Over 5 lakh tourists to visit Varanasi on Dev Deepawali

LUCKNOW, 7 NOVEMBER

Over 5 lakh tourists are expected to arrive in Varanasi this year for the Dev Deepawali celebrations.

Special security arrangements are being made to cope with the rush of pilgrims.

A state home department official said: "To ensure safety and security of pilgrims, the district administration has divided Kashi's 84 ghats into nine zones, 11 sectors, and 32 sub-sectors. Police teams will be deployed at all ghats and adjoining streets."

In addition, 20 units of quick response team, 11 specialised teams equipped with loudhailers, and anti-Romeo squads will be deployed at busy ghats."

BJP accepted defeat: Baghel on ED, IT raids during polls

'Central agencies will take a short break after 17 November, they'll return to action before LS elections'

Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Bhupesh Baghel said on Tuesday that the BJP has accepted defeat in Chhattisgarh and the central agencies will take a short break and return to raid again before the Lok Sabha election.

Baghel said, "BJP has accepted its defeat as they are using agencies to target opposition leaders. They (ED, IT) will take a short break. After November 17, they will take a break. They also have families. Before Lok Sabha (elections), they will again return."

He also hit out at the former Chief Minister of the state Raman Singh.

"Whoever has been caught with money has a photograph of themselves with Raman Singh. The day before yesterday, no one knew Shubham Soni. All of a sudden, he has become the owner of the Mahadev app. And he is such



an owner who spends Rs 250 crore on the wedding of his servant. He would be the first person to do this," Baghel said.

"Two officers used to live

with Raman Singh, and they used to make up similar stories. This is all planted," Baghel said.

The ED in its probe into the Mahadev betting app case

had last week claimed that a forensic analysis and a statement made by a 'cash courier' have led to 'startling allegations' that Mahadev betting app promoters paid about

Rs 508 crore to Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Baghel so far, and that "these are the subject matter of investigation."

He also alleged that ever since Ajit Pawar joined the BJP his name was removed from the probe of ED, as per reports.

Baghel said, "As Ajit Pawar joined the BJP, his name was removed from the ED. Himanta Biswa Sarma is Chief Minister now, his name was in Saradha Chit Fund corruption.

There are many examples like this where, after being washed in 'Modi Washing Powder', all the stains are cleaned."

Voting for the first phase of the Chhattisgarh Assembly polls for 20 seats in the state's southern region began on Tuesday morning amid tight security. Of the 20 constituencies that are witnessing polling in the state, 12 are from the Bastar division. Chhattisgarh, which has a 90-member house is undergoing elections in two phases, with the second phase scheduled for 17 November.

"To meet this democratic end, the leader of the largest opposition party in Lok Sabha serves as a Member of the Selection Committee which is chaired by the Prime Minister, with the Home Minister being the other Member. I, despite being a Member of the Selection Committee in my capacity as the Leader of the largest Opposition Party in Lok Sabha, was totally kept in the dark about the selection of the officers.

Notably, President Droupadi Murmu administered the oath of office to Heeralal Samariya as CIC in the Central Information Commission at a ceremony held at the Rashtrapati Bhawan here on Monday. In his letter addressed to the President, Chowdhury on Monday wrote, "It is with extreme sadness and a heavy heart that I bring to your notice that all democratic norms, customs and procedures were thrown to the wind in the matter of selection of the CIC and ICs. The Right to Information Act, 2005, in consonance with our democratic norms and traditions envisages that the voice of the Opposition too is heard in the process of selec-

tion. Chowdhury said, "The fact that within hours of the meeting in which only the Prime Minister and the Home Minister were present and the 'face of the opposition', that is me, as a bona fide member of the Selection Committee was not present, the names of the selected candidates were announced, notified and also sworn into office, only indicates that the entire selection exercise was predetermined. You will appreciate the fact that the process, as it unfolded within a short span, is not conducive for your democratic ethos and norms."
