In Paris, PM will push to bridge AI digital divide

To co-chair AI Summit with French President Emmanuel Macron on Feb 11

India aims to reduce the technology gap that emerges with the proliferation of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and will focus on its inclusive use during Prime Minister Narendra Modi's visit to France next week for the AI Action Summit, Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said on Friday.

After his three-day visit to France from February 10, the PM will travel to the United States (US) to hold bilateral meetings with President Donald Trump, Misri confirmed.

A declaration will be adopted at the Paris Summit, which will be co-chaired by Modi and French President Emmanuel Macron on February 11, Misri told reporters at a special briefing.

The summit, the third in as many years, builds on initial global efforts to establish scientific foundations, solutions, and standards for more sustainable AI.

"India is interested in AI applications that are designed, developed, deployed, and used in a safe, humane, responsible, and trustworthy manner. There are issues related to the inclusive use and application of AI, and the inevitable technology gap we expect these developments to create. It is our effort to try and minimise this gap as much as possible," Misri said.

Both leaders will also address the India-France CEO forum featuring tech leaders and hold bilateral meetings.

On February 12, Modi will visit a memorial honouring Indian soldiers martyred in World War I to inaugurate India's consulate in Marseilles, France's second-largest city.

The PM will also visit the International Thermonuclear Experimental Reactor in southern France. This international nuclear fusion research and engineering megaproject aims to create energy

through a fusion process similar to that of the Sun.

Modi's visit to the US on February 12-13 will include bilateral meetings between the leaders three weeks after Trump began his second term in the White House. The visit is expected to conclude with a joint statement. The meetings will focus heavily on trade and tariffs.

New Delhi is in a wait-and-watch mode as US President Donald Trump has imposed a 25 per cent tariff on imports from Canada and Mexico, and a 10 per cent levy on Chinese imports.

US deportations

As many as 487 presumed Indian citizens illegally present in the US have been served final deportation orders by the Trump administration, and India is verifying their citizenship, Misri said. Of these, the US has provided identifying details of 298 individuals.

A US military aircraft carrying 104 illegal Indian immigrants landed in Amritsar on Wednesday, marking the first batch of

Indian deportees.

The ministry did not provide the details of how many similar flights are expected in coming days, or the total number of Indians illegally in the US who may face forced removal. India is working on first identifying whether the deportees selected by the US are bona fide Indian citizens.

While it would be hard to give an exact number, further flights are expected if the number of identified Indians went up, he indicated. Between October 2023 and September 2024, US authorities apprehended 90,415 Indians attempting to enter illegally.

Responding to outrage over the handcuffing of Indians on the flight, Misri said the Standard Operating Procedures followed by the US regarding the detention of illegal immigrants on return flights have been unchanged since 2012. The government is also focused on dismantling the ecosystem enabling illegal migration by criminal networks targeting vulnerable individuals.

Cabinet okays ₹8,800 crore to boost Skill India Programme

The Union Cabinet on Friday approved continuation and restructuring of the 'Skill India Programme (SIP)' till 2026 with an outlay of ₹8,800 crore from the period of 2022-23 to 2025-26.

Three components — Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana 4.0 (PMKVY 4.0), Pradhan Mantri National Apprenticeship Promotion Scheme (PM-NAPS) and the Jan Shikshan Sansthan (JSS) scheme — are now combined under the composite central sector scheme, the SIP. To keep pace with evolving industry demands and advent of new-age technologies, the ₹6,000 crore PMKVY 4.0 scheme will provide over 400 new courses on AI, 5G technology, and cybersecurity, among others.

New South Coast Railway Zone gets nod

The Union Cabinet on Friday approved the creation of a new railway zone under the Indian Railways — South Coast Railway, which will consist of a part of the Waltair division, whose name will also be changed to Visakhapatnam division.

The new railway zone has been created in accordance with the Andhra Pradesh Reorganisation Act and will lead to efficiency in railway operations, said the Cabinet.

The move is a partial modification of an earlier decision made in February 2019 to retain Waltair division in a truncated form and rename it.

Probe agencies line up measures to crack down on illegal travel agents

A day after External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar told Parliament that the focus should be on a "strong crackdown on the illegal migration industry", central probe agencies and state police forces on Friday announced a slew of measures that they plan to take against such travel agents.

According to the data that the government provided in Parliament last year, the Centre and states had notified 3,094 "illegal agents" on the eMigrate Portal until October 2024.

Jaishankar told Parliament on Thursday that on the "basis of information provided by returning deportees about the agents and others involved, law enforcement agencies will take necessary preventive and exemplary actions".

Punjab Police Director General of Police (DGP) Gaurav Yadav on Friday said it had set up a four-member Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe the issue of illegal migration and human trafficking.

In a post on X, the DGP said the fact-finding committee/SIT has been directed to take appropriate action according to law and facts and take action against any person found involved in committing illegalities and indulging in illegal migration/human trafficking.

In Haryana, two days after 104 deportees from the US landed in Amritsar, including 33 from Haryana, two people, including a deportee, police complaints were registered against travel agents who had allegedly sent them to the US.

According to the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA), as part of India-US cooperation on migration and mobility, both sides are engaged in a process to deter illegal migration, including human smuggling and create more avenues for legal migration from India to the US.

To ease the emigration process and facilitate the employment of Indian workers abroad, the MEA has signed several Memorandum of Understanding (MoUs), Migration and Mobility Partnership Agreements (MMPAs) and Labour Manpower Agreements (LMAs) with the governments of various countries. does not have any such specific agreements with the US.

According to the MEA, it has signed MMPAs with the UK, France, Germany, Austria, Australia, Italy and Denmark. It has inked Labour Welfare Agreements with Bahrain, Kuwait, Oman, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, the UAE and Jordan.

India has labour mobility agreements with Denmark, Japan, Portugal, Mauritius, Israel, Taiwan and Malaysia.

Officials of the Enforcement Directorate said on Friday they are probing a "complex network" of agents and facilitators in India, Canada, and the US who help Indians illegally enter the US via "bogus" admissions in Canadian colleges.

Focus on bringing out district-level estimates: Amitabh Kant to MoSPI

Amitabh Kant, India's G20 Sherpa, on Friday said the Statistics ministry should focus more on bringing out district-level estimates of gross domestic product (GDP) and other socio-economic indicators as it can drive comprehensive improvements in socio-economic outcomes.

He was speaking at an event organised by the Ministry of Statistics and Programme Implementation (MoSPI) to mark 75 years of National Sample Survey. "While rich data is generated at the state-level through NSS (National Sample Survey), we must now shift our focus to districts. My own experience with the aspirational districts programme showed us that data at the district level could drive comprehensive improvements in socio-economic indicators, whether

it is district level GDP data or any other socio-economic indicator data," he said.

Kant also highlighted the pivotal role that the organisation has played in policy formulation over these years.

Addressing the event, MoSPI secretary Saurabh Garg also emphasised on the work being done by the ministry on making district-level estimates available.

"Sample designs have been modified to make district-level estimates available. State policies can benefit much more from survey data that is being used," Garg highlighted.



AP IT minister for \$100 bn investment in data centres

Andhra Pradesh's Minister of Information Technology and TDP General Secretary Nara Lokesh has proposed that India should target \$100 billion of data centre investments each year and look to develop AI/data cities across the country. He wrapped up a two-day visit in Delhi this week.

Delhi LG orders probe into AAP's poaching claims against BJP

Delhi Lieutenant Governor V K Saxena on Friday ordered an anti-corruption branch (ACB) probe into allegations by the AAP leaders that the BJP attempted to poach its candidates, officials said. Meanwhile, the ACB team has reached AAP chief Arvind Kejriwal's residence to carry forward its probe.



India in talks with EU to resolve new trade regulations

Union Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal on Friday said India is in talks with the European Union to resolve issues related to their new trade regulations. Replying to queries on EU trade barriers in the Rajya Sabha, Goyal said, "There is certainly an issue where the EU has come up with new regulations which we are actively discussing with them to resolve." The government is discussing issues like the deforestation Act, he said. Goyal said if unfair trade barriers are imposed, the government will take up the matter with India's counterparts through bilateral discussions and multilateral trade organisations.

Pvt member's Bill to safeguard workers' rights from AI tabled in RS

Nearly 50 private members' Bills, including those seeking to protect employees' rights in relation to use and implementation of artificial intelligence in workplaces; prevent and criminalise creation and use of deepfake contents were introduced in Rajya Sabha on Friday. Members across political parties, from the ruling BJP to Opposition TMC, Congress, RJD, CPI, CPI(M) and the AAP introduced several private members' bills, including two separate bills seeking to increase the sitting of Parliament to at



least 100 to 120 days a year. TMC member Mausam B Noor introduced the Artificial Intelligence (Protection of Rights of Employees) Bill, 2023 that seeks to protect the rights of employees in relation to the use and implementation of AI at workplaces. Noor also introduced the Deepfake Prevention and Criminalisation Bill, 2023 that seeks to prevent and criminalise the creation, dissemination, and use of deepfake content without consent or without digital watermark.

10K Indian prisoners in foreign jails at present: Govt in LS

As per the information available with the Ministry of External Affairs, the number of Indian prisoners, including undertrials, in foreign jails at present is 10,152, the government informed Parliament on Friday. Minister of State for External Affairs Kirti Vardhan Singh in a written response to a query in the Lok Sabha shared country-wise data on such prisoners. The data shared under the head "total number of Indians under trail and convicted in foreign jails at present" included for 86 countries, including Saudi Arabia, Kuwait, the UAE, Qatar, Nepal, Pakistan, the US, Sri Lanka, Spain, Russia, Israel, China, Bangladesh, and Argentina.

'Online ticket booking costlier than physical counter purchase'

Passengers booking tickets online via IRCTC pay more than those purchasing physically at railway counters because of convenience fee and transaction charges, Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw said in the Rajya Sabha on Friday. Responding to questions raised by Shiv Sena (UBT) MP Sanjay Raut regarding discrepancies in IRCTC ticket pricing, Vaishnaw said: "IRCTC incurs a substantial expenditure on providing online ticketing facility and in order to defray the cost incurred in maintenance, upgradation and expansion of ticketing infrastructure, a convenience fee is levied. In addition, customers also pay transaction charges to banks."

India's first hydrogen train to be among world's longest

Indian Railways has taken up a state-of-the-art project to develop the country's first hydrogen train, which is slated to be among the longest and the maximum powered hydrogen trains in the world, Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw informed the Rajya Sabha in a written reply on Friday. "The specifications for this fully indigenously developed train have been prepared by the Research Design and Standards Organisation (RDSO). This is slated to be among the longest hydrogen train in the world presently. It will also be among the maximum powered hydrogen trains in the world," he added.
