The rape survivor, who is studying in college, lodged a complaint with Mehsana A-division police two days ago, alleging that her father had been sexually assaulting her repeatedly ever since she was 14 years old and studying in Class IX. She even narrated the ordeal to her mother, who reportedly turned a deaf ear. The girl's mother then sent her to Visnagar after her maternal uncle's house. However, he too allegedly raped her several times.

She was not granted bail due to her record of being found involved in various instances of sexual misbehavior at shelter home. The other accused was released on bail.

The juvenile delinquents were tried before a special PCCO court at the city sessions court. As the survivor was suffering from severe schizophrenia, a mental illness characterized by relapsing episodes of psychosis, her statement recorded before a judicial magistrate under Section 164 of CrPc, was treated as her deposition before the trial court.

The victim was mentally unstable and had to be taken to a mental hospital, whenever she had schizophrenic attacks.

After the completion of the trial, additional sessions judge P C Joshi on January 16 acquitted both the girls of rape charges on property.

A medical certificate said that the man was not competent to give testimony in court and therefore her statement under Section 164 of the CrPc was treated as her deposition. Her statement does not mention the names of the accused or describes what they had done to her. The prosecution could not prove that the victim was below 18 and it's case beyond reasonable doubts.

Man rapes minor niece for 3 yrs, held

Rajkot: A 30-year-old man was arrested for allegedly raping his 17-year-old orphaned niece for nearly three years after she had come to live in his house in Gandhinagar in Kutch. The police have also arrested the man's wife (28) for aiding and abetting the crime.

While the man was arrested on Monday, the wife was taken into custody on Tuesday. According to police, the Class XI girl had come to live with her uncle about three years ago. On January 26 she approached a local NGO saying that she had been raped by her own uncle in the past few years and also ap-

plied the NGO that her aunt was helping her uncle in the crime. Acting on the girl's complaint the NGO approached the police and got an FIR registered against the uncle on January 26. Based on the complaint police arrested the girl's uncle on Monday and her aunt on Tuesday.

In her statement, the survivor said that she was sexually abused by her uncle for three years ago when he used to sneak her drink one night and raped her. The exploitation then continued frequently and when she could not take it any more she approached the local NGO for help.

Police said that Sonrat had come to Jamnagar for a police in his friends car and was returning to his village in Navagam. On his way back, he gave lift to Vishvarajsinh, his sister Sneha and Chudrasamma, a resident of Navagam and had come to Jamnagar city for shopping.

Joshi's brother Nanji Joshi has become complaint in the case registered at a police post Padana police station. Police sub-inspector DS Wadher is investigating the case.

'India hub for potato-based frozen food'

Industry experts peg the global market for frozen potato products at 15 million metric tonnes, against which the total market size in India is 600 metric tonnes as of 2019. Of this, merely 40% is exported.

"India can become a supply hub for potato-based frozen products, which require a processing variety here. Hence, majority of processors are based in Gujarat and others who are sourcing most of their volumes from the state," Kamran said. On his part, Kamran said TOL Gujarat produced 40 lakh MT of potatoes in 2018-19 as against the total potato output of 59 lakh MT. The state exports for 1 lakh MT of India's total potato exports of 3.80 MT. Kamran said that India can also emerge as a leader for frozen potato products, which are currently dependent on Europe and the US for import of french fries.

Speed-demon loses control of car, kills four

Rajkot: Four youths including a teenager were killed and two minor girls injured when the car in which they were travelling cartwheelled 3-4 times after colliding with a motorcycle near Shapur village in Lalpur taluka of Jamnagar on Tuesday.

The incident happened when Kuldeep Sonrat (21), who was driving at a high speed on a narrow road, lost control of the vehicle after hitting a motorcycle coming from the opposite side.

The survivors — Sneha Zala (15) and her cousin Arth Jethwa (15) — who were in the back seat of the car, con-

firmed that Sonrat was driving at a very high speed. They further told the police that after hitting the bike, the car rolled over 3-4 times and crossed boundary wall of a factory. According to police, besides Sonrat, Vishvarajsinh Zala (14) and Sukhdevsinh Jadhav (22), who were inside the car, also died on the spot. Manoj Joshi, who was riding the motorcycle, was rushed to a private hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries. Joshi is resident of Kanaski village in Lalpur.
