The Claim had been allowed by SCDRC vide its order dated June 02, 2017. The Insurance Co. has filed appeal before National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission ("NCDRC") against the order of SCDRC. The appeal was dismissed by NCDRC ride order dated February 06, 2024. The nsurance Co. has filed a writ petition in the don'ble High Court seeking stay on the order of NCDRC. The High Court has granted the stay on he operation of order of NCDRC.	If the Hon'ble High Court will decide against the Company, then the Company will lose the claim of Rs. 65,00,000/- alongwith 9% interest per annum with effect from 22.09.2015 awarded by SCDRC and NCDRC.
