Sponsorship for Olympians...

“When we joined hands with the IOA — responsible for selecting athletes to represent the country at the Olympic Games, among other global sporting events—in 2016, we observed that a proper mechanism for bringing in sponsors and ensuring delivery was lacking,” said Tomar. “At that time, the federation typically managed to secure only one or two sponsors, such as Samsung, which was a global brand, or local sponsors like ONGC and Amul, contributing small amounts that totalled to about ₹2 crore to ₹2.5 crore. However, by the Rio Olympics (2016), when we partnered with the IOA, the sponsorship revenue reached about ₹12 crore, a 500-600% increase. This marked the beginning of a positive trend,” he added.

This upward trajectory continued with the Tokyo Olympics, where the revenue almost doubled compared to Rio, reaching around ₹24 crore to ₹28 crore. “Looking ahead to the Paris Olympics, the sponsorship revenue is about double again, at approx



of ₹150 crore to ₹200 crore for these brands. They will utilise TV, digital, print, outdoor hoardings and events to promote their association. This means the total association value with Paris is around ₹200 crore to ₹250 crore when considering all these factors,” he added.

On the digital front, multiple brands are engaging in small-scale promotions. These are deals ranging from tile companies to honey brands, and one will see numerous campaigns during and around the upcoming Olympic, to be held from July 26 to Aug 11. Without divulging a specific figure for the marketing spends, Tomar said there are at least 40 to 50 brands that will do campaigns involving athletes and digital platforms in the coming days. “Influencer marketing is particularly popular for the Olympic games, with brands partnering with anywhere from two to six athletes per campaign. The value of these campaigns varies based on their budgets and spending strategies,” he added.

The ministry of external affairs issued a statement confirming the names of the leaders attending the ceremony. “President of Sri Lanka Ranil Wickremesinghe, President of Maldives Mohamed Muizzu, Vice-President of Seychelles Ahmed Afif, Prime Minister of Bangladesh Sheikh Hasina, Prime Minister of Mauritius Pravind Kumar Jugnauth, Prime Minister of Nepal Pushpa Kamal Dahal ‘Prachanda’, and Prime Minister of Bhutan Tshering Tobgay have accepted the invitation to attend,” it said.

Apart from the swearing-in ceremony, the leaders will attend a banquet hosted by President Droupadi Murmu at

Among names taking rounds as possible ministers are Srikakulam MP K Ram Mohan Naidu; Guntur MP Chandra Shekhar Pemmasani; and Chittoor MP Daggumalla Prasada Rao. Sources said also on the table are the names of Lavu Srikrishna Devarayalu (Narasaraopet) and Vemireddy Prabhakar Reddy (Nellore). Three of these MPs, when contacted Saturday evening, said they have not yet got any calls regarding the ceremony. JD-U is also likely to have at least three of its leaders in the new government. IJP-Paswan’s Chirag Paswan is expected to be a Cabinet minister. “Bihar will have a good presence in the new government. Both allies performed impressively,” said a party leader. Bihar also goes to Assembly polls next year.

The BJP leadership is keen to see that Maharashtra, another poll-bound state where Assembly elections are due later this year, is also well-represented. The coalition has fared poorly in there: Shiv Sena (Shinde) won seven seats, NCP (Ajit Pawar) got one while the BJP could manage only 12 from the total of 48 seats in the state. However, with INDIA bloc showing signs of

revival in the state, the BJP does not want its allies to be “politically vulnerable” ahead of the state polls, sources said.

Sources said Amit Shah and Rajnath Singh are very likely to continue in “crucial” ministries and some new faces could be from former CMs Shivraj Singh Chouhan, Manohar Lal Khattar, Biplab Kumar Deb and Basavaraj Bommai. In parallel, the BJP is also exploring ways to expand the NDA’s footprint and feelers are being sent to some Independents. Of the seven Independents, one MP, Vishal Prakashbabu Patil from Sangli, has joined with the INDIA bloc. Party leaders are also in touch with the MPs from regional parties, including the YSRCP, which has four MPs. Also, BJP and RSS leaders have discussed changes in the BJP leadership with party chief JP Nadda’s extended term

Rashtrapati Bhavan on Sunday.

“We wish to clarify that on the day, ICCL successfully processed more than 3.2 million subscription orders amounting to ₹2,445 crore,” ICCL said. However, ICCL added that some instances have been brought to the notice wherein delay was prima-facie attributable to payment aggregators/banks involved in the process of subscription, and hence transactions of some investors could not be processed in time. Tuesday was not the only day this week when retail investors were unable to execute trades at their will. Even on Monday, when benchmark indices had hit a record high, some investors could not sell their stocks due to glitches at depository firm Central Depository Services (CDSL).

‘REVIVAL AND REJUVENATION’

Rahul asked to take up LoP role, says will decide soon

CWC effusive in praise of Gandhis, Mallikarjun Kharge

THE MEETING OF the Congress Working Committee (CWC) Saturday unfolded according to the script. Jubilant at the party’s better-than-expected showing in the Lok Sabha elections, the CWC was effusive in praise of Rahul Gandhi — as also Mallikarjun Kharge, Sonia Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra — and “unanimously” passed a resolution asking Rahul to take up the post of Leader of the Opposition in Lok Sabha.

The mood in the CWC was buoyant. Although the party could not reach three digits, the committee felt the election verdict had “infused new life” into the party and signalled its “overall revival and rejuvenation”. While there were green shoots of revival in many states, the leadership was concerned about the party’s disastrous performance in some of the states, especially Madhya Pradesh, West Bengal, Delhi and party-rivaled Himachal Pradesh.

It was decided that party president Kharge will set up a committee which will look into the factors and reasons for the rout in some states and suggest steps to address the shortcomings. Sources said some of the state Congress presidents could be replaced soon. As expected, the meeting saw leader after leader asking Rahul to lead the party from the front in Lok Sabha and take up the post of Leader of the Opposition which it would

get after a decade. And as is his wont, Rahul told the CWC that he will take a decision very soon. Kharge, too, told Rahul that he should take up the post since the CWC has passed a resolution and, in a lighter vein, added that he would take disciplinary action if he does not heed to the CWC’s decision.

“During this election, we raised so many burning issues — unemployment, price rise, Agrievor issue, women and social justice issues. These issues need to be raised in a greater manner inside Parliament also. Rahul ji is the best person to lead this campaign inside Parliament. This is the CWC view,” AICC general secretary (Organisation) KC Venugopal said after the meeting.

“The entire CWC feels that in the current scenario of Indian politics for a better and strong vigilant Opposition, those who want to protect the Constitution also, should be safe under the leadership of Rahul Gandhi ji as a Leader of

Opposition,” he said. There is also pressure on Rahul not to vacate the Rae Bareilly seat in view of the shift in mood in Uttar Pradesh and the Hindi heartland. While the Congress has won six seats in Uttar Pradesh, its ally Samajwadi Party emerged victorious in 37. Besides, the Congress has made gains in Hindi-speaking states like Bihar, Rajasthan and Haryana.

Sources said he is thinking about vacating Wayanad, which re-elected him for the second time, but has not taken a final decision. In the evening, the Congress Parliamentary Party (CPP) met and re-elected Sonia Gandhi as its chairperson. The CWC reiterated that the Lok Sabha election verdict was a decisive rejection of the BJP’s style and substance of governance. “The verdict of the people is not just a political loss but a personal and moral defeat for the Prime Minister who sought the mandate in his name and ran a campaign anchored in lies, hate, prejudice, divisiveness

and extreme bigotry. The verdict of the people is clearly against the undermining of democracy and democratic institutions that has taken place since 2014,” the CWC resolution said.

The CWC meeting was largely self-congratulatory. It also singled out the Gandhis and Kharge for praise. It said the yatras Rahul “designed” and led were “historic turning points in our nation’s politics and instilled hope and confidence in lakhs of our workers and crores of our voters” and his election campaign was single-minded and sharp, and more than any other individual it was he who made the protection of the Constitution the central issue in the 2024 elections.

Incidentally, the CWC noted that the INDIA bloc parties “performed exceedingly well” in several states, among them UP, West Bengal, Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra. In West Bengal, the TMC won 29 of the 42 seats against the BJP and the Congress-Left combine.

Addressing reporters after the meeting, Congress leaders Venugopal and Jai Ram Ramesh said the CWC felt that revival of the party had begun.

In his address, Kharge said the verdict was against the dictatorial and anti-democratic ways of the BJP. “It is a decisive rejection of the politics of the last 10 years. It is rejection of the politics of divisiveness, hate and polarisation,” he said. Kharge said the Congress’s tally increased in seats “dominated by SC, ST, OBC, and minority voters as well as in rural areas”. Going forward, he said, the party has to make its presence felt in urban areas as well.

INDIA not staking claim to form govt today doesn’t mean it won’t: Mamata

WEST BENGAL CHIEF Minister Mamata Banerjee on Saturday said that the opposition INDIA bloc may not have staked claim to form the government today, but that does not mean it will not do it tomorrow.

Banerjee, also the TMC supremo, said her party will be in a “wait and watch” mode and she would be happy if the “weak and unstable” BJP-led NDA government is shunted out of power.

“The country needs change; the country wants change. This mandate was for change. We are waiting and keeping a watch on the situation. This mandate was against Narendra Modi, so he should

not become the prime minister this time. Someone else should have been allowed to take over,” Banerjee told reporters after a meeting of newly-elected TMC MPs.

The Trinamool Congress supremo said the party will not attend the swearing-in ceremony of the new government. “The BJP is forming the government undemocratically

and illegally. Today INDIA bloc may not have staked a claim to form the government, but that doesn’t mean tomorrow it won’t stake a claim. Let’s wait for some time,” she said.

“I would be happy to see that this unstable and weak government at the centre is out of power,” Banerjee said.

She said that the TMC MPs in Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha will seek repeal of the Citizenship Amendment Act (CAA).

Panel to re-examine NEET results

THE EDUCATION MINISTRY has set up a four-member panel to review the grace marks awarded to more than 1,500 candidates in the NEET-UG medical entrance exam, the National Testing Agency (NTA) announced on Saturday. The move comes amid allegations of inflation of marks leading to 67 candidates sharing first rank in the exam. “The panel headed by a former UPSC chairman will submit its recommendations within a week and the results of the candidates might be revised,” NTA DG Subodh Kumar Singh said.

“The awarding of grace marks has not impacted the qualifying criteria of the exam and the review of results of the affected candidates will not impact the admission process,” he added. Several aspirants of the medical entrance exam NEET have alleged inflation of marks which led to a record 67 candidates bagging the top rank, including six from the same exam centre. —PTI
