MADHYA PRADESH TO COME UP WITH MSME POLICY SOON; START-UP, CBG PLANS ALSO ON ANVIL

As Madhya Pradesh government gears up to forthcoming next session of Global Investors Summit on February 24 and February 25, its new MSME policy for 2025 is likely to debut on Tuesday. The State Cabinet meeting during its meeting on February 18 will delve into the intricacies of this policy. According to well-placed government sources, various departments are putting their two cents in, revising the provisions that make things easier for micro, small, and medium enterprises. Among the highlights is the allocation of parcels of land to private investors...



In 2023 talks of various facilities yet provisions of allotment of land are yet needed to be improvised and overhauled. Similarly the Start-up policy was launched in 2022 (amended in 2024). The compressed biogas policy for investors will be a new policy. The new policy will divert the powers of the general manager of the district trade and industry center to a committee comprising the MSME commissioner, deputy or additional secretary of the MSME department, and the general manager of the district trade and industry center. Yet, the state retains the exclusive right to approve or deny any request for more than one parcel of land, the sources said. Meanwhile, the State Cabinet will also mull over a start-up policy for fledgling entrepreneurs, alongside a policy for Compressed Biogas Plants in the forthcoming meeting. This start-up policy aims to create an ecosystem that nurtures and facilitates budding entrepreneurs, ensuring they have a plug-and-play environment to kickstart their ventures, said the sources.

Four-day water sports event for security forces begins in Bhopal
Bhopal: The 24th edition of the water sports competition for police and other security forces was inaugurated by Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav at Upper Lake here on Monday. Chief Minister Yadav, accompanied by the Director General of Police (DGP), lit the ceremonial lamp, took the guard of honor, and interacted with players during the inaugural session at the boat club. In his address, Chief Minister Yadav praised the police and security personnel for making the country proud by winning medals at national and international competitions. 'Your dedication to sports, alongside your national service, serves as a source of inspiration for the youth of the country. My best wishes to each player and team participating in this event,' he said. The four-day event, organised by the All India Sports Control Board (AISCB) in the city of lakes, will feature competitions for more than 300 medals. A total of 557 participants from 22 states, union territories, and Central Armed Police Forces are taking part in the competition, including 123 women players. Chief Minister Yadav also extended a warm welcome to all teams from across the country who have come to participate in the water sports event in Bhopal. 'Madhya Pradesh has previously organised five editions of this event, and I hope the fifth edition will be a great success,' he said. During the five-day competition, 27 events in canoeing, kayaking, and rowing will be held. A total of 360 medals will be awarded - 60 gold, 60 silver, and 60 bronze in both men's and women's categories. Notably, this is the 6th time Bhopal has hosted the water sports competition. Madhya Pradesh previously hosted the event in 2005, 2007, 2013, 2017, and 2019. Water sports were included in the police games by the All India Police Sports Control Board in 2002, where the Madhya Pradesh Police delivered an outstanding performance, winning 12 gold, 3 silver, and 6 bronze medals.

Couple dies in Shahdol as 'illegal' coal mine caves in

Bhopal: In a tragic accident in Dhanganva village of Budhar Police station area in Madhya Pradesh's Shahdol district, a labourer couple lost their lives when an 'illegal coal mine' caved in. The incident occurred on the banks of the Son River on Sunday evening. However, the police have dismissed the claims of it being an illegal coal mine. Sanjay Jaiswal, the Budhar police station in-charge, clarified over the phone with IANS that the terrain is rich with coal, and villagers often extract it themselves. He emphasised that it wasn't a mine per se, but rather an approximately ten-foot-deep pit at the river bank that caved in while the couple was extracting coal from it, entrapping them in the debris. Other people were present, but they fled when they couldn't rescue the couple, the official said. Villagers noticed the trapped individuals and informed the police. The victims have been identified as Onkar Yadav and Parvati Yadav, and their bodies were sent for post-mortem at the government hospital in Budhar, Shahdol district. State Congress unit President Jitu Patwari criticised the government on social media through his X handle accusing them of emboldening the mafia through inaction. He tweeted in Hindi about the incident, expressing his outrage. The deceased couple is survived by five young children, as reports suggest, that more labourers might be trapped in the debris, with allegations that mine owners attempted to suppress the incident. The reports also said when villagers raised an uproar, the incident came to light, prompting the Collector and Superintendent of Police to reach the scene. Both bodies were retrieved with the aid of an earthmoving machine, working late into the night. However, police sources assured reporter that no other persons are trapped, and a proper investigation is underway.

Three Kumbh pilgrims die, five injured in Sidhi as vehicle falls into gorge

Three persons died and five others were injured when a vehicle carrying them plunged into a 40-foot abyss on Kaimar hills locally known as Mouda Pahad in Amilla Police station area of Sidhi district, Madhya Pradesh. Initial reports varied, with some sources stating four fatalities, though the police confirmed three. The ill-fated passengers, all friends from different villages within Sidhi district, shared the vehicle. Amilla Police Station in-charge Rajesh Pandey told IANS on telephone that two persons died on the spot. The deceased, according to him, have been identified as Pramod Yadav, Sonu Sahu, and Ramakant Sahu. The injured, Neeraj Vaish, Krishna Vaish, Pradeep Sahu, Sajeet Yadav, and Krishna Sahu, were all between 22 and 30 years old. Pradeep Sahu was at the wheel. It appears that in an attempt to maneuver around another vehicle,

the driver lost control, sending their vehicle tumbling into the deep gorge of the Kaimar hills. A vigilant tractor driver who was passing by alerted the police. 'Within half an hour, we reached the spot and rescued them. Tragically, two of the pilgrims died on the spot, while another succumbed to injuries in the hospital,' the police officer said. The outcome could have been far worse had the vehicle not become entangled in trees, halting its descent at around 12 feet, other sources said. The injured were initially treated at Amilla Hospital before being transferred to Sidhi District Hospital. Sources indicated that most of the injured had sustained fractures and were subsequently referred to Sanjay Gandhi Hospital in Bina. Meanwhile, the roads from Madhya Pradesh to Prayagraj remain congested due to the ongoing Kumbh Mela, contributing to the challenges faced by travellers and emergency responders alike.

JUDICIAL CUSTODY OF EX-RTO CONSTABLE SAURABH SHARMA, TWO AIDES EXTENDED TILL MAR 3

A district court here on Monday extended the judicial custody of former RTO constable Saurabh Sharma and his two aides Chetan Gaur and Sharad Jaiswal by 14 days. They were produced in court after the 6-day custody of the Enforcement Directorate (ED) expired on Monday. Now, the trio will be under judicial remand till March 3, 2025. Sharma and his associates, who are facing charges of corruption, were sent to ED's custody for questioning in a disproportionate assets case on February 12. They were arrested by Madhya Pradesh Lokayukta Police on January 28 and 29 in connection with the properties worth several crores recovered during raids at their premises. Subsequently, the ED, which is carrying out a parallel investigation under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), took them into custody for interrogation. ED conducted its first raids on December 27 last year and searched at least eight premises across the state covering Bhopal, Gwalior, and Jabalpur.

The searches covered the residential premises of Saurabh Sharma, Chetan Singh Gaur, Sharad Jaiswal, and others. According to ED's earlier statements, during the searches, movable assets in the form of fixed deposits (FDs) of more than Rs 6 crore were identified in the name of Chetan Singh Gaur, and bank balance of more than Rs 4 crore was found in the name of family members

and companies of Saurabh Sharma. The ED had recovered documents pertaining to immovable assets, and properties worth over Rs 23 crore in the name of various companies and family members of Saurabh Sharma. On January 17, the ED again conducted raids across several places including Pune, Gwalior and Bhopal and found cash and valuables worth Rs 52 lakh, while the Income Tax (IT) department, which has recovered more than 22 kg gold and cash amount of Rs 11 crore from an abandoned car belonging to Chetan Gaur, was yet to move an application in the court to get permission for interrogation.



CM unveils former PM Vajpayee's statue in Morena

Bhopal: Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav said on Monday that former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee's dream of river interlinking project has given new hope for the development of the state. The Chief Minister made this statement while unveiling a statue of the former Prime Minister Vajpayee in Morena. He said that former PM Vajpayee devoted his entire life to the service of the country. State BJP President V.D. Sharma and Madhya Pradesh Assembly Speaker Narendra Singh Tomar, who belongs to Morena, were also present on this occasion.

VULTURE TALLY BEGINS IN MADHYA PRADESH

The rocky areas of high altitude in Madhya Pradesh will play host from Monday to an avian census like no other — a roll call of the vultures. The three-day census protocol for this grand counting of the feathered creatures includes visual surveys to catch the keen eye, carcass monitoring to gauge their appetite, and nest counts to peek into their homes. These methods are dove-tailed together to estimate the state's vulture population, the guardians of the skies who once teetered on the brink of extinction. At present, the Panna National Park boasts a fair number of vultures and shines with over a thousand vultures, a species reborn from near oblivion. Forest department sources said this counting will now be a bi-annual affair and next will begin on April 29. The counting will commence amidst the rocky highlands, recording only the vultures in test-ment.

According to the forest department, Madhya Pradesh is home to about 10,000 vultures of various species. Among them, the largest congregation of these magnificent birds resides in Panna National Park, a sanctuary also famed for its tigers. The vultures, once imperilled by the deadly diclofenac, a drug found in the carcasses of treated livestock, faced a dramatic decline. By the mid-1990s, their numbers plummeted from a staggering 50 million to near extinction due to this fatal non-steroidal painkiller.

'Disabled' Government Official Seen Dancing At Party In Madhya Pradesh, Probe Initiated

A students' organisation in Madhya Pradesh on Friday demanded an inquiry after a woman, recently selected in the government service in the disabled quota, was seen dancing in a viral social media video. The woman, however, denied that there was any irregularity in her appointment, claiming that she suffers from 45 percent disability due to bone-related problems though she is able to walk, and even dance a little. Radhe Raj, a leader of the National Educated Youth Union, said in a statement that Priyanka Kadam, the woman, appeared for the State Service Examination 2022

conducted by the Madhya Pradesh Public Service Commission (MPPSC). She sought benefit under the disabled quota by providing a certificate of being "bone-disabled," but said the results were announced last month and she was selected for the post of district excise officer, but there are videos on social media showing her dancing, which calls into question her disability claim, he alleged. All candidates selected under the disabled quota in this examination should be

examined All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) to verify their certificates, he demanded. MPPSC officials were unavailable for a comment on the issue despite attempts. When contacted, Priyanka Kadam asserted that there were no irregularities in her selection. 'I come from ordinary background, and I have achieved my position in life by struggling hard,' she said. She suffered a serious hip injury after falling in the bathroom in 2017 and MRI scan revealed that

she had 'avascular necrosis', following which she underwent surgery four times. Kadam said. 'Avascular necrosis is a disorder where a person's bone tissues start dying due to obstruction in blood supply. Priyanka Kadam claimed that she has 45 percent disability. 'I may look like a normal woman at a first glance, but it is because of implants installed during a complex surgery that I am able to walk, and can even dance for five to ten minutes, as suggested by the doctors. But I also have to take painkillers at times,' she said. She dances a little now and then to keep her morale high, Kadam added.
