Plaint against MKU official for embezzling seminar funds

AFTER a superintendent in the Directorate of Distance Education (DDE), Madurai, Kamaraj University (MKU), was allegedly involved in misappropriation of funds several times, an inquiry committee has recommended that he be suspended immediately. The university officials have also filed a police complaint with the Nagamalai Pudukottai police, seeking action against the accused.

Speaking to TN7E, highly placed sources from MKU said that the accused, R. Karthik, Superintendent (Seminar Series), in DDE, was in charge of distributing funds for seminars.

When Additional Controller of Examinations (U) and Head of Journalism Department S Saleema Rabiath lodged seminar classes for students, Karthik obtained the signature of DDE Director P Muthupandi to disburse money to four persons, including Saleema. While Karthik deposited the money into the accounts of three persons, he did not deposit ₹20,000 into Saleema's account. Instead, he deposited it in his personal account on June 30, 2024.

When Saleema informed Muthupandi that she did not receive money, the latter contacted the bank and Karthik was caught. Following this, Muthupandi lodged a complaint with the convener committee of the MKU. The inquiry committee conducted an inquiry, verified the documents, and recommended the registrar to suspend Karthik on Wednesday.

Meanwhile, Karthik returned the money to the DDE director. Karthik is likely to be suspended on Friday.

Chased out of GH, patient spends 2 days on street

HOUSEKEEPING staff of Government Rajaji Hospital (GRH) in Madurai allegedly chased a patient out of the facility after he reportedly spilt urine on the floor. The patient allegedly crawled out of the hospital and lay on the pavement in front of a local bus stop for two days. Subsequently, social activists admitted him back to the hospital on Thursday morning.

ALL ARRESTED

9 pose as cops, abduct, rob bizman of ₹7 lakh

NINE men were arrested by the Nagai police on Wednesday for allegedly impersonating police personnel and robbing ₹7 lakh from a businessman after abducting him near Chembet several weeks ago.

Police identified the suspects as Rafiq (40), Arunkumar (40), Karmaganan (38), Sajidham (28), Imran (27), Sathish (29), Anthony Raj (36), Venugopal (27), and Yashwanth (33). Rafiq had previously worked for the victim, Azharuddin (33), who is a medical wholesaler.

Police claimed that they would arrest Azharuddin for allegedly involving in sale of illegal drugs, the suspects handcuffed him and threatened him with a pistol. However, the victim lodged a police complaint on June 1 as the gang again contacted him and sought more money. Following inquiry, the police arrested the nine men on Wednesday and confiscated a car, a carry-swinging device, six mobile phones, a fake pistol, handcuffs, and a walkie-talkie from the accused.

mar) (66), of Vilachari in Coimbatore, was working as a cook for a catering company for several years. A month ago, while he was shifting his bike, he was hit by two people near Nagamalai Pudukottai. He sustained injuries to the chest, leg, and hip and was admitted to the hospital. Soon, his right leg had gone numb, and he was unable to walk. He had no attendant as his son was out of station.

Church priest held for sexually assaulting minor

CHENNAI: A 54-year-old church priest in Kancheepuram has been arrested under the POCSO Act for allegedly sexually assaulting a 14-year-old girl.

The victim had been residing on the church grounds along with her father, who was a gardener there, ever since her mother passed away a few years ago.

Her relatives lodged a complaint with the Chief Minister's Cell and it was forwarded to the district child welfare department. On Wednesday, Kancheepuram All Women Police Station personnel arrested the priest under POCSO Act.

"Inquiries revealed that the 54-year-old man had sexually attacked the child more than once. He was remanded to judicial custody. We have sent the victim for a medical checkup and the report is awaited," an officer said. ENS

call, but nobody was present to help him. Hence, he straitened in a box, and it slipped and fell to the ground. The housekeeping staff of the hospital verbally abused him. Kattukumar alleged that the sweepers would routinely use foul language with him and ask him to move out of the facility. As he was unable to walk, he allegedly crawled out of the facility and lay on the pavement of the Anna Street for two days. Street-hawkers found the elderly man and informed social activists, who informed hospital authorities and admitted him back.

Speaking to TN7E, GRH Dean Dr C Dharmaraj said, "The official records mention that the person was admitted after an assault last month, and he went absconding for the last two days. But social activists have admitted the person claiming that he was chased out by our sweepers. I have asked the Resident Medical Officer to submit a complete report on the incident. Based on the outcome, appropriate action will be taken."

Chennai city buyers also opt for high-value homes: Report

HOMEBUYERS in Chennai are now increasingly preferring larger spaces and high-value homes resulting in a surge in sale of units ranging between ₹60 lakh - ₹1 crore. Units in this price range alone constituted 28% of the total sales in the city in the first half of 2024, according to a report by Knight Frank.

The report, which was released on Thursday, stated that the city witnessed 12% year-on-year growth in residential unit sales, while office space transactions touched 3 million sq ft in first half of 2024. While 1,200 units were sold in the first half of last year, as many as 3,975 units were sold in the same period this year.

However, it was the mid-segment residential market in Chennai, priced between ₹50 lakh - ₹80 lakh, that witnessed the most number of sales, comprising 44% of total sales. Srinivas Anilkpanti, Senior Director, Tamil Nadu and Kerala, Knight Frank India, said during first half of 2024, a steady price appreciation of 5% year-on-year was observed in Chennai. The city recorded an average price of ₹4,500 sq ft per month. Former state chairman of Builders Association of India Prakash Ramdoss said the price appreciation year-on-year is due to the rise in price of construction materials.

Cows on road claim 2 lives

CHENNAI: Two people died in separate road accidents involving stray cattle at Guduvanchery and Singaperumal Koil on Wednesday night.

In Guduvanchery, Selvaraj (54) and his wife Vijaya (54) were travelling on a bike along the GST Road when a cow crossed the road suddenly. Selvaraj lost control of the bike and fell to the ground.

While both suffered head injuries, Vijaya died on the spot. Selvaraj is under treatment at a government hospital. In Singaperumal Koil, a 46-year-old man, Thilukanam, died after a truck hit him while he was trying to escape a cow that was chasing him. A cow from a herd had begun to chase him when he was walking along the road. ENS
