- 1. - 22.  - i. The voting period begins on Friday, September 27, 2024 at 9.00 A.M. (IST) and ends on Sunday, September 29, 2024 at 5.00 P.M. (IST). During this period shareholders of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form, as on the cut-off date (record date) of Monday, the September 23, 2024 may cast their vote electronically. The e-voting module shall be disabled by CDSL for voting thereafter.
 - ii. Shareholders who have already voted prior to the meeting date would not be entitled to vote at the meeting venue.
 - iii. Pursuant to SEBI Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2020/242 dated 09.12.2020, under Regulation 44 of Securities and Exchange Board of India

(Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, listed entities are required to provide remote e-voting facility to its shareholders, in respect of all shareholders' resolutions. However, it has been observed that the participation by the public non-institutional shareholders/retail shareholders is at a negligible level.

Secretarial Auditor's Comment:

1. Except for general delays ranging upto 121 days, the Company has prima facie been regular in submitting the documents as stipulated under the Companies Act, 2013;

Board's Reply:

Your Directors would like to state that they are making their best efforts in filing its statutory returns within the prescribed time. However, due to technical difficulties in getting the digital signatures registered on the website of MCA, the Company has submitted e-Form MGT-7 (Annual Return of the Company) after the due date. Your Directors would like to assure you that they shall take steps to ensure that the returns are filed well within the prescribed time.

Secretarial Auditor's Comment:

2. The Company has not updated its website with regard to various matters which are statutorily required to be placed on the website of the Company.

Board's Reply:

Your Directors would like to state that the Company has provided all the data to the external technical supporter for the web applications and is expecting the same to be updated shortly. As informed by the web supporter,

the website has been majorly updated and only a portion is pending to be updated and will be done shortly.

Secretarial Auditor's Comment:

3. As informed by the management, the Company has installed and maintained the structured digital database as contemplated under Regulation 3(5) & 3(6) of the SEBI (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015 with effect from January, 2024. Further, we have verified for the specific compliance of the said software for the period between January 1, 2024 to March 15, 2024 and found that the required UPSI was getting captured in the database. to be captured in the database during the period between March 16, 2024 to March 31, 2024.

- 4. The Company has delayed in submitting the Quarterly Confirmation Certificate for the quarter ended September 30, 2023 received from the Registrar and Share Transfer Agent in respect of the compliance of Regulation 74(5) to the Stock Exchange.
- 5. During the financial year 2022-23, the Company has received an email from the Bombay Stock Exchange Limited (BSE) consolidating the various outstanding penalties levied on the Company since the quarter ended March 31, 2014 amounting to Rs.1513227/- (including GST amount of Rs.230831/-). MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

Global Outlook

The World Economic Outlook Report of April 2024 from IMF describes the Global Economic situation as "Steady but Slow". It says as global inflation has descended from its mid-2022 peak, economic activity has grown steadily. Growth in employment and incomes have held steady, resulting in increased consumption demand. The unexpected growth in consumption is a residual effect of the substantial savings accumulated by households during the pandemic.

Global growth, estimated at 3.2 percent in 2023, is projected to continue at the same pace in 2024 and 2025. Global headline inflation is expected to fall from an annual average of 6.8 percent in 2023 to 5.9 percent in 2024 and 4.5 percent in 2025.

Oil prices have remained volatile having risen to near the \$90 per barrel-mark, with supply worries high given the escalating Middle East tensions between Iran and Israel and back-to-back attacks on energy infrastructure between Ukraine and Russia. The price has since corrected but remains above USD 80-85.

Having said the aforesaid, the global supply is being constrained by producers to even with supply.

Economic situation:

India: India continues to shine as a bright spot. It is the fifth-largest economy in the world and is poised to retain its position as the world's fastest-growing major economy. Its GDP growth remained buoyant at 7.3% in FY 2023-24 as against 7.2% in FY 2022-23 was supported by robust domestic demand, moderate inflation, a stable interest rate environment, and strong foreign exchange reserves. The International Monetary Fund (IMF) commended India's economic resilience, robust growth, and notable progress in formalization and digital infrastructure.

India's economic outlook is optimistic as it reaps the benefits of demographic dividend, physical and digital infrastructure enhancements, increased capital

expenditure and the government's proactive policy measures such as Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Schemes. According to the IMF, the Indian economy is expected to expand steadily at 6.5% in 2024.

Industry Structure and Developments

The Non-Banking Financial Companies (NBFCs) in India have been pivotal in bridging the credit gap for various segments of the economy, notably the Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) and the under banked populations. The transformative shift in India's financial services landscape over recent years, driven by digital innovations such as neo-banking, digital authentication, the proliferation of the Unified Payments Interface (UPI), and increased mobile internet usage, has redefined the dynamics of financial services, especially credit. The modularization of financial services facilitated by these advancements has empowered NBFCs to offer specialized and accessible financial products.

Between FY 2023 and FY 2025, the NBFC sector is expected to witness a Compound Annual Growth Rate (CAGR) of 13–15% in credit extension. This growth is a testament to the sector's resilience and reflects its crucial role in supporting India's economic development by enhancing formal credit penetration among underserved populations.

Opportunities and Threats

India has emerged as one of the fastest growing economies in the globe and has generated a lot of interest among foreign investors both financial and strategic. Global players see India as the future economic powerhouse and they are making huge investments in different business within the country. Buoyant market conditions and sustained economic growth over the past few years coupled with a very positive outlook in the coming years give the business of our Company.

Segment Wise / Product Wise Performance

The Company operates in single business segment i.e. NBFC, it has witnessed considerable growth in the last few years and is now being recognized as complementary to the banking sector due to implementation of innovative marketing strategies, introduction of tailor made products, customer-oriented services and simplified procedures, etc.

Your Company is engaged only in lending and investment activities and no other business activities. Hence, the requirement of segment-wise reporting is just for one segment.

Business Outlook

The Company is mainly engaged in the business of financing and investment in bodies corporate in order to yield greater revenue for its stakeholders. The Management of the Company is looking for a steady growth of the Company and aims at maximizing the shareholders wealth by way of earning maximum profits at low investment costs.

Risks and areas of concern

Managing risk is fundamental to financial services industry and it is key to ensure sustained profitability and stability. In a rapidly changing economic, geo-politics,

regulatory and financial environment, your Company has continued to leverage on its strong risk management capabilities.

The Company continuously evaluates its lending activities to ensure that the same meets the objective of ensuring maximization of value to all its stakeholders in a prudent manner. The Company expects to make full use of the growth opportunities available to it however, the challenge remains on being able to leverage these initiatives to carve out a space in the competitive industry, within the regulatory and compliance framework.

Any change in the interest rate in the market will have impact on the profit of the company. The Company has a defined credit policy duly approved and reviewed by the Management from time to time. The credit policy is strictly implemented and the debtors are regularly monitored. However any default or downgrade of credit worthiness of customers may affect profitability. The Company strives to comply with all the statutory laws of the Country. But the same law may be misused by opposite party especially the defaulters. It may happen in financial business that some people may get loan from the financiers with no intention to repay.

Internal Control Systems and Adequacy

The Company has satisfactory internal control system. The adequacy of the internal control system is reviewed by the Audit Committee of the Board of Directors. Your Company has taken proper and sufficient care for the maintenance of adequate accounting records as required by various Statutes. NOTES TO ACCOUNTS

Notes on Financial Statements for the year ended 31-MARCH 2024

1. CORPORATE INFORMATION

Mansi Finance Chennai Limited (the Company) is a public Company and incorporated under the provisions of the Companies Act,1956. Its shares are listed in the Bombay Stock Exchange in India. The Compnay is registered as a Non-Banking Finance Compnay (NBFC) with Reserve Bank of India. The Company is presently classified as Non-Deposit taking and non systematically importat NBFC and is primarily engaged in the business of financing of commercial loans.

2. BASIS OF PREPARATION

- a. The Financial statement of the Company have been prepared to comply with the Indian Accounting Standards (Inds AS), including the rules notified under the relevant provisions of the Companies act, 2013
- b. These Financial statements of the Company are presented as per Schedule III (Division III) of the Companies Act, 2013 applicable to NBFCs, as notified by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA). In addition, the directions of Reserve Bank of India, the Guidance Notes and announcements issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India are also applied, except where the compliance with other statutory provisions required different treatement.
 - These Financial Statements of the Company are presented in Indian Rupees (INR) in Lakh, which is also the Company's functional currency.
 - The Company presents its Balance sheet in the order of liquidty.
- c. The Financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis except for certain financial instruments that are measured at fair values at the end of each reporting period.
- d. The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, as the management is satisfied that the Company shall be able continue

its business for the foreseeable future and no material uncertainty exists that may cast significant doubt on the going concern assumption. The Company uses accrual basis of accounting except in case of significant uncertainties.

3. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

3.1 REVENUE RECOGNITION

Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Interst Income

Interest Income is recognised by applying effective interest rate to the gross carrying amount of financial assets other than credit impaired assests, taking into account principal outstanding and the applicable interest rate. Interest income is recognised on non performing assets at net of expected credit loss.

Delayed payment interest levied on customers for delay in repayment/ non payment of contractual cashflows is recognised on realisation.

Dividend Income

Dividend income is recognised when the Company's right to receive dividend is established by the reporting date and no singnificant uncertainty as to collectability exists.

Recovery of financial assets

The Company recognises income on recoveries of financial assets written off on realisation or when the right to receive the same without any uncertainties of recovery is established.

3.2 Property, Plant & Equipement

Property, plant and equipement are stated in the balance sheet at cost (net of duty/tax credit if any availed) less accumulated depreciation and

accumulated impairment losses. Cost of acquisition is inclusive of freight, non refundable duties & taxes and other directly attributable cost of bringing the asset to its working condition for the intended use.

Depreciation on Fixed Assets is provided on written down value method based on useful life of the assets as prescibed in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

In case addition/deletion of property, Plat & equipement, depreciation has been provided on a pro rata basis from the date of such addition or, as case may be , upto the date of deletion of such asset.

3.3 Investment property

Properties held to earn rental income or for capital appreciation or both and that is not occupied by the Company is classified as Investment property. Investment property is measured and reported at cost, including transaction costs.

Depreciation is not charged on the investment property building.

An Investment property is derecognised upon disposal or when the investment property is permanently withdrawn from use and no future benefits are expected from the disposal. Any gain or loss arising on derecognision of property is recognised in the Statement of profit & loss in the same period.

3.4 Financial Instruments

i) Financial Assets

Financial assets include cash, or an equity instrument of another entity, or a contractual right to receive cash or another financial asset from another entity. Few examples of financial assets are loan receivables, investment in equity and debt instruments, trade receivables and cash and cash equivalents.

Initial Measurement

All financial assets are recognised initially at fair value including transaction costs that are attributable to the acquisition of financial assets except in the case of financial assets recorded at FVTPL where the transaction costs are charged to profit or loss.

Subsequent Measurement

a) Financial assets carried at amortised cost (AC)

A financial asset is measured at amortised cost if it is held within a business model whose objective is to hold the asset in order to collect contractual cash flows and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

b) Financial assets at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI)

A financial asset is measured at FVTOCI if it is held within a business model whose objective is achieved by both collecting contractual cash flows and selling financial assets and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

c) Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL)

A financial asset which is not classified in any of the above categories are measured at FVTPL.

ii Financial Liabilities

a) Initial recognition and measurement

All financial liabilities are recognized at fair value and in case of loans, net of directly attributable cost.

b) Subsequent Measurement

Financial liabilities are carried at amortized cost using the effective interest method. For trade and other payables maturing within one year from the balance sheet date, the carrying amounts approximate fair value due to the short maturity of these instruments.

iii Derecognition of financial instruments

The Company derecognizes a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire or it transfers the financial asset and the transfer qualifies for derecognition under Ind AS 109. A financial liability (or a part of a financial liability) is derecognized from the Company's Balance Sheet when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged or cancelled or expires.

3.5 Cash & cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, Cheques/Drafts on hand, balances in current accounts with banks, other short tem, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

3.6 TAXATION

Current Tax is the amount of tax payable on the taxable income for the year and determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act,1961.

Deferred tax is recognised on temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities in the financial statements and the corresponding tax bases used in the computation of taxable profit.

Deferred tax liabilities and assets are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the liability is settled or

the asset realised, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

3.7 IMPAIRMENT OF NON FINANCIAL ASSETS

An assessment is done at each Balance Sheet date to ascertain whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, as estimate of the recoverable amount of asset is determined, If the carrying value of relevant asset is higher than the recoverable amount, the carrying value is written down accordingly.

3.8 Provisions, contingent Liabilities & contingent Assets.

Provisions are recognised only when the Company has present, legal, or constructive obligations as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefit will be required to settle the transactions and a reliable estimate can be made for the amount of the obligation.

Contingent laibility is disclosed for (1) possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of Company or (2) present obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

Contingent assets are not recognised in the financial statements since this may result in the recognition of income that may never be realised

3.9 Foreign Currency transaction

The Company's financial statements are presented in Indian Rupee, which is also the Company's functional currency.

During the year Company has not carried out any foreign currency transactions.

3.10 Employee Benefits Expense

Short Term Employee Benefits

The undiscounted amount of short term employee benefits expected to be paid in exchange for the services rendered by employees are recognised as an expense during the period when the employees render the services.

Post Employment Benefits

Gratuity shall be provided on the basis of payment and no provision has been made for the same on accrual basis.

3.11 Earnings per share

Basic EPS is computed using weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the period. Diluted EPS is computed using weighted average number of equity and dilutive equity equivalent shares outstanding during the period except where the results would be anti-dilutive.

3.12 Fair Value

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

A number of the Company's accounting policies and disclosures require the measurement of fair values, for both financial and non-financial assets and liabilities.

Fair value measurements are categorised into Level 1,2 or 3 based on the degree to which the inputs to the fair value measurements are observable and the significance of the inputs to the fair value measurement in its entirety, which are described as follows:

- (i) Level 1 inputs are quoted prices unadjusted in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the entity can access at the measurement date.
- (ii) Level 2 inputs are inputs, other than quoted prices included within Level 1, that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly and
- (iii) Level 3 inputs are unobservable inputs for the asset or liability.

3.13 Foreign currency transactions

"The Company's financial statements are presented in Indian Rupee, which is also the Company's functional currency."

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amount the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

All exchange differences are accounted in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

During the year, there are no foreign currency transactions.
