SHELTER ATTACKED | Complex in Gaza housed 6,000 displaced Palestinians, 11 children and six women among those killed 93 killed, several hurt in Israeli strike on school

An Israeli strike on a school in Gaza City sheltering displaced Palestinians killed at least 93 people, according to Gaza's Civil Defense Force. Unconfirmed sources put the toll at 100. Israel's military said early Saturday that it had carried out airstrikes on a school compound in Gaza City where people had been sheltering.

The military said the school, Al-Tabin, in the Al-Daraj neighborhood of Gaza City, had also been operating as headquarters for Hamas. Hamas fighters had been "operating within a Hamas

command and control center embedded in the school". They accused Hamas of using the civilian population as "human shields".

Hamas rejected Israel's assertion that it had been using the school in Al-Daraj as a base of operations. A spokesman for the civil defense,

Based on intel, around 20 Hamas and Islamic Jihad militants were operating from the school compound, says IDF spokesman

Mahmoud Basal, said Israeli rockets struck as about 250 people gathered to pray at a mosque inside the school turned to shelter in the pre-dawn hours on Saturday. He put the preliminary death toll at at least 90 and said that many others had been critically wounded. The school had been housing 6,000 displaced Pa-

lestinians before it was struck, and that 11 children and six women were among the killed, with dozens injured. The attack came during the dawn prayer, "which rapidly increased" the number of people killed, the Hamas-run Gaza media of-

fice said in a statement, asserting Israel "directly bombed the displaced". The scale of the attack was such that the teams had not been able to recover all of the bodies yet, the statement added, labeling it a "horrific massacre". Videos from journal-

ists in Gaza taken in the aftermath of the attack showed bloodied bodies and debris strewn across a concrete floor. Another video showed what appeared to be dozens of bodies covered in cloth and laid out in a courtyard. The strike follows two at-

tacks Thursday, when more than a dozen people were killed at Gaza City schools sheltering displaced people, Palestinian officials said. After the attacks, the IDF also said that the school compounds were being used by Hamas.

US base hit by drone in Syria

Dubai: A United States military base in eastern Syria was attacked by a one-way drone, according to a US defense official. Initial reports do not indicate there were any injuries in the attack, but the official said medical evaluations and a damage assessment following the attack were ongoing.

'Israeli hostages critical, some may not survive'

Some of the hostages held by Hamas in Gaza are presumed to be in critical condition and may not be able to survive in captivity for long, a senior security official told TV network Channel 12 on Friday. The official, who remained anonymous, told the channel, "We know that some of the hostages will not survive much longer in the conditions in which they are being held, and in light of their physical and mental health."

The official claimed that this was not just an assumption and that the Israeli government had information about the situation that proved hostages were in a serious condition. Out of the 111 hostages still held by Hamas, 39 have been confirmed as dead by the Israeli Defence Force (IDF).

Pressure to accept a ceasefire in exchange for hostages has been increasing, as the retaliation against Gaza also continues, with the UN condemning Israel for "illegal occupation" as well. The security official also told the channel, "The thought that they are being held in relatively good conditions, like Noa Argamani and the hostages released in the [special forces] operation, is incorrect."

He was referring to a rescue mission in June in which four hostages were released in notably good condition relative after eight months of captivity. He added, "The argument that they are 'suffering but not dying' does not hold up to scrutiny," referring to comments by Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu during a cabinet meeting in July.

The anonymous comments by the source, come a day after the US, Egypt and Qatar asked for a final deal without delay. "It is time to bring immediate relief both to the long-suffering people of Gaza as well as the long-suffering hostages and their families. The time has come to conclude the ceasefire and hostages and detainees release deal," said the statement published by Qatari state media.
