Munambam Waqf row: IUML chief meets priests

KOCHI: The top leaders of the Indian Union Muslim League (IUML) met Latin Catholic priests on Monday and held discussions to resolve the ongoing Waqf land issue in the coastal hamlet of Munambam in Ernakulam district.

Several families have been fighting against the Waqf Board's claim on their properties in Munambam, located about 35 km from Kochi, with the support of the Latin Catholic Church. They allege that the Waqf Board's claim is legally invalid.

IUML state chief Panakkad Sadiq Ali Shihab Thangal and senior leader P K Kunhalikutty visited Verapoly Archbishop Joseph Kalathiparambil at the bishop's house.

Bishop Kalathiparambil and Thangal later told reporters that their meeting was very warm and positive. Everybody

who took part in the discussion wanted to resolve the issue as soon as possible through legal means, they said.

"Several good suggestions were made during the discussion. Our collective opinion is that there are legal and factual issues involved, and it is the government's responsibility to make effective interventions in the matter," Thangal said.

He also said those who took part in the meeting wanted the government to urgently convene a meeting of everyone involved in the issue and resolve it amicably.

The meeting of the IUML leaders and church came amidst growing resentment among a significant portion of the Christian population in the state regarding the LDF and UDP's stance on the Waqf (Amendment) Bill, 2024, introduced by the Centre. PTI

AP bins two-children norm in civic polls

CHIEF Minister N Chandrababu Naidu, who had recently underscored the need for increasing population, has come up with bills to remove the restriction on those with two or more children from contesting in local body elections.

The Andhra Pradesh Legislative Assembly on Monday passed the bills to amend the AP Panchayat Raj and AP Municipal Acts. As per the amendments, individuals irrespective of the number of children they have, can contest the local body elections hereafter. In fact, it

was the Naidu government, which amended the Panchayat Raj and Municipal Administration Department Acts in 1994 to control the population by incorporating the 'Two children norm' to disqualify individuals with more than two children from contesting the local body elections. Now, Naidu has shifted focus on population management, and came up with further amendments to the Acts to allow those having more children to contest the local body elections.

Accordingly, the State gov-

ernment tabled the bills to amend the Andhra Pradesh Panchayat Raj Act, 1994, the Andhra Pradesh Municipalities Act, 1965, and the Municipal Corporation Act, 1955 to relax the two children norm.

While reviewing the population policy three decades after implementation of the two children norm, the government found that as per the National Family Health Survey, the Total Fertility Rate (TFR) declined from 3.7 children in 1992-92 to 2.1 in 2019-21 in rural areas, and from 2.6 in 2001 to 1.5 in recent years in

urban areas.

"As the declining fertility rates, population stabilisation and changing socio-economic conditions proved to be outdated and counterproductive, the government felt that repealing sections intended to control the population, will promote inclusive governance, reflect contemporary social values and align with global best practices and demographic trends," the bills read.

The government came up with the bills to amend AP Panchayat Raj Act, 1994, AP Municipalities Act, 1965 and Municipal Corporation Act, 1955.

Farmer dies in jumbo attack in Erode's Kadambur hills

A 55-year-old farmer died after being attacked by a wild elephant at Kadambur hills in the district on Sunday night.

The deceased was identified as K Maran, a resident of Anaikarai village near Kuthiyalathur. Police said, "Maran was a farmer, who owned five acres of land where he cultivated maize.

There is a reserve forest boundary 50 metres away from his land and he used to stay in the fields every night to protect crops from wild boars."

On Sunday night, around 10.40 pm, the 55-year-old went to the farm. Suddenly a wild elephant came out and attacked him, killing Maran on the spot. Hearing noises, people in nearby fields rushed there, but the elephant receded back to the forest, the police added.

On information, Kadambur forest range officials and police conducted an investigation at the spot.

Police recovered Maran's body and sent it to Sathya-mangalam Government Hospital for post-mortem examination.

A case has been registered and further investigation is under way.

TEMPLE police and forest officials sent the bodies to the Tiruchendur GH for postmortem. Sources said Udhayakumar's father was also a mahout. Police have registered a case and initiated an investigation. Speaking to TNIE, District Forest Officer (DFO) Revathi Raman said a six-member team, comprising veterinarians, has been deployed to monitor the health and behaviour of the elephant.

"The attack is a sudden provocation, and it is hard to ascertain the cause. The elephant will be observed for a certain period," he said. Previously, an elephant at the Tiruchendur temple had attacked its mahout in 1992, and another elephant, Shanthi had attacked her mahout in 2001. In both incidents, the mahouts had escaped with injuries, temple sources said.

TN asks 50% more disaster relief fund

STALIN also expressed concern over Tamil Nadu's diminishing share of tax revenue, which fell from 7.831% under the 9th Finance Commission to 4.079% under the 15th Commission.

Drawing attention to the state's ageing population, he said that currently, the average age of the population in Tamil Nadu is 36.4 years, which is 9.5 years higher than that of UP. Hence, the need for social security, healthcare and other services has increased, he said. He elaborated on the natural disasters, the rap-

id urbanisation and the need for centre's support to carry out relief and rescue work.

Besides, the state, in its memorandum to the 16th Finance Commission, has urged that the devolution of funds must be based on the population data of the 1971 Census. The state has also called for increased weightage to be given to demographic performance, economic contribution to the national GDP, and urbanisation in determining resource allocation. Addressing the state's vulnerability to natural disasters, TN requested a 50% increase in the State Disaster Risk Management Fund

(SDRMF) corpus for 2026-27, with a 90:10 funding ratio between centre and the states.

The government called for raising local body grants to at least 5% of the divisible pool, with an equitable 50:50 allocation between rural and urban areas.

The memorandum also outlined a financial requirement of ₹6,84,500 crore to support TN's economic and developmental goals. Major requests include ₹43,600 crore for industrialisation, ₹5,32,000 crore for urban infrastructure, ₹62,000 crore for the power sector, ₹7,000 crore for public transport modernisation, and ₹25,000 crore for water management initiatives.

HYDERABAD city police are seeking legal advice on whether to register a case against Andhra Pradesh Deputy Chief Minister Pawan Kalyan over his alleged remarks about the Old City of Hyderabad and certain leaders during an election campaign for the BJP in Maharashtra.

Two days ago, during a public meeting in Maharashtra, Pawan claimed that some people from the Old City, when they visit Maharashtra, say, "Give us 15 minutes."

He stated, "If people come from Hyderabad and say 'we will see', it's very simple — this is our land, and we should know where to stand. If they come with swords, should we not defend ourselves? Who has the courage to lay a hand on us? Think about that."

Hyd residents take Lagcherla issue to Delhi

A few residents of Lagcherla met the National Human Rights Commission, SC/ST Commission, and Women's Commission in New Delhi on Monday, voicing grievances over alleged violence during a public hearing on a proposed pharma cluster and the subsequent arrests of fellow villagers.

They accused the State government of favouring pharmaceutical firms linked to CM A Revanth Reddy's family, offering meagre compensation for their lands. BRS working president KT Rama Rao condemned the government for oppressing tribals and farmers and criticised AICC leader Rahul Gandhi for his silence.

Villagers described harassment, arrests, and assaults, with an elderly farmer lamenting the loss of their livelihood. BRS MLC Satyavati Rathod alleged threats and tyranny by the Congress government.

K'taka may sue Maha govt over 'misleading' ads

THE Karnataka Congress government is considering legal action against the Maharashtra government for publishing allegedly misleading advertisements about its guarantee schemes, Chief Minister Siddaramaiah said on Monday.

The ads, released ahead of Maharashtra's Assembly elections, claimed Karnataka's schemes were not implemented. Siddaramaiah countered this, stating his government

spends ₹56,000 crore annually on the five schemes, which contributed to Congress' return to power in Karnataka last year.

One advertisement criticised Karnataka's schemes with the tagline "Vaada kiya, Dhoka diya" ("Made promises, but betrayed"). Siddaramaiah called the ads false and accused Prime Minister Narendra Modi of making similar baseless allegations during his recent Maharashtra visit, where Modi claimed Congress was looting Karnataka to fund its campaigns.



The Karnataka CM clarified that BPL cards of ineligible beneficiaries would be cancelled, not those of eligible individuals. He also highlighted Congress' initiatives, including providing free rice since 2017,

contrasting them with BJP's alleged failures in Gujarat, Madhya Pradesh, and Bihar.

Siddaramaiah criticised Union Minister HD Kumaraswamy and other BJP leaders, questioning their silence on Karnataka's rightful tax share. "Karnataka pays ₹4.5 lakh crore in taxes but gets only ₹59,000 crore in return," he said.

The government is reviewing legal options against Maharashtra's advertisements, asserting they were issued for electoral gain.
