Tholkappia Poonga skywalk work to commence by June

Corporation gets CRZ clearance, expects to finish project by end of year

AS the Coastal Regulation Zone clearance has been granted, the city corporation is all set to issue work orders for a cable-stayed pedestrian skywalk in June after the model code of conduct has been lifted. The work is expected to be completed by December 2024.

The skywalk, designed to be 156 metres long and three metres wide, will connect the two phases of the Tholkappia Poonga that is being renovated by the Chennai Rivers Restoration Trust at a total cost of ₹42.4 crore. The cable-stayed skywalk alone is to be constructed at an estimated cost of ₹9.35 crore.

₹9.35 cr Project cost

156 m: Overall length

3.2 m: Width

The skywalk will be constructed with a pylon to support the structure (a support tower to string wires from) which will be placed at the centre median of the road at a height of 25 metres. This is planned on the DGS Dhinakaran Salai, TP Scheme road, Santhome high road junction. "The CRZ clearance came on Monday. The tender evaluation has already been completed and we will issue work orders as soon as the model code of conduct is lifted," said a corporation official. The work is expected to be

Hypertension treated with minimally invasive surgery

DOCTORS at Apollo Hospital recently treated a 58-year-old man with uncontrolled blood pressure using a minimally invasive procedure as his hypertension had not improved with drugs.

The doctors used renal denervation (RDN) therapy on the man who had both the kidneys on the right side, an extremely rare anatomical variation.

Speaking to reporters on Thursday, Dr Refai Showkathali, senior consultant, interventional cardiology, Apollo Hospitals, said, "The patient was taking around five drugs to control blood pressure. However, it remained high for the last few

years. Last year, he suffered a heart attack. Doctors performed angiogram and angioplasty. But, his BP remained high. So, they decided to perform renal denervation therapy, a procedure which is approved by the US FDA on patients with uncontrolled hypertension."

The procedure involves radiofrequency ablation of both the renal arteries—basically calming the synthetic nerves in the renal system using radiofrequency. This led to reduction in BP from over 160/100 mmHg to 130/80 mmHg within a day. The patient was discharged the day after the procedure and now requires only two medications, Dr Showkathali said. In TN, this procedure has been performed in four cases.

Dalits denied seats under RTE, NCSC issues notice

THE National Commission for Scheduled Castes (NCSC) on Wednesday issued a notice to the secretary of the Tamil Nadu school education department J Kumaragurubaran seeking an explanation for denying admission to Dalit children in self-financing private schools under the Right To Education (RTE) Act.

NCSC sent the notice following a complaint from former member of the TN Sanitary Workers Welfare Board S Selvakumar on May 22. NCSC stated that based on the petition, the commission has decided to inquire into the matter in pursuance of the power conferred upon it under Article 338 of the Constitution of India. The secretary is requested to submit the facts and information on the action on the petition within 15 days. When asked about it, secretary of school education department J Kumaragurubaran said he would look into the matter.

Man, partner die by suicide

A woman and her lover who were living together died by suicide near Pallikaranai on Wednesday. They got separated from their spouses a few months ago. The woman, Selfiya Mary (23), has a five-year-old child and the man, and Vijay (30), has a three-year-old child from their previous relationships.

According to police, the two had met a few months ago and started a relationship. When their families found out about this, the two got separated from their spouses and then started living together. However, on Wednesday, Mary sent a message to a friend saying that she was going to take the extreme step as it was difficult for her to live with Vijay because of the problem from her family. Seeing the message, her friend informed the police, who rushed to the spot and found the two dead. The bodies were sent for postmortem.

Painkillers worth ₹8.36 lakh seized, five arrested

Chennai: A 11-month-old child died after accidentally falling into a water bucket at her house in Selaiyur on Thursday. According to police, V Archana was the daughter of Vishwanathan and Umadevi. Around 1.30 am on Thursday, Vishwanathan woke up and found Archana missing. He alerted his wife and after a search, the couple found the child in a bucket of water kept near the front door. They rushed her to a government hospital, where doctors declared her dead. 'Policemen' kidnap medical shop owner for ₹65k ransom

CHENNAI: The Ayanavaram police have launched a search to trace two men who allegedly kidnapped a medical shop owner Prabhakaran claiming to be policemen. On Wednesday, two persons claiming to be policemen came to the shop and told Prabhakaran that they have seen him illegally sell painkiller tablets. They demanded ₹7,000 to drop the case and forcibly took the money from the shop. They also took him away on their bike, made him call his wife and asked her to pay ₹65,000 as ransom. The woman pawned her jewels and allegedly paid them, after which Prabhakaran was released. Following a complaint, police registered a case and are an investigating.

Two arrested for making fake land documents

CHENNAI: Police on Thursday said two persons were arrested on Wednesday for preparing fake land documents to sell over 23 grounds in Thiruvannamiyur.

According to the Central Crime Branch, Rajasekar, joint sub-registrar of Saidapet, filed a complaint against Kamala Kannan for producing fake documents with a draft sale deed executed by Arun Malhotra in favour of Harsh Malhotra for the land on Kalki Krishnamoorthy Road in February.

Police arrested Kamala Kannan on May 3. A probe revealed that Suresh Kumar of Padappai, Yuvaraj Chowdhry of West Mambalam and Raju of Kodambakkam had allegedly prepared the fake documents at a graphics shop in Kodambakkam. Suresh Kumar and Yuvaraj were arrested on Wednesday. The CCB team seized computers, electronic goods, Tamil Nadu government holograms, 35 rubber stamp handles, fake sale deeds, eight fake rubber stamps and 15 fake voter IDs from the shop. ENS

3 held for luring women abroad & forcing them into prostitution

CITY police said on Thursday that they have busted a racket in which women were sent abroad to work as dancers in hotels but forced into prostitution.

The Central Crime Branch's Immoral Traffic Prevention Unit recently received a complaint from a woman who returned from a Gulf country. She had alleged that she was offered a job in a foreign hotel by mid-

dlemen, but after reaching was forced into prostitution. Police arrested Prakash Raj (24) from Madipakkam, A Aafia (24) from Thoraipakkam and K Jayakumar (40) from Tenkasi district who allegedly worked as middlemen in sending the woman abroad. Search is on to nab four main accused in the case. Police have invoked the Prevention of Prostitution Act against the accused. Police said the gang targeted poor women seeking jobs abroad.
