Formula for fixing MSP for Paddy and Wheat

New Delhi: Government fixes minimum support prices (MSPs) of 22 mandated crops including paddy, wheat, for every agricultural year and fair & remunerative price (FRP) for sugarcane on the basis of recommendations of Commission for Agricultural Costs & Prices (CACP), after considering the views of State Governments and Central Ministries/Departments concerned & other relevant factors. In addition, MSP for Toria and De-Husked coconut is also fixed on the basis of MSPs of Rapeseed & Mustard and Copra respectively. While recommending MSPs, CACP considers important factors like cost of production, overall demand-supply conditions, domestic and international prices, inter-crop price parity, terms of trade between agricultural and non-agricultural sectors, the likely effect on the rest of the economy, besides ensuring rational utilization of land, water and other production resources and a minimum of 50 per cent as the margin over cost of production in case of MSPs and reasonable margins over cost of production in case of FRP.

National Commission on Farmers (NCF) headed by Dr. M.S. Swaminathan had recommended that the MSP should be at least 50 per cent more than the weighted average cost of production. However, when the National

Policy for Farmers, 2007 was finalized by the then Government, this recommendation of providing 50 per cent returns over cost of production was not included.

CACP considers both A2+FL and C2 costs while recommending MSPs. CACP reckons only A2+FL cost for return. However, C2 costs are used by CACP primarily as benchmark reference costs (opportunity costs) to see if the MSPs recommended by them at least cover these costs in some of the major producing States.

The Union Budget for 2018-19 had announced the pre-determined principle to keep MSP at levels of one and half times of the cost of production. Accordingly, Government has increased the MSPs for all mandated Kharif, Rabi and other commercial crops with a return of at least 50 per cent of cost of production for the agricultural year 2018-19. During 2019-20 also, Government has increased the MSP of all mandated kharif and rabi crops in line with the principle of fixing the MSP with a return of at least 50 per cent of the cost of production.

This information was given in a written reply by the Union Minister of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Shri Narendra Singh Tomar in Rajya Sabha today.

GSHSEB syncs its academic calendar with CBSE

VADODARA: In order to bring uniformity to the academic years of the central board and the state board, the state education department has decided to begin the academic year from April 1 instead of June 1.

As of now, schools affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) begin their academic year on April 1 while Gujarat Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board (GSHSEB) schools begin on June 1.

All primary, secondary and higher secondary schools in Gujarat will begin their 2020-



21 year from April 1, immediately soon after the annual exams, as is followed by CBSE schools, a notification states.

Till now, though the process of annual exams used to be completed in early April, five weeks of summer vacations began only from early May.

The month of April was not utilized with hardly any academic activity after the final exams. The new calendar will allow schools to conduct four to five weeks of academic activity ahead of five-week summer vacations beginning in the first week of May. Officials said the new calendar will add 24 to 30 days of academic activity, to help schools achieve 200-240 academic days a year, across classes.

Steps to reduce Dependency on Monsoon

New Delhi: The Water Resources Projects are planned, funded, executed and maintained by the State Governments themselves, as per their own resources and priority. In order to supplement their efforts, Government of India provides technical and financial assistance to State Governments to encourage sustainable development and efficient management of water resources through various schemes and programmes such as, Accelerated Irrigation Benefits Programme (AIBP) under Pradhan Mantri Krishi Sinchayee Yojana (PMKSY) etc.

During 2016-17, ninety-nine (99) on-going Major/Medium irrigation projects under PMKSY- AIBP, having ultimate irrigation potential of 76.03 lakh hectares at an estimated cost of Rs. 77595 Crore (Central Assistance component of Rs. 31342 Crore) have been prioritized

in consultation with States, for completion in phases up to December, 2019, along with their Command Area Development & Water Management (CADWM) works. Funding mechanism through NABARD has been approved by the Government for both Central and State Shares.

Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare through ICAR-Central Research Institute for Dryland Agriculture (CRIDA), Hyderabad, has prepared detailed crop Contingency Plans for 650 districts. States have been advised for preparing, updating, and fine-tuning Contingency Plans for each district in consultation with CRIDA-ICAR and the State Agriculture Universities and to prepare location specific remedial measures based on these contingency plans in the event of late arrival of monsoon, long dry spells, scanty rainfall.

Fight over feeding stray dogs reaches police station

Vadodara: Feeding stray dogs resulted in a clash between two neighbours in Gorwa that eventually ended at the police station on Wednesday.

Tired of dog barks throughout the nights, two residents of Shantinagar Society in Gorwa – Dipen Patel and Aatish Patel – chased away the dogs with sticks from their society on January 28. But this action of the duo irked their neighbour Bina Joshi and her daughter Prerna. The mother-daughter duo confronted Dipen and Aatish regarding shoving sticks at stray dogs and allegedly started recording video in their mobile phone.

Beena alleged that it was Dipen and Aatish who started the arguments. The duo



shouted at Beena saying who will be held responsible if the stray dogs bite someone and asked her to keep the stray dogs in her house. Both alleged each other of using foul language and lodged cross complaints at Gorwa police station. Beena lodged a case of

using obscene words in public and under Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act against Dipen and Aatish. On the other hand, Dipen's wife lodged a case of using obscene words and criminal intimidation against Beena and Prerna.

"The stray dogs have bitten five to six people in the society and my husband and our neighbour were chasing the dogs away only because one of the canines attacked our three-year-old daughter last Sunday. Although the dogs have been barking all nights, we have never chased them away, it was only after the attack on our daughter that we felt that these animals cannot be tolerated any longer," said Dipen's wife Trupti. She added that Beena and her daughter have been feeding the dogs daily for past two years. Feeding stray dogs resulted in a clash between two neighbours in Gorwa that eventually ended at the police station on Wednesday.

Post-Harvest Infrastructure in the States

New Delhi: As per a Study, All India Cold-chain Infrastructure Capacity (Assessment of Status and Gap), commissioned by National Centre for Cold-chain Development (NCCD) under the Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare and conducted by NABARD Consultancy Services Private Limited (NABCONS) in 2015 there has been infrastructural gaps ranging from 10% in the case of cold storages (bulk & hub) to 99.6% in the case of pack houses as compared to the requirement of the level of production of perishable produces like fruits and vegetables. Insufficient private investment in such infrastructure and logistics is one of the principal reasons for such gaps.

The Government has taken a number of steps in order to improve post harvest infrastructure in various States of the country. Under Mission for Integrated Development of Horticulture (MIDH) assistance is provided for development of post harvest management and marketing infrastructure such as cold storages, ripening chamber, pack houses, reefer vehicles to farmers to improve marketability of their produce.

Government of India through National Horticulture Board is implementing scheme for Development of

Commercial Horticulture for Production and Post Harvest Management of Horticulture Crops.

Government is implementing Rashtriya Krishi Vikas Yojana-Remunerative Approaches for Agriculture and Allied Sector Rejuvenation (RKVY-RAFTAAR) Scheme with major focus for development of pre & post-harvest infrastructure, besides promoting agri-entrepreneurship and innovations.

The Government is promoting scientific storage facilities for the farmers in the country in rural areas through the scheme of "Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure (AMI)", which is a sub-scheme of Integrated Scheme for Agricultural Marketing (ISAM). Assistance under the AMI Scheme is available to Individual farmers, Group of farmers/growers, registered Farmer Produce Organizations (FPOs) etc. Government is implementing Pradhan Mantri Kisan Sampada Yojana (PMKSY) scheme with the objective of creation of modern infrastructure along with efficient supply chain management for the entire processing value chain.

Jobless man vents anger at girlfriend by burning his car

VADODARA: In a repeat of 90s Bollywood potboiler 'Anjaam' on Vadodara streets, a jobless IT engineer from Ahmedabad did a SRK stunt by burning his car out of frustration over his girlfriend. According to police, local people of Vadiwadi near RC Dutt Road witnessed the similar scene on Tuesday morning, albeit, the 'love interest' in this case was not present at the scene.

The 23-year-old man from Ahmedabad set his sedan on fire in the narrow lane behind Bombay Shopping Centre after his girlfriend stood him up. The frustrated man first broke the windshield and glass panes of his car with stones. Later he collected garbage and dumped it in the car and finally set it afire. The man also allegedly pelted stones at passers-by and onlookers who gathered at the spot.

Locals informed the police control room and the fire brigade. Believing it to be a case of vandalism, police reached the spot to to arrest the man, but understood that it was his own car after talking to him. When cops wanted him to come with them to Sayajigunj police station, the man at first refused, but later agreed to go with them in an auto-rickshaw. Meanwhile, the firemen doused the fire. The man continued to stay mum even



at the police station despite repeated coaxing till his father arrived from Ahmedabad. When his father reached the police station, he finally opened up and said that it was act out of rage over his girlfriend who did not meet him as promised. However, he did not divulge details about the girl to cops or his father. "We let him leave as the father did not want to register any case. It was anyway a personal problem," said inspector S G Solanki of Sayajigunj police station. Believing it to be a case of vandalism, police reached the spot to to arrest the man, but understood that it was his own car after talking to him. When cops wanted him to come with them to Sayajigunj police station, the man at first refused, but later agreed to go with them in an auto-rickshaw. Meanwhile, the firemen doused the fire. Improving Soil Productivity and Fertility

New Delhi: The Government has introduced Soil Health Card (SHC) Scheme to assist State Governments to provide soil health cards to all farmers across the country once in a cycle of 2 years. Soil Health Card provides information to farmers on nutrient status of their soil along with recommendations on appropriate dosage of nutrients to be applied for improving soil health and its fertility.

To increase acceptability of SHC by farmers, during 2019-20, a pilot project 'Development of Model Villages' has been taken up where soil samples collection

has been taken up at individual farm holding with farmer's participation instead of sample collection at grids being done earlier.

Government is recommending soil test based balanced and integrated nutrient management through conjunctive use of inorganic and organic sources of plant nutrient to sustain good soil health. In this regard advisories are issued to farmers from time to time. The Government has introduced Soil Health Card (SHC) Scheme to assist State Governments to provide soil health cards to all farmers across the country once in a cycle of 2 years.
