Revamped shipyard

Union Minister Sarbananda Sonowal on Tuesday dedicated to the nation a revamped shipbuilding facility of Hooghly Cochin Shipyard Ltd in West Bengal's Howrah District. The facility at Nazirgunge was recreated by turning around a 200-year-old shipyard on the western bank of the Hooghly river. Addressing a programme, the shipping minister said, "Such a state-of-the-art shipyard will provide a boost to meet the requirements of new generation, high technology, greener vessels to propel growth in inland water transport along the National Waterways."

The facility was developed by Hooghly Cochin Shipyard Ltd, a wholly owned subsidiary of Cochin Shipyard Ltd (CSL), at Rs. 175 crore. CSL Chairman and Managing Director Madhu S. Nair said, "It is a matter of great pride to

turn around the defunct dry dock at a cost of Rs. 175 crore and all the equipment are made in India." Nair also stated that the shipyard, which has recently delivered the country's first indigenously-built aircraft carrier (IAC-1) to the Indian Navy, wants Prime Minister Narendra Modi to dedicate the warship to the nation.

Defence sources had earlier said that the official induction and commissioning of the IAC is likely to take place later this month. "We want the Prime Minister to dedicate the first indigenously-built aircraft carrier to the nation," Nair said.

Speaking on the shipyard in Howrah, Sonowal said it will give an impetus to water transport to the northeastern states and to Varanasi in the upstream, and this will enable economic development in the region. Nair

acknowledged the "proactive role of the West Bengal government" to turn around the dry dock, but no state government officials were seen at the programme. The state-owned CSL had taken over Hooghly Dock and Port Engineers Ltd for the modernisation and renovation of its two dry docks on the western bank of the Hooghly river in Nazirgunj and Salkia, both in Howrah district.

The new facility will focus on building inland river cruise and coastal vessels, deep sea fishing ships, dredgers and others. Under the Sagarmala project, 210 initiatives have been completed at a cost of Rs. 1.12 lakh crore so far, the shipping minister said. All the 1,507 projects under the programme will be completed by 2037, he added.

New Delhi, Aug 17:

The potential geopolitical fault line in the maritime domain in East Asia could be "graver" than what is being witnessed, Defence Minister Rajnath Singh said on Tuesday, amid escalating tensions in the Taiwan Strait.

In a virtual address at the Moscow Conference on International Security, Singh also strongly pitched for reform of the United Nations (UN), saying the global body may progressively lose its effectiveness without democratisation in its decision-making.

The Defence Minister said the refusal of major powers to change UN institutions in tune with time ignores the emerging geo-political realities and economic and technological progress that has happened since 1945.

"Global security in the framework of multilateralism requires abiding by the UN charter and principles of international law, which act as a bulwark against anarchy, instability and higher chances of conflict," Singh said.

He observed that the UN can deliver effective solutions only if it gives a voice to the entire world rather than "zealously guarding the status quo".

"Conflicts could seriously jeopardise political and economic stability and development efforts. For example, the potential geopolitical fault line in the maritime domain - particularly in East Asia - could be graver than what we are witnessing today," Singh said.

The maritime zones in East Asia have been witnessing rising unease largely because of China's aggressive military posturing.

Rajnath pushes for big reforms in UN

'India backs free, inclusive Indo-Pacific'

has been carrying out large-scale military drills around the Taiwan Strait following US House Speaker Nancy Pelosi's recent visit to Taipei.

"As a nation central to the Indian Ocean, India is committed to a free, open, secure and inclusive Indo-Pacific region that promotes sustainable maritime trade and economic practices, resilient infrastructure and adherence to global legal order," Singh said.

He said India's resolution of maritime border issues with neighbours as per international law and its focus on regional maritime cooperation in the Indian Ocean bear testimony to the value that India places on multilateralism.

"Multilaterally or through partnership with willing nations, India will continue contributing to a positive and constructive agenda that seeks to address contemporary global priorities," Singh said.

The defence minister said India's active participation in the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) is manifest of one such priority in pursuit of peace, stability and prosperity in Eurasia, of which India is an "inalienable part".

"A faith in global conventions and regulations and a multilateral, dispassionate approach overcoming isolation, unilateralism and

temptation of temporary gains, can usher us into an era of genuine multilateralism," he said.

The defence minister noted that the UN has given a platform for global progress in a number of areas, but clearly there is a "crisis of confidence" today in the UN system.

"While the UN has addressed most of these issues somewhat partially and intermittently, our collective effort has nonetheless fallen short in providing effective and enduring solutions, particularly due to the infirmities within the multilateral system," he said.

"Several contemporary global challenges have

come to the fore such as terrorism, radicalism, climate change, growing asymmetric threats, disruptive role of non-state actors and the intensifying geopolitical competition, all of which call for a robust multilateral response," he added.

Singh said this "worrying shortcoming" of the UN system is manifestation of its structural inadequacy.

"There is an incongruity today in the expectation that multilateralism under the UN will deliver, when the UN and its sister organisations, including economic and financial entities, are structurally frozen or hardly moved since their inception," he said.

Biden enacts \$ 375 bn Law to fight climate change

Washington, Aug 17:

US President Joe Biden has signed a \$ 700 billion Bill that aims to fight climate change and healthcare costs while raising taxes mainly on the rich, likely providing him with the much-needed boost ahead of mid-term polls.

The act includes measures to curb the price of prescription drugs. The final version is a much modest version of the \$ 3.5 trillion package first envisaged by Democrats.

Key economic claims about the legislation have been under scrutiny, the BBC said.

According to economic experts, despite being called the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), the package will have zero measurable impact on

inflation. The Bill sets a minimum 15 per cent tax for corporations, and Democrats have pledged it will entail no tax hikes for those with incomes below \$ 400,000 a year.

But an analysis of the legislation by the Congressional Budget Office said Americans earning less than \$ 400,000 a year would end up paying an additional \$ 20 billion in taxes, the BBC report said.

While the climate spending is unprecedented, many of its changes will not go into effect for at least

two more years, leaving questions about how the new programmes will work.

The tax credit for electric vehicles, for example, comes with price caps that disqualify nearly every option currently on the market, according to the car industry.

Several ambitious proposals were scrapped from the bill in the final weeks, including closing a tax loophole for private equity firms and capping the price of the diabetes medicine insulin

Modi-Macron hold telephonic talk

New Delhi, Aug 17:

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday had a telephonic conversation with President of France Emmanuel Macron and conveyed his solidarity for the ongoing drought and wildfires in France.

The two leaders reviewed ongoing bilateral initiatives including defence cooperation projects, cooperation in civil nuclear energy and also discussed important

geopolitical challenges including those related to global food security, the PMO said.

The two leaders expressed satisfaction at the depth and strength that the India-France Strategic Partnership has acquired in recent years and agreed to continue working closely together to expand the

relationship to new areas of cooperation, the PMO added.

1.2 lakh marooned in Odisha due to floods, says official

Bhubaneswar, Aug 17:

Over 1.2 lakh people of 237 villages in Odisha were marooned in low lying areas of Mahanadi river system, Odisha Special Relief Commissioner (SRC) P.K. Jena told reporters on Tuesday night. The SRC appealed to the people, the district administration and the people's representatives to remain alert as the next few hours are very critical.

The flood situation, he said, is likely to get worse as the peak flow at Munduli started at 18:00 hrs and would continue till 3 am.

Meanwhile, the Hirakud Dam authority opened 14 more today to flush out excess water from the Dam. Excess water is being discharged through 40

sluice gates of the dam. The current inflow into the dam is 6,91,950 cusecs while the outflow is 6,10,003 cusecs, sources said.

The SRC said around 12 lakh cusecs of water is flowing at Munduli. He warned of floods in Puri, Jagatsinghpur and Kendrapara Districts in coastal Odisha around 9 a.m. after the water was discharged from Munduli. Flood situation would peak around 1 a.m. and would continue till Wednesday evening.

Jena said around two lakh people in 1366 villages of 369 gram panchayats spread over 49 blocks and 45 wards of nine ULBs in ten districts were affected by the floods that were triggered by incessant rains.

He said so far 90 free kitchens were opened and around 27, 000 people were being provided cooked food.

Preliminary reports said so far 707 houses were damaged but the number is likely to rise.

Jena stated that 25,000 people in 353 villages of 43 blocks were affected by heavy rainfall. Free cooked food is being provided to 500 people. He said so far 26,000 people in nine districts have been evacuated. He said around 600 students were trapped in Saraswati Sishu Mandir in Gatrioutpatna in Cuttack district.

The NDRF and ODRAF team have reached the spot and have evacuated around 400 students so far. The delay in evacuation was caused as the school authorities said they have enough provision and did not want the students to shift out of the schools. The evacuation started after the students did not want to remain in school.

District Collectors have been asked to evacuate people from vulnerable areas to the safe shelters and provide them with food.
