India come back from 2-goal deficit, win Asian Champions Hockey

Chennai, Aug 13: In a contest that went down the wire, India, shot into the lead, trailed 1-3 and came back strongly to defeat spirited Malaysia 4-3 to lift the Asian Champions Hockey title for the fourth time in front of a packed stadium here on Saturday night.

The title win will augur well for India's preparations for the Asian Games at Zhangzhou in China, which will further boost the confidence of the home team to focus on the Asian games.

In a close contest, a much improved Malaysia after losing in the league phase, dictated terms right from the hit off, having worked the home work well.

But it was India, despite being at the receiving end, went into the lead much against the run of play, before Malaysia came back with two goals in three minutes to make it 2-1 and stretched it to 3-1.

However, a determined India, firing on all angles, scored two goals in the third quarter to level

it 3-3, before finding the matchwinner within minutes from the hooter in the 4th and final quarter with Sukhjeet finding the mark and the skipper doing the spadework.

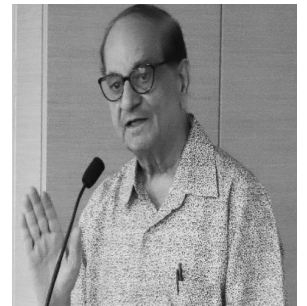
Thanks to Sukhjeet's target that fetched India the winning goal after being at the receiving end for most part of the first two quarters, the fans went crazy in the stands as the final hooter went off.

"What a night, what a win for Team India! They came back

from being two goals down to win this 4-3! Celebrations in the Indian camp after a madcap final 16 minutes of the game where it scored three goals, including two in the space of 30-odd seconds," fans said, after enjoying the every moment of this contest, that went down the wire.

It was a match in which the Malaysians, having worked out their strategy well, packed their defence and never gave a leeway for the Indians to cut through.

Kuldeep, gold dust, keeps art of left-arm spinning alive

Bowling is a sport for people who have talent to spare. Spin bowling has been commended by spinners and iconic writers. The legendary spinner Shane Warne said, "Part of the art of bowling spin is to make the batsman think something special is happening when it isn't." Noted writer Gideon Haigh put it on a wider canvas, "No cricketer is so dependent on the turf on which the game is played as the spinner; it can make, break, enfang or defang him."

The left-handed wrist spinners are rarer than right-handed wrist-spinners. This form of delivery was often termed a Chinaman after an early left-arm spinner of Chinese lineage Ellis "Puss" Achong of West Indies. Paul Adams and Tabraiz Shamsi of South Africa are the other best-known recent left-arm unorthodox bowlers as is Kuldeep Yadav from India while Brad Hogg, Simon Katich and Beau Casson are also in the queue of left-handed wrist spinners category.

Left-arm wrist spin bowling hogged the limelight when Kuldeep Yadav turned the tables on the Windies batters to pilot India to a much-needed recent win in the third T-20 at Providence in Guyana.

Former India cricketer-cum-commentator Aakash Chopra lauded Kuldeep Yadav and stated that the left-arm wrist spinner is going to be extremely crucial for the national team in the upcoming ODI World Cup, which is slated to begin on October 5. He has been terrific in the recent ODI series against West Indies and



was sensational in the third T20I, picking up three crucial wickets in Guyana.

While commending Kuldeep's contribution, Chopra believes that his confidence is back and will not just be important for the team in the upcoming ODI World Cup but also in the 2024 T20 World Cup, as he has done a tremendous job in these conditions. He also called the spinner gold dust and lauded his ability to take wickets in the middle overs.

"It is absolutely back, and he is doing slightly different things. I am trying to think a little ahead. We are going to play the T20 World Cup in the West Indies itself. In these conditions, you will need a bowler who keeps you in the game by picking up wickets," Chopra said during his commentary stint.

Elaborating further Chopra opined, "The way T20 is played, it is important that you pick up wickets constantly. If you have a wicket-taking bowler, especially in the middle overs, he is gold dust. He is anyway doing well in ODIs, so his role in the upcoming 50-over World Cup will also be extremely crucial."

On a used track of Providence Stadium, the Indian bowlers tried to keep West Indies batters quiet. However, openers Brandon King and Kyle Mayers had a better day as both provided a fine start to their team. When West Indies were at 55, Axar Patel

provided the team with the first breakthrough before Kuldeep made further inroads. He took three wickets and, in the process, became the fastest Indian to take 50 T20I wickets in terms of matches played.

The Chinaman pipped fellow spinner Yuzvendra Chahal (34), Ravichandran Ashwin (42) and Bhuvneshwar Kumar (50). In the run up to the Providence T20I, Kuldeep became highest (15) wicket-taker against West Indies.

Kuldeep saw the light of the day on December 14, 1994 in a humble background in Unnao (nearby town) but grew up in Kanpur. His cricketing credentials were recognised by his father who took him to coach Kapil Pandey, who was impressed with the turn and variations he was extracting from the track. He was asked to watch the videos of Shane Warne's bowling to make him learn the nuances of spin bowling.

However, he had a big setback when he was not selected in the Uttar Pradesh's under-15 team. The desperation made him contemplate suicide. However, wiser counsel made him turn around and rest is a tell-tale. Besides Uttar Pradesh, he has been playing IPL for Mumbai Indians, Kolkata Knight Riders and Delhi Capitals.

Kuldeep has many

feathers in his cap - only third left-arm wrist-spinner to take four wickets on debut; third Indian (after Chetan Sharma and Kapil Dev) to claim hat-trick in an ODI; first left-arm wrist spinner to scalp five victims (6/25-a record) in a T20I; in 2019 vs West Indies, he became first Indian bowler to take two hat-tricks.

Kuldeep stands apart among peers of the spin bowling, earning the epithet of mystery spinner. To trace back, the origin of mystery spinner nomenclature, it sprang up with the West Indies spinner Sonny Ramadhin, who rocked the English batting boat in 1950s. The others to follow suit were Australians Jack Iverson, Johnny Gleeson and the South African Paul Adams.

On a personal note, the scribe first met Kuldeep at Queen's Park Oval, Port-of-Spain in the twin Island of Trinidad & Tobago (my second home) during his commentary stint with Radio 360 where they (the scribe and Kuldeep) spoke about their Kanpur links. He may be a canny spinner but a humble man at heart.

Kuldeep Yadav's journey to stardom has been through troughs and crests. But in the end, it has been his own commitment and dedication that enabled him to reach the podium and to keep the vanishing art of left-arm wrist spin bowling alive.

They were holy moments. David asked me whether I would pray at the end of their prayers and I did: All the urgency in me, talked to a God above about granting a peace, a peace that would envelope these Jewish friends and their Muslim neighbors in Israel.

It's all about peace isn't it? It's not about who's right and who's wrong, it's not about who's firing the missiles and where those horrible weapons of destruction are hitting, whose lives are being stuffed out, it's all about peace.

If only we would move away from trying to judge who is right and wrong, if only we would stop looking for reasons and instead hold onto the one big reason, and realise that its all about peace, we could then bring that peace down into that piece of Gaza and stop the violence.

There must be thousands of homes where prayers are being said, either in homes or in mosques or synagogues, where as the prayers rise up to the same God above, a sense of peace pervades and then the sound of police jeeps, machine gun fire or a missile crashing in somewhere near, all spelling destruction makes everyone afraid. Suddenly prayers are shattered by screams, gentleness by violence and love by hate.

They asked me to pray at the end of their prayers and I raise my voice as I did that evening and plead for a God above to bring peace for warring nations who long for such peace. I also pray today, for peace in our own nation, peace between warring tribes in Manipur! Oh God of peace grant all that peace they all so desire..!

Openers add 165, India level T20I series vs Windies

Florida, Aug 13: Indian openers Shubman Gill and Yashasvi Jaiswal's half centuries and a grand opening stand helped India to square series 2-2 after registering 9 wickets victory over West Indies in the fourth T20I match at Lauderdale's Central Broward Regional Park Stadium Turf Ground here on Saturday.

The Indian openers stitched a match-winning 165 runs partnership for the first wicket, and scored 66 runs in an eventful powerplay, chasing a very competitive 179 runs target. They got the ball over the ropes on plenty of occasions, and without losing any wicket.

Jaiswal made an unbeaten 84 runs off 51 balls with 11 boundaries and 3 sixes. Gill, on the other hand, made 77 off 47 balls by smacking 3 boundaries and 5 sixes.

Jaiswal, who smacked his maiden T20I 50, started his innings with a bang by getting two boundaries each against Obed McCoy and Jason Holder in the very first two overs of India's innings.

Gill, who did not go past two-digit scores in the series, waited to get his eyes in and made runs in boundaries. At the other end, Gill dealt in sixes off Odean Smith in 4th and 6th over.

Jaiswal pummeled

Smith to milk 15 runs in the 13th over, getting India closer to the much-needed victory.

Both Gill and Jaiswal reached their fifties in the 11th over. While Gill got to his milestone by cutting Rovman Powell behind square on the off-side for two runs, Jaiswal got to his fifty in a great style as he shuffled across a long way and broomed it over backward square leg for a boundary.

They continued to score at a brisk rate and brought up the century partnership in the tenth over. The opening stand eventually came to an end when Gill holed out to deep mid-wicket, but it was too late for

Windies as India romped home with 18 balls to spare.

Earlier, Shimron Hetmyer's 39-ball 61 helped West Indies post a competitive 178/8.

Hetmyer's crucial 44 runs partnership for 8th wicket also played a stellar role in taking the hosts to a strong position after they were reduced to 123/7 at one stage.

Hetmyer, who was not getting a big score under his belt, ran form into the match as he took on Axar Patel and Indian pacers - Arshdeep Singh and Mukesh Kumar. However, he treated specialist spinners - Kuldeep Yadav and Yuzvendra Chahal.

Ravindran recovers from 2 frame loss to beat Arun

Chennai, Aug 13: Jabez Naveen Kumar (TRDBSA), who comfortably took the initial two frames with small breaks of 20s, lost his rhythm against L. Prakash (Snooker Hub) in the third frame of the State Ranking 15-Red Snooker tournament. However, Kumar managed to regain his momentum to win the fourth frame and the match by 3-1 in the Tamil Nadu Billiards and Snooker Association's State Ranking Championship 2023.

In another match, S. Ravindran of TNBSA, who lost 2 frames in-a-row, made a remarkable comeback in the next three frames to defeat R. Arun Kumar (The Den) 3-2.
