Harmeet wins second National TT title

Panchkula: Top seed Harmeet Desai defeated second seed G Sathiyan 4-3 to claim his second men's singles title in the 85th UTT Senior Nationals and Inter-State Table Tennis Championships at the Tau Devi Lal Indoor Stadium here on Friday. The women's singles crown went to Poymantee Baisya of the Railways, another new face to claim it with some authority. She defeated Aihika Mukherjee 4-2. The PSPB paddler, who won his first crown at the Jammu Nationals last season, is tied with Sathiyan. It was a just reward for his perseverance. But the win was not easy because at the other end of the table was Sathiyan, looking for his third title. The final witnessed excellent rallies in a fast-paced match and went neck and neck.

Crystal Palace, Brighton draw 1-1

London: The Premier League's hectic festive schedule was launched with another 1-1 draw between rivals Crystal Palace and Brighton, for whom Danny Welbeck grabbed an 82nd-minute equalizer at Selhurst Park. Welbeck, a second-half substitute, rose to meet Pascal Gross' inswinging cross with a looping header that found the top corner. That canceled out Jordan Ayew's opener in the first minute of first-half stoppage time that arose from a mistake by Brighton goalkeeper Bart Verbruggen. The Dutch keeper's weak clearance went straight to Michael Olise, who headed to Will Hughes and received the ball back before crossing for Ayew to head home. It meant Brighton conceded for a 22nd straight league game - the club's longest ever run without a clean sheet.

James hits out at "hate and negativity"

London: Chelsea captain Reece James hit out at negative comments regarding his latest injury setback after undergoing hamstring surgery. The England right back limped off in the first half of Chelsea's 2-0 loss at Everton on Dec. 10 with a recurring hamstring injury and underwent an operation to try to solve the issue. It is James' third hamstring problem in the past year, prompting what he said had been negative and abusive messages toward him on social media. "Since this injury I've had a good amount of support but significantly more hate and negativity," James wrote on Instagram on Thursday. "Believe me, I don't wanna be injured, I'm happiest when I'm playing football." James added that his "recovery has started, both physically and mentally."

Argentina leads 2023 FIFA rankings

Geneva: World champions Argentina firmly held onto their world No. 1 position at the end of 2023, as FIFA announced the year-ending men's world rankings. Argentina regained top spot in April and have held the lead since then, despite the other nine placings in the top ten changing many times, reports Xinhua. France kept their second place and England finished 2023 in third place. Only 11 international matches were played in December after the previous world rankings were released on November 30, and the December edition of the standings did not see much change.

Spanish giants for Super League ruling

Madrid: Both FC Barcelona and Real Madrid have reacted positively to the ruling made by the European Court of Justice that UEFA and FIFA were wrong to ban clubs from joining breakaway competitions, such as the proposed European Super League. The two Spanish giants, who were among the founders of the Super League project and who are now the only two who remain openly committed to it, both issued statements supporting the court's decision, reports Xinhua. "FC Barcelona wishes to express its satisfaction with the sentence of the Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU) assessing the Super League project as proposed by A2E Sports," Barcelona wrote, needing the cash injection from a possible breakaway tournament to help their precarious financial situation.

Real beat Alaves for top spot

Lucas Vazquez's stoppage-time goal does the trick for Spanish giants

With a late goal after a lack-luster performance, Real Madrid found its way to victory and to the top of the Spanish league standings.

Lucas Vázquez (pic, left) scored with a header in stoppage-time and Madrid pulled off a 1-0 win on the road against Alaves to reclaim first place after Girona conceded a late equalizer in its 1-1 draw at Real Betis earlier on Thursday.

Madrid and Girona are tied on 45 points but Madrid was ahead on a tiebreaker: Defending champion Barcelona was third, seven points off the lead. The Catalan club edged last-place Almeria 3-2 at home on Wednesday.

Madrid got the late win despite playing with 10 men from the 54th minute after central defender Nacho Fernández was sent off with a straight red card for a hard foul.

down everybody thought that maybe today we were going to lose," Madrid coach Carlo Ancelotti said. "But this team finds energy out of nowhere. We held tough and in the end we got rewarded." Vázquez was left free

inside the area to score the winner with a header after a well-placed corner-kick cross by Toni Kroos. Alaves coach Luis García was livid by the bench after the goal, kicking objects, throwing his jacket, screaming and even grabbing a staff

member by the jacket and shoving him back to his seat.

"We can't let Lucas finish by himself like that," he said afterward. "You can't let the game slip away from you like that, against 10 men, in the final minutes."

Madrid's attack this season, were kept in check during most of the match in a poor performance by Ancelotti's team at Mendizorrosa Stadium. Neither team was able to create many significant scoring chances.

Nacho was initially shown a yellow card after stepping on an opponent while going for the ball, but video review called the referee and it was determined the Madrid defender deserved a straight red card. After Nacho was sent off, Ancelotti was forced to replace Luka Modric with midfielder Aurélien Tchouaméni, who went into Nacho's position in the middle of the defense.

Mukul Rane got the better of Vihaan Rao, joining top-seeded players Guru Prakash, Darsh Shetty, and Atharv Soni.

In a game marked by shifting fortunes, Mukul secured victory from the black side of the Ruy Lopez opening against Vihaan, making decisive moves over the course of 72 moves and extending his winning streak.

In the high-stakes match on the top board, Khanak Pa-



haria, the sole female participant, gave her all but couldn't

withstand the challenge posed by the 3rd-seeded Atharv Soni. She ultimately conceded defeat in 53 moves while playing from the black side in the Italian game.
