Mukta Arts reports results for Q3 FY2021

Mumbai, February 11, 2021: Mukta Arts Limited has stayed on course with its positive trajectory and delivered a Standalone PAT of INR 454.9 lakhs in the third quarter of the fiscal 2020-21. For nine months of the financial year 2020-2021, the Standalone PAT stood at INR 868.6 lakhs, with a growth of 134% over the previous corresponding period and has exceeded the total PAT registered in the previous financial year.

On a consolidated basis, for Q3 FY21, the company registered a revenue of INR 2,304.9 lakhs, EBITDA of INR 714.5 lakhs with EBITDA margin at 31% and a PAT of INR 139.9 lakhs and PAT margin at 6.1%.

Whistling Woods International, its subsidiary and a leading educational institute in media studies, registered a topline of INR 1,461 lakhs for the nine months of this financial year. The nine months' EBITDA & PAT stood at INR 595 lakhs and INR 315 lakhs respectively.

Commenting on the results, Mr Rahul Puri, Managing Director, Mukta Arts said "The gradual unlocking of the economy continues to lead us towards restoring the normalcy. In the third quarter, the ministry of film affairs permitted cinemas to reopen from 15th October with the overall capacity restricted at 50%. We have 22 locations with 52 screens operational in India along with the 6 operational screens in Bahrain. Our education business continues to scale new heights and we have onboarded 413 new students in this academic year. We look forward towards putting the worst of the pandemic behind us and hope to maintain our positive trajectory."

Independent Auditor's Review Report on quarterly unaudited standalone financial results of Mukta Arts Limited pursuant to the Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended.

To The Board of Directors of Mukta Arts Limited

- 1. We have reviewed the accompanying statement of unaudited standalone financial results of M/s Mukta Arts Limited ("the Company") for the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2020 ("the statement") attached herewith, being submitted by the company pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirement) Regulations, 2015 ('Listing Regulations') as amended.
- 2. The preparation of the Statement in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standard 34, (Ind AS 34) "Interim Financial Reporting" prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, as amended, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, read with the Circular is the responsibility of the Company's management and has been approved by the Board of Directors of the Company. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the statement based on our review.
- 3. We conducted our review of the statement in accordance with the Standard on Review Engagement (SRE) 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. This standard requires that we plan and perform the review to obtain moderate assurance as to whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. A review is limited primarily to inquiries of company personnel and analytical procedures applied to financial data and thus provide less assurance than an audit. We have not performed an audit and accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.
- 4. As at December 31, 2020, the company's investment in its subsidiary (including deemed investment), Whistling woods International Limited (WWIL) a joint venture between the company and Maharashtra Film, Stage and Cultural Development Corporation Limited (MFSCDCL), aggregates to Rs. 19,95,11,218/and loans and advances and interest receivable Rs.59,22,29,704/- recoverable from WWIL. As fully explained in Note 2 to the accompanying unaudited financial statements, the Order of February 9, 2012 passed by the High Court of judicature at Bombay ('High Court'), had quashed the joint Venture Agreement ('JVA') between the company and Maharashtra Film Stage Cultural Development Corporation ('MFSCDCL'). Maharashtra Film Stage and Cultural Development Corporation ('MFSCDC') raised net demand of Rs. 59,19,66,210/- and asked WWIL to vacate the premises. WWIL's petition for special leave to appeal filed with the Supreme Court of India had also been dismissed. The Company and WWIL had filed application to review the said order with the High Court and an Interim stay was granted on July 30, 2014 which required deposit of Rs.10,00,38,000/- by January 2015 against payment of arrears of rent for the year 2000-01 to 2013-14 and payment of Rs.45,00,000/- per annum from Financial Year 2014-15 till the settlement of the case, to MFSCDCL. As per the terms of the said Order, till financial year 2016-17, Rs. 11,35,38,000/- has been paid by the Company and for financial year 2017-18 to 2019-20 Rs. 45,00,000/- per annum has been paid by WWIL. The State Govt. of Maharashtra and

MFSCDCL challenged the order of the High Court in the Supreme Court which was dismissed by the Supreme Court on September 22, 2014. The amount so paid / being paid by the Company have been accounted under Non - Current Other Financial Assets in the Standalone Financial Statements to be adjusted on the settlement of the case. Management of WWIL informs that these will be accounted as an expense, if required, on the settlement of the case.

Additionally, without giving effect to the matter as stated above, WWIL's net worth stands fully eroded as at December 31, 2020. Having regard to the circumstances explained above and pending final outcome of the matter under litigation, the Company has not made any adjustment to the carrying value of investment in and amounts due from WWIL and the deposit paid consequent to the High Court's Orders. Accordingly, the impact on the carrying value of investments, recoverability of loans and advances and consequential impact on loss for the year and reserves is not determinable.

5. Based on our review conducted as above, except for the matters relating to the investment in and loans and advances and interest recoverable from WWIL referred to in paragraph 4 above, the outcome and consequent adjustment to the unaudited financial results of which cannot be presently determined, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying statement of unaudited financial results prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in aforesaid Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) specified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other recognized accounting practices and policies has not disclosed the information required to be disclosed in terms of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (as amended), including the manner in which it is to be disclosed, or that it contains any material misstatement.

We have reviewed the accompanying Statement of Unaudited Consolidated Financial Results of Mukta Arts Limited ("the Parent"), and its subsidiaries (the Parent and its subsidiaries together referred to as "the Group") and its share of net loss after tax and total comprehensive loss of its joint venture for the quarter ended December 31, 2020 ("the statement"), being submitted by the Parent pursuant to the requirement of Regulation 33 of SEBI (Listing Obligation and Disclosure Requirement) Regulations, 2015 as amended ('the Regulations').
- 2. This Statement, which is the responsibility of the Parent's Management and approved by the Parent's Board of Directors, has been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in Indian Accounting Standard 34 "Interim Financial Reporting" (Ind AS 34), prescribed under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 as amended, read with relevant rules issued thereunder and other accounting principles generally accepted in India read with the Circular. Our responsibility is to express a conclusion on the Statement based on our review.
- 3. We conducted our review of the Statement in accordance with the Standard on Review Engagements (SRE) 2410, "Review of Interim Financial Information Performed by the Independent Auditor of the Entity" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India. A review of interim financial information consists of making inquiries, primarily of persons responsible for financial and accounting matters, and applying analytical and other review procedures. A review is substantially less in scope than an audit conducted in accordance with Standards on Auditing and consequently does not enable us to obtain assurance that we would become aware of all significant matters that might be identified in an audit. Accordingly, we do not express an audit opinion.

We also performed procedures in accordance with the circular issued by the Securities and Exchange Board of India under Regulation 33(8) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 as amended, to the extent applicable.

- 4. The statement includes the results of the following entities:

- 5. As at December 31,2020 the company's investment in its subsidiary (including deemed investment), Whistling woods International Limited (WWIL) a joint venture between the company and Maharashtra Film, Stage and Cultural Development Corporation Limited (MFSCDCL), aggregates to Rs. 19,95,11,218/- and loans and advances, deposits, interest receivable and rent receivable aggregate to Rs. 59,22,29,704/- recoverable from WWIL. As fully explained in Note 2 to the accompanying unaudited financial statements, the Order of February 9, 2012 passed by the High Court of judicature at Bombay ('High Court'), had quashed the joint Venture Agreement ('JVA') between the company and Maharashtra Film Stage Cultural Development Corporation ('MFSCDCL'). Maharashtra Film Stage and Cultural Development Corporation ('MFSCDC') raised net demand of Rs. 59,19,66,210/- and asked WWIL to vacate the premises. WWIL's petition for special leave to appeal filed with the Supreme Court of India had also been dismissed. The Company and WWIL had filed application to review the said order with the High Court and an Interim stay was granted on July 30, 2014 which required deposit of Rs.10,00,38,000/- by January 2015 against payment of arrears of rent for the year 2000-01 to 2013-14 and payment of Rs.45,00,000/- per annum from Financial Year 2014-15 till the settlement of the case, to MFSCDCL. As per the terms of the said Order, till financial year 2016-17, Rs. 11,35,38,000/- has been paid by the Parent Company and for financial year 2017-18 to 2019-20 Rs. 45,00,000/- per annum has been paid by WWIL. The State Govt. of Maharashtra and MFSCDCL challenged the order of the High Court in the Supreme Court which was dismissed by the Supreme Court on September 22, 2014. The amount so paid / being paid by the Company have been accounted under Non - Current Other Financial Assets in the Standalone Financial Statements to be adjusted on the settlement of the case. Management of WWIL informs that these will be accounted as an expense, if required, on the settlement of the case.

Additionally, without giving effect to the matter as stated above, WWIL's net worth stands fully eroded as at December 31, 2020. Having regard to the circumstances explained above and pending final outcome of the matter under litigation, the Company has not made any adjustment to the carrying value of investment in and amounts due from WWIL and the deposit paid consequent to the High Court's Orders. Accordingly, the impact on the carrying value of investments, recoverability of loans and advances and consequential impact on loss for the year and reserves is not determinable.

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- 6. The Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) on March 30, 2019 notified Ind AS 116 "Leases" as part of Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Amendment Rules, 2019. The New standard is effective from reporting period beginning on or after April 1, 2019. Pending final outcome of the matter under litigation as mentioned in paragraph above, no adjustments has been made in the financial information with respect to Ind AS 116 on land rights.
- 7. Based on our review conducted and procedures performed as stated in paragraph 3 above and based on the consideration of the review reports of other auditors referred to in paragraph 9 below and management certified accounts referred to in paragraph 10 below, except for the matters relating to the investment in and loans and advances and interest recoverable from WWIL referred to in paragraph 5 above and for matter relating to Ind AS 116 "Leases" referred to in paragraph 6 above, the outcome and consequent adjustment to the unaudited financial results of which cannot be presently determined, nothing has come to our attention that causes us to believe that the accompanying statement, prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement principles laid down in the aforesaid Indian Accounting Standard and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, has not disclosed the information required to be disclosed in terms of Regulation 33 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as amended, including the manner in which it is to be disclosed, or that it contains any material misstatement.
- 8. We draw your attention to following matters
 - a) As described in financial statement, the group has considered the effect of uncertainties due to Covid-19 pandemic on the operations of the group. However, the actual impact may be significantly different than estimated as it is not possible to completely evaluate and quantify the impact of Covid-19 on the future operations of the group.
 - b) As described in financial Statement, Mukta A2 Cinemas Limited (Subsidiary) has invoked the Force Majeure clause under various lease arrangements for its premises and informed the landlords that no rent would accrue for the period impacted by Covid-19 pandemic. The amount of reduction in lease liability which is yet to be confirmed in writing for the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2020 is Rs. 618.84 lakhs has been recognized as concessional lease income.
 - c) During the quarter and nine months ended December 31, 2020, the company has incurred loss before tax (including other comprehensive income) of Rs. 1,373.42 lakhs and has accumulated losses of Rs. 3,486.63 lakhs as on December 31, 2020. Further the company's net worth has been fully eroded and there is a deficit of Rs. 3,336.63 lakhs in the shareholder's equity as on December 31, 2020. These conditions indicate the existence of a material uncertainty which may cast significant doubt about the Company's ability to continue as a going concern. However, the company's unaudited financial results have been prepared on a going concern basis on the reporting date.
- d) There is an emphasis of matter with regards to the financial statements of Mukta A2 Multiplex S.P.C. (Subsidiary) on account of deficit in the Shareholder's Equity and the company's current liability exceeding its current assets as on December 31, 2020. These conditions indicate the existence of

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material uncertainty which may cast significant doubt about the Company's ability to continue as a going concern.

Our conclusion on the Statement is not modified in respect of the above matters.

9. We did not review the interim financial results of One subsidiaries included in the consolidated unaudited financial results, whose interim financial results reflect total revenues of Rs. 39,33,72,901/-, total net profit after tax and total comprehensive profit of Rs. 5,33,45,893/- for the quarter ended December 31, 2020 as considered in the consolidated unaudited financial results. These interim financial results have been reviewed by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management and our conclusion on the Statement, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these subsidiaries, is based solely on the reports of the other auditors and the procedures performed by us as stated in paragraph 3 above.

Our conclusion on the Statement is not modified in respect of the above matters.

10. The consolidated unaudited financial results include the interim financial results of Four subsidiaries which have not been reviewed by their auditors, whose interim financial results reflect total revenue of Rs. 2,07,66,201/-, total net loss after tax of and total comprehensive loss of Rs. 3,95,19,512/- for the quarter ended December 31, 2020, respectively. The consolidated unaudited financial results also include the Group's share of net loss after tax of and total comprehensive loss of Rs 30,11,416/- for the quarter ended December 31, 2020 respectively, as considered in the consolidated unaudited financial results, in respect of one joint ventures, based on their interim financial results which have not been reviewed by their auditors. According to the information and explanations given to us.

Our conclusion on the Statement is not modified in respect of the above matters.
