We don't fear Germany, we're confident in our abilities: Savita

PTI ■ NEW DELHI
The Indian women's hockey team might have been pitted against world No.5 Germany in the FIH Olympic Qualifiers but an unperturbed skipper Savita Punia said her side has the wherewithal to overcome the challenge. At No. 6, the hosts are the second-best side in the India-leg of the Olympic Qualifiers to be held in Ranchi from January 13 to 19, and the other teams are: New Zealand (9th), Japan (11th), Chile (14th), United States (15th), Italy (19th) and the Czech Republic (25th). The other eight teams that will

fight for the Olympic spots in Valencia, Spain, include Belgium, Great Britain, Spain, South Korea, Ireland, Canada, Malaysia and Ukraine. The top three teams from each of the qualifiers will secure their places in the Paris Olympics next year. "We are confident in our abilities, and the rankings of opposing teams don't faze us as we are ready to face all the tough teams that will be coming to India for the FIH Hockey Olympic Qualifier," said Savita. "We played Germany in July, so we know what we're up against," she added. India's chief coach Janneke



Schopman echoed Savita's confidence, saying that there was a lot to learn from their title triumph at the recent Asian Champions Trophy in Ranchi. "A lot of things went well for us, but there are always areas where we can improve. We need to avoid unnecessary cards and make better use of our referrals," the coach said. "Similarly, with our attacking style of play, we have to face a lot of teams that play with 11 players behind their 25-yard line and we have to get better at creating opportunities playing against a closed defence. "This tournament (ACT)

showed we are a tough team. So, we will continue to focus on ourselves, look for ways to improve and leave no stone unturned in our preparation for the Olympic Qualifier," Schopman said. "We are familiar with New Zealand, we played against the US as well in the FIH Pro League last year, but most importantly I am happy to take on these tough teams at home," she added. The top three teams each from Ranchi and Valencia Qualifiers will join hosts France, Australia, the Netherlands, China, Argentina, and South Africa at the Paris Olympics.



We will become solid again when our injured players return: Stimac

Emphasising on the need to stay positive, Indian football team coach Igor Stimac says injuries to key players such as Ashique Kuruniyan and Jeakson Singh have made the task tougher ahead of the FIFA World Cup Qualifiers. India are slated to play Kuwait in their den in a 2026 World Cup and AFC 2027 Asian Cup Preliminary Joint Qualification Round 2 next week. India are also playing in the upcoming Asian Cup in January next year. "We have entered the new phase of our work, and we know it's going to be very hard and difficult on the boys. We know that the next few months until March will be very difficult," Stimac told the All India Football Federation (AIFF) website. "We are very optimistic then that once the players, who are missing now, are back, we will become solid again and show strength on the pitch, no matter who we play against. "So, the focus at this moment is how to replace those boys who were the starting 11 players, such as Ashique Kuruniyan, Anwar Ali and Jeakson Singh (currently nursing injuries). "They were our strength in the latest successes we had. These boys played very good football; they were adding extra value to the whole team," he added. India have emerged victorious 3-2 against Kuwait on their home turf only once in a friendly match in 2004. Asked if the group is tough, he replied in the positive and said the aim is to bag the second position. "Yes, the group is very tough and challenging because we know there will be no easy opponents, and they are the top teams. So apart from that, from the third pot we got by far the best opponents available (Kuwait). "So, the group is tough at the moment, but we need to approach it game by game and prepare for it. As far as I'm concerned and with my experience in football, November to March will be difficult. "To prepare well and to make sure that the national team gets enough time to secure the second spot in the group and qualify -- that is our plan." Stimac, the 1998 World Cup semifinalist with Croatia, is getting the squad together for only a few days before the Qualifiers.



US tops defending champion Switzerland in BJK Cup Finals

The United States began its campaign in the Billie Jean King Cup Finals with a win over defending champion Switzerland, setting up a decisive tie against the Czech Republic for a spot in the semifinals. Danielle Collins and Sofia Kenin won their singles matches to give the Americans the victory that left them tied with the Czech Republic atop Group A. The U.S. will face the Czechs on Friday. Only the winners in each of the four groups make it to the semifinals. The Czech Republic beat Switzerland on Tuesday. The U.S. is without its two top-ranked players - No. 3 Coco Gauff and No. 5 Jessica Pegula. They opted to play in the WTA Finals, which was played just before the Billie Jean King Cup Finals. Collins defeated teenager Celine Naef 7-6 (4), 6-1 for her sixth win in seven Billie Jean King Cup matches. Kenin then beat Viktorija Golubic 6-3, 6-7 (1), 7-5 to seal the victory for the Americans. Kenin is playing her first Billie Jean King Cup tie since 2020. "I was very feisty and eager to get back up the rankings and I definitely feel like I'm getting more attention now," Kenin said. "I definitely feel I deserve it." The U.S. Remains unbeaten against Switzerland in the Billie Jean King Cup, winning all 10 ties between the nations. The U.S. is the most successful nation in Billie Jean King Cup history with 18 titles. It is trying to reach the semifinals for the second time in three years. U.S. Team captain Kathy Rinaldi will be stepping down from her role after this year's Billie Jean King Cup Finals. "I know in any tough situation, I can look over at Kathy and there is a calming presence about her," Collins said. "She's one of my biggest role models on and off the court." Earlier in Group D, Italy defeated Germany 3-0 to reach its first Billie Jean King Cup semifinal in nine years. Martina Trevisan defeated Eva Lys 7-6 (6), 6-1 before Jasmine Paolini beat Anna-Lena Friedsam 6-3, 6-2. In the doubles, Elisabetta Cocciaretto and Lucia Bronzetti defeated Friedsam and Laura Siegemund 6-4, 6-7 (4), 11-9. In Group C, Canada advanced by beating Poland for its second consecutive victory after defeating host Spain. Marina Stakusic got past Magdalena Frech 4-6, 7-5, 6-3, while Leylah Fernandez beat Magda Linette 6-2, 6-3. Australia defeated Kazakhstan 2-1 in Alicia Molik's final Billie Jean King Cup tie after 10 years as Aussie captain.

National Billiards & Snooker Championships to begin in Chennai on November 21

The upcoming National Billiards & Snooker Championships is set to take place from November 21 at the Nehru Indoor Stadium here. It will be the 90th edition of the national championship and the first edition to be held in the city since 2011. The event will be held for over 30 days and conclude on December 25, with around 1,500 cueists across formats and age groups expected to participate. It would also include the likes of Aditya Mehta, Rafath Habib, Vidya Pillai, Brijesh Damani, Shrikrishna Suryanarayan and Anupama Ramachandran. The divisions expected at the event are Senior billiards & snooker for men and women, Masters snooker, 6 Reds Snooker for men and women and sub-junior and junior billiards & snooker for boys and girls. "If you consider snooker in Europe, it is making more money than cricket, while the prize money too is quite high, nearly at par with Wimbledon tennis, which is GBP 2,50,000," Tamil Nadu Billiards and Snooker Association (TNBSA) vice-president Rajmohan told PTI. "It's all being possible because of the visual (television) media. Gradually, with enough support, I assure you 100% that we can gain immense popularity next to cricket. It is how the sport has gained popularity in England." Echoing Rajmohan's thoughts, TNBSA president



BG Muralidharan said that the biggest challenge for Indian snooker is to reach the masses, especially at the grassroots level. "We have to reach out to more schools and universities; that's how cricket has developed and gained popularity (in the country)." Billiards and snooker are some of the indoor sports which are yet to make it to the Olympics, and Rajmohan said efforts are being made to ensure that it is included in the editions beyond 2028 Los Angeles Games. "England and even China has come up very well (in the sport). They are all strong countries, alongside France and Germany. If these four nations push for it, it will certainly be included in the Olympics," he said. "After television and social media began spreading the sport, the viewership has peaked, and it will keep escalating in the coming years. So, if this trend keeps going upwards, we will certainly get there (in the Olympics)," he signed off.



Spain calls up Girona midfielder Aleix for final 2 European qualifiers

Spain coach Luis de la Fuente scalled up four new players, including Girona midfielder Aleix Garcia, on Friday for the final two UEFA European Championship qualifiers, with a place in next year's tournament already secured. Spain ensured it will be among the 24 teams playing in Germany after winning at Norway 1-0 last month. The three-time winner will close out the qualifying phase by visiting Cyprus on Thursday and hosting Georgia three days later. Garcia, 26, has helped Girona far exceed expectations to lead the La Liga ahead of Real Madrid and Barcelona after losing just once in 12 games. In addition to Garcia, De la Fuente could also give debuts to Bayer Leverkusen left-back Alejandro Grimaldo, Atletico Madrid midfielder Rodrigo Riquelme and Real Sociedad goalkeeper Alex Remiro after including them in his 25-man squad.

Storm Hunter put Australia ahead by beating Anna Danilina 7-6 (2), 6-4. Kazakhstan evened the tie with Yulia Putintseva defeating Kimberly Birrell 6-0, 7-5, and Hunter and Ellen Perez gave the Aussies the win by beating Danilina and Putintseva 6-1, 4-6, 10-5.

Liverpool loses 3-2 at Toulouse in Europa League

Liverpool's comeback fell short in a 3-2 loss at Toulouse in the Europa League on Thursday but it was still a victorious day for striker Luis Diaz. Diaz's father was released hours before the match, 12 days after his kidnapping in northern Colombia by members of the guerrilla group National Liberation Army, or ELN. Diaz had appealed for his father's release after scoring Sunday in a Premier League match, revealing a T-shirt saying "Freedom for Papa" in Spanish. On Thursday, Diaz didn't score but still tested Toulouse goalkeeper Guillaume Restes with a low right-footed shot from outside the area in the first half. Aron Dønnum scored in the first half and Thijs Dallinga doubled the advantage just before the hour mark for the hosts, who lost 5-1 at Anfield two weeks ago. An own goal from Cristian Cáseres made it 2-1 in the 74th minute but Frank Maguire quickly restored the two-goal lead. Diogo Jota came on for Diaz in the 81st minute and scored eight minutes later. Liverpool thought its equalized in stoppage time but Jarell Quansah's goal was disallowed by VAR. The game was Jürgen Klopp's 450th as manager for Liverpool. Before it, Klopp told TNT Sports the Colombia striker was "really happy" with the news that his father was freed. After the game, he was not that happy with his team's performance. "It was well deserved to lose because they won pretty much all the decisive challenges, battles," Klopp said. "We have too many situations where we should have won the ball but we didn't." Liverpool leads Group E with nine points from four games. Toulouse trails by two in second. Leverkusen remained the last team with a perfect record after four games with a 1-0 victory at Qarabag in Group H. The Bundesliga leader reached the round of 16 after Victor Boniface scored the winner from the penalty spot in stoppage time. Brighton scored early in each half to beat



Ajax in Amsterdam 2-0 for its second straight win after defeating the struggling Dutch powerhouse by the same score two weeks ago. Forward Ansu Fati gave the Seagulls the lead against the run of play amid Ajax's early dominance. Simon Adingra doubled it on a counter-attack to lift Brighton to second place in Group B with seven points. Marseille leads with eight after Chancel Mbemba and Ismaïla Sarr scored in a 2-0 win at

AEK Athens, which remains on four points in third. Slavia beat Roma 2-0 in Prague, handing José Mourinho's team its first defeat. Václav Jurečka and Lukáš Masopust netted second-half goals for Slavia to tie Roma atop Group G with nine points each. At London Stadium, Lucas Paquetá's late volley secured a 1-0 for West Ham over Olympiacos to stay tied atop Group A with Freiburg, which routed Serbia's TSC Backa Topola 5-0. Borja Iglesias, Aitor Ruibal, Marc Roca and Abdessamad Ezzalzouli all scored for Real Betis in a 4-1 victory over Aris Limassol and keep the lead in Group C with nine points. Danilo Pereira and Todd Cantwell scored within eight minutes in the first half to set Rangers on the way to a 2-1 victory over Sparta Prague. The Scots are second on seven. In Group D, Berat Djimsiti's goal helped Atalanta maintain the top place with 10 points after a 1-0 win over Sturm Graz. Sporting is three points back in second after a 2-1 win over Poland's Raków.
