# UN-backed rights experts seek wider arms embargo and 'impartial force' deployed to war-torn Sudan

**GENEVA, SEPT 6** -- UN-backed human rights investigators on Friday urged the creation of an "independent and impartial force" to protect civilians in Sudan's war, blaming both sides for war crimes including murder, mutilation and torture and

warning that foreign governments which arm and finance them could be complicit.

The fact-finding team, in their first report since being created by the UN's main human rights body last October, also accused the paramilitary Rapid Support Forces, which are fighting Sudan's army, and its allies of crimes against humanity including rape, sexual slavery and persecution on ethnic or gender grounds. "The people of Sudan have suf-

fered greatly, and the violations against them must stop. This cannot be done without ending the fighting," Mohamed Chande Othman, the chair of the team, told a news conference.

The experts called for the expansion of an arms embargo on Sudan's long-restive western Darfur region to the entire country. The findings from the team mandated by the 47-country Human Rights Council come as more than 10 million people have been driven from their homes including over 2 million to neighbouring countries and famine has broken out in one large camp for displaced people in Darfur.

"Given the failure of the parties to protect civilians so far, the fact-finding mission recommends the deployment of an independent and impartial force with a mandate to protect civilians in Sudan," the team's report said.

The conflict that erupted in April last year has killed untold thousands of people, and humanitarian groups are struggling to gain access to people in need. In December,

the UN Security Council voted to end the world body's political mission in the country under pressure from the military leadership. While the killings, displacements and forced starvation have been long known, the call for creation of an independent force marks the latest sign of desperation from rights advocates both within the country and abroad to halt the bloodshed, displacement and food crisis.

"The fact-finding mission considers that fighting will stop once the arms flow stops," the report said.

It called for an immediate end to funneling weapons, ammunition and other support to any side, "as there is a risk that those supplying arms may be complicit in grave violations of human rights and humanitarian law". The experts focused on a period from January and August this year. They visited three neighbouring countries and took testimonies from over 180 survivors, relatives and witnesses to the conflict that now has spread to 14 of Sudan's 18 states.

Joy Ngozi Ezeilo, a team member, said conflict-related sexual violence had a "long and tragic history" in Sudan, and civilians overwhelmingly women and girls "were, and continue to be, targeted with sexual violence in particular rape (and) gang-rape by both parties to the conflict.

## Fire in school in Kenya kills 17 students and seriously burns 13 others

**NAIROBI, SEPT 6** -- A fire in a school dormitory in Kenya killed 17 students and seriously burned 13 others, police said on Friday. There are fears that the death toll may rise, police said. The cause of the fire Thursday night at Hillside Endarasha Primary in

Nyeri county was being investigated, police spokesman Resila Onyango said. The school caters to children up to the age of 14. Nyeri County Commissioner Pius Murugu and the Education Ministry reported that the dormitory that caught fire housed more than 150 boys. Since

most of the buildings are built with wood planks, the fire spread very fast. The school, which has 824 students, is located in the country's central highlands, 200 kilometers (125 miles) north of the capital, Nairobi, where wooden structures are common. Anxious parents who had been unable to trace their children among survivors waited at the school, engulfed with grief. President William Ruto called the news "devastating". "I instruct relevant authorities to thoroughly investigate this horrific incident. Those responsible will be held to account," he wrote on the social media platform X. His deputy, Rigathi Gachagua, urged school administrators to ensure that safety guidelines recommended by the Education Ministry for boarding schools are being followed. School fires are common in Kenyan boarding schools, often due to arson fuelled by drug abuse and overcrowding, according to a recent Education Ministry report. (AP)

## 1st court appearance set for Georgia teen accused of killing 4 at his high school

**WINDER, SEPT 6** -- The 14-year-old boy accused of fatally shooting four people at a Georgia high school was expected to make his first court appearance Friday, a day after his father was also arrested for allowing his son to possess a weapon.

Colt Gray, who is charged as an adult with four counts of murder, will appear by video from a youth detention facility for the proceedings at the Barrow County courthouse.

The hearing will be held two days after authorities said the teen opened fire at Apalachee High School in Winder, just outside Atlanta.

The teen's father, Colin Gray, 54, was charged Thursday with four counts of involuntary manslaughter, two counts of second-degree murder and eight counts of cruelty to children, Georgia Bureau of Investigation Director Chris Hosey.

"His charges are directly connected with the actions of his son and allowing him to possess a weapon," Hosey said. Colin Gray's first court appearance has not been set. Father and son have been charged in the deaths of students Mason Schermerhorn and Christian Angulo, both 14, and teachers Richard Aspinwall, 39, and Cristina Irimie, 53, according to Hosey.

"His charges are directly connected with the actions of his son and allowing him to possess a weapon," Hosey said. Colin Gray's first court appearance has not been set. Father and son have been charged in the deaths of students Mason Schermerhorn and Christian Angulo, both 14, and teachers Richard Aspinwall, 39, and Cristina Irimie, 53, according to Hosey.

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Nine other people were injured, seven of them shot.

It's the latest example of prosecutors holding parents responsible for their children's actions in school shootings. In April, Michigan parents Jennifer and James Crumbley were the first convicted in a US mass school shooting. They were sentenced to at least 10 years in prison for not securing a firearm at home and acting indifferently to signs of their son's deteriorating mental health before he killed four students in 2021. Arrest warrants obtained by the AP accuse Colt Gray of using a semi-automatic assault-style rifle in the attack. Authorities have not offered any motive or explained how he obtained the gun and got it into the school. The teen denied threatening to carry out a school shooting when authorities interviewed him last year about a menacing post on social media, according to a sheriff's report obtained Thursday.

Conflicting evidence on

the post's origin left investigators unable to arrest anyone, the report said. Jackson County Sheriff Janis Mangum said she reviewed the report from May 2023 and found nothing that would have justified bringing charges at the time. The attack was the latest among dozens of school shootings across the US in recent years, including especially deadly ones in Newtown, Connecticut; Parkland, Florida; and Uvalde, Texas. The classroom killings have set off fervent debates about gun control but there has been little change to national gun laws. It was the 30th mass killing in the US so far this year, according to a database maintained by The Associated Press and USA Today in partnership with Northeastern University. At least 127 people have died in those killings, which are defined as events in which four or more people die within a 24-hour period, not including the killer the same definition used by the FBI.
