VMC razes makeshift pedestrian bridge

Vadodra: Close on the heels of the Morbi bridge tragedy, the Vadodra Municipal Corporation (VMC) razed a makeshift pedestrian bridge that was erected by the residents of a settlement in the Kasamla Kabrastan area near Nagarwada, on Wednesday to prevent similar accidents in the future. The bridge was utilized by the residents of around 20 to 25 dwellings located on one side of the storm water drain to cross over to the other side. The bridge was constructed from planks, angles, and other loose materials. The residents informed Atul Gamechi, an activist, about the bridge while highlighting their situation. "The only alternative route is long and that too passing through the water drains. Again, walking along the storm water drain is also risky

SURAT: District officials will ensure that each voter in the city and district receive their voter information slip seven days before the polling on December 1. It will make the voting process smooth for the voter as all important details will be mentioned in the slip. Compared to 2017, this time

the number of registered voters has been increased by 7.25 lakh in the district. According to district election officials, the increase in the number of voters in the district is 18 per cent. In the 16 constituencies of the district, a total of 47.39 lakh voters are registered of which 25.46 lakh

are men, 21.92 lakh are women and 159 are third gender. Among the voters, 23,859 are above 80 years old and 423 are divyang voters. In this election, 36,556 are first-time voters. Each constituency will have seven all-women polling booths, one booth managed by divyang people.

Rajkot: Student sodomized in university hostel

RAJKOT: A horrifying case of ragging has surfaced in a private university of Rajkot city with a 19-year-old student being allegedly sodomized by five other students after being blackmailed with his nude video of bathing. The incident was reported from the hostel of Marwadi University located on Morbi Road and police have detained three of the five students. One of accused is a minor and will be tried in a juvenile court. On October 20 night, the victim's father approached the Kuvada Road police station with a complaint after his son broke down before the family and narrated his ordeal. Two days ago, the boy contacted his elder sister and pleaded that he did not want to stay in the hostel. She sensed something fishy and informed her father. When the two went to meet him on Thursday, he broke down and revealed the gory details of ragging. The complaint states that three of the hostel staff recorded his nude video last month while he was bathing. They threatened to circulate

the video on social media if he did not follow their instructions. Four of the accused then gave him three options, chop his private part, chop his ears or jump from the hostel's terrace. When the victim started crying and pleading with them, the accused then told him that they had another option which he should agree to. GSLSA's member secretary R A Trivedi said that under the guidance of the Gujarat high court's Justice Sonia Gokani, public awareness campaign under the banner of 'Empowerment of Citizens Through Legal Awareness' and 'Haq Hamara Bhi To Hai' has been organized across the state. The programme will continue till November 13. GSLSA aims to organize legal awareness camps on different legal subjects at all the gram panchayats in the state. Sunset ride: Ropeway operator booked in Gujarat

RAJKOT: The forest department has filed an offence against Usha Breco Ltd, the company operating the Ginnar ropeway service in Rajkot. The offence was filed a couple of days ago for operating ropeway after sunset, which is in violation of Wildlife Protection Act. The forest department filed a first offence report (FOR) against responsible person of the company after issuing notice to the company twice.

According to the FOR, the Ginnar ropeway falls under the sanctuary area and as per rules, nobody is allowed before sunrise and after sunset in the protected area. The firm Usha Breco Ltd was slapped with notice twice before the forest department registered a FOR against it under section 27 of the Wildlife Protection Act. The firm could be fined under the provisions of the Act. According to the forest officials, the company in reply to the notices had stated that they had stopped the ropeway operations on time. But because of the rush people who had gone up the Ginnar mountain got delayed, hence they had to operate the ropeway after sunset to bring them back. However, the forest officials argued that the company needed to manage the timings according to the rush. Talking to TOI, deputy conservator of forests in Junagadh Akshay Joshi said, "The company has endangered the safety of the people."
