Self goal by India, helps Kuwait draw 1-1

Bengaluru, June 28: India and Kuwait drew 1-1 in the final Group A clash of the Bangabandhu SAFF Championship 2023, Group A match at the Sree Kanteerava Stadium here on Tuesday.

In what was a high-tempo and high-tempered contest from start to finish, Sunil Chhetri's 92nd international goal, a clinical volley put India ahead at the stroke of half-time. However, an unfortunate own goal from Anwar Ali in second-half injury time put a heartbreaking and unfortunate end to India's hopes of topping the group.

India started off aggressively, suffocating Kuwait with their pressing in the final and middle thirds. Naorem Mahesh Singh, who scored his first international goal in the previous match, was causing all sorts of trouble from the left wing.

In the fifth minute, he picked out Akash Mishra on the overlap and the left-back sent an inviting delivery into the middle which flashed just beyond Sunil Chhetri's reach.

Nepal pip Pak 1-0

Nepal scored late in the match to beat Pakistan 1-0 in their last Bangabandhu SAFF Championship 2023, Group A match at the Sree Kanteerava Stadium here on Tuesday.

While Nepal finished their campaign with three points from as many matches, Pakistan are returning homewithout a point in their kitty. India and Kuwait have already qualified for the semifinals from this group.

The two sides were evenly matched from the beginning and produced some good football. In the 13th minute, Nepal had an opportunity to draw the first blood when Syed Abdullah Shah brought down Bimal Gharti Magar near the dangerous area. The reckless tackle earned Shah a yellow card too. However, the resultant free-kick, taken by Bimal, brazed over the bar.

On the other end, Pakistan came close to scoring in the 30th minute. Muhammad Umar Hayat set Alamgir Ali Khan Ghazi near the edge of the box, only for the latter to shoot it straight at Nepal goalkeeper Kiran Kumar Limbu.

entire match, and the first chance came from Mahesh's corner which Kuwait failed to clear and landed for Anwar Ali, whose attempt was feeble and easily blocked on the line.

India's aggressive approach led to a slight setback in the 14th minute when Sandesh Jhingan's flying challenge on Eid Al-Rashidi got him booked and suspended for Saturday's semifinal.

Kuwait gradually grew into the game, and got

their first real chance on 20 minutes as Shabaib Al-Khaldi drove a loose ball over the crossbar. Five minutes later, Amrinder Singh made a terrific save to keep out Mohammad Abdullah's shot from close range after a clever pass from Al-Khaldi.

India looked increasingly dangerous from dead-ball situations, and while Kuwait breathed a sigh of relief when Anwar headed wide from a Thapa

corner, Chhetri ensured that wouldn't be the case the next time of asking.

Moments before half-time, facing another Thapa corner, the captain, almost hiding in plain sight against Kuwait's zonal marking, cleanly nestled the ball into the back of the net with a side-footed volley from 12 yards out. One chance is all it takes for Sunil Chhetri.

Expectedly, Kuwait came out with plenty of urgency after the break, and although Rui Bento's side were allowed to see more of the ball, India remained their dominant selves in the defensive third. In the 57th minute, Al-Khaldi's free-kick was brilliantly tipped over by Amrinder.

Attack is the best form of defence, and as cliched as it sounds, that's how Igor Stimac's men operated for large parts of the second half. Mahesh, who had switched positions with Lallianzuala Chhangte after the restart, whipped a high cross from the right which fell for Ashique Kuruniyan, who blasted a volley just over the bar from a tight angle.

England drop Moeen, add rookie Josh for 2nd Ashes Test

London, June 28: England have announced their team a day early for the second men's Ashes Test against Australia at Lord's.

There is one change to the England playing XI from the side that suffered the two-wicket loss at Edgbaston last week, with Moeen Ali missing out.

And with Moeen not selected, England have instead opted for a four-pronged seam attack, with inexperienced Josh Tongue added to the team for Lord's.

Tongue made his England debut at Lord's

earlier this month against Ireland, taking 5/66 in the second innings and offering Ben Stokes a point of difference with his pace and bounce, the ICC reported.

Butan Ashes call-up is a huge step up for a 25-year-old who was earmarked as a future England bowler way back in 2017, before a string of injuries slowed his development.

The noises from England had been positive about the fitness of Moeen, who suffered an injury to his spinning finger during the Edgbaston Test.

The 36-year-old's recent record in Tests at Lord's is impressive, with his 14 wickets from his last four matches at an average of 20.14. But fears over a repeat injury mean England have given their primary spinner an extra week to recover.

Rehan Ahmed had been called up as cover for Moeen, but with some rain and unpredictable weather forecast for the week in London, and with captain Ben Stokes not at full fitness, England have instead opted for an additional seam option. Mark Wood, Matthew

Potts and Chris Woakes were also in the squad, but concerns over a tweak to an elbow issue means Wood has not been risked, while Woakes and Potts' similarity to the remainder of England's bowling attack of James Anderson, Stuart Broad and Ollie Robinson is believed to have counted against the pair.

Confident TN seek to win women's football title

Amritsar, June 28: A battle of nerves awaits the two finalists, Tamil Nadu and Haryana in the Senior Women's National Football Championship, as they cross swords at the Guru Nanak Stadium here on Wednesday.

The Senior Women's NFC has, thus far, been dominated by Manipur, who have won 21 of the 26 championships. The 2022-23 edition, however, has thrown a few surprises, with Manipur being knocked out in the group stage of the Final Round, where they finished third in Group B, behind Haryana and Railways. On the other hand, Tamil Nadu have also proved to be a tough unit, having topped Group A and beaten one of the top dogs, Railways, in the semifinal.

Tamil Nadu have arguably been the most consistent side in the championship, having a perfect record of nine victories from as many matches so far. They had topped Group V in the preliminary stages to make it to the Final Round, where they again topped Group A, scoring 32 goals and conceding none in the process.

In fact, the only goal they conceded so far in this campaign, came against tournament favourites Railways, scored by substitute Diparnita Dey in the third minute of injury time.

The 2017-18 champions are able to dominate their opponents through a much superior midfield consisting of captain Indumathi Kathiresan and Karthika Angamuthu. The duo are

regulars in the Senior Women's National Team and have exerted their supremacy over their opponents in the middle of the park, distributing the ball all over the pitch, and stretching the opposing back-line.

Indumathi Kathiresan has been especially brilliant from midfield, frequently going forward to create goalscoring opportunities, most of which, have been put away by the 29-year-old has put away herself; she is currently the highest scorer of the final round, having found the net eight times. The role of Karthika must not be understated in Indumathi's success, however, as she drops back in the number six role, providing stability to the backline, and allowing Indumathi and the fullbacks Dhurga

and Pavithra to bomb forward.

Another player who has helped Indumathi in her goalscoring rampage in the championship is Sandhya Ranganathan, who is not a conventional centre forward by any stretch of the imagination. The 25-year-old, who mostly plays on the wings for the National Team, has been operating in the tricky role of a false nine, often dropping back to drag or wide to drag opposition defenders along with her, allowing more space for Indumathi in the process. The final of the Senior Women's National Football Championship is set to kick off at 4.30 pm IST, at the Guru Nanak Stadium in Amritsar, and will be streamed live on the Indian Football YouTube channel

India's Ankit goes down fighting in Elorda Cup boxing

Astana, June 28: In spite of his best efforts, India's Ankit Narwal suffered a hard-fought defeat in his tournament opener and bowed out of the 2nd Elorda Cup boxing championship in Astana, Kazakhstan on Tuesday.

Going up against Sultana Mussinova of Kazakhstan, Ankit (63.5kg) put up a stern

fight but went down fighting to endure a 0-5 defeat and exited the tournament.

On Wednesday, six Indian pugilists will take to the ring to contest their respective tournament openers. The 2016 World Championships silver medallist Sonia Lather (57kg) will face Viktoriya Grafeyeva of Kazakhstan in her

tournament opener, according to a media release.

Alongside Sonia, female pugilists Shvinder Singh Kaur (50kg) and Poonam (60kg) will also be in action. While Shvinder will go head-to-head against Turapbay Gulnar of Kazakhstan, Poonam will square off against Issayeva Shakhnaz of Kazakhstan.

Male pugilists Zoram Muana (51kg), Hemant Yadav (71kg) and Sanjay (80kg) will also start their respective campaigns.

The Boxing Federation of India (BFI) has sent a 16-member squad across male and female categories to compete at the tournament. Having clinched 14 medals at the previous edition of the competition, India will be determined to better their tally this time round.

Gold medallists of the tournament will be awarded with \$ 700, silver medallists will receive \$ 400 while the two boxers who will take the bronze medals will each get \$ 200.

Ex-captain Tushar named junior women's hockey coach

New Delhi, June 28: Hockey India on Tuesday named former India captain Tushar Khandker as the new coach for the junior women's team.

His appointment is a shot-in-the-arm for the junior women's side as they prepare for the FIH Women's Junior Hockey World Cup 2023 in Santiago, Chile, which is scheduled to take place from November 29 to December 10.

While Khandker's credentials are backed by a prolific career in international hockey, he has over the last decade developed a strong portfolio in coaching. Between 2014 and 2016, he was part of the Indian men's team in the capacity of coach and has tasted numerous feats including a historic Champions Trophy 2016 silver medal in London, gold at Asian Champions Trophy and bronze at the World Hockey League 2015 in Raipur. He was also part of the team's coaching staff for the 2016 Rio Olympic Games.

In his recent stint as Chief Coach Janneke Schopman's deputy for the Women's side, Khandker helped the team prepare for the Asian Champions Trophy 2021 in South Korea, they also played the Asia Cup, Oman in 2022 where the team won Bronze and also qualified for the World Cup.

He was also part of the Women's Team

support staff for their maiden FIH Pro League 2021-22 season. In recent years, Khandker has also pursued FIH Level 1 course apart from Hockey India's Coaches Education Pathway Level Basic, Level 1 and Level 2.

Welcoming Tushar Khandker to the Junior Team's National Program, Hockey India president Dilip Tirkey said, "It is always great to have former Indian team players return to the system as coaches. Tushar brings with him decades of experience in

hockey both as a player as well as a coach and he will also be a great role model for the young players in the Junior Core Group. His appointment comes at the right time, as the team is preparing for the FIH Women's Junior World Cup 2023 in Santiago. I thank SAI for their support in appointing Tushar Khandker in this new role and I also wish Tushar the very best in this new endeavour."

Elated on arriving in SAI, Bengaluru where the junior women's core probable group is based,

Khandker said, "I am grateful to Hockey India for entrusting me with this responsibility. I have always been inclined towards coaching after my playing career. Over the years, I have worked under some renowned coaches in world hockey and have learnt a lot working with them. I look forward to using my knowledge of the sport to help these young and talented players to elevate their performance in international hockey."
