In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us these standalone financial results:

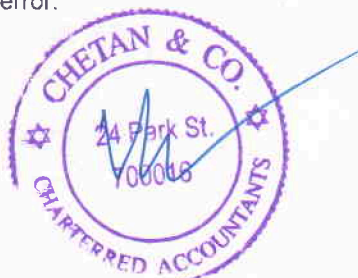
- i. are presented in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 33 of the Listing Regulations in this regard and
- ii. give a true and fair view in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the applicable accounting standards and other accounting principles generally accepted in India of the net loss and other comprehensive income and other financial information for the quarter ended 31st March 2020 as well as the year to date results for the period from 1st April 2019 to 31st March 2020.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act, 2013 (the Act). Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Standalone Financial Results section of our report. We are independent of the Company in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial results under the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the standalone financial results that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.



In preparing the standalone financial results, the Board of Directors are responsible for assessing the Company's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the Board of Directors either intends to liquidate the Company or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

The Board of Directors are also responsible for overseeing the Company's financial reporting process.


As part of an audit in accordance with SAs, we exercise professional judgment and maintain professional skepticism throughout the audit. We also:



Notes:

- 1 The Financial Results of the Company for the quarter and year ended 31st March, 2020 have been prepared in accordance with Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015. These results have been reviewed and recommended by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of the Company in their respective meetings held on 30th June, 2020. The Statutory Auditors of the Company have carried out Audit of these results.
- 2 The performance of the Company is dependent on HCL, its main customer. The gas plant of the Company was closed for most of the year due to shutdown of HCL.
- 3 Other Income includes invoices of minimum offtake guarantee(MOG) raised on HCL. HCL has disputed the MOG payment and matter is referred for arbitration.
- 4 The figures for the last quarter of current and previous year are the balancing figures between audited figures for the full financial year and the unaudited published year to date figures for the nine months for the respective years.
- 5 Previous year's figures have been rearranged/ regrouped wherever necessary.
