Handler of mule accounts linked to over 100 cyber crime cases held

Syndicate had links to Cambodia masterminds; 5 associates of ring also arrested

A YOUNG Bollywood aspirant from Odisha who was doing small time modelling gigs and ended up becoming a handler of a network of hundreds of cyber mule accounts with links to international masterminds in Cambodia, was arrested by cyber crime sleuths of Pimpri Chinchwad. The investigators also arrested five syndicate associates from Jharkhand, Gujarat and Maharashtra who handled mule accounts flagged in over 100 cyber crime cases registered across India.

The major breakthrough came when a cyber crime team of Pimpri Chinchwad police had been investigating a particular share trading cyber fraud registered earlier this month in which the victim was duped of Rs 7.6 lakh on the promise of high returns. During the initial phase of the probe, the investigation team zeroed in on a suspect, Shubham Londhe (24), from Chikhali area of Pune.

Police found that Londhe was handling a small set of mule accounts by himself used in cyber crimes and had given access of these accounts to a higher level handler who went by the name Sam David. It further came to light that this Sam David was handling a network of hundreds of mule accounts and was in contact with international cyber criminals in Cambodia.

"Probe revealed that Sam David was using at least 20 different phone numbers, had his primary base in Goa and was moving across India. We received a concrete tip off that he was coming to Hinjewadi on January 23. He was nabbed from Hinjewadi and it came to light that his real name is Sambidhikumar Shripati Nayak, 22, a resident of Rourkela in Odisha, a Bollywood aspirant. Probe has revealed that recently he had booked at least seven hotel rooms at various places in Pune where he was keeping the mule account holders for some duration," said Deputy Commissioner of Police (Crime) with Pimpri Chinchwad police, Sandeep Doiphode.

"Investigation revealed Nayak alias Sam David moved to Maharashtra with aspirations to become a star in Bollywood. He initially did some small time modelling gigs and was pursuing a Bachelors in Computer Applications from a College in Mumbai. In the party circles of Pune and Mumbai he came in contact with some people with links to international cyber criminals. He soon rose in ranks and was currently operating a vast network of mule account holders across India and reported to masterminds in Cambodia," said an officer who is part of the probe.

Two teams of cyber investigators checked the hotel rooms booked by Sam David. It was revealed that the kits of these mule accounts — comprising account details, debit card, SIM card linked to the account

among other things — were moved using an online delivery application to avoid getting caught. From a flat in Bavdhan, the investigation teams arrested one Raj Ansh Singh (21), a student from Hazaribagh in Jharkhand who had been receiving these mule account kits and would send the details to masterminds in Cambodia. He was the third person to be arrested in the case. The investigation and questioning of these suspects led police to arrest three more persons identified as Himanshu Kumar Thakur (24) of Hazaribagh, Gaurav Sharma (40), a tiffin service operator from Valsad in Gujarat and Ankush More (31), a businessman from Nashik.

Pimpri Chinchwad police commissioner Vinoykumar Choubey, who supervised the probe, said, "The arrest of the main handler of the international syndicate Sam David and his five accomplices has led our cyber investigators to expose and bust a vast network of mule accounts. Till now over 100 cyber frauds cases from across India have been linked to the mule accounts from the network."

The probe was led by DCP, crime, Sandeep Doiphode and ACP Vishal Hire and the investigation team comprised Inspector Ravikiran Nale, Assistant Inspector Praveen Swami and Sub inspectors Sagar Poman, Vaibhav Patil, Prakash Katkade and the constabulary staff.

'What happens after death': Teen dies by suicide after net search

Nagpur: A 17-year-old girl in Nagpur city allegedly died by suicide on Monday after searching online about "what happens after death", police said on Tuesday.

The deceased, a Class 12 student of a private school and the only child of an RBI official in Nagpur, frequently searched for information about death and foreign cultures, they said.

She allegedly slashed her wrist with a "stone blade knife" which she ordered online, and then slit her throat, police said. Her mother, a homemaker, found her lying in a pool of blood in her bedroom and raised an alarm, police said. PTI

EDU DEPT REVISES 3-COURSE MEAL PLAN

Sweet dish in mid-day meal only if school managements can raise funds for sugar

MID-DAY MEAL served in Maharashtra's government schools will include sweet dish only if the respective School Management Committees (SMC) can raise funds through public participation to buy sugar required to prepare these dishes.

The decision is part of the reforms to the three-course meal plan declared in June 2024 by the then school education minister Deepak Kesarkar.

The school education department on Tuesday declared a Government Resolution (GR) announcing these reforms.

According to the GR, the revision was necessitated following multiple representations from stakeholders on challenges in implementing the three-course-meal plan announced in June 2024 comprising rice, pulses, sprouts, and sweet dishes like rice-kheer and Nachani Satva (sweet dish made with raagi flour).

The revised recipe set has ten dishes which can be prepared with existing cost for supply of raw materials for mid-day meals. In order to offer variety in food served, these recipes will be served on different days.

The chart of the revised set of recipes also includes options

of two sweet dishes and egg pulao. But it is made clear that the government will not provide any additional funds for this.

"These two recipes — Egg Pulao and rice-kheer or Nachani Satva (sweet dish made with Raagi flour) are being provided as optional choices. Considering that the central government has instructed to increase public participation in the scheme by holding special-lunches, SMCs should try to provide the benefits of these two dishes. And sugar required for the sweet dishes should be bought with funds raised through public participation. No additional funds are being provided for this by the government," states the government resolution.

Reasoning the decision, the GR further said, "There were many challenges in providing such a three-course-meal plan at local levels. Several organisations providing mid-day meal to schools and many other stakeholders submitted representations to the government regarding the challenges... In addition to these representations, the per-student daily food expenditure limit set by the Central Government, the state government has decided to amend the midday-meal changes proposed by the earlier government resolution."

It also directed strict punitive action against organisations or individuals responsible for repeated erection of illegal hoardings and also asked printing presses to check permission of the local body while printing such banners and hoardings. The government has sought a compliance report from the authorities by February 28.

The HC bench of Chief Justice Alok Aradhe and Bharati H Dange on January 27 asked the petitioners to file additional affidavits in response to the state's submissions and posted further hearing to February 12.

Justice who laid a roadmap for prison reforms

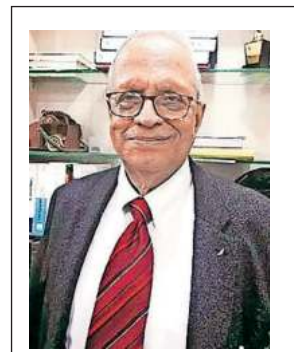

KNOWN FOR laying down a roadmap for prison reforms in Maharashtra and advocating human rights causes, Justice S Radhakrishnan (78), a former judge of the Bombay High Court, passed away at a hospital in the city on Tuesday morning. After his retirement, Justice Radhakrishnan headed a panel that recommended steps to reduce overcrowding in jails and improve health conditions of inmates.

Born on December 25, 1946, Justice Radhakrishnan had pursued B Sc and LLB and stood first in the LL.M course of Mumbai University. He enrolled as an ad-

vocate on October 15, 1971, and practiced before the Bombay High Court in constitutional, civil, labour, criminal, company and service matters and specialised in civil writ matters involving constitutional and administrative law. He was designated as senior advocate in December 1991.

He also taught constitutional law, administrative law, public international law and press laws for LLB and LL.M students for over a decade before his appointment as additional judge of Bombay HC on April 15, 1996. He was made permanent judge in April, 1998 and he served as HC judge for nearly 12 years until he retired in December 2008. He received Doctorate in Human Rights during his judicial career.

After his retirement, Justice Radhakrishnan served as the chairperson of the Maharashtra

Administrative Tribunal (MAT) from 2009 to 2014.

In 2017, on directions from the High Court, Maharashtra government constituted a five-member committee headed by Justice Radhakrishnan (Retd) to look into prison reforms and modernisation in the state.

As per Justice Radhakrishnan (Retd) panel's report, till April 2018, 73% of total prison inmates in Maharashtra consisted of undertrial prisoners and at Arthur Road jail (Mumbai central prison), the number of inmates was three times more than the sanctioned capacity.

The panel also recommended repairs in women's prison and said that priority be given for women prisoners to meet their children who are out-

side and also directed weekly OPDs consisting of gynaecologists and paediatricians.

In January 2020, the High Court had formed a three-member committee headed by retired judge Justice Radhakrishnan for disposal and distribution of proceeds on priority to PMC Bank depositors. The court had ordered constitution of the panel on the PIL seeking the public auction of all assets of debt-ridden Housing Development Infrastructure Ltd (HDIL) either mortgaged with the crisis-hit PMC Bank or attached by the Economic Offences Wing, Mumbai.

He will be cremated on Wednesday afternoon at a crematorium near Teachers Colony, Bandra (East).

Maharashtra to remove blank pages from Balbharati textbooks

MAHARASHTRA STATE Board curriculum textbooks published by Balbharati will no longer have blank pages included after every chapter in all subjects. State's school education department has decided to withdraw the decision from last year that had attracted wide-spread backlash from teachers, educationists and parents across states.

In a Government Resolution (GR) announced on Tuesday by the state's school education department, it declared that it has decided to withdraw the GR dated March 8, 2023 which had announced inclusion of blank pages after every chapter in textbooks prepared by Balbharati on Maharashtra State Board curriculum for classes 2 to 8. "From academic year 2025-26, textbooks will be provided without blank pages, as per the traditional practice of publishing textbooks," stated the GR.

The initiative of adding blank pages to the textbooks was announced in 2023 by the previous school education minister Deepak Kesarkar. This was applicable to only those textbooks prepared for free-of-cost distribution in state government-run schools. The idea then was reducing the weight of school bags by providing blank pages in textbooks, as an alternative to notebooks so that students will not have to carry notebooks separately. The decision, however, was met with severe criticism.

Noting public sentiments, School Education Minister Dada Bhuse took the decision to withdraw the initiative.

MLA face of the 'almost repoll' in Maharashtra wants to help AAP curb EVM 'tampering'

IF THE Nationalist Congress Party (SP) has announced its support to the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) in Delhi, at least one of its MLAs, Uttam Jankar, has gone one step further. He says he has reached out to the AAP to apprise it of the ways in which EVMs can be "manipulated", ahead of the polling — and counting — for the Delhi Assembly elections.

Jankar believes he is the right person to do so. While the NCP (SP) leader had won from the Malshiras constituency in the Maharashtra Assembly polls in November last year, voters in Markarwadi village falling under the seat had announced a "repoll" by ballot paper, raising questions over Jankar's BJP rival leading from there in the Assembly polls. Following threat of action by the authorities and the imposition of prohibitory orders, the "repoll" had been cancelled. Jankar was one of the 89 people booked for allegedly violating the prohibitory orders.

Jankar, who was in Delhi last week and met AAP Rajya Sabha MP Sanjay Singh, told The Indian Express that he will be meeting AAP booth-level leaders soon to apprise them of possible ways the BJP can "tamper with" EVMs.

"We had planned a protest at Jantar Mantar over the EVM discrepancies too, but it was called off due to security restrictions for Republic Day. I will meet AAP leaders and tell them how the BJP manipulates EVMs," Jankar said.

Sources said a protest along

with AAP leaders was still on the cards and may be held after January 31. The campaigning for the February 5 Delhi elections ends on February 3.

Jankar said that given the shortage of time, "there is a possibility that the meeting with AAP booth-level leaders may be held virtually, as it would be easier".

Sanjay Singh confirmed meeting the NCP (SP) MLA but said he was unaware about Jankar's possible meeting with booth-level leaders. Highly placed sources in the AAP added that the party had for its part roped in young engineers to keep an eye out on voting day. "On February 5, the team will monitor voting as we have information that the authorities, including the police, may try to slow down the voting process," a source said.

As per sources, other youths affiliated to the AAP in areas where the party is strong could be trained in the use of "sting devices" to record any incidents of "police or administrative high-handedness".

Asked about Jankar's remarks, the NCP (SP) was guarded, with the chief party spokesperson Mahesh Tapase only saying they were "strategically supporting" the AAP. "We want to defeat the BJP. With this in mind, we are supporting the AAP strategically as among the non-BJP parties in the fray in Delhi, it has the highest chance of coming to power," he said.

Advocating better coordination between non-BJP parties, Tapase said his party may also extend "support to the Congress on strategic seats" if the need arises.
