Class 8 student murdered in Bareilly

PNS ■ LUCKNOW

In a shocking incident reported from Hafizganj police station area of Bareilly, a Class 8 student, Ashish Sharma, was murdered by slitting his throat on Wednesday night.

His body was found lying in a pool of blood in Banjariya village after which the police reached the spot and started investigation. The body was sent for post-mortem.

Police have picked up two people from the village on suspicion and are interrogating them.

According to the student's father, Rakesh Sharma, his 14-year-old son Ashish was having dinner on Wednesday evening when someone called him. After this he left. When he did not return for a long time, the family members started searching for him. At around 2 o'clock in the night, Ashish's body was found lying on straw near a tube well in a field outside the village. The family has no enmity with anyone. There was a mark of cut with a sharp weapon on Ashish's neck.

On receiving information about the incident, Hafizganj police and Superintendent of Police (Rural) Mukesh Chandra Mishra reached the spot. Police talked to the family members and villagers. Ashish was good in studies.

Police have collected evidence from the incident site. During investigation, a knife used for cutting vegetables was found in the field.

Youth's death shrouded in mystery, body recovered from pond

Mystery has shrouded the death of an undergraduate student, whose body was recovered from a pond in a Bakshi-Ka-Talab village on Thursday. Identified as Prabhakar aka Adarsh (22) of Devi Rukhara village, he was missing since Wednesday after he left for Behadi village, also in BKT, to purchase household goods.

His body was later recovered from a pond in Tikari village. The police said he died of drowning while bathing in the pond in a drunken state. The police sent the body for autopsy and started investigation. The police did not explain how they came to know that Prabhakar was in a drunken state while bathing in the pond.

The incident came to light when his family members called him on Thursday morn-

ing and someone else answered the call. His uncle Ram Shanker said a man from Tikari village attended the call and told him that he was passing by the pond and picked the phone from there. He told Ram Shanker that a cycle, a pair of slippers and garments were also lying near the pond.

Ram Shanker and others reached the scene along with a police team and divers. The divers fished out the body, which was sent for autopsy. Sub-inspector Shesh Mani Mishra said: "As per locals, Prabhakar consumed liquor which he had purchased from a shop about 200 metres away from the pond." He claimed that Prabhakar died due to drowning while bathing in the pond in a drunken state.

Meanwhile, a youth ended his life at his house in Alambagh. Identified as Govind (25) of Shram Vihar

Nagar in the area, he was found hanging from the ceiling with a nylon rope tied around his neck. His mother Mamta was the first to find him hanging. The deceased was a loader driver. Police sent the body for autopsy and started further investigation.

ATTACKED
A doctor was attacked by his opponents inside Sadar tehsil under Wazirganj police station on cancellation of the contract on Wednesday. Dr Sushil Kumar Yadav of Unnao, along with Dr Abhishek Bansal, had visited the tehsil to get the contract cancelled.

"My opponents Amrendra Singh Ashish and their unidentified aides were against this and they attacked me. My mobile phone was damaged and my gold chain broke and was lost. I suffered injuries in the attack," he said.

arguments with the son of the local gram pradhan over urinating on their boundary wall. The incident took place in Madha Machhijheel in Bidhuna Kotwali area.

Reports said that Mohit, son of gram pradhan of Madha Machhijheel, was urinating on the boundary wall of his neigh-

bour Udayveer Singh's house. This led to an altercation between Mohit and Udayveer Singh. The neighbours intervened and pacified them.

A few minutes later, Mohit, along with about half a dozen of his henchmen, attacked Singh at his house. Udayveer Singh and his wife Lakshmi

Devi were critically injured in the attack while his aged mother Shanti Devi (70) died on the spot. On getting information, the police reached the spot and admitted Udayveer and Lakshmi Devi to community health centre in Bidhuna. Seeing their serious condition, the doctors referred both to Saifai PGI. Shanti Devi's body was sent for post-mortem.

Superintendent of Police Charu Sharma has formed four teams to arrest the accused. The SP said that a case had been registered against Mohit and his associates under relevant sections of the Indian Penal Code and they would be arrested soon.

Meanwhile, a man was arrested for allegedly urinating on a woman patient inside a hospital ward in Ballia, police said on Thursday.

"We have arrested Vikas Singh for urinating on a woman inside the district hospital. An FIR regarding the incident has also been registered," police official Vaibhav Pandey said.

According to the complaint of the victim, a resident of Sukhpura village, the incident happened on Tuesday night. A man, who was later identified as Vikas Singh, entered the ward she was admitted to and urinated on her as she lay in the bed.

The woman alleged that Singh hurled abuse at her when she opposed him. Singh was arrested on Wednesday, police said.

Two more members of human trafficking gang held by ATS

Sleuths of the Anti-Terror Squad (ATS) of Uttar Pradesh claimed to have arrested two more members of a human trafficking gang involved in facilitating forged Indian identity to citizens of Bangladesh and Myanmar and later sending them on job to other countries or even in India.

In an official communiqué released on Thursday, the ATS claimed that they were receiving intelligence inputs that a syndicate had been formed by some persons, who hid their identities and got illegal infiltrators settled in India on the basis of fake Indian documents and by giving them financial support, they promoted anti-national activities.

This intelligence was further developed both by physical and electronic surveillance

and the first breakthrough was made on October 11 this year when the team members nabbed Adilur Rahman Asrafi, a resident of Dhaka, Bangladesh, Abu Huraira Ghazi, a resident of Kalutara, Rameswarpur, Hasnabad, District North 24 Parganas, West Bengal, and Sheikh Najibul Haq, a resident of 1, Purva Haldharpura, Guranbos Basanti, District 24 Parganas South, West Bengal.

The ATS registered a case 12/2023 under sections 120B, 419, 420, 467, 468, 471, 370 of the Indian Penal Code, Section 14 of Foreigners Act 1946 and sections 12(1) and 12(2) of Passport Act, 1967.

Following interrogation of the arrested accused, the ATS worked on the information and last Tuesday, arrested a Bangladeshi woman, Tania Mandal, native of Pirojpur, Bangladesh, and Ibrahim

Khan, also a native of Bangladesh, soon after they crossed the India-Bangladesh international border to enter India. The arrest was made in Bengaluru.

The communiqué said that Adilur Rahman, with the help of the syndicate, had brought Tania Mandal into India. Thereafter Tania Mandal was sold to Ibrahim Khan for Rs 25,000. Presently Tania Mandal is working as a labourer in a textile factory in Bengaluru.

Ibrahim Khan was residing in Bengaluru by concealing his identity by making forged Indian documents and Indian passports.

Thus, a total of five accused have been arrested so far in the above registered case. Further legal action is being taken by bringing the above two arrested accused to Lucknow on transit remand from Bengaluru.

Man abducted by 'victims' of job fraud, rescued

Sushant Golf City police on Thursday rescued a man, who was abducted allegedly for not returning the money which he owes to the abductors. The police arrested five accused, who were identified as Vikas Babu, Vinod Kumar, Amir Khan, Shaban and Jamshed — all of Lakhimpur Kheri district.

The police also recovered a car, a country-made pistol with a cartridge, and a scooter from the possession of the accused, who were nabbed from Lakhimpur Kheri. The victim, Prakhari Seth of Alankanda Enclave in the area, was handed over to his family.

The accused reportedly confessed to their crime and claimed that Prakhari had taken Rs 20 lakh from them for facilitating their jobs in Nagar Nigam and FCI some time ago, and was not

returning the money despite having failed to do them the favour.

They further disclosed that they called Prakhari to settle the issue at a place near Lulu Mall and bundled him inside a car soon after he reached there.

Vikas took Prakhari's scooter and mobile phone and travelled to Lakhimpur Kheri via a different route. Prakhari was held hostage at the house of Jamshed in Oel (Kheri). He was later shifted to another house owned by one Nazim. The house is said to be abandoned. The accused allegedly tortured him at both the places to force him to cough up the money. The accused used the victim's mobile phone to call his wife and demanded Rs 20 lakh as ransom. However, as the police had put his number on surveillance, their location was traced. Their confession matched

the police claim that they had demanded money as ransom from the victim's wife around 3 am on November 8.

Prakhari's wife Richa Seth had lodged a complaint around 10 pm on November 7, stating that some unidentified miscreants had abducted her husband around 2 pm on November 7. She had said that Prakhari left the house on scooter, saying he was going to meet someone but did not return home and later his mobile number was also switched off. She had also told the police that she got a call from Prakhari's mobile number and was asked to pay Rs 20 lakh as ransom. The accused told Richa that Prakhari had taken Rs 20 lakh for facilitating jobs to them and that they would not release him until they got their money back. They had also threatened to kill Richa and her children.

RLD leader supports Dial 112 contractual women workers

The protest of Dial 112 contractual women workers in Lucknow is getting support from opposition parties.

On Thursday, Rashtriya Lok Dal national spokesperson Anil Dubey reached the Eco Garden where UP Dial 112 women workers have been staging demonstrations to press their five-point demands, including hike in salary.

Samajwadi Party chief Akhilesh Yadav has also posted tweets on X in support of the protesting Dial 112 contractual women workers.

Extending support to their demands, Dubey, who reached the dharna site on the instructions of RLD president Jayant Chaudhary, also took part in the dharna in support of women workers.

Speaking at the dharna site, Dubey criticised the government for registering two cases against the protesting Dial 112 women employees with the aim to crush the protest. He said the government was conspiring to sack the women employees who were working to strengthen the police system and this was condemnable.

Dubey said the protesting Dial 112 women employees were sitting in the open when winter was setting in and the government was not paying any heed to their demands despite the Bharatiya Janata Party claims that its government was pro-women.

"Their claim on women empowerment and employment to youths is merely to take their votes. Dial 112 service has also been privatised like Railways and Airport," he said.

While assuring support to the Dial 112 women workers protesting at Eco Garden, Dubey said that the RLD leadership would take up their five-point demands to higher level and also raise the issue in the Rajya Sabha.

The protesting Dial 112 women workers are demanding salary hike, casual leave, weekly leave, maternity leave, permanent job and withdrawal of cases registered against them.

Meanwhile, the Communist Party of India (Marxist-Leninist) also supported the agitation of the women employees of Dial 112 and condemned the police action against them.

CPI (ML) state secretary Sudhakar Yadav said in a statement on Thursday that the Bharatiya Janata Party's slogan of women empowerment was merely lip service. "When it comes to implementation, they make a mess of it. Due to the government's arrogance, the women employees of Dial 112 had to leave their workplace and to take to the streets to press their demands. But the Yogi Adityanath government has been maintaining silence

on their economic exploitation for a long time and when the girls raised their voice, instead of accepting their just demands, it is trying to intimidate and silence them by filing FIRs against them," he said.

Meanwhile, another case was registered against women call takers on the complaint of the project director of the company which had been awarded the contract to run Dial 112 contact service centre.

In his complaint, the project director of We Win Limited, Syed Ahmed said the company took the charge on November 3 midnight. "All the call takers were sent offer letters but only 150 accepted the offers and came back to work. Later on November 6, several of the call takers went on a strike at gate number 4 of the Dial 112 office after their shift was over. The agitating workers did not resume duties, causing the services to get hampered. They did not even listen to the police and misbehaved with them. To run Dial 112, the company started a fresh hiring drive, and a batch of 100 joined from November 8" he said.

LDA auctions commercial properties for ₹425 crore

The Lucknow Development Authority on Thursday auctioned commercial properties for Rs 425 crore, much more than their initially estimated cost. Vice-Chairman Indramani Tripathi said that the prices would likely increase further in the coming days, anticipating a significant improvement in the financial standing of the LDA.

Facing financial constraints with an almost empty exchequer and no incoming revenue, the development authority struggled to initiate new projects or complete existing ones. Though they sought special funds from the state government in January, their plea was rejected.

Supervised by Lucknow Divisional Commissioner, Roshan Jacob, the auction

began at 10 am on Thursday and concluded by 6 pm. Tripathi highlighted the sale of a commercial plot in Ahimamau area, measuring 11,000 square metres, initially estimated at Rs 30 crore but sold for Rs 24.34 crore.

The auction also included shops fetching Rs 24.58 crore, exceeding the estimated value of Rs 24.85 crore.

The immediate registration ensured that the buyers could not deny their purchases, and a unique feature of this e-auction was the requirement for buyers to deposit money immediately, eliminating monthly installment options.

The divisional commissioner assured the buyers that confirmation letters would be issued within a fortnight after the auction, held at the main hall of the LDA headquarters.

Two killed in road accident

Budaun (PTI): Two men riding a motorcycle were killed when they were hit by an unknown vehicle from behind in the Zarif Nagar Police Station area, an officer said on Thursday. Station House Officer Rakesh Kumar said, "Nanhe (25) and Maniram (23) who were travelling on a bike were killed after being hit by an unknown vehicle from behind on Budaun-Delhi road Wednesday evening." Two other men who were riding the same bike and sustained serious injuries have been admitted to a hospital, he said.

In Bareilly, a 22-year-old man died of electrocution at a Ramleela fair in the Bhojpur Police Station area of the district, police said on Thursday. Bareilly DM Ravindra Kumar identified the victim as one Shiv Kumar. He had gone to see the Ramleela fair where he was electrocuted on Wednesday evening.
