## Drop in enrolments for local languages: Gujarat Vidyapith's challenge post Covid

ESTABLISHED BY Mahatma Gandhi more than a century ago, Gujarat Vidyapith in Ahmedabad has seen a veritable record of student enrolments from across the world over the years. Lately, however, the institution has been finding it difficult to find takers for local languages from India.

Eying a surge in enrolments, Gujarat Vidyapith now aims to channelise efforts to increase awareness and outreach by using various means, including social media.

The deemed-to-be university's Bhartiya Bhasha Sanskriti Sansthan, the department of languages that offers courses in both Indian and foreign languages, has been finding it tough to match the numbers for pre-Covid enrolments for local languages, reveals the official data.

Urdu, Tamil, Marathi and Punjabi were some of the popular local languages where the enrolments passed the figure of 65 before the pandemic.

While the department remained shut for a year in 2020 as the coronavirus struck, online classes resumed in 2021.

In the current four-month batch for Indian languages and the three-month foreign language batch that started on September 15, a total of nearly 65 students have enrolled.

"Since there were no regular classes during Covid and after that, there is a general perception among people that Vidyapith has shut down its language courses. So, now, we are not finding many takers for local languages," Professor Usha Upadhyay, Director of the Department, told

The Indian Express. Only 14 students have enrolled for Urdu (5), Marathi (4), Tamil (4) and Malayalam (1), as per the official data.

However, the situation is still better in foreign languages like Arabic, French and German. "As students still prefer to go abroad for higher studies or employment, they enrol for foreign languages like French and German. But after the pandemic, the word spread that Indian languages are no longer being taught here," said

25-year-old Jahnavi Shejwalkar, who has been teaching French at Gujarat Vidyapith since 2019.

Even Hindi is not finding many takers. Dr Anjana Sandhir, 63, who has been teaching Hindi and English at Gujarat Vidyapith since 2009, says, "Mostly students from abroad would enrol for Hindi and English. For instance, I have had batches of more than 40 students for Hindi and English each and do two sessions in one batch and had to decline any new takers. In 2016-17, we had 45 students including five professors from Mexico who not only learnt Hindi but English and Gujarati too."

On Thursday, Charmi Vedja, a 21-year-old final-year aerospace engineering student in Vellore, who had come enquiring about the course in German was sent back and asked to enquire about the next batch, which is set to start in January 2024.

"I got to know that Vidyapith offers the course in German for a very low fee from my uncle now... so I came today," Charmi, a resident of Morbi currently pursuing an internship at ISRO (Indian Space Research Organisation) Ahmedabad, told The Indian Express. She wants to pursue her masters in Germany.

To spread awareness, the department has started using social media platforms like Facebook, WhatsApp, official website. It has also been putting banners in and around the campus.

"With these efforts, we have been able to achieve these numbers. We hope that the batch starting in January will have more students. We already have an edge in terms of flexibility in classes and the fee charged is just the information that needs to be spread out. Also, with a push for the mother tongue in the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020, we hope these will find takers in the coming batches. While private institutes charge anywhere around Rs 30,000-35,000 for a foreign language, the fee here is only Rs 6,000. Two-hour classes for Indian languages are taught on weekends while foreign languages are on alternate days," adds Prof Upadhyay.

Most enrolments, as per officials, for the local language courses have come from students whose families are from other states and are settled in Ahmedabad.

They either want their children to learn their mother tongue or foreign languages for international opportunities.

## Man, 70, held for molesting minor, charged with POCSO: Police

A 70-YEAR-OLD man was arrested Sunday for allegedly molesting a seven-year-old girl in Ahmedabad. The man has been booked under various provisions of the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act and the Indian Penal Code.

The girl's mother had sent her to a nearby shop to buy chocolate. The accused, their neighbour, asked her to get chocolate for him too. "While returning after getting the chocolate, the girl went to give the chocolate to the accused and the latter sexually molested her after closing the door," Police inspector J H Chaudhari said.

He added that the police will take statements from the neighbours and an investigation is underway.

## Leopard mauls woman to death in Navsari

A 24-YEAR-OLD woman was mauled to death by a leopard at a village in Navsari district, a forest official said on Sunday. The incident occurred at Sadakpore village of Chikhli taluka late on Saturday night, he said.

Prima facie, it appeared that the woman was killed by a leopard when she went to attend nature's call last night, range forest officer (RFO), Chikhli, Akash Padshala said. "The body of the deceased was sent for post-mortem and the police's help was taken to rule out any foul play," he said.

The Forest Department has set up cages in the area to trap the leopard, he added. Chhaya Patel, the woman, had sustained injuries on her neck and other parts of the body and was killed on the spot, officials said. When the woman did not return home, her family members and other villagers went looking for her and found her body, they said.

A case of accidental death was registered at Chikhli police station, it was stated. The incident comes a day after a 55-year-old woman was similarly attacked by a leopard at Wadala village in Talala taluka of Amreli district.

Gujarat has witnessed a rise in the leopard population, with the latest census putting the number of the big cat in the state to 2,274 in 2023, a 63 per cent rise from 1,395 in 2016.

## ROOM FOR SPECULATION

WHILE ATTENDING a blood donation campaign organised by industrialist Maulesh Ukani to mark his 60th birthday, Gujarat BJP president C R Paatil Sunday threw a name that might be in the reckoning of the party for the Rajkot Lok Sabha constituency in next year's general elections. "There was news that Mauleshbhai is going to be taken to Lok Sabha (by the BJP). If he is willing to come, then we will take him for sure. But Mauleshbhai himself has announced that those doing the service (as MP) are doing fine and there is no need to change," Paatil said as the audience broke into laughter. BJP MPs Mohan Kundariya, Rambhai Mokariya and party MLA Darshita Shah were also on the stage. The party sources identify Ukani as an industrialist who has been a BJP well-wisher.

## MULTIPLE HATS

FORMER MEDIA convener of Gujarat BJP Harshad Patel, who is currently the vice-chancellor of two state universities - Indian Institute of Teacher Education and Children's University - was appointed to the Board of Management of Gujarat Vidyapith (GV) as a member in June 2022 and later, a trustee in January. In a meeting of the Vidyapith trust held on September 6, Patel was announced as the secretary of the trust, post usually held by the Registrar of the university.

## Former poll panel chief MS Gill dies at 87

FORMER CHIEF election commissioner and Padma Vibhushan awardee Manohar Singh Gill died at 87 in a Delhi hospital on Sunday.

A distinguished figure in bureaucracy and politics, Gill's journey as a civil servant, Punjab-cadre, in 1958. He retired as the Chief Election Commissioner of India, a position he held from 1996 to 2001. It was during his tenure as CEC that the Election Commission introduced Electronic Voting Machines (EVMs).

After his retirement, Gill joined the Indian National Congress and represented Punjab in the Rajya Sabha from 2004 to 2016, marking two successful terms as a member of Parliament. During this period, he held portfolios of Minister of Youth Affairs and Sports and Minister of Statistics and Programme Implementation.

Gill was known for his sharp intellect and plain speaking. He was a prolific writer and scholar, delving into topics close to his heart, particularly those related to Punjab.

His book 'Agriculture Cooperatives: A Case Study of Punjab', which originated during

his study leave in Cambridge in 1974-75, showcased his deep understanding of agricultural issues. He was an advocate of a consensus-based resolution to river water disputes that have long plagued the region. He believed that dialogue and not the Supreme Court held the key to the resolution of the contentious Satluj Yamuna Link canal issue.

Born in undivided Punjab on June 14, 1936, Gill never stopped lamenting what he called the "second division" of the state in 1966. Linking the water dispute with the trifurcation of Punjab (Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana), he once told The Indian Express, "The division was unfair with many Punjabi-speaking areas going to Haryana; our riparian state was given a raw deal and forced to share its river water."

## Enthusiasm among birdwatchers as orange-headed thrush sighting recorded in Gujarat in a first

BIRDWATCHERS IN Gujarat are excited over an orange-headed thrush (Geokichla citrina citrina), usually spotted in the Himalayas, Eastern Ghats, and Sri Lanka, was seen in Ahmedabad early this year. With this, the number of species of birds recorded in the state has gone up to 117.

The petite forest-dwelling bird was sighted by Ishaan Lalbhai, son of businessman Punit Lalbhai, in the family's garden in Koteswar on the outskirts of Ahmedabad on March 9. Later, Punit Lalbhai, fellow birdwatcher Sunil Kini, Ruchita Soni, and Ishaan spotted it again in the same garden on April 9. The sighting has been detailed in the latest issue of Flamingo Gujarat, the quarterly journal published by Bird Conservation Society, Gujarat (BCSG), an Ahmedabad-headquartered NGO working for the conservation of birds in the state.

"On March 24, 2023, at around 17:30 hours, while on a

regular birding trip at our garden area in Ahmedabad, I encountered a male orange-headed thrush. The bird was seen well, and it was noted that it moved on the dry leaf bed and looked for insects. It was identified as an orange-headed thrush, and photos were taken from a safe distance. Later, the photos were shared with Devvratish Mori, Prasad Ganpule, and Sunil Kini, and it was confirmed to be of the nominate G. c. citrina subspecies," 11-year-old Ishaan has written in his article published

in Flamingo Gujarat, stressing that this is the first-ever record of Geokichla citrina citrina in Gujarat. Punit Lalbhai is vice-chairman and executive director of Arvind Limited, one of the biggest textile manufacturers in India.

Geokichla citrina cyanotus, a sub-species of orange-headed thrush, is a resident bird in forests of north and south Gujarat regions and there are scattered records of this subspecies in the Saurashtra region also, the Flamingo Gujarat article says.

Geokichla cyanotus can be distinguished from Geokichla c. citrina by its black vertical stripes across the eye and the ear coverts.

As per the Flamingo Gujarat article, Geokichla c. citrina lacks such stripes and, instead, has an unmarked orange-rufous head and a broad white bar on the slaty-broad wings. They forage on the foliage on the forest floor and their range extends into south-east Asia.

"Ishaan had been seeing this bird since February and he managed to click good photos in

March. This bird is common in North and North East India as well as in the Eastern Ghats, southern India, and Sri Lanka," Kini told The Indian Express.

"While this bird is a species preferring forests and woodland, the Lalbhai family's garden is spread over around 10 acres and is a wooded area which can attract such birds," he added.

Kini said that he too spotted the bird during a bird walk the Lalbhais had organised on April 9. "Sometimes, woodland birds are seen in gardens in cities also. Some time ago, an Indian Pitta had made a garden on CG Road in the heart of Ahmedabad its home for a month," said Kini, a birdwatcher from Ahmedabad.

Devvratish Mori, assistant managing editor of Flamingo Gujarat, ruled out the possibility of the individual seen in the Lalbhai estate being an escapee. "While birds of this species do have vibrant colours, there are no known records or literature, portraying birds of this species as pets. Hence, I don't think the one sighted in Ahmedabad was an escapee," he said.

The bird was not seen in the

garden after April 9, the article says. Prasad Ganpule, a prominent birdwatcher of Gujarat and former editor of Flamingo Gujarat, said that the orange-headed thrush seen in Ahmedabad could be a vagrant.

"Birds of this species are known to migrate from their breeding grounds in the Himalayas to their wintering grounds in the Eastern Ghats and Sri Lanka. The time of its sighting in Ahmedabad suggests that this individual bird could be migrating back to its breeding ground. But Gujarat is not known to be the migration path of this species. So, this particular bird could be a vagrant," said Ganpule.

With this, the number of species of birds recorded in Gujarat has gone up to 117. In fact, the same article records a rescue of a red-tailed tropicbird, a bird that lives at sea most of the time, by Nagajan Modhwadiya in Javar village on the outskirts of Porbandar city on April 16 this year.

This is also the first record of this species in Gujarat, taking the species count to 618.

## 12 dead as mini bus rams truck on highway in Maharashtra; driver, 2 RTO officials arrested

TWELVE PEOPLE, including a five-year-old girl, died after the driver of a minibus allegedly lost control and rams a stationary container truck on Samruddhi Mahamarg near Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar district, also known as Aurangabad, in Maharashtra early Sunday. The Aurangabad rural police have arrested the driver of the container and two assistant inspectors of Regional Transport Office (RTO) as it came to light that stopping the container truck on the highway without following appropriate procedure was the cause of the accident.

The deceased have been identified as Tanushree Solse, 5, Sangeeta Asvale, 40, Punjabi Ramesh Jagtap, 38, Ratan Jamdade, 45, Kajal Solse, 32, Rajni Tapase, 32, Hausabai Shirsat, 70, Jhumber Gangurde, 50, Amol Gangurde, 18, Sareeta Gangurde, 40, Milind Pagare, 50, and Deepak Prabhakar Kekane, 47.

According to police, the accident took place on the intervening night of Saturday and Sunday when 35 members of a family from Nashik were returning home after paying a visit to the Sailani Baba Dargah in Buldhana. Aurangabad superintendent

of police Maneesh Kalwaniya said, "The two RTO personnels had stopped the container truck around 10 kilometres before the Jambargaon toll plaza. They took the vehicle documents and licence from the driver, identified as Brijeshkumar Kamal Singh Chandal, after which they asked him to go ahead, claiming that they shall stop him again."

The two assistant inspectors identified as Pradeep Rathod and Nitin Ganorkar later stopped another vehicle after the toll naka and subsequently instructed Chandal to stop his container truck.

"Chandal parked his vehicle on the fourth lane of the highway and the driver of the trailing mini bus could not gauge it, due to which the vehicle rams the container," said Kalwaniya.

RTO commissioner Vivek Bhimanwar said that the two assistant inspectors have been suspended for not following proper precaution while stopping the vehicle on the highway.

"As soon as the message was received at the control room, personnel from both the district police and the highway traffic rushed to the spot and all the passengers were admitted to government hospitals in Aurangabad and Vijapur," said a senior police official.

"Another 23 passengers are injured and around 10-15 persons are admitted, of which three are critical," said the official, adding that the drivers of both vehicles sustained minor injuries.

Soon after the incident, the relatives of the victims along with the Leader of Opposition in the Maharashtra Legislative Council, Ambadas Danve, raised questions on the role of the RTO personnel as they had allegedly stopped the container suddenly, due to which the driver of the trailing minibus could not control its speed.
