# Shooters may have fled to Nepal

In the Baba Siddique murder case, Mumbai crime branch sources have revealed that absconding shooter Shiv Kumar Gautam, Shubham Lonkar, and Zeeshan Akhtar may have fled to Nepal. Based on this information, two teams are conducting raids along the Indo-Nepal border and also in Haryana and Punjab.

Meanwhile, a fifth weapon has been seized from Pune; a pistol from the residence of accused Rupesh Mohol. The crime branch believes there is still another weapon and

### Five pistols brought to Mumbai to shoot Baba Siddique

In the Baba Siddique murder case, the Mumbai crime branch revealed another pistol was brought to Mumbai on Friday, marking the fourth weapon seized in the case. This country-made pistol, brought from Ludhiana, was found at the residence of accused Shiv Kumar Gautam, along with three rounds. This recovery followed the investigation; however, it is not the same pistol used in the crime, and the crime branch is still searching for it.

three rounds unaccounted for, estimating that around six weapons were brought to Mumbai in connection with the crime. The police have also seized four mobile phones and two SIM cards.

### Crime branch believes there is still another weapon and three live rounds unaccounted for

It has also been revealed that one of the accused, Sujit Kumar Singh, met absconding mastermind Zeeshan Akhtar in Ludhiana. After fleeing from Mumbai on September 12, Sujit Singh met Zeeshan on the orders of jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi's Canada-based brother Anmol. In Ludhiana,

Sujit handed over some funds to Zeeshan and put him in touch with another accused Nitin Sapre. While Sujit stayed in Ludhiana after the meeting, Zeeshan went to Kaithal, remaining in touch through the Jenga app. The messages on the app are still being investigated by the crime branch. The probe has also revealed that Sujit was in regular touch with another absconding accused, Shubham Lonkar.

As per the probe, from June 24 to sometime in July, Lonkar met accused Rupesh in Pune, with Zeeshan joining online. These meetings took place when Rupesh and two

of his associates were tasked with Siddique's murder. Following this meeting, Rupesh contacted the gang that provided weapons and agreed to undertake the contract from Sapre to kill Siddique; he even conducted a reconnaissance of Siddique's home and office.

On Monday, five accused were presented in the Killa Court, where they were granted one-day police custody. Those presented in court included Amit Kumar, Sujit Singh, Rupesh Mohol, Karan Salve, and Shivam Kohad. They will be presented again in the court on Tuesday.

## Ranade quits as VC of Gokhale Institute

**Pune:** Noted economist Dr Ajit Ranade has resigned as vice-chancellor of the Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics (GIPE), the institute's officials said on Monday.

Ranade was removed from the position on September 14 by the then chancellor Bibek Debroy, after a committee concluded that his appointment did not conform to the UGC regulations on minimum qualifications for the appointment of teachers and other academic staff.

Ranade had approached the Bombay High Court to challenge the decision and managed to secure a stay order. After the court stayed the order, Debroy, who was then chairman of the Economic Advisory Council

to the Prime Minister, resigned as chancellor on September 27, stating he had no moral right to continue on the post at GIPE. Debroy, 69, passed away in Delhi on November 1.

On October 22, Sanjeev Sanyal, the newly appointed chancellor of GIPE, withdrew the order of Ranade's removal as the vice-chancellor, allowing him to continue in the role.

In his resignation letter dated October 29, Ranade stated he is quitting the post due to personal reasons. "Please note that this letter of resignation does not in any way indicate my acceptance of any defect or ineligibility in my appointment as vice-chancellor in October 2021," Ranade said in the letter.

## Raj lashes at party splits, says don't insult your vote

At his first campaign rally, MNS leader says 'bow and arrow' is not the property of any Shiv Sena faction

The Raj Thackeray-led Maharashtra Navnirman Sena (MNS) launched its assembly poll campaign on Monday with a 'public sabha' in Dombivli in Thane district, which is the stronghold of Chief Minister Eknath Shinde. Notably, Raj Thackeray has not fielded his candidates in 10 constituencies in support of the Mahayuti alliance. In Kalyan Gramin, his party's Raju Patil is pitted against Rajesh More from Eknath Shinde-led Shiv Sena, and Subhash Bhoir from Uddhav Thackeray-led Shiv Sena (UBT).

Though on Mahayuti's side, Raj strangely lashed out at Uddhav and Shinde for the acrimonious fight over the Shiv Sena legacy. He said that the party name and 'bow and arrow' symbol belong to Balasaheb Thackeray and are not the property of either of the warring factions. Asserting that the state had been insulted due to splits in parties and MLAs switching sides for power, the MNS chief said voters must think hard before exercising their franchise.

Raj said his candidate Raju

Patil is not for sale and will stay loyal to the MNS. "Majha Raju Bikau nahi, Tikau aahe," he lashed. "Your vote must not be insulted.

No one knows whether a candidate is part of the Mahayuti or of the Maha Vikas Aghadi (MVA)," he said. "Eknath Shinde was against Ajit Pawar when in the MVA but took him in his lap for the sake of power along with the BJP. These politicians have taken voters for granted as they know no harm can come to them. Vote for the MNS for the betterment of the state,"

he said. Attacking Uddhav Thackeray for his claim that the BJP reneged on the promise to share chief ministership (after the 2019 assembly polls), the MNS chief asked why he did not object when Devendra Fadnis was announced as the CM candidate at a rally attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. By joining hands with the Congress and (undivided) NCP, Uddhav had removed the 'Hinduhridayasamrat' honorific of Balasaheb Thackeray, he claimed.

## Amid strains with INDIA bloc, SP solo

In a move that underscores deepening fissures within the INDIA bloc alliance, the Samajwadi Party (SP) has announced it will field candidates independently in Maharashtra.

Earlier discussions were aimed at securing 12 seats for SP within the alliance in Maharashtra, but the party opted to proceed with its own slate of candidates with no conclusive agreement in sight. The decision reflects SP chief Akhilesh Yadav's adoption of an 'Ekla chalo re' or "Go it alone" strategy to broaden SP's influence outside of its Uttar Pradesh stronghold, signalling a readiness to assert independence where alliances do not serve its ambitions.

In Maharashtra, SP has fielded candidates for 10 seats after Congress, leading the Maha Vikas Aghadi, did not accommodate its requests. Two of these seats were previously won by the SP and could risk vote splits.

Political analyst Nomita P. Kumar from the GRI Institute of Development Studies noted, "Unlike the NDA, the INDIA bloc contends with inter-party tensions rooted in overlapping voter bases and diverse political priorities."

## City gasping for breath after Diwali

Following Diwali celebrations, Mumbai hospitals are seeing a gradual rise in respiratory cases, including ICU admissions. Doctors attribute this to both weather whiplash and worsening air pollution due to traffic congestion and unchecked bursting of firecrackers.

Dr Swapnil Mehta, a pulmonologist at Dr LH Hiranandani Hospital, noted that respiratory-related hospital visits surge by nearly 50% after Diwali. "Diwali is often linked to a rise in respiratory illnesses, particularly due to heightened air pollution from smoke, particulate matter, and harmful chemicals released into the atmosphere. Trends from past years show a significant spike in air pollution levels post-Diwali, leading to an uptick in respiratory conditions," he said. While children, senior citizens, and persons with pre-existing respiratory conditions remain the most vulnerable, doctors report that even young, healthy working adults are being affected.

Dr Pratik Samdhani, a physician at Breach Candy Hospital, said, "We're seeing

severe pneumonia cases - some viral, some bacterial - that are taking longer to resolve. The weather and air pollution are major contributing factors. Firecrackers during Diwali increase particulate matter in the air, worsening pollution. Now that Diwali is over, we may see even more cases."

Nanavati Max Super Speciality Hospital's director of pulmonology and sleep medicine, Dr Salil Bendre, advised deep breathing exercises, particularly those rooted in yoga, such as pranayama. He said that strengthening of respiratory muscles and enhancing lung capacity help our lungs better cope with pollutants. He added, "It's also advisable to limit outdoor physical activities and prioritise indoor breathing exercises. Staying well-hydrated also supports respiratory health by aiding muscle function and keeping airways clear."

## Man found dead in hotel, booked for sex assault on teen

A man from Surat, Gujarat, was found dead under suspicious circumstances in a Mumbai hotel on Saturday evening. After a probe was launched, the police found that a 14-year-old girl was with him in the room at the time of his death. Later, the girl's mother alleged that the deceased, Sanjay Kumar Tiwari, 42, had sexually assaulted the minor girl. Resulting in a parallel case under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act.

The incident unfolded on Saturday at 6.15pm when the manager of Hotel Super alerted the police about Tiwari being found unconscious in his room. He was taken to JJ Hospital where he was pronounced dead. Police

later confirmed that a 14-year-old girl, reportedly acquainted with Tiwari, was present in the room. Later, the police interviewed the girl's mother, who alleged that the deceased had sexually assaulted her daughter. The police seized certain medicines from the hotel room and said that the forensic report is awaited to ascertain if Tiwari died of an overdose.

The police said Tiwari was acquainted with the minor girl's parents and allegedly brought the girl to Mumbai under the pretence of sight-seeing. To obtain a hotel room, he allegedly presented fake documents, claiming the girl to be his daughter.

The D B Marg police have filed an accidental death report and also registered charges against the deceased under the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita and the POCSO Act.

## Bullet train: 9 bridges done

**Mumbai:** In a significant milestone in the Mumbai-Ahmedabad bullet train project, nine river bridges have been completed between Vapi and Surat. In total, 12 of the 20 planned river bridges in Gujarat have now been completed as part of this vital infrastructure project. The bridges connecting Vapi and Surat include those over the Kolak, Par, Auranga, and Kaveri rivers, among others.

## Contractual health staff reinstated

The BMC has decided to reinstate its contractual healthcare professionals at peripheral hospitals. The staff - doctors and technicians - had been hired to fill vacant posts but the civic body abolished 1,230 posts in August, announcing only last month that it would not appoint new personnel.

The FPJ reported on October 23 how the staff discovered that their contracts won't be renewed, resulting in a debate on how it would impact patient care.

A doctor said, "It was the Diwali weekend, and no one was giving us a clear picture on whether we should come to work or if our services were no longer required. On Monday morning, we came to know that a circular has been issued to reinstate us until further notice."

## Post failure: ₹30 refund and ₹2,000 for mental agony

The South Mumbai District Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission has ruled against the General Post Office (GPO) and the Bhandup postal department for failing to deliver a registered letter on time, holding them accountable for deficient service. The commission ordered the GPO to refund postal charges of Rs30 and pay Rs2,000 each for mental agony and litigation costs to the complainant.

The case stems from an incident on November 20, 2020, when 78-year-old RTI activist Bhagwan Karia, a Mulund resident, sent an appeal via registered post, paying Rs30 in fees. The letter, however, was returned marked "Not Known" and "Closed." Karia, seeking clarifi-

cation on the failed delivery, was informed that the delay was due to postman Sushant Chalkhe's oversight, prompting him to file a complaint with the consumer commission.

In response, the postal department argued that under Rule 170 of Post Office Guide Rules reads, a maximum fine of Rs100 applies for undelivered or delayed mail, contending that this was the maximum compensation Karia should receive.

However, after reviewing arguments from both sides, the commission ruled that as a service provider, the post department is obligated to deliver services accurately and on time, particularly when fees are paid for registered services. It held the department liable for deficiency in service, ordering the compensation.
