Holy water from Ganga and Yamuna, sandstone from Rajasthan for first Hindu stone temple in Abu Dhabi

ABU DHABI: (AGENCY)

Holy water from Ganga and Yamuna, pink sandstone from Rajasthan, furniture made of wooden trunks used to transport stones from India - the first Hindu stone temple in Abu Dhabi is an architectural marvel made with contributions from different parts of the country. The temple is set to be inaugurated on Wednesday by Prime Minister Narendra Modi who will lead a dedication ceremony. On the sides of the temple, holy water flows from Ganga and Yamuna, which was brought from India in huge containers. According to temple authorities, an amphitheatre in the shape of a ghat has been built on the side where the water from Ganga flows. "The idea was to make it resemble the ghats of Varanasi where the visitors can sit meditate and get transported mentally to ghats back in India. When visitors walk in they will see two streams of water that symbolically represent the Ganga and Yamuna rivers in India. A beam of light to represent the river Saraswati will be



directed from the temple structure to form 'Triveni Sangam', said Vishal Patel, a lead volunteer at the iconic temple. The temple has been built by the BAPS Swaminarayan Sanstha on a 27-acre site in Abu Dhabi, near Al Raffa off the Dubai-Abu Dhabi Sheikh Zayed Highway. The temple's facade features exquisite marble carvings set against a sandstone backdrop, crafted from more than 25,000 pieces of stone by skilled artisans from Rajasthan and Gujarat. A substantial number of pink sandstone were transported from northern Rajasthan to Abu Dhabi for the temple. Vishal Brahmbhatt, who supervises procurement and logistics at the site, said more than two lakh cubic feet of 'sacred' stone has been transported in more than 700 containers for the temple's construction. "The pink sandstone was brought from India. The carving was done by sculptors there and the stones were retrofitted here. Then the artisans gave the final shape to the designs here," he said. The wooden trunks and containers in which the stones were packed and transported to Abu Dhabi have been reused to make furniture at the temple. Swami Brahmavivahar, head of international relations for BAPS, "The entire furniture which has been

placed at various places inside the temple including prayer halls, cafeteria, community centre etc has been made using the wood from the boxes and trunks which were used to transport the stones. There is a bit of India in every corner of the temple. The temple complex is bordered by buildings that house prayer halls, a community centre to host cultural events, a library, a children's park and an amphitheatre through which a stream cuts across. The work for the structure has been going on since 2019. The land for the temple was donated by the UAE government. The UAE has three other Hindu temples that are located in Dubai. The BAPS temple, spread over a large area with stone architecture, will be the largest of all in the Gulf region. Prime Minister Modi will be in the UAE on a two-day visit beginning today. This is his seventh visit to the UAE since 2015 and his third in the last eight months. During the visit Modi will hold bilateral meetings with UAE President Sheikh Mohamed Bin Zayed Al Nahyan. The two leaders are expected.

Dutch court orders government to stop exporting parts for F-35 fighter jets to Israel

A court in the Netherlands on Monday ordered the Dutch government to stop exporting parts for F-35 fighter jets to Israel, a move that reflected mounting alarm over the heavy civilian toll of Israel's war in the Gaza Strip but was unlikely to have an immediate effect on the military campaign.

The Netherlands hosts a warehouse of US-owned F-35 parts that are exported to countries that operate the fighters. Oxfam and two other human rights organisations filed a lawsuit against the Dutch government in December, demanding that it halt the exports. The work for the structure has been going on since 2019. One dead, five injured in shooting at New York City subway station, shooter at large

One person was killed and five wounded following a dispute between two groups of teenagers at a New York City subway station on Monday at the start of the evening rush hour, authorities said. The gun fire broke out on an elevated train platform in the Bronx at around 4.30 pm, a time when stations throughout the city are filled with kids coming home from school and many workers are beginning their evening commute. A 34-year-old man was killed, police said. The wounded include a 15-year-old boy and three adults, aged 28, 29 and 71. Some of the victims were believed involved in the dispute, but others were waiting for the train, authorities said, describing four of the injuries as serious. "We don't believe this was a random shooting. We do not believe that this was an individual indiscriminately firing into a train or a train station," NYPD's chief of transit, Michael Kemper, said at a news conference. "This incident today occurred as a result of two groups that started fighting while on a train." The gun fire erupted within the train station into the platform, Kemper said, striking people on the platform. "The doors opened up and at



least one of the individuals in that group, or in the two groups, took out a gun and fired bullets," Kemper said. "People started running off the train onto the platform and more shots were fired on the platform." A hunt was on for at least one shooter, who fled the scene. "The train was coming and there were two kids yelling," witness Efrain Feliciano (61) told the Daily News. "There were at least six shots. I saw sparks as the bullets hit the wall." Feliciano said "A woman was holding a child screaming." Video from television news helicopters showed a subway train stopped at the station and orange evidence cones on the platform, which is three stops north of Yankee Stadium. Trains were still running through the station on an express track, but were stopped as police investigated. Fear of violence on the subway system spiked after a string of incidents in recent years, but overall crime in New York City has been plummeting since a surge at the height of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Bilawal's Pakistan Peoples Party split on whether to join a coalition govt or sit on Opposition benches

The Bilawal Bhutto-led Pakistan Peoples Party which won the third largest number of seats in the National Assembly in the elections appears to be split on whether to join a coalition government or sit on Opposition benches. The Central Executive Committee (CEC) of the PPP which met in Islamabad to deliberate on the post-poll scenario and proposals regarding the coalition government has decided to reach out to all political parties, including the PTI-backed independents, for a possible power-sharing deal. Addressing a press conference after the CEC meeting on Monday night, Senator Sherry Rehman said, "The PPP will approach all (political) parties, and a committee will be set up." The committee will be formed on Tuesday, while the CEC meeting which ended without reaching any final decision will also resume at 3 pm. A highly reliable source within the party said this was the main reason for the party's central executive committee which met on Monday. They failed to reach a final decision on whether to form a coalition government with the former prime minister Nawaz Sharif-led Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) or sit on Opposition benches with

replacing him as leader of the House in Parliament," he added. The source confirmed there were still differences remaining over who would be nominated for key ministerial positions like foreign minister, home minister, finance minister and also the chief minister of Punjab. But the source confirmed that Bilawal the 35-year-old former foreign minister, and some of his like-minded supporters on the Central Executive Committee CEC of the PPP are not in favour of aligning with the PML-N as they point out that they are serious doubts over whether Nawaz Sharif, his brother Shehbaz Sharif and daughter, Maryam Nawaz did even win genuinely from their constituencies or were given a mandate by the establishment. "Bilawal has said the PML-N is presently lacking credibility in the eyes of the people

who surprised everyone by voting in favour of the PTI independents in many constituencies and he believes it is better to sit on Opposition benches and give a tough time to whichever coalition government takes power," the source said. The source said Bilawal was not in favour of sharing the prime minister's position or the key ministerial posts. "There is yet to be consensus to be developed in the PPP over their next line of action even though Asif Zardari is carrying on his talks with the PML-N and some other parties," the source said. Bilawal, an Oxford University graduate in his election rallies has kept on highlighting the need for free and fair democracy in the country and for parties to stop wheeling and dealing with the establishment to get power. He also publicly criticised the jail term given to Imran Khan in the Nihal case and said even in politics he does not support going to this level. The PPP has a strong legacy in Pakistan politics owing to the Bhutto family which gave the country two prime ministers, Zulfikar Ali Bhutto and his daughter, Mohanra Benazir Bhutto. Both had abrasive relations with the establishment with Z.A. Bhutto's overthrow in 1979 and Benazir assassinated in Rawalpindi.

Democratic senator raises concerns about Biden campaign decision to join TikTok

ARLINGTON (AGENCY): The chair of the Senate Intelligence Committee said on Monday he is concerned about the decision by the campaign of President Joe Biden to join short-video app TikTok, while the White House said nothing has changed about government national security concerns. Democratic Senator Mark Warner said he was concerned about the national security implications of Chinese-owned TikTok and the Biden campaign decision to join. "I think that we still need to find a way to slow India, which has prohibited TikTok," Warner said on the sidelines of an event. "I'm a little worried about a mixed message." The White House noted that a ban on the use of TikTok on government devices that was approved by Congress in late 2022 remains in place. White House spokesperson John Kirby said "nothing's changed about the national security concerns from the (National Security Council) perspective, about the use of TikTok on government devices. That policy is still in place."

Joe Biden cautions PM Benjamin Netanyahu of Israel's action on Gaza

NEW YORK (AGENCY): President Joe Biden warned Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu of Israel on Sunday that a ground offensive in the southern Gaza Strip should not proceed without a plan to protect the more than 1.4 million Palestinians clustered there, the latest sign of frustration by the White House over civilian deaths from Israel's military assault. During the call on Sunday, according to a description from the White House, the two leaders also discussed ongoing negotiations with Hamas to release Israeli hostages in Gaza in exchange for a cease-fire and the release of Palestinians being held in Israel jails. Last week, Netanyahu bluntly rejected as "ludicrous" a response from Hamas to the negotiations that called for Israel's withdrawal from Gaza and the freeing of Palestinian prisoners in exchange for the release of more than 100 Israeli

Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party to sit in Opposition for coalition govt formation

ISLAMABAD (AGENCY)

Imran Khan's Pakistan Tehreek-e-Insaf party will not join hands with rival PML-N or the PPP to form a coalition government and would sit in the Opposition despite having a majority in the newly elected parliament, party leader Barrister Gohar Ali Khan said Monday. Independent candidates, mostly affiliated with Khan's PTI, secured the most parliamentary seats in last week's general election. However, the PTI does not have enough seats in the 266-member National Assembly to form a government on its own. "We don't feel comfortable with both (Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz and Pakistan People's Party) of them. There will be no coalition with anyone to make a government or to make a government together with them. It is better to sit in the opposition than to make a govern-

ment [with them], but we think we have the majority," Gohar Khan told Dawn News. The Election Commission of Pakistan has announced that independent candidates, a majority of them supported by the PTI secured 101 seats, followed by Pakistan Muslim League-Nawaz (PML-N) with 75 seats, Pakistan Peoples Party (PPP) getting 54 seats, and Muttahida Qaumi Movement Pakistan (MQM-P) getting 17 seats. Other parties got 17 seats while the bulk of one constituency was withheld. Though the PTI initially claimed to form the government but its chances looked grim from the beginning as at least 169 seats, in the house of 336, were needed to form the government. A total of 266 seats are directly contested while 60 women-reserved seats and 10 minority seats are allocated based on proportional representation to the winning parties. As PTI was not allowed to contest as a single party with a common symbol, it was not qualified to get the reserved seats. The party leaders decided to sit on the opposition benches, leaving the field open for PML-N and PPP as well as others to form a coalition, Gohar said, adding that the PTI would form a strong Opposition. Gohar also called out all those politicians who switched loyalties in the past saying they had been rejected outright by the people in the February 8 elections. He said the party was looking into the matter of the PTI-backed independent Waseem Qadir joining
