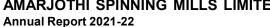

STATE OF COMPANY'S AFFAIRS AND FUTURE OUTLOOK:

OPERATIONS

During the year under review, the Company's revenue from operations (net of GST) has increased by 7704.74 lakhs over the previous financial year and recorded a revenue of Rs.25192.54 lakhs for the financial year ended 31st March 2022. The profit after tax is Rs. 2108.91 Lakhs as against Rs. 1631.42 Lakhs for the previous financial year.

1) YARN DIVISION

Your directors inform you that yarn division continues to perform well. We hope that in future also our performance will improve.

2) PROCESSING UNIT

The Processing unit is fully utilized for the dyeing of material of our spinning unit. In addition to our own dyeing, we process our material in outside dyeing also.

3) WINDMILLS:

Companies windmills are fully utilized for captive consumption of yarn division and processing



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division's power usage. The wind farm has generated 283.66 Lakhs Kwh as compared to 277.65 Lakhs Kwh of the previous year. The wind availability / velocity was better during initial wind season of the financial year 2021-22 as compared to the last financial year. During the financial year 2021-22, the Company was able to consume power from its own wind farms to the extent of 90% of total power requirement. The income during the year from the Wind Mill Division was Rs.18.55 Crores as against Rs.17.75 Crores of previous year.

FUTURE PROSPECTS:

The Company will continue to perform well in the domestic market. The Company is in the process of implementing several cost saving measures including modernization, which will make the product more competitive.

CHANGE IN NATURE OF BUSINESS, IF ANY:

There were no changes in Nature of Business during the year 2021-2022.

INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS

Relationship with employees was cordial throughout the year.

SUBSIDIARIES, JOINT VENTURES, AND ASSOCIATE COMPANIES:

The Company has one wholly owned subsidiary company M/s.RPJ Textiles Ltd., in which our company holds 100% of equity shares. The details are mentioned in AOC-1. The Secretarial Audit report of the Subsidiary company is annexed herewith as **ANNEXURE – VIII** and forms an integral part of this Report.

The Company has one Associate Firm named Kanagathara Wind Farms in which our company holds 27% for the purpose of captive consumption of wind power. The details are mentioned in Form AOC-1 as annexed as a part of this report vide **ANNEXURE-II**. The companies which has been ceased to be an associate companies are Jayanthi Green Energy Private Limited, Premchander Green Energy Private Limited, AFCM Wind Farms Private Limited and AJSM Green Energy Private Limited.

DIVIDEND

The Directors have recommended a dividend of Rs. 2.20 per share (22% on the Face value) for the year ended 31st March 2022 absorbing a sum of Rs.1,48,50,000/- for the approval of the shareholders at the ensuing Annual General Meeting. Pursuant to the Income-tax Act, 1961 read with the Finance Act, 2020. Dividend income is taxable in the hands of the Members with effect from 1st April, 2020 and the Company is required to deduct tax at source from such dividend at the prescribed rates.

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MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT:

The Directors present the Report on Management Discussion and Analysis Report for the financial year ended 31st March 2022, in terms of Regulation 34(2) read with Schedule V of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015[SEBI LODR].

1. ECONOMIC SCENARIO

The Global Economy started witnessing a sharp recovery after unprecedented disruptions due to COVID-19 Pandemic. However, the growth prospects again weakened in the course of the year with the emergence of second wave of COVID-19 and unprecedented increase in the prices of commodities because of the ongoing conflict between Russia & Ukraine which has put breaks on the growth of the Global economies.

The sharp rise in the fuel and food prices, high rate of inflation and tightening of Monetary policy in several countries has further aggravated the problems for the Global Economies. In addition frequent and wider-ranging lockdown in china including in key manufacturing hubs have also slow down the economic activity and has thus caused new bottlenecks in Global supply chain. Because of the prevailing Economic and Business scenario, the International Monetary Fund (IMF), in the World Economic Outlook published in April, 2022, has revised the Global growth prospects for the financial year 2022 and 2023 to 3.6%. This is 0.8% and 0.2% points lower for 2022 and 2023 than projected in January, 2022.

The Indian economy too has been severally impacted because of prevailing geopolitical situation which is not conducive for the Global Trade. The ongoing conflict between Russia and Ukraine and subsequent sanction by U.S. and European Union has affected India's exports. As a result, India's GDP is expected to grow at a slower pace. To put the economy on faster lane of growth and sustainable development, Government and Policy makers have introduced several path breaking initiatives and policies in the area of Health Care, Infrastructure and Social Welfare to support the economic activities.

2. INDUSTRY STRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENT:

The Indian Textile Industry is one of the largest in the World, enjoying its presence in the entire value chain i.e. cotton, yarn, fiber and apparel. The ongoing global slowdown coupled with sharp increase in the prices of raw cotton are posing serious challenges to the Textile Industry. Beside, the increase in the interest rates and re-emergence of COVID-19 has aggravated the problems for the Industry. In case the situation persists for the longer period then earning a reasonable margin will become a challenging task for the Textile Industry. Because of the prevailing Textile scenario, Spinning Mills have already cut down their production in the past few months. Even some mills have closed down their operations for 1-2 days in a week due to prevailing adverse conditions.

The Government is fully conscious of the importance of the Textile Industry and the sector is going to be its key focus area in the new policies being framed so as to achieve the target of USD 5 Trillion economy. The Government has introduced Production Link Incentives Scheme (PLI) for the Textile Industry under which incentives will be provided for setting Textile & Apparel manufacturing in key man -made fibre based products. The Mega Textile parks will offer an opportunity to create an integrated Textile value chain right from spinning, weaving, processing, dyeing and knitting to garment manufacturing at one location. It is expected that the world class industrial infrastructure will attract big-ticket investments in the sector.



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Your Management is quite optimistic that Industry with the support of favorable Government Policies and Programs will capitalize on this opportunity to increase its share in Global Textile Markets. In line with the global trends and to remain competitive, your company continues to modernize, upgrade and expand its capacities so that it remains globally competitive in terms of cost and quality

3. OPPORTUNITIES AND THREATS:

This Company being a major supplier of melange yarn to the Tirupur market with its local presence, there is good scope for improved turnover and profitability. The Company has been improving its share of value added yarn in the market in the form of Dyed fibre yarn, Dyed cotton yarn, PC yarn, etc. The Company offers competitive price due to low power cost through windmills, low interest cost, low processing cost, etc. The Company has obtained ISO 9001:2000 Certification, MGMT.SYS RVA C 216 Certification for quality management and systems and OEKO TEX STANDARD— 100 Certification for not using harmful substances in the product.

On positive note there have been lots of developments undertaken, including different product mix, introducing several health and hygiene products and exploring new business channels. Even during these torrid times, the business has managed the working capital well

The relative success of the Spinning Industry is dependent on the availability of Raw Cotton at reasonable prices. The Raw cotton is the main Raw material (constituting approx. 60% of the total cost) for the manufacture of cotton yarn and it is dependent on the Nature i.e. Good/Bad Monsoon. So availability of raw cotton at reasonable prices is crucial for the spinning Industry. Any significant change in raw cotton prices and Monsoon can affect the performance of the Industry. This year steep increase in the prices of raw cotton as severally impacted the Textile Industry.

The Textile Industry is also not free from normal business risks and threats. The slowdown in the Global Trade because of the Geo political tension, High prices of raw cotton, low demand coupled with Outbreak of second wave of Covid-19 Pandemic in several countries, has affected exports of textile products. The prevailing situation is still uncertain as the risk of new disrupted COVID-19 variant has the potential to prolong the pandemic and thus causing fresh economic impacts. The above mentioned factors have had and will continue to have a significant bearing on the financial performance of the Industry in the coming period too.

4. SEGMENT-WISE PERFORMANCE:

The Company operates only in one segment and the operational results are mentioned elsewhere in this report.

TRADE CONDITIONS

COTTON

In India, the opening stock of cotton for the current cotton season 2021-22 (October to September) was at 75 Lakhs Bales, which is lower by 37% as compared to last year opening stock of 120 Lakhs Bales. The Cotton Association of India has estimated the Indian Cotton Crop for the cotton season 2021-22 at 335 Lakhs Bales as compared to 360 Lakhs Bales of last cotton season, which is lower by 7%. The lower opening stock, coupled



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with lower production estimate of cotton during the current cotton crop season has pushed-up the cotton prices in upward trend.

The cotton price has increased from Rs. 60,000/- to more than Rs. 1,00,000/- per candy within a period of 6 months from the beginning of the cotton season. The Government of India has imposed duty on all varieties of imported cotton during February, 2021 and this made imported cotton dearer by 11% for Indian Spinning Mills; however, the Government of India has withdrawn the import duty effective 14th April, 2022 till 30th September, 2022.

Due to lower production of long stable imported cotton, the prices of some of the imported cotton varieties had also increased very steeply. The price of medium stable fibres has increased by more than 40% and in case of long stable fibre, it has increased by more than 70%.

Since the Company is focusing to produce more value added counts and in order to meet the quality requirement of value added counts, more volume high quality imported cotton has been procured when the prices were at reasonable level. The imported cotton consumption for the financial year 2021-22 has been decreased by 26.83% as compared to last financial year.

YARN PRODUCTION

The production volume of yarn has increased to 70.33 Lakhs Kgs during the financial year 2021-22 as against 57.75 Lakhs Kgs of last year, registering a growth of 17.89%. The increase in production was due to full utilization of machineries made during the financial year 2021-22.

SALE OF YARN

The Company's focus on new product development, innovation and cost-effective production has started yielding results. The sale volume for the FY 2021-22 stood at 62.41 Lakh Kgs as compared to 60.15 Lakh Kgs of last year, registering a growth of 3.62%. The Company is taking various steps to expand its market presence both in domestic and international markets and hope to achieve higher volume of sales in value added yarns in the forthcoming years.

EXPORTS

The Company has made export of Cotton Yarn (including merchant exports) for a value of Rs.35.45 lakh kgs as against Rs.37.43 lakh kgs of the previous year, registering a decline of 5.29%.

POWER COST

During the financial year 2021-22, the Company was able to consume power from its own wind farms to the extent of 90% of total power requirement. The power cost has increased during the financial year 2021-22 to Rs.10.32 Crores as compared to Rs.5.32 Crores incurred during previous year, due to increased level of utilization of machineries.

FINANCE COST

The Finance cost has decreased to Rs.5.03 Crores during the financial year 2021-22 from Rs.5.59 Crores of previous financial year.

5. OUTLOOK:

We are pleased to inform you that the year gone by has been excellent for the Textile Industry. The Indian Textile Exports surpassed the export figures of last year. Indian



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Textile Industry is one of the key industry of the country and the Government through its policies and initiatives continues to give further push to the industry so that it become global competitive and increase its Global share. The Government has introduced Production Linked Incentive (PLI) Scheme for the Textile Industry which will help in increasing the Textile Exports.

However, in the current year the risk of slow down in the world economy has lowered the demand for the Textile Products resulting fall in the International as well as Domestic prices. The high cotton prices coupled with slackness in Global demand are affecting the fortunes of the Textile Industry. Indian cotton yarn exports are likely to witness a decline in financial year 2023 after robust increase in the previous year. The Future is still not clear. Your management is looking at the future with optimism and expects that with the improvement in the global demand and softening of raw cotton prices in the coming periods, will give a relief to the Textile Industry.

We expect that in this challenging period, Government will support the Spinning industry in the form of favorable Textile policies, incentives and other benefits which are of paramount importance for the future growth of the Industry. The Company will continue to perform well in the domestic market. The Company is in the process of implementing several cost saving measures, which will make the product more competitive.

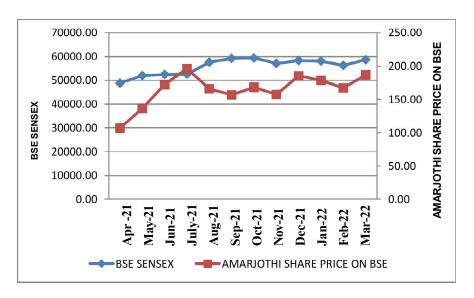

AMARJOTHI SHARE PERFORMANCE (April 2021 to March 2022)

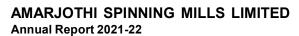
BSE Sensex Vs Amariothi Share Price

- 9) (a) The company has not defaulted in repayment of loans or other borrowings taken from or in the payment of interest thereon to any lender.
 - (b) The company is not a declared willful defaulter by any bank or financial institution or other lender.
 - (c) The term loans were applied for the purpose for which the loans were obtained by the company.
 - (d) No funds raised on short term basis have been utilised for long term purposes by the company.
 - (e) The company has not taken any funds from any entity or person on account of or to meet the obligations of its subsidiaries, associates or joint ventures.
 - (f) The company has not raised loans during the year on the pledge of securities held in its subsidiaries, joint ventures or associate companies.
- 10) (a) The Company has not raised any money by way of initial public offer or further public offer during the year.
 - (b) The company has not made any preferential allotment or private placement of shares or fully or partly or optionally convertible debentures during the year.
- 11) (a) Based upon the audit procedures performed and according to the information and explanations given to me, no fraud by the company or no fraud on the company has



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been noticed or reported during the year that causes the financial statements to be materially misstated.

- (b) According to the information and explanations given to me, No report under subsection (12) of section 143 of the Companies Act has been filed by the auditors in Form ADT-4 as prescribed under rule 13 of Companies (Audit and Auditors) Rules, 2014 with the Central Government.
- (c) According to the information and explanations given to me, no whistle-blower complaints were received during the year by the company.
- 12) The company is not a Nidhi Company and hence clause 3(xii)of the order is not applicable.
- 13) According to the information and explanations given to me and based on my examination of the records of the company, transactions with the related parties are in compliance with section 177 and 188 of the Act. Where applicable, the details of such transactions have been disclosed in the financial statements as required by the applicable accounting standards.
- 14) (a) According to the information and explanations given to me and based on my examination of the records of the company, the company has an internal audit system commensurate with the size and nature of its business.
 - (b) The reports of the Internal Auditors of the company for the period under audit were considered by me and no material adverse points are there in that reports.
- 15) According to the information and explanations given to me and based on my examination of the records of the company, the company has not entered into non-cash transactions with directors or persons connected with them.
- 16) (a)&(b) According to the information and explanations given to me and based on my examination of the records of the company, the company is not required to be registered under section 45-IA of the Reserve Bank of India Act 1934 as the company is not a non-banking financial company. Accordingly Clause 3 (xvi)(a) and Clause 3 (xvi)(b) of the order is not applicable.
 - (c) &(d) According to the information and explanations given to me and based on my examination of the records of the company, the company is not a Core Investment Company (CIC) as defined in the regulations made by the Reserve Bank of India. Accordingly Clause 3 (xvi)(c) and Clause 3 (xvi)(d) of the order is not applicable.
- 17) According to the information and explanations given to me and based on my examination of the records of the company, the company has not incurred cash losses in the financial year and in the immediately preceding financial year.
- 18) According to the information and explanations given to me and based on my examination of the records of the company, there has been no resignation of the statutory auditors during the year.
- 19) According to the information and explanations given to me and on the basis of the financial ratios, ageing and expected dates of realization of financial assets and payment of financial





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liabilities, other information accompanying the financial statements, my knowledge of the Board of Directors and management plans, I am of the opinion that no material uncertainty exists as on the date of the audit report that company is capable of meeting its liabilities existing at the date of balance sheet as and when they fall due within a period of one year from the balance sheet date. I, however, state that this is not an assurance as to the future viability of the company. I further state that my reporting is based on the facts up to the date of the audit report and I neither give any guarantee nor any assurance that all liabilities falling due within a period of one year from the balance sheet date, will get discharged by the company as and when they fall due.

20) According to the information and explanations given to me and based on my examination of the records of the company, the company is contributing to the Prime ministers national relief fund for the purpose of CSR compliance and hence there is no requirement of transfer of unspent amount to the fund specified in schedule VII to the Companies Act.

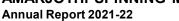

25. CORPORATE INFORMATION:

Amarjothi Spinning Mills Limited was incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 in December 1987 and converted into a public limited company in December 1991. The registered office of the company is situated at Tirupur. Tamilnadu. The company issued shares to the public in January 1993. The company's shares are listed in Bombay Stock Exchange. The Company is engaged in the business of manufacturing of Yarn. The company has its own processing unit for Yarn and Fibre and own Wind power generation plans which are mainly used for own captive use. The Company has its manufacturing facilities in India and sells both in India and across the globe. The standalone financial statements for the year ended 31 March, 2022 were approved by the Board of Directors and authorised for issue on 30th May, 2022.

26. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

26.1. Statement of Compliance

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS)as notified under the Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (Act) read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015. The presentation of the Financial Statements is based on Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013.

26.2. Basis of preparation and presentation of financial statements

The financial statements are presented in Indian Rupeeswhich is the functional currency and presentation currency of the Company and all values are rounded to the nearest lakhs, except where otherwise indicated. These financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis and on accrual and going concern basis. All assets and liabilities are presented as Current or Non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III of the Act. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of Current / Non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

26.3. Property Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property Plant and Equipment are initially recognised at cost. The initial cost of PPEcomprises its purchase price, including non-refundable duties and taxes net of any trade discounts and rebates. The cost of PPE includes interest on borrowings (borrowing cost) directly attributable to acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets. Subsequent to initial recognition, PPE are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation (other than freehold land, which are stated at cost) and impairment losses, if any.

The residual values, useful life and depreciation method are reviewed at each financial year-end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the items of property, plant and equipment.

Any gain or loss arising on disposal or retirement of an item of property, plant and equipment is determined as the difference between sales proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and is recognised in profit or loss. Fully depreciated assets still in use are retained in the Standalone financial statements.

Depreciation is recognised so as to write off the cost of assets (other than freehold land and capital work in progress) less their residual values over the useful lives, using the straight-line



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method ("SLM"). During the year the company has adopted useful life of the following assets purchased during the year as per the details given below.

26.4. Intangible assets

An intangible asset is an identifiable non-monetary asset without physical substance. An intangible asset with finite useful life that areacquired separately and where the useful life is 2 years or more is capitalised and carried at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is recognised on a straight line basis over the useful life of the asset. A life of 6 years is estimated for Computer software acquired by the company.

26.5 Impairment of assets

At the end of each reporting period, the company determines whether there is any indication that its assets (tangible, intangible assets and investments in equity instruments in joint ventures and associates carried at cost) have suffered an impairment loss with reference to their carrying amounts. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and impairment is recognised, if the carrying amount exceeds the recoverable amount. Recoverable amount is higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset for which the estimates of future cash flows have not been adjusted.

26.6. Leases

The Company has elected not to recognise right-of-useassets and lease liabilities for short-term leases that have a lease term of 12 months or less and leases of low-value assets. The Company recognises the lease payments associated with these leases as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term. The Company leases land and buildings for warehouse facilities.

26.7. Capital work-in-progress and intangible assets under development

Capital work-in-progress/intangible assets under development are carried at cost, comprising direct cost, related incidental expenses and attributable borrowing cost, less impairment losses if any. Age wise capital work in progress is given in note no.1B to balance sheet.

26.8. Non-derivative financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are recognised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at fair value. Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets and financial liabilities (other than financial assets and financialliabilities at fair value through profit or loss) are added to ordeducted from the fair value measured on initial recognition of financial asset or financial liability.

Cash and cash equivalents

The Company considers all highly liquid financialinstruments, which are readily convertible into



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known amounts of cash that are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value and having original maturities of three months or less from the date of purchase, to be cash equivalents. Cash and cash equivalents consist of balanceswith banks which are unrestricted for withdrawal and usage.

Trade receivables

Trade receivables are initially recognised at fair value. Subsequently, these assets are held at amortized cost net of any expected credit losses. Loss allowance on trade receivables is measured at an amount equal to life time expected losses i.e., expected cash shortfall.

Financial assets at amortised cost

Financial assets are subsequently measured at amortised cost if these financial assets are held within a business whose objective is to hold these assets in order to collect contractual cash flows and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

Financial assets at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI)

Financial assets are measured at fair value through other comprehensive income if these financial assets are held within a business whose objective is achieved by both collecting contractual cash flows that give rise on specified dates to solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding and by selling financial assets.

The Company has made an irrevocable election to present subsequent changes in the fair value of equity investments not held for trading in Other Comprehensive Income.

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL)

Financial assets are measured at fair value through profit or loss unless it is measured at amortised cost or at fair value through other comprehensive income on initial recognition. The transaction costs directly attributable to the acquisition of financial assets and liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are immediately recognised in profit or loss.

Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

Equity instruments

An equity instrument is a contract that evidences residual interest in the assets of the Company after deducting all ofits liabilities. Equity instruments recognised by the Companyare measured at the proceeds received net off direct issue cost.

Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in standalone financial statements if there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

Investments in subsidiaries

A subsidiary is an entity that is controlled by the Company. The Company accounts for the investments in equity shares of subsidiaries at cost in accordance with Ind AS 27- Separate Financial Statements.





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In respect of investment in equity share capital of group captive power companies which are made to comply with the provisions of Electricity Rules 2003, these investments are carried at cost as these investments can be sold back only at par.

Derivative financial instruments

The Company has no derivative contracts to hedge risks during the year.

Impairment of financial assets

A financial asset is regarded as credit impaired when one or more events that may have a detrimental effect on estimated future cash flows of the asset have occurred. The Company applies the expected credit loss model for recognising impairment loss on financial assets (i.e. the shortfall between the contractual cash flows that are due and all the cash flows (discounted) that the Company expects to receive).

26.9. Inventories

The Company uses the same cost formula for all inventories of similar nature and use. The cost formula used is applied on a consistent basis from period to period.

Raw materials, components, stores and spares of inventory are measured at weighted average cost. Materials and other items held for use in the production of inventories are not written down below cost if the finished products in which they will be incorporated are expected to be sold at or above cost. Work in progress and finished goods are valued at cost or Net Realisable Value whichever is lower. Cost includes direct materials, labour and a portion of manufacturing overheads. Saleable scrap is valued at lowest of the net realisable value in the last two months.

26.10. Revenue recognition

Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point in time when control is transferred to the customer which is usually on dispatch / delivery. Revenue is measured based on the transaction price, which is the consideration, adjusted for volume discounts, rebates, scheme allowances, price concessions, incentives, and returns, if any, as specified in the contracts with the customers. Revenue excludes taxes collected from customers on behalf of the government.

Rendering of services

Revenue from rendering of services is recognised overtime as and when the customer receives the benefit of the Company's performance and the Company has an enforceable right to payment for services transferred.

Other Operating revenues

Other operating revenues comprise income from ancillary activities incidental to the operations of the Company and are recognised when the right to receive the income is established as per the terms of the contract.

Dividend and Interest Income

Dividend income from investments is recognized when the Company's right to receive payment has been established (provided that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the amount of income can be measured reliably).



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Interest income is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable (provided that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the amount of income can be measured reliably).

Insurance claims

Insurance claims are accounted for on the basis of claims admitted and to the extent that there is no uncertainty in receiving the claims.

Government Grants

Government grants (including export incentives) are recognised only when there is reasonable assurance that the Company will comply with the conditions attaching to them and the grants will be received. Government grants whose primary condition is that the Company should purchase, construct or otherwise acquire capital assets are presented by deducting them from the carrying value of the assets. The grant is recognized as income over the life of a depreciable asset by way of a reduced depreciation charge. Export benefits are accounted for in the year of exports based on eligibility and when there is no uncertainty in receiving the same.

26.11. Employee Benefits

Defined contribution plans

Provident fund (PF)

Contribution towards PF is determined under the Employees' Provident Funds & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 and charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss during the period of incurrence when the services are rendered by the employees.

Defined benefit plans

As per the records of the Company none of the employees come under the purview of Payment of Gratuity Act. With regard to other terminal benefits payable to employees the Company makes a payment of such benefits every year and hence no provision is required.

Compensated leave absences

Compensated leave absences are encashed by employees at year end and no carry forward of leave is permitted as per the leave policy. All leave remaining to be encashed at period end are fully provided.

26.12 Borrowing cost

Borrowing costs are interest and ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings. General and specific borrowing costs attributable to acquisition and construction of any qualifying asset (one that takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its designated use or sale) are capitalised until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use or sale, and included as part of the cost of that asset. Investment income earned on the temporary investment of specific borrowings pending their expenditure on qualifying assets is deducted from the borrowing costs eligible for capitalisation. All the other borrowing costs are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss within Finance costs of the period in which they are incurred.

26.13. Foreign Currency Transactions

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the books by applying the exchange rates as on the date of transaction. Foreign currency assets are converted at the exchange rate prevailing on



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the last working day of the accounting year and the exchange is adjusted to the Profit & Loss Account.

26.14. Income Taxes

Income tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax. Current and deferred tax are recognised in profit and loss, except when they relate to items that are recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, in which case, the current and deferred tax are also recognized in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

Current tax

Current tax is measured at the amount of tax expected to be payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Current tax assets and current tax liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognized amounts and there is an intention to settle the asset and the liability on a net basis.

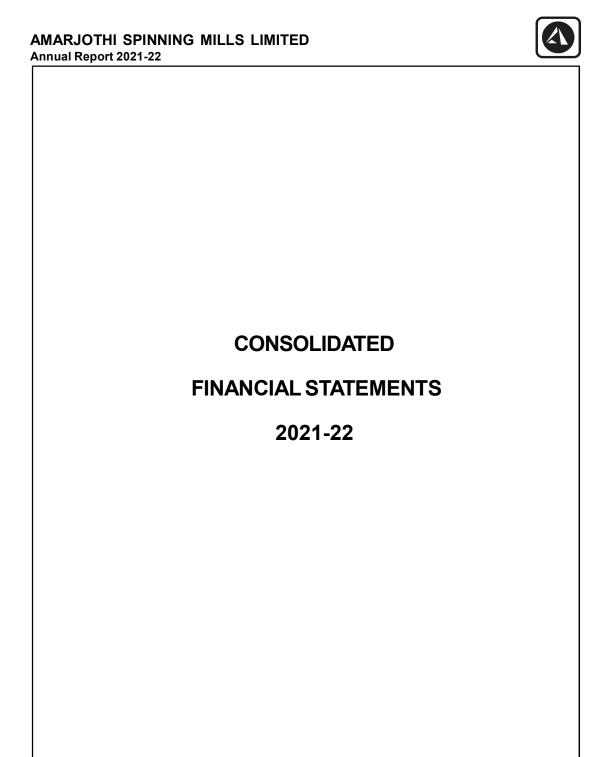

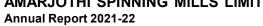

26. CORPORATE INFORMATION:

The Consolidated Financial Statements comprise of Financial Statements of Amarjothi Spinning Mills Limited (the Holding Company), its Subsidiaries and its Associates (collectively "the Group") for the year ended March 31 2022. Amarjothi Spinning Mills Limited was incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 in December 1987 and converted into a public limited company in December 1991. The registered office of the company is situated at Tirupur. The company issued shares to the public in January 1993. The company's shares are listed in Bombay Stock Exchange. The Company is engaged in the business of manufacturing of Yarn, processing of Yarn and Fiber and generation of Wind Power.The Company has its manufacturing facilities in India and sells both in India and across the globe.The consolidated financial statements for the year ended 31 March, 2022 were approved by the Board of Directors and authorised for issue on 30th May, 2022.

27. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

27.1. Statement of Compliance

The consolidated financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) as notified under the Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 (Act) read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules 2015. The presentation of the Financial Statements is based on Schedule III of the Companies Act, 2013.

27.2. Basis of preparation and presentation of financial statements

The consolidated financial statements are presented in Indian Rupees which is the functional currency and presentation currency of the Company and all values are rounded to the nearest lakhs, except where otherwise indicated. These financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis and on accrual and going concern basis. All assets and liabilities are presented as Current or Non-current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria set out in the Schedule III of the Act. Based on the nature of products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of Current / Non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

27.3. Principles of consolidation:

The consolidated financial statements relate to Amarjothi Spinning Mills Ltd (the "company") and its subsidiary and associates. The consolidated financial statements have been prepared on the following basis:

The financial statements of the company and its subsidiary and associates are combined on a line by line basis by adding together the book values of like items of assets, liabilities, income and expenses, after fully eliminating intra group balances and intra group transactions resulting in unrealised profit or losses. Subsidiaries are consolidated from the date control commences until the date control ceases. The difference between cost of investment in the subsidiary and associates, over the net assets at the time of acquisition of shares in the subsidiary and associates is recognised in the financial statements as Goodwill or Capital reserve as the case may be. As far as possible, the consolidated financial statements are prepared using accounting policies for like transactions and other events in similar circumstances and are presented in the same manner as the company's separate financial statements.

27.4. Property Plant and Equipment (PPE)

Property Plant and Equipment are initially recognised at cost. The initial cost of PPE comprises its purchase price, including non-refundable duties and taxes net of any trade discounts and rebates. The cost of PPE includes interest on borrowings (borrowing cost) directly attributable to acquisition, construction or production of qualifying assets. Subsequent to initial recognition, PPE are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation (other than freehold land, which are stated at cost) and impairment losses, if any.

The residual values, useful life and depreciation method are reviewed at each financial year-end to ensure that the amount, method and period of depreciation are consistent with previous estimates and the expected pattern of consumption of the future economic benefits embodied in the items of property, plant and equipment.

Any gain or loss arising on disposal or retirement of an item of property, plant and equipment is determined as the difference between sales proceeds and the carrying amount of the asset and is recognised in profit or loss. Fully depreciated assets still in use are retained in the Standalone financial statements.

Depreciation is recognised so as to write off the cost of assets (other than freehold land and capital work in progress) less their residual values over the useful lives, using the straight- line method ("SLM"). During the year the company has adopted useful life of the following assets purchased during the year as per the details given below.

27.5. Intangible assets

An intangible asset is an identifiable non-monetary asset without physical substance. An intangible asset with finite useful life that areacquired separately and where the useful life is 2 years or more is capitalised and carried at cost less accumulated amortization. Amortization is recognised on a straight line basis over the useful life of the asset. A life of 6 years is estimated for Computer software acquired by the company.

27.6. Impairment of assets

At the end of each reporting period, the company determines whether there is any indication that its assets (tangible, intangible assets and investments in equity instruments in joint ventures and associates carried at cost) have suffered an impairment loss with reference to their carrying amounts. If any indication of impairment exists, the recoverable amount of such assets is estimated and impairment is recognised, if the carrying amount exceeds the recoverable amount. Recoverable amount is higher of the fair value less costs of disposal and value in use. In assessing value in use, the estimated future cash flows are discounted to their present value using a pre-tax discount rate that reflects current market assessments of the time value of money and the risks specific to the asset for which the estimates of future cash flows have not been adjusted.

27.7. Leases

The Company has elected not to recognise right-of-useassets and lease liabilities for short-term leases that have a lease term of 12 months or less and leases of low-value assets. The Company



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recognises the lease payments associated with these leases as an expense on a straight-line basis over the lease term. The Company leases land and buildings for warehouse facilities.

27.8. Capital work-in-progress and intangible assets under development

Capital work-in-progress/intangible assets under development are carried at cost, comprising direct cost, related incidental expenses and attributable borrowing cost, less impairment losses if any. Age wise capital work in progress is given in note no.1B to balance sheet.

27.9. Non-derivative financial instruments

Financial assets and liabilities are recognised when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. Financial assets and liabilities are initially measured at fair value. Transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition or issue of financial assets andfinancial liabilities (other than financial assets and financialliabilities at fair value through profit or loss) are added to ordeducted from the fair value measured on initial recognition financial asset or financial liability.

Cash and cash equivalents

The Company considers all highly liquid financialinstruments, which are readily convertible into known amounts of cash that are subject to an insignificant risk of change in value and having original maturities of three months or less from the date of purchase, to be cash equivalents. Cash and cash equivalents consist of balanceswith banks which are unrestricted for withdrawal and usage.

Trade receivables

Trade receivables are initially recognised at fair value. Subsequently, these assets are held at amortized cost net of any expected credit losses. Loss allowance on trade receivables is measured at an amount equal to life time expected losses i.e., expected cash shortfall.

Financial assets at amortised cost

Financial assets are subsequently measured at amortised cost if these financial assets are held within a business whose objective is to hold these assets in order to collect contractual cash flows and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding.

Financial assets at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI)

Financial assets are measured at fair value through other comprehensive income if these financial assets are held within a business whose objective is achieved by both collecting contractual cash flows that give rise on specified dates to solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding and by selling financial assets.

The Company has made an irrevocable election to present subsequent changes in the fair value of equity investments not held for trading in Other Comprehensive Income.

Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL)

Financial assets are measured at fair value through profit or loss unless it is measured at amortised cost or at fair value through other comprehensive income on initial recognition. The transaction costs directly attributable to the acquisition of financial assets and liabilities at fair value through profit or loss are immediately recognised in profit or loss.

Financial liabilities

Financial liabilities are measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

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Equity instruments

An equity instrument is a contract that evidences residual interest in the assets of the Company after deducting all of its liabilities. Equity instruments recognised by the Company are measured at the proceeds received net off direct issue cost.

Offsetting of financial instruments

Financial assets and financial liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in standalone financial statements if there is a currently enforceable legal right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, to realise the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

Investments

In respect of investment in equity share capital of group captive power companies which are made to comply with the provisions of Electricity Rules 2003, these investments are carried at cost as these investments can be sold back only at par.

Derivative financial instruments

The Company has no derivative contracts to hedge risks during the year.

Impairment of financial assets

A financial asset is regarded as credit impaired when one or more events that may have a detrimental effect on estimated future cash flows of the asset have occurred. The Company applies the expected credit loss model for recognising impairment loss on financial assets (i.e. the shortfall between the contractual cash flows that are due and all the cash flows (discounted) that the Company expects to receive).

27.10. Inventories

The Company uses the same cost formula for all inventories of similar nature and use. The cost formula used is applied on a consistent basis from period to period.

Raw materials, components, stores and spares of inventory are measured at weighted average cost. Materials and other items held for use in the production of inventories are not written down below cost if the finished products in which they will be incorporated are expected to be sold at or above cost. Work in progress and finished goods are valued at cost or Net Realisable Value whichever is lower. Cost includes direct materials, labour and a portion of manufacturing overheads. Saleable scrap is valued at lowest of the net realisable value in the last two months.

27.11. Revenue recognition

Sale of goods

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point in time when control is transferred to the customer which is usually on dispatch / delivery. Revenue is measured based on the transaction price, which is the consideration, adjusted for volume discounts, rebates, scheme allowances, price concessions, incentives, and returns, if any, as specified in the contracts with the customers. Revenue excludes taxes collected from customers on behalf of the government.

Rendering of services

Revenue from rendering of services is recognised overtime as and when the customer receives the benefit of the Company's performance and the Company has an enforceable right to payment for services transferred.

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Other Operating revenues

Other operating revenues comprise income from ancillary activities incidental to the operations of the Company and are recognised when the right to receive the income is established as per the terms of the contract

Dividend and Interest Income

Dividend income from investments is recognized when the Company's right to receive payment has been established (provided that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the amount of income can be measured reliably).

Interest income is accrued on a time basis, by reference to the principal outstanding and at the effective interest rate applicable (provided that it is probable that the economic benefits will flow to the Company and the amount of income can be measured reliably).

Insurance claims

Insurance claims are accounted for on the basis of claims admitted and to the extent that there is no uncertainty in receiving the claims.

Government Grants

Government grants (including export incentives) are recognised only when there is reasonable assurance that the Company will comply with the conditions attaching to them and the grants will be received. Government grants whose primary condition is that the Company should purchase, construct or otherwise acquire capital assets are presented by deducting them from the carrying value of the assets. The grant is recognized as income over the life of a depreciable asset by way of a reduced depreciation charge. Export benefits are accounted for in the year of exports based on eligibility and when there is no uncertainty in receiving the same.

27.12. Employee Benefits

Defined contribution plans

Provident fund (PF)

Contribution towards PF is determined under the Employees' Provident Funds & Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 and charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss during the period of incurrence when the services are rendered by the employees.

Defined benefit plans

As per the records of the Company none of the employees come under the purview of Payment of Gratuity Act. With regard to other terminal benefits payable to employees the Company makes a payment of such benefits every year and hence no provision is required.

Compensated leave absences

Compensated leave absences are encashed by employees at year end and no carry forward of leave is permitted as per the leave policy. All leave remaining to be encashed at period end are fully provided.

27.13 Borrowing cost

Borrowing costs are interest and ancillary costs incurred in connection with the arrangement of borrowings. General and specific borrowing costs attributable to acquisition and construction of any qualifying asset (one that takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its designated use or sale) are capitalised until such time as the assets are substantially ready for their intended use or sale, and included as part of the cost of that asset. Investment income earned on the temporary investment of specific borrowings pending their expenditure on qualifying assets is deducted from the borrowing costs eligible for capitalisation. All the other borrowing costs are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss within Finance costs of the period in which they are incurred.





27.14. Foreign Currency Transactions

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the books by applying the exchange rates as on the date of transaction. Foreign currency assets are converted at the exchange rate prevailing on the last working day of the accounting year and the exchange is adjusted to the Profit & Loss Account.

27.15. Income Taxes

Income tax expense represents the sum of the tax currently payable and deferred tax. Current and deferred tax are recognised in profit and loss, except when they relate to items that are recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, in which case, the current and deferred tax are also recognized in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

Current tax

Current tax is measured at the amount of tax expected to be payable on the taxable income for the year as determined in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Current tax assets and current tax liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognized amounts and there is an intention to settle the asset and the liability on a net basis.

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27.17 Segment reporting

Operating segments are defined as components of an enterprise for which discrete financial information is available that is evaluated regularly by the chief operating decision maker, in deciding how to allocate resources and assessing performance.

The Company is engaged mainly in the manufacture of yarn. The Company owns thirteen windmills which were installed mainly for captive utilization of power generated with power cost of yarn production. No internal billing is done for power adjusted for captive use. The expenses related to wind mills are not treated separately and they are part of cost of yarn production.

The processing division is operating mainly for captive utilization of yarn division.

The above facts are reviewed regularly by the entity's chief operating decision maker and he has decided that the company has only one reportable segment that is yarn manufacturing during the year.
