

YSRCP's colours whitewashed, principal secy suspended

Following tremendous outrage in social media after a wall of a village secretariat in Anantpur district displaying national colours was painted over with party colours of ruling YSRCP, the government has suspended the Panchayat secretary.

Moreover, the building which was painted in blue has been whitewashed, literally. In addition, a new flagpole has been erected in front of the office of village secretariat in Tamedapalli in Amarapuram block of Anantapur district. A viral video which showed a wall displaying the Tricolour being painted over with bright blue, evoked tremendous reaction among public as well as Opposition leaders who castigated the government.

A government order authorising departmental secretaries to sue media houses for what they deem to be "defamatory, baseless and false reports" has raised the hackles of the media and drawn flak from Opposition as well.

Hyderabad has found a place as a creative city of gastronomy among 66 cities in the world which features in the latest list of UNESCO's creative cities network.

Announced on the occasion of World Cities Day, this latest honour for the four centuries old city should have made its denizens proud but faced with bad roads and crumbling infrastructure,

many chose to troll state urban development minister KT Rama Rao when he tweeted the report.

Besides Hyderabad, Mumbai too has made it to the list as a creative city of film. Apart from these two cities, Chennai and Varanasi are already on the list for being creative cities of music. Jaipur too has made it to the list earlier as a city for crafts and folkarts.

There are seven creative fields including craft, folk arts, media arts, film, design, gastronomy, literature and music.

According to the UNESCO's website, there are 246 cities worldwide committing with UNESCO to place culture and creativity at the centre of their development strategies and to share their best practices. By joining the UNESCO Creative Cities Network cities commit to sharing their best practices and developing partnerships involving the public and private sectors as well as civil society in order to strengthen the creation, production, distribution and dissemination of cultural activities, goods and services.

They also pledge to develop hubs of creativity and innovation and broaden opportunities for creators and professionals in the cultural sector. Hyderabad is known for its gastronomical delicacies which are a part of rich culture and Nizami legacy including its distinctive Biryani which is very different from that of Lucknow, Haleem as well as Irani tea and Osmania biscuit, offering a

balance between salty and sweet tastes.

However, Hyderabadi seem to be less than impressed due to their daily harrowing experience, wrestling with poor infrastructure, bad roads with potholes, the ongoing

strike of bus workers leaving them without much options in terms of public transport.

Many instead chose to lash out at the minister for the poor road infrastructure which has taken a worse turn due to prolonged rains.

Disciplinary action taken against doctors on strike

The one week old indefinite strike by government doctors in Tamil Nadu reached a flash point on Thursday with government started taking strict including transferring doctors on strike as they defied the ultimatum to join for duty without delay. Doctors on strike who ignored the pressure tactics of government intensified the strike.

Doctors affiliated to Federation of Government Doctors' Association (FOGDA) striking fortune past seven day and the government initiated action by issuing transfer orders to 500 of them today. A break in notice regarding the transfer has been sent to the medics, including Dean of a government hospital, assistant professors and doctors.

A warning of declaring the protestors' seats vacant has also been issued, even as Chief Minister Edappadi K Palaniswami asking them to get back to work without any further delay.

Meanwhile, speaking to reporters in Salem on Thursday, Mr. Palaniswami appealed to the protestors to consider the situation of the underprivileged people and withdraw the strike. "The govt.. spends Rs 1.24 crore to create one physician and they are respected like God. They should think about it and get back to work. The health minister has promised to consider their demands," he said.

Meanwhile, speaking to reporters in Salem on Thursday, Mr. Palaniswami appealed to the protestors to consider the situation of the underprivileged people and withdraw the strike.
