'No fans' safest for Tokyo Olympics, says expert

Final decision on Monday, says organiser

Tokyo, June 19: The safest way to hold the Tokyo Olympics is without any fans, the top medical adviser to the Japanese government said in a report on Friday.

Dr. Shigeru Omi's recommendation seems to put him at odds with organisers and the International Olympic Committee with the Olympics opening in just five weeks on July 23.

Fans from abroad were banned several months ago, and organisers are to

announce early next week if some local fans should be allowed.

"We believe the risks of infections inside venues would be lowest by holding the event with no fans," said the report, which was compiled by a group of 26 experts led by Omi, a former World Health Organisation official. It was submitted to the government and Olympic officials widely circulated reports say the government wants to allow up to 10,000

people at some sports and cultural events. This policy is expected to be applied to the Olympics with smaller ceilings at smaller venues, and differences for indoor and outdoor venues.

"We believe it would be most desirable not to have fans inside venues," Omi told a news conference on Friday after submitting the written report.

"Regardless of holding the Olympics or not, Japan has continuing risks of a resurgence of

the infections that puts pressure on the medical systems," Omi said that putting fans in the venues increased the risk and not only there but afterward as people exit. He said the Olympics easily get more attention from the public than other sporting events and are likely to trigger more movements and more partying.

Seiko Hashimoto, the president of the local organising committee, said that the final decision on fans was likely to be made on Monday in a meeting with organisers, the IOC, the Tokyo metropolitan government, the Japanese government, and the International Paralympic Committee.

Hashimoto said if Tokyo decides to allow fans, the rules will have to be much stricter than for half-filled stadiums in Japan for baseball or soccer. She also said organisers would have to be ready to suddenly ban local fans if conditions change.

"Dr. Omi has indicated that ideally the best way is to hold the games without spectators that was his recommendation. But if we are to hold the games with spectators, Dr. Omi also had his recommendations," Hashimoto said.

Organisers said about 3.6 million-3.7 million tickets are still held by residents of Japan. About 800,000 tickets were returned locally. The total number of tickets originally announced for the Olympics was about 7.8 million.

Africa in distress

World Health Organisation (WHO) officials warned on Friday about rising numbers of COVID-19 cases and deaths in Africa, saying a huge number of countries have been forced to suspend giving second doses of coronavirus vaccines because of short supplies. WHO Director-General Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus cited a 52 per cent rise in coronavirus cases and a 32 per cent rise in deaths in Africa related to the pandemic in the last week, and we expect things only to get worse.

A growing number of wealthy countries have pledged to share billions of doses, but WHO officials say time is of the essence. Dr. Bruce Aylward, a top adviser to the WHO chief, estimated more than 30 or 40 countries initially set to receive second doses of AstraZeneca doses won't be getting them right away. He says the U.N. health agency was working with manufacturers for more doses.

Canada border cubs

Canada's Public Safety Minister said Friday border restrictions on nonessential travel with the United States will be extended until July 21. Public Safety Minister Bill Blair tweeted the move has been made in coordination with the U.S. He said Canada's number one priority is to keep Canadians safe during the pandemic. Blair also noted the government plans to release details on Monday about fully vaccinated Canadians who return to the country.

The Canadian government has said it anticipates fully vaccinated Canadian citizens who test negative for COVID-19 will be exempt from two weeks of quarantine when returning to the country sometime in early July. Dr. Theresa Tam, Canada's chief public health officer, has said she would like to see 75 per cent of eligible Canada residents fully vaccinated before advising that border restrictions be loosened for tourists and business travelers who aren't citizens or permanent residents.

Brazil behind US

The official COVID-19 death toll in Brazil is about to hit 500,000, the second highest in the world behind the United States. Official data showed some 2,000 COVID-19 deaths per day in Brazil in the past week, representing one-fifth the global total. Only 11 per cent of Brazil's population is fully vaccinated.

Brazil's Senate is investigating how the toll got so high, focusing on why President Jair Bolsonaro's far-right government ignored opportunities to buy vaccines for months while it relentlessly pushed hydroxychloroquine.

That's a malaria drug that rigorous studies have shown to be ineffective in treating COVID-19. The nationally televised hearings have contained scientific claims, counterclaims and outright falsehoods. The skepticism has extended to the death toll itself, with Bolsonaro arguing the official tally from his own Health Ministry is greatly exaggerated. However, some epidemiologists saying the real death number is significantly higher perhaps hundreds of thousands higher.

AstraZeneca pulled up

A Belgian court ruled on Friday that coronavirus vaccine-maker AstraZeneca had committed a serious breach of its contract with the European Union amid a major legal battle over delivery obligations that has tarnished the company's image. The court ordered AstraZeneca to deliver a total of 80.2 million doses to the EU from the time the contract was agreed up until Sept. 27. The ruling said the company did not appear to have made a best reasonable effort to meet the delivery schedule because it had not used its U.K. production sites.

But the Anglo-Swedish company claimed victory, saying that this was far fewer than the 120 million doses that the EU's executive branch, the European Commission, was seeking in total by the end of June. It also welcomed the court's acknowledgement that it was under unprecedented pressure. AstraZeneca was seen as a key pillar of the EU's vaccine rollout.

India again avers ball in China's court on border peace

New Delhi, June 19: India on Friday said the onus is on China to address the remaining unresolved issues relating to the eastern Ladakh row and that peace and tranquillity along the frontier were key for the restoration of normal relations between the two sides.

In an interactive session at a virtual conference, Foreign Secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla said the entire basis of the relationship was predicated on having peace and tranquillity along the border.

"Today, that is not the case," he said, referring to "multiple provocations" along the Line of Actual Control in eastern Ladakh by China last year.

"We have obviously seen this as a unilateral provocation, we have tried to deal with it... through negotiations and through talks, and to

some extent, we have addressed some of the issues that had arisen out of this situation that was created by China," he said.

The foreign secretary said there are still issues that needed to be addressed.

"But there are still friction points and there are still issues that we need to...and we are very clear that until these issues are addressed and our border areas are peaceful and tranquil, we will not be able to go into what is known as a normal relationship as we go forward," he said.

"How do you see that situation evolving and I think we will have to be guided by the progress and the level of cooperation, the willingness that you see on the part of China in how we take the issues forward," Shringla added.

He was replying to a question on India's

ties with China at the conference organised by the Public Affairs Forum of India (PAFI).

The foreign secretary said the onus is on China to ensure that the remaining issues are addressed.

"Obviously the fact is that we need to work on it, we have to see how to; we are obviously looking at resolving the issues... The onus is on China to ensure that the issues that remain are addressed," he said.

In his address on India's foreign policy in the post-COVID world, Shringla also said "the rise of China has also placed us in a central role at the geopolitical stage. It is our largest neighbour and one with which we share more than just a border and proximity. We have also had to confront a specific strategic challenge posed by China and its tactics on our shared border."

CBSE banks on IT assistance to tabulate class 12 results

New Delhi, June 19: The Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) is developing an IT system to assist schools with tabulating class 12 results by easing down calculation work and reducing time taken, a top official said

Friday. The exams for both class 10 and 12 were cancelled by CBSE in view of the COVID-19 pandemic. The board has announced its alternative assessment policy for both the classes. While schools have been asked

to submit class 10 marks till June 30, the deadline for schools to compile class 12 marks is July 15.

"Regarding the tabulation of marks for class 12, the CBSE has decided to assist the result committee and schools

in preparation of result. Accordingly, an IT system is being developed in-house which will be made available to all the concerned schools sponsoring students for class 12 for calculation of results," CBSE Examination Controller Sanyam Bhardwaj said.

"This system will ease down the calculation work, reduce time taken and so many other hassles. This system will also pre populate marks of Class 10 of the students passed from CBSE. Efforts will also be made to take other boards' class 10 results data," he added.

"CBSE will continuously communicate with all the schools to ensure that without any problem, result is prepared by the schools. CBSE will also establish a help desk to assist the schools in preparation of result of both class 10 and class 12 from next

week," Bhardwaj said.

According to the policy for class 12 results, decided by a 13-member panel set up by the board, the theory paper evaluation formula is 30 per cent weightage will be given to Class 10 marks, 30 per cent to Class 11 marks and 40 per cent weightage to Class 12 marks obtained in unit test/mid-term/pre-board exams.

The CBSE scheme further elaborated that for Class 10, the 30 per cent marks based on average theory component of best three performing subjects out of main five subjects will be taken.

According to the evaluation criteria announced for class 10 students, while 20 marks for each subject will be for internal assessment as every year, 80 marks will be calculated on basis of the students' performance in various tests or exams throughout the year.

Decision soon on pending entrance exams

New Delhi, June 19: The Ministry of Education is expected to soon decide on conducting the two remaining editions of the engineering entrance examination JEE-Mains and the medical entrance test NEET in August, according to officials.

"The situation is being reviewed to decide on the schedule of the pending editions of JEE-Mains and whether NEET-UG can be conducted on August 1," a senior official said.

From the current academic session, JEE-Mains is being conducted four times a year to offer flexibility to students and a chance to improve their scores. The first phase in February was followed by the second phase in March, while the next phases were

scheduled for April and May. But those were postponed after an exponential rise in the number of COVID-19 cases during the second wave of the pandemic in the country.

The JEE-Advanced exam, which is conducted for admission to the prestigious Indian Institutes of Technology, was also postponed. The exam was scheduled on July 3.

While no further decision was taken on NEET-UG, the registration for the exam, which was supposed to commence from May 1, was kept in abeyance.

The ministry is also yet to decide on the fate of the Central University Common Entrance Test (CUCET).

Ex-Japanese minister jailed for vote buying

Tokyo, June 19: A former Japanese justice minister received a three-year jail term on Friday for vote-buying in an attempt to get his wife elected to a national office, local media said.

Katsuyuki Kawai, 58, was found guilty of charges that he distributed 29 million yen to about 100 people in 2019, to help secure an upper house seat for his wife Anri, national broadcaster NHK said. He was fined 1.3

million yen in addition to the jail term, local media added.

Officials at the Tokyo District Court could not immediately confirm the reports.

Katsuyuki, a close confidant of former Prime Minister Shinzo Abe, had reversed his earlier claims of innocence and broadly conceded the allegations against him.

Anri, who won her seat in the July 2019 election, has already been found guilty

over her role in the scheme and received a suspended sentence of 16 months earlier this year.

Katsuyuki's sentence is not suspended, meaning he faces jail time. But the Yomiuri Shimbun daily reported that he appealed.

He was named justice minister by Abe in 2019 but left the office after only a few weeks as the scandal emerged.
