FIGHTING GOES ON NEAR UKRAINE NUCLEAR PLANT; IAEA ON SITE

Heavy fighting continued Friday near Europe's largest nuclear power plant in a Russian-controlled area of eastern Ukraine, a day after experts from the U.N.'s nuclear watchdog agency voiced concerns about structural damage to the sprawling Zaporizhzhia site.

Britain's Defense Ministry says shelling continued in the district where the Zaporizhzhia power plant sits. Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy's office said Russian shelling damaged houses, gas pipelines and other infrastructure in the Nikopol region on the other bank of the Dnieper River.

The team of inspectors from the International Atomic Energy Agency, braving gunfire and artillery blasts along their route, crossed the frontlines to reach the Zaporizhzhia plant on Thursday in a mission to help safeguard the plant against catastrophe. Fighting Thursday prompted the shutdown of one reactor — underscoring the urgency of their task.

The 14-member delegation

arrived in a convoy of SUVs and vans after months of negotiations to enable the experts to pass through the front lines. Speaking to reporters after leaving colleagues inside, IAEA director Rafael Grossi, said the agency was "not moving" from the plant from now on, and vowed Thursday a "continued presence" of agency experts.

Grossi said it was "obvious that the plant and the physical integrity of the plant has been violated several times" — but couldn't assess whether by chance or on purpose. "I will continue to be worried about the plant until we have a situation which is more stable," he said.

Grossi said IAEA experts toured the entire site, including control rooms, emergency systems and diesel generators, and met with the plant's staff.

The plant has been occupied by Russian forces but run by Ukrainian engineers since the early days of the 6-month war. Ukraine alleges Russia is using it as a shield to launch attacks, while Moscow accuses Ukraine of recklessly firing on the area.

Before the IAEA team

arrived, Energoatom, Ukraine's state nuclear power company, said Russian mortar shelling had led to the shutdown of one of its reactors by its emergency protection system and had damaged a backup power supply line used for in-house needs.

IAEA announced plans for a news conference later Friday from its headquarters in Vienna to discuss the mission.

Energoatom on Friday accused Russian forces of "making every effort" to prevent the IAEA mission from getting to know the facts on the ground. On Thursday, Russian Foreign Ministry Sergey Lavrov said Russia was making sure that the plant was secure and safe, and that mission "accomplishes all of its plans there."

Elsewhere in Ukraine on Friday, Zelenskyy's office said four people were killed and 10 injured over the last day in the eastern Donetsk region, a key hub of the Russian invasion, and reported rocket attacks on Sloviansk that destroyed a kindergarden. It said heavy fighting continues in two districts of the Kherson region to the south.

G7 to urgently implement price cap on Russian oil imports

G7 industrialised powers vowed Friday to "urgently" move towards implementing a price cap on Russian oil imports in a bid to cut a major source of funding for Moscow's war in Ukraine.



The G7 said it was working towards a "broad coalition" of support for the measure but officials in France urged caution, saying a "final" decision could only be taken once all 27 members of the European Union had given their assent.

Households on the continent have borne the brunt of rising energy prices, with governments under pressure to alleviate the pain of the resulting high inflation.

"Russia is benefitting economically from the uncertainty on energy markets caused by the war and is making big profits from the export of oil and we want to counter that decisively," German Finance Minister Christian Lindner said in a press conference after the move was announced. The aim of the price cap on oil exports was to "stop an important source of financing for the war of aggression and contain the rise in global energy prices", he added.

Ahead of Friday's decision, Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov sounded a clear warning.

The adoption of a price cap "will lead to a significant destabilisation of the oil markets," he said. Moscow would "simply not supply oil and petroleum products to companies or states that impose restrictions," Russia's Deputy Prime Minister Alexander Novak had warned on Thursday, according to Russian news agencies.

"Interference in the market mechanisms of such an important industry... will only destabilise the oil industry, the oil market. And for this, European and American consumers will be the first to pay," he said.

At a summit in June, the G7 leaders agreed to work towards implementing the ceiling on crude sales.

In their statement, finance ministers from the G7 said they would "urgently work on the

finalisation and implementation" of the long-considered measure, without specifying the cap level.

The price cap was "one of the most powerful tools we have to fight inflation and protect workers and businesses in the United States", US Secretary of the Treasury Janet Yellen said in a statement Friday.

However, the French finance ministry said technical work on the price cap was still "in progress". It is clear that no final decision can be taken until we have consulted and obtained unanimous support from all 27 member states of the European Union," it said.

"We support all measures that reduce the income that Russia derives from the sale of oil," French Finance Minister Bruno Le Maire added.

Argentine Prez says man tried to shoot VP

A man has been detained after he aimed a handgun at Argentina's politically powerful Vice President Cristina Fernández, and President Alberto Fernández said the assassination attempt failed because the gun did not fire.

"A man (Thursday night) pointed a firearm at her head and pulled the trigger," the president said in a national broadcast.

He called it "the most serious incident since we recovered democracy" in 1983 and urged political leaders, and society at large, to repudiate the incident.

Supporters of the vice president have been gathering in the streets surrounding her home since last week, when a prosecutor called for a 12-year sentence for Fernández as well as a life-long prohibition in holding public office as part of a case involving alleged corruption in public works during her 2007-2015 presidency.

Fernández, who is not related to the current president, has denied all charges.

The president spoke shortly after video from the scene broadcast on local television channels showed Fernández exiting her vehicle surrounded by supporters outside her home when a man could be seen extending his hand with what looked like a pistol.

The vice president ducked as supporters surrounding the person appeared shocked at what was happening amid the commotion in the Recoleta neighbourhood of Argentina's capital.

White House seeks \$13.7 bn more for Ukraine

President Joe Biden is asking Congress to provide USD 13.7 billion in emergency dollars for Ukraine as US aid to the war-torn country is running out.

The request, which comes as lawmakers are preparing to return to Washington, is part of a larger USD 47.1 billion emergency spending package the White House is proposing to pay for the COVID-19 response, the ongoing monkeypox outbreak and help for recent natural disasters in Kentucky and other states. Congress will have to extend current financing for federal agencies before it runs out on September 30.

The money for Ukraine would be on top of USD 40 billion that was approved earlier this year.

Ship carrying Ukrainian corn briefly stranded in Istanbul

A cargo ship carrying tons of grain from Ukraine was stranded in Istanbul's Bosphorus and had to be rescued early Friday.

Turkey's Directorate General of Coastal Safety tweeted that the 173-metre cargo ship was stuck off the coast of the scenic Bebek neighbourhood late Thursday because of a rudder malfunction.

The busy strait was closed to traffic for the rescue by coastal safety boats. The Panama-flagged Lady Zehma was towed and the strait reopened.

The cargo ship had departed the Ukrainian port of Chornomorsk under the deal brokered by the United Nations



that allows the safe shipment of Ukrainian grain.

It's the first reported incident of malfunction since grain shipments restarted last month.

On August 29, the Joint Coordination Centre in Istanbul — which monitors the ships under the grain deal and is composed of Turkish, Russian, Ukrainian and UN officials — authorised the movement of Lady Zehma with 3,000 metric tons of corn to Ravenna, Italy.

The ship is currently anchored in the Marmara Sea off the coast of Istanbul.

Biden to meet South Africa leader amid differences on Russia

US President Joe Biden will meet with South African President Cyril Ramaphosa this month, the White House announced on Thursday, as the administration looks to draw African nations closer to the US at a time when South Africa and many of its neighbours have staked out neutral ground on Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

Announcement of the September 16 visit comes on the heels of US Secretary of State Antony Blinken's visit to South Africa last month, in which he said the Biden administration sees Africa's 54 nations as "equal partners" in tackling global problems.

But the administration has been disappointed that South Africa and much of the continent have declined to follow the US in condemning the Russian invasion of Ukraine.

South Africa abstained in a United

Nations vote to condemn Russia's action, and Ramaphosa has avoided any criticism of Russia and instead has called for a mediated peace.

Biden and Ramaphosa, who spoke by phone in April, are expected to focus their talks on trade and investment, infrastructure, climate and energy, public health and South Africa's leading role on the continent, officials said.

"The two Presidents will reaffirm the importance of our enduring partnership, and discuss our work together to address regional and global challenges," White House press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre said in a statement announcing this month's meeting.

Biden also plans to host a US-Africa leaders summit in December.

During the Blinken visit, Foreign Minister Naledi Pandor maintained South Africa's neutrality on the Ukraine war. In a press briefing following the meeting, Pandor accused the US and



other Western powers of focusing on the Ukraine conflict to the detriment of other international issues.

"We should be equally concerned at what is happening to the people of Palestine, as we are with what is happening to the people of Ukraine," she said.

Blinken for his part underscored that Russia's blockade of Ukraine's Black Sea ports has led to scarcities in grain, cooking oil and fertiliser — an issue that has had disproportionate impact on Africans.

"The US is there for African countries in this unprecedented crisis, because that's what partners do for each other," Blinken said.

"The United States will not dictate Africa's choices, and neither should anyone else. The right to make these choices belongs to Africans, and Africans alone."

South Africa's neutral position is largely because of the support the Soviet Union gave during the Cold War era to Ramaphosa's African National Congress in its fight to end apartheid, South Africa's regime of repression against the Black majority that ended in 1994.

South Africa is seen as a leader of the several African countries that will side against Russia.

Ex-president Gotabaya to return to Lanka today, say official sources

Former Sri Lankan president Gotabaya Rajapaksa will return to the country from Thailand in the early hours of Saturday, official sources confirmed on Friday, nearly two months after he fled the country following an uprising against his government over the island nation's worst-ever economic crisis.

Rajapaksa, 73, fled the country on July 13 after months-long mass public demonstrations demanding his immediate resignation on July 9 gained momentum after protesters stormed the President's House in Colombo and several other state buildings in the capital.

Rajapaksa is to return to Sri Lanka in the early hours of tomorrow, official sources here said.

His flight details are not known yet, sources said.

It was not clear if he would be returning to his private house in the Colombo eastern suburb of Mirihana.

As a former president, Rajapaksa is entitled to a government house and other privileges.

Rajapaksa fled Sri Lanka to the Maldives on a Sri Lanka Airforce plane and then proceeded to Singapore, from where he sent in his resignation on July 14.

Later, he flew to Thailand,



seeking temporary shelter. Thailand's foreign minister Don Pramudwinai has said that Rajapaksa can stay in the country for 90 days because he is still a diplomatic passport holder.

However, Rajapaksa was not allowed to engage in political activities in Thailand. He is also reportedly confined to a hotel and surrounded by security personnel.

After Rajapaksa was ousted, Sri Lanka's parliament elected then-Acting President and six-time former Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe as the new Head of State. He had the backing of Sri Lanka Podujana Peramuna (SLPP), the largest bloc in the 225-member parliament.

Media reports say President Wickremesinghe has made arrangements for his return after the SLPP led by the Rajapaksas requested him.

China could use US oil to support Russian invasion of Ukraine: GOP

A group of GOP lawmakers has expressed concerns that US oil to Unipac America, a company operated by the Chinese Communist Party, could be used by China to support Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

To ensure the Biden administration is properly managing the sale of critical assets, the lawmakers are once again calling on Department of Energy (DOE) Secretary Jennifer Granholm to provide an immediate briefing and all documents and communications related to the SPR sale.

"We are continuing oversight of the US Department of Energy's depletion of oil from the Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR). According to DOE, the Biden administration recently sold almost a million barrels of SPR oil to Unipac America, a subsidiary of Sinopec, a company owned by the Chinese Communist Party," said House Committee on Oversight and Reform Ranking Member James Comer and Subcommittee on Civil Rights and Civil Liberties Ranking Member Nancy Mace.



Iran briefly seizes 2 US sea drones in Red Sea amid tensions

Iran said Friday its navy seized two American sea drones in the Red Sea before letting them go, the latest maritime incident involving the US Navy's new drone fleet in the Mideast.

Cmdr Timothy Hawkins, a spokesman for the Navy's Mideast-based 5th Fleet, acknowledged the incident on Friday to The Associated Press but declined to immediately elaborate.

Iranian state television aired footage it said came from the deck of the Iranian navy's Jamaran destroyer, where life-jacket-wearing sailors examined what appeared to be two Sailerone Explorers. They tossed one overboard as another warship could be seen in the

distance.

State TV said the Iranian navy found "several unmanned spying vessels abandoned in the international maritime routes" on Thursday.

"After two warnings to an American destroyer to prevent possible incidents, Jamaran seized the two vessels," state TV said. "After securing the international shipping waterway, the Naval Squadron No. 84 released the vessels in a safe area."

This marks the second such incident in recent days as negotiations over Tehran's nuclear deal with world powers hang in the balance. The earlier incident involved Iran's paramilitary Revolutionary Guard, not its regular navy, and occurred in the Persian Gulf.
