NEW CASES BELOW 50 IN ALL DISTRICTS

25 districts reports no fresh cases in last 24 hours OUR STAFF REPORTER BHOPAL

districts reported less than 5 cases, of these almost 50 per cent did not see a single new case on Wednesday. No fresh cases were reported in 25 districts including Burhanpur, Bhand, Ashok Nagar, Niwari, Sheopur, Khandwa, Dindori, Hamda, Guna, Mandla, Umaria, Tikamgarh, Chhattarpur, Jabua, Devas, Neemuch, Damoh, Singrauli, Balaghat, Anuppur, Katni, Shahdol, Sehore, Narsingpur and Gwalior. Their active cases are 1, 1, 33, 25, 24, 7, 14, 17, 14, 13, 24, 99, 11, 16, 49, 5, 24, 13, 18 and 25 respectively. Except for four districts -

Bhopal, Indore, Jabalpur and Ratlam, the active cases number in all the districts is under 100, while 41 districts reported active cases below 30. Indore reported 36 corona cases while Bhopal reported 47 corona cases. Jabalpur reported 13 new cases. Indore currently has 561 active cases, Bhopal 1081 and Jabalpur 117. The toll in the state stands at 8649. Around 463 Covid patients were discharged from hospitals across the state. Around 72,087 samples were sent for testing and 210 samples were rejected.

Bengali Flyover: new design will be made after 80% of work done

The design of the Bengal Square flyover will be redesigned for construction of the flyover at the Bengal Square after objections have been made over the old design of the flyover claiming that the design is having a defect, 80 percent of the construction work has been completed of the flyover. On Thursday a meeting chaired by Minister Tulsi Silawat, MP Shankar Lalwani and other public representatives was held in which all the concerned department officials were called for having discussion on the bridge design. In the meeting, it was decided that the changes will be made in the bridge design and the new design will be inherited from the Atal Bihari Vajpayee Bridge at Pipliyahana of IDA.

But the objections were made that the pillar will act as a black-spot on the road and the commuters will not be able to see the other lane and accidents risk will increase. Now, as the new design decisions have been taken in which there will no pillar will be constructed in the middle of the road and a span (a gap between one pillar to another pillar) will be increased at Bengal Square.

the square then the purpose of the flyover of ease of traffic will not be fulfilled because at present we are providing 18-lanes of each lane post-construction whereas there are only 15-meters of each lane below the Atal Bihari Vajpayee Bridge. The officials added that if rotary will be made it will occupy the space and the space for traffic flow will decrease.

Maturity days of Indian soyabean are different: Dr Khandekar

Dr Neeta Khandekar, acting director of the Indian Institute of Soybean Research, has said that it will not be appropriate to compare the Indian soybean with other countries as the average maturity duration for soybean there is more than 180 days compared to 100 days in India. Khandekar was addressing programme jointly organised by ICAR-ISR and ITC E-Chaupal on 'Improved Soybean Production Technologies' on Wednesday for the farmers and field staff of ITC, E-Chaupal, ICAR-Indian Soybean Research Institute, Indore and ITC Company Limited jointly organised an online training programme 'Improved Soybean Production Technology and New Innovative Practices

of soybean Production' with the participation of more than 850 farmers and field staff associated with ITC from the states like Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Rajasthan and Gujarat under the E-Choupal programme. Dr Khandekar stressed about the major objective of increasing the productivity of soybean crop through which a number of online webinars and training programmes are being organised by creating and strengthening linkages with various governments as well as private organizations like ITC, Solidarity etc. Indian Institute of Soybean Research has always been striving for the development of varieties and technologies capable of higher yield as well as characters resistant to major pest and disease resistance. She also expressed the hope to achieve the average productivity of soybean to 15 quintal/ha by 2025.

CASE AGAINST RUCHI GLOBAL LTD FOR RS 188.35 CR BANK FRAUD

BHOPAL: The CBI has registered a case against a private company and its directors for causing alleged loss of Rs 188.35 crore to banks and also conducted searches on Wednesday. The case has been registered against the Ruchi Global Limited, its directors and unknown public servants and others. The CBI has registered a case on a complaint from Bank of Baroda filed on behalf of consortium of lending banks against the company having its office in Mumbai, and corporate office in Indore and others on the allegations of bank fraud during the period January 1, 2016 to December 31, 2017. It was alleged that the accused fraudulently induced in diversion of funds, speculation transactions, non-routing of sale proceeds in consortium bank accounts, transactions with related parties/related concerns etc and caused a loss of Rs 188.35 crore (approx) to the lending banks. Searches were conducted on Wednesday at six places including Indore, Mumbai and Bangalore at the premises of the accused which led to recovery of various incriminating documents.
