## Maha BJP chief hits out at Uddhav Thackeray

Maharashtra BJP president Chandreshkar Bavankule on Thursday accused Shiv Sena (UBT) president and former chief minister Uddhav Thackeray of ruining Hindutva by being a part of INDIA alliance, whose leader Udayanidhi has announced that if INDIA alliance came to power then 'Sanatan Dharma' would be finished. Addressing a press conference in Ratnagiri this evening, he sought to dismiss Thackeray's allegation that the central government did not give funds when the previous Maha Vikas Aghadi government was in power in the state. Thackeray, who had come only twice in Mantrakya during the two-and-a-half-year rule, did not send any proposals of development works to the central government, he alleged and claimed on con-

trary, current Chief Minister Eknath Shine and his both deputies were taking a follow-up of state's proposals. Bavankule further alleged that development of the state had totally come to a standstill during the MVA government's tenure.



BJP has not staked any claim on any constituency in the state so far, but the central parliamentary board, Chief Minister Eknath Shinde, two Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis and Ajit Pawar, along with Mahayuti, would take a decision on selection of candidates, the party chief said. BJP's warriors would work very honestly in every constituency in coming Lok Sabha elections, he added.

#### Navelim P'yat pushes PWD for infra repairs on unsafe highway

MARGAO: OPEN SEARCH

Pursuant to a gram sabha resolution, the Navelim Village Panchayat has written to the PWD's Executive Engineer (EE), calling for swift action to resolve infrastructure-related issues on the National Highway passing through the village. Among the key concerns raised by the gram sabha resolution are the safety of boundary walls along a specific section of the highway and the malfunctioning traffic signals on the Western Bypass. Sarpanch Lucia Carvalho referred to the observations made by local resident Harold Pinto who had moved the resolution. Pinto, during the gram sabha, drew attention to a situation where the PWD had initially constructed boundary walls along the stretch from Navelim Rosary Church to the Petrol Pump on the highway as part of a road-widening project. However, these walls were subsequently broken due to the road expansion. Pinto warned that these damaged walls were now in a precarious state and in danger of collapsing, urging the PWD to conduct a safety audit of these walls, particularly those opposite Ward 2 (Buticas). The Sarpanch stressed the need for prompt repairs to ensure the safety of commuters. Furthermore, the gram sabha raised a second pressing issue concerning the inoperable traffic signals at the Western Bypass Junction. Carvalho conveyed the frustration of residents.

#### Countdown for Gaganyaan First unmanned flight test today

CHENNAI (AGENCY)

The 24-hour countdown for the first unmanned Flight Test Vehicle Abort Mission-1 (TV-D1) to demonstrate the crew escape system of the Gaganyaan programme, will begin at 8.00 am at SHAR Range, Sriharikota on Friday. The Indian Space



Research Organisation (ISRO) sources on Thursday said the countdown will commence at 0800 hrs tomorrow. The launch of the short duration mission will take place from the First Launch Pad at 0800 hrs on Saturday morning and the entire mission will last 531 secs (about nine minutes). This flight test will mark a major milestone in the overall Gaganyaan programme--

which will be India's first manned mission to space-- and will define the in-flight abort demonstration of Crew Escape System (CES) at Mach Number 1.2 with the newly developed Test Vehicle followed by Crew Module Separation and Recovery. The objective of the mission is Flight demonstration and evaluation of Test Vehicle sub systems, Crew Escape System including various separation systems and Crew Module characteristics & deceleration systems demonstration at higher altitude and its recovery. The 35 m tall Liquid Propelled Single Stage Test Vehicle, weighing about 44 ton, uses a modified Vikas engine with 4,520 kg Crew Module (CM) and CES mounted at its fore end. "The entire flight sequence, right from lift off from the First Launch Pad to the crew module touchdown at sea about 10 km from Sriharikota, with the deployment of parachutes, will last 531 seconds.

## Madras HC dismisses TN Minister Senthilbalaji's bail plea

CHENNAI (AGENCY)

The Madras High Court on Thursday dismissed the bail petition filed by jailed Tamil Nadu Minister V.Senthilbalaji, who was arrested in a money laundering case and presently in judicial custody. The Minister, who had undergone a bypass surgery in June, sought his release on bail on medical grounds after his counsel N.R.Eango submitted a medical report from Government Stanley Medical College hospital where he was treated last week. He said the Minister is at risk of heart attack and cited the medical complications mentioned in the medical report.

After perusing the documents and the arguments put forth by Additional Solicitor General ARL Sundaresan, appearing for the ED, and Mr Elango, Mr Justice GJayachandran dismissed the bail plea on medical grounds. The AAG objected granting bail on medical grounds and said

medical reports showed that the Minister was hale and hearty and no need has arisen to enlarge him on bail on medical grounds. The AAG also said the Minister was on constant observation in jail. He said bail could be granted on medical grounds only he was not getting proper



treatment or in need for special treatment when it was not available in the government hospital. He also submitted that Mr Senthilbalaji would tamper with the witnesses and evidence if enlarged bail and opposed it. Mr Senthilbalaji was arrested on June 14 in cash-for-jobs scam when he was the Transport Minister in the 2011-2016 AIADMK regime.

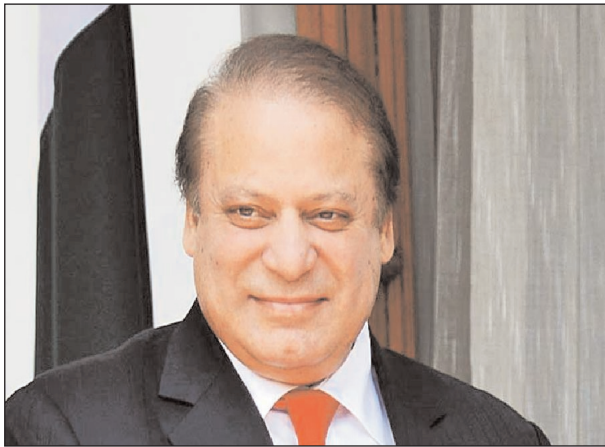


# Court grants Nawaz protective bail in two graft cases till Oct 24

ISLAMABAD : (AGENCY)

In a temporary relief to Nawaz Sharif ahead of his return to Pakistan on Saturday, the Islamabad High Court on Thursday granted the former prime minister a protective bail in the Avenfield and Al-Azizia corruption cases until October 24. Also, an anti-corruption court in Pakistan suspended his arrest warrant in the Toshakhana vehicles case.

The Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) supreme through a counsel Qazi Mushahid approached the Islamabad-base accountability court No. 1 on Wednesday for suspension of the permanent arrest warrant issued two years ago for failing to appear in a case about getting a vehicle from Toshakhana on concessional price. The 73-year-old politician was convicted in the Avenfield and Al-Azizia cases and was declared a proclaimed



offender in the Toshakhana vehicle case, which is pending before an accountability court in Islamabad. Nawaz was on bail in these cases when he left for the UK in 2019 for medical treatment. The respite comes just days ahead of Nawaz Sharif's arrival in Pakistan on October 21, ending about four years of self-exile in London. According to the petition, Nawaz was seeking protective bail in order

to surrender before the court and "submit to due process of justice and avail remedies permissible under the law".

The plea sought the Islamabad High Court's direction to stop authorities from arresting Nawaz from the airport on his return to the country on October 21 to allow him to surrender before the court. Judge Muhammad Bashir heard the plea and ordered to suspend the

warrants when informed that Nawaz wanted to appear before the court.

The judge fixed the hearing for October 24 and suspended warrants until then. However, the judge warned to restore the arrest orders if Nawaz failed to appear.

The decision by the court removed one hurdle before the three-time former prime minister's safe return. He is also expected to get relief from the Islamabad High Court where he petitioned on Wednesday for protective bail in two corruption cases.

Last month, PML-N President Shehbaz Sharif confirmed that his elder brother Nawaz Sharif was returning to Pakistan on October 21 to lead the party's campaign for the general election. Subsequently, the party announced that Nawaz was ready to face "all kinds of circumstances" upon his return from London.

Nawaz stepped down as Pakistan's prime minister in 2017 after he was disqualified for life from holding public office by the Supreme Court for not declaring a receivable salary. He has been living in London since 2019 after the Lahore High Court granted him four-week permission to go abroad for his treatment. He was serving a seven-year imprisonment at Lahore's Kot Lakhpat jail in the Al-Azizia Mills corruption case before he was allowed to proceed to London in 2019 on "medical grounds".

In 2020, an accountability court declared Nawaz a proclaimed offender in the Toshakhana vehicles case. He is also accused of obtaining luxury cars from the treasury house by paying just 15 per cent of the price of these vehicles. Nawaz was convicted in the Al-Azizia Mills and Avenfield corruption cases in 2018.

# Sri Lanka anti-graft body drops corruption charges against Gotabaya Rajapaksa in president's house cash case

COLOMBO : (AGENCY)

Citing lack of evidence, Sri Lanka's anti-graft commission has dropped a case against former president Gotabaya Rajapaksa in which more than Rs 17 million was discovered by protesters from the President's House here in July 2022.

The Commission to Investigate Allegations of Bribery or Corruption (CIA-BOC) on Wednesday reported to the Colombo Fort Magistrate's Court that due to lack of evidence, no further action can be taken against the 74-year-old politician. The Bribery Commission informed the court that further legal proceedings regarding this incident would not be taken owing to insufficient evidence to proceed with the matter, the Daily Mirror online reported on Thursday. More than Rs 17 million in cash was found at the President's House in Fort Colombo after Rajapaksa fled the President's House on July 9 last year following the

uprising against him. Tens of thousands of protesters stormed the President's House in the capital in July last year demanding his resignation. The anti-govern-

ment protesters discovered over Rs 17.85 million in cash and handed over the money to the Colombo Fort police. Rajapaksa later applied to the court to return the cash to him. The Colombo Fort magistrate's court rejected the plea. Earlier this year, he was also questioned by Sri Lanka police in the case. A three-hour-long statement was recorded at his private house as directed by the



prevailing security situation at that time. He told the police that the money belonged to him and it was to be distributed among the people whose houses were destroyed by the protesters, the Daily Mirror portal reported. The former president fled Sri Lanka on July 13 last year to the Maldives. From there, he travelled to Singapore from where he sent in his resignation on July 14, paving

# King Charles makes plea for religious tolerance amid Israel-Gaza conflict

LONDON : (AGENCY)

Britain's King Charles III has made a plea for religious tolerance and the importance of a multi-faith outlook as he mourned the loss of lives in times of international turmoil, an indirect reference to the Israel-Gaza conflict in the Middle East. In a speech at Mansion House in the City of London on Wednesday evening, the 74-year-old monarch described the UK as a "community of communities" where shared values are the force holding it together and reminding that "there is far, far more that unites us than divides us". He stressed that British society was nurtured and enriched by citizens from the four corners of the globe, drawing upon deep wells filled with shared histories and experiences. "One of my first acts as Sovereign, a little over a year ago, was to open the doors of Buckingham Palace to the leaders of the major faiths represented across these islands; to welcome them, with respect and indeed love, and to re-dedicate my life to protecting the space for faith itself within our shores," said King Charles. "Such understanding, both at home and overseas, is never more vital than at times of international turmoil and heartbreaking loss

of life...Even in the most fractious times - when disagreements are polished, paraded and asserted - there is in our land a kind of muscle-memory that it does not have to be like this; that the temptation to turn ourselves into a shouting or recriminatory society must be resisted," he said. The King called for the moderating forces of "civility and tolerance, on which our political life and wider national conversation depend" and warned



against the "rancour and acrimony" of social media.

In the wide-ranging speech, the monarch also reflected upon the advancement of science and the impact of artificial intelligence (AI). On a lighter note, he highlighted the importance of a healthy sense of humour that characterises British life. "The British sense of humour is world-renowned. It is not what we do. It is who we are. Our ability to laugh at ourselves is one of our great national characteristics. Just as well, you may say, given.

# Evidence shows Hamas militants likely used some North Korean weapons in attack on Israel

SEOUL : (AGENCY)

Hamas fighters likely fired North Korean weapons during their October 7 assault on Israel, a militant video and weapons seized by Israel show, despite Pyongyang's denials that it arms the militant group. South Korean officials, two experts on North Korean arms and an Associated Press analysis of weapons captured on the battlefield by Israel point toward Hamas using Pyongyang's F-7 rocket-propelled grenade, a shoulder-fired weapon that fighters typically use against armored vehicles.

The evidence shines a light on the murky world of the illicit arms shipments that sanction-battered North Korea uses as a way to fund its own conventional and nuclear weapons programs. Rocket-propelled grenade launchers fire a single warhead and can be quickly reloaded, making them valuable weapons for guerrilla forces in running skirmishes with heavy vehicles. The F-7 has been documented in Syria, Iraq, Lebanon and the Gaza Strip, said N Jenzen-Jones, a weapons expert who works as the director of the consultancy Armament Research Services. "North Korea has long supported Palestinian militant groups, and North Korean arms

have previously been documented amongst interdicted supplies," Jenzen-Jones told the AP.

Hamas has published images of their fighters with a launcher with a rocket-propelled grenade with a distinctive red stripe across



its warhead, and other design elements matching the F-7, said Matt Schroeder, a senior researcher with Small Arms Survey who wrote a guide to Pyongyang's light weapons. "It is not a surprise to see North Korean weapons with Hamas," Schroeder said. The North Korean F-7 resembles the more widely distributed Soviet-era RPG-7 rocket-propelled grenade, with a few noticeable differences. Jenzen-Jones described the F-7 rocket-propelled grenade as "intended to offer a lethal effect against personnel" given its shape and payload, rather than armoured vehi-

cles. Weapons seized by the Israeli military and shown to journalists also included that red stripe and other design elements matching the F-7. In a background briefing with journalists Tuesday, South Korea's Joint Chiefs of Staff specifically

identified the F-7 as one of the North Korean weapons it believed Hamas used in the attack. The Israeli military declined to answer questions from the AP about the origin and the manufacturer of those rocket-propelled grenades, saying the ongoing war with Hamas prevented it from responding. North Korea's mission to the United Nations did not respond to a request for comment from the AP. Jenzen-Jones said he believed, based on imagery of the weapons wielded by Hamas fighters in the October 7 attack, they also used North Korea's Type 58 self-loading rifle, a

variant of the Kalashnikov assault rifle. "Many North Korean weapons have been provided by Iran to militant groups, and this is believed to be the primary way by which Palestinian militants have come to possess North Korean weapons," Jenzen-Jones said.

Iran also has modeled some of its ballistic missiles after North Korean variants. Iran's mission to the United Nations did not respond to a request for comment. Officials in Iran long have supported Hamas and have praised their assault on Israel.

In December 2009, Thai authorities grounded a North Korean cargo plane reportedly carrying 35 tons of conventional arms, including rockets and rocket-propelled grenades, as it made a refueling stop at a Bangkok airport.

# Joe Biden says he was 'very blunt' with Israeli leaders on humanitarian assistance to Gaza

The US President also said Israel has been 'badly victimised' but it would lose credibility worldwide if it did not explore the opportunity to relieve the suffering of these people who have nowhere to go

WASHINGTON : (AGENCY)

US President Joe Biden said he was "very blunt" with Israeli leaders that they would be "held accountable" if they didn't allow humanitarian assistance to relieve the suffering of people in Gaza displaced by its raging conflict with Hamas.

He also said Israel has been "badly victimised" but it would lose credibility worldwide if it did not explore the opportunity to relieve the suffering of these people who have nowhere to go. Israel has told 1.1 million Palestinians living in the north of Gaza to move south ahead of the possible ground operations against the Hamas militants who launched an unprecedented attack on Israel and killed more than 1,400 people on October 7. The UN agencies have warned that an unprecedented humanitarian catastrophe is unfolding in the besieged city of Gaza. "As they probably told



you I was very blunt with the Israelis," Biden told reporters on Air Force One while on his return from Tel Aviv where he expressed America's solidarity with Israel and held crucial talks with Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu. "Look, Israel has been badly victimised. But the truth is that if they have an opportunity to relieve the suffering of people who have nowhere to go, it's what they should do. And if they don't, they'll be held

accountable in ways that may be unfair," Biden said on his way back from Israel on Wednesday. "And my point to everyone is, look, if you have an opportunity to alleviate the pain, you should do it. And if you don't, you're going to lose credibility worldwide. And I think everyone understands that," Biden said after he spent several hours in Israel in the aftermath of the terrorist strike from Hamas on October 7.

Asked specifically what
