FIRE IN OIL TANKER

Petrol pump dealers assn blames failure of static earthing

Petrol pump dealers association has said that failure of static earthing caused fire, which broke out in an oil tanker at Bharat Petroleum Corporation Limited oil filling depot at Bhauri Bakania under Khajuri Sadak police station area on Friday. The mishap left seven people injured.



Static earthing is important in processes dealing with volatile products, where a single spark can lead to disastrous consequences. Association president Ajay Singh said, "There must be proper static earthing at time of refilling oil tankers at depots. If it fails, it may lead to fire. It might be reason behind this tragedy."

There are three compartments inside the tanker and each has capacity of 4,000 litres. At the time of the accident, one compartment of the tanker was filled with petrol, while the other was being filled with diesel. The blast took place in the third compartment. Investigation into the incident has begun.

Chirayaj Hospital director Dr Ajay Goenka said, "Four out of seven injured persons are critical. Three of them are on ventilator. Doctors are monitoring the situation round the clock."

The survivor further added that few of the passengers asked the driver to check the problem properly before starting. But none of them asked to first drop them and then go for repairs.

Another thirty-year-old labourer Subhash Choudhary was in deep slumber. But a loud thud broke his sleep and his dream soon turned into a nightmare as he saw people writhing in pain and lying in pools of blood around him. Although Choudhary survived, he suffered injuries

on his hand and legs. He was going to his hometown Maharajganj in Uttar Pradesh from Hyderabad to celebrate Diwali with his loved ones. But the accident shattered his dream as he is now undergoing treatment in a hospital in Rewa.

"I was fast asleep and celebrating Diwali in my dream. I had gone to sleep after having dinner with fellow passengers. But I woke up to a loud thud. In a second or two, cries like 'God save me. God help me' resonated in our bus," he said.

"My dream soon turned into a nightmare and I literally felt stars were tumbling around me. I was writhing in pain and there were several others like me. I saw helpless people in pools of blood inside the bus. Some of them were

not responding, while some others were gasping for breath," he added. Choudhary is currently being treated at the Sanjay Gandhi Hospital in Rewa.
