head said 1,493 ABRCs/BRPs would be trained from December 26 to 29 and the training programme for school heads would be organised from January 1 to 6 in different batches. "The Director (Women and Child Development) has been urged to provide master trainers for the purpose," he added.

Only vehicles with GPS to ferry minor minerals: National Green Tribunal

Directions issued during hearing on illegal mining in Aravalli region on December 11

CHANDIGARH, DECEMBER 23

The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has ruled that all vehicles carrying minor minerals for supplying to stone crushers/screening plants in Faridabad, Gurugram, and Nuh districts are required to be equipped with Global Positioning System (GPS), latest by February 28.

In its order dated December 11, it added, "The route of the vehicle from source to destination be tracked through the system using checkpoints, radio-frequency identification (RFID) tags and Global Positioning System tracking. The requisite facilities be provided, systems be installed and control room/monitoring station be set up for this purpose accordingly."

The directions came during a hearing on illegal mining in the Aravalli region of Haryana. In response to an earlier query of the tribunal on vehicles carrying minor minerals fitted with GPS in the Aravalli, the Director of Mines and Geology had replied on August 12 that no stone crusher/screening plant existed in the Aravalli region. However, the NGT commented that by taking advantage of the fact that the tribunal didn't specify the names of three districts in the query, no information on such vehicles was provided.

Applicable to F'bad, G'gram & Nuh districts



It pointed out that the Enforcement and Monitoring Guidelines for Sand Mining, 2020, provided GPS equipment should be installed in all sand-carrying vehicles. Taking on the Haryana State Pollution Control Board (HSPCB), the NGT said, "In the Interim Report (filed by HSPCB)

there is no mention as to the initiation of proceedings for imposition of and realisation of environmental damage compensation from all persons involved in illegal mining throughout the State of Haryana, including Aravalli."

It said environmental compensation "do not originate from and are not dependent on criminal proceedings". "There is no valid justification for not initiating the same," it said, directing HSPCB to prepare an SOP for the same and issue directions within two months.

The tribunal found that the helpline, started by the mines department, to report illegal mining complaints was functional, but the email id of the control room did not work. The web portal for uploading photographs and videos with complaints was also in the process of development. "No report has been filed regarding progress

Agriculture Minister apologises for his remarks on farm activists

Agriculture Minister Jai Prakash Dalal today tendered an apology over his remarks on farm activists, while stating that he was also from a farmer's family and could not think bad about the community.

Interacting with the mediapersons on the occasion of Kisan Divas in the Chaudhary Charan Singh Haryana Agriculture University here today, Dalal stated, "I belong to a farmer's family and am a son of a farmer. ...if someone is feeling hurt, I profusely apologise and am ready to apologise again and again," he stated.

Dalal had landed in a row when he made a controversial statement against farm activists during a function in Bhiwani on November 26. Dalal had remarked that had stated that some of the farm activists who resorted to agitation to repeal three agriculture laws in 2020-21 had faced criminal charges and had indulged in immoral acts. The minister also targeted women family members of these farm activists, stating that even their daughters and wives had eloped with someone. Furthermore, he had remarked that even the wives of these farm leaders don't

listen to them and they claim to speak for the entire farmers' community.

After his remarks, the farmers' bodies, led by the Samyukta Kisan Morcha and the Sheoran Khap (Chaurasi), organised a panchayat at Gignau village in Bhiwani district on December 9 and announced social boycott of the minister. The khap panchayat also imposed a symbolic fine of one 'dhela' on the minister and announced that the farmers and khap panchayat would stage protests if the Agriculture Minister visited any village to organise a political event.

While addressing farmers on the occasion, Dalal said that farmers need to leverage cutting-edge technologies while enhancing the

quality of their products to secure better prices and boost demand in the international market.

Elaborating on agricultural schemes implemented by the state government, he said that the agriculture budget had been increased from Rs 800 crore to Rs 3,900 crore.

He added that the budgets for canals, fisheries, electricity and tubewell connections had been augmented. Haryana stood as the only state purchasing 14 crops at Minimum Support Price (MSP), he said and added that the government had disbursed Rs 9,000 crore among farmers under the crop insurance scheme, while the crop insurance companies had collected only Rs 1,973 crore from the farmers, he claimed.
