

GMDC's Market Cap. surges to Rs. 3534 Cr posting a highest ever quarterly revenue of Rs. 764 Cr

Ahmedabad : Gujarat Mineral Development Corporation Ltd, one of the leading mining Public Sector Enterprise in India, has announced its financial results for the third quarter and nine months ended December 31st 2021. The company has put forward remarkable performance in its third-quarter results for the financial year 2022 with a Profit (before tax) of Rs. 220 Cr. The company reported its best quarter this year with a revenue of Rs. 764 Cr.

Highlights for Q3FY22 Standalone Financials

Total income stands at Rs. 763.87 crore as against Rs. 494.30 crore in Q2FY22. Revenue from Operations stood at Rs. 725 crores as against Rs. 451.88 crores in Q2FY22. Core EBITDA reported was at Rs. 202 crores as compared to Rs. 27 crores in Q2FY22 Profit Before Tax stands at Rs. 220 crores as

against Rs. 50 crores in Q2FY22 Profit After Tax reported was at Rs. 150 crores as against Rs. 41.13 crore in Q2FY22 EPS stands at Rs. 4.71 (Face Value Rs.2 per share) During the year 2021-22, lignite production at Bhavnagar mines achieved was 12.86 lakh MT, an increase of 7.92 lakh MT, as against 4.94 Lakh MT in 2020-21. The production target of lignite for the year 2021-22 is 86.83 lakh MT and GMDC has achieved 65.64 lakhs MT till 23/1/2022 and expected to reach around 80.00 lakh MT for the year 2021-22, an increase of 20.00 lakh MT compared to 2020-21 ie 33.34 % compared to last year. BSE STAR MF achieves a new milestone, 1.87 crore transactions processed

Mumbai, BSE STAR MF, India's largest regulated Exchange-based online Mutual Funds Distribution platform, has created an all-new record. With all mutual funds and distributors channelising their transactions through online platforms and despite the outbreak of Covid-19. In Jan 22, BSE STAR MF set a record processing 1.87 Cr transaction worth Rs. 37,397 Cr.

The former highest monthly transactions 1.73 Cr was achieved in Dec'21. On 10th January 2022, BSE STAR MF has processed 26.65 lakh transactions outdoing its previous best single-day record of 26.52 lakh transactions (on 8th November 2021).

The platform also achieved its highest ever new SIPs of 13.19 lakh registered in a month in Jan'22 as compared to previous highest of 9.71 lakh in Sep'21.

Overall, the platform achieved 157% of the transaction within 10 months which is 14.69 Cr. during FY 21-22 (Apr - Jan) as compared to 9.38 Cr. transactions during FY 20-21.

80L houses under PM Awas Yojana in 2022-23

New Delhi, Feb 1 (IANS) Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday said that 80 lakh houses will be completed for identified beneficiaries of PM Awas Yojana in the next financial year.

Presenting the Union Budget for 2022-23, Sitharaman said, "In 2022-23, eighty lakh houses will be completed for identified eligible beneficiaries of PM Awas Yojana in both rural and urban areas. Rs 48,000 crore is allocated for this purpose."

The Finance Minister further stated that the central government will work with state government for reduction of time required for all land and construction related approvals for promoting affordable housing for middle class and economically weaker sections in urban areas.

"We shall also work with financial sector, regulators to expand the access to capital along with reduction in cost of intermediaries," she said.

'Vande Bharat's third prototype has to be rolled out first'

Chennai, Feb 1 (IANS) Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman's announcement of 400 Vande Bharat trains over the next three years seems to be a tall target as the third prototype is yet to be rolled out, an Indian Railway official said.

Presenting the Union Budget for 2022-23, Sitharaman said 400 new energy efficient Vande Bharat trains will be introduced in three year's time.

However, a senior official of the Integral Coach Factory (ICF) told IANS that "the third prototype of the train has to be rolled out first and cleared by the Research Design and Standards Organisation (RDSO). Once that is done, production can be streamlined". Currently only two trains are in service - Delhi to Varanasi and Delhi to Katra.

The official said the third prototype is getting delayed due to production bottlenecks and logistical challenges due to the Covid-19 pandemic.

The Vande Bharat Express or Train 18 is a semi-high speed train designed, developed and built by the ICF at an outlay of Rs 100 crore.

It is one classic example of Make in India and far cheaper than similar trains that are rolled out by foreign companies.

Chemical-free, natural farming with focus on Ganga basin to be promoted: FM

New Delhi, Feb 1 (IANS) The Centre will promote chemical-free natural farming across the country with primary focus on farmers' lands in 5-km wide corridors along the river Ganga in the first stage, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said while presenting the Union Budget 2022-23 in the Parliament on Tuesday.

"To ensure that farmers adopt natural farming, a comprehensive package for participation of state governments and the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) will be

introduced," Sitharaman said. Prime Minister Narendra Modi too has been emphasizing the importance of chemical-free natural farming for some time now. "Natural farming will benefit the country's 80 per cent farmers, who are small-scale and have less than two hectares of land, as they spend a lot on chemical input. But using natural fertilisers will benefit them with low expenditure and more profit," Modi had said in December last year.

The Finance Minister further said that Kisan drones

will be used for crop assessments, land records, and spraying of insecticides to drive a wave of technology in the agriculture and farming sector. The estimated procurement of wheat in Rabi 2021-22 and paddy in Kharif 2021-22 will cover 1,208 lakh metric tonnes of wheat and paddy from 163 lakh farmers.

"About Rs 2.37 lakh crore will be direct payment of MSP to their accounts," she said. Sitharaman further said that funds will be facilitated through NABARD to finance startups for agriculture and

rural enterprise, relevant for farm produce value chain, and the startups will support the Farmer Producer Organisations (FPOs) to provide the benefit of technology to the farmers.

With the implementation of the Ken Betwa Linking project, 9 lakh hectares of farm land will reap the benefits, the minister highlighted.

According to the Economic Survey 2021-22, agriculture and the allied sector proved to be the most resilient to the Covid-19 shock as it registered a growth of 3.6 per cent in 2020-21 and improved to 3.9 per cent in 2021-22, driving the overall Indian economy's real GDP expansion of 9.2 per cent in the current financial year.

FM announces to set up digital university

New Delhi, Feb 1 (IANS) While presenting the Union Budget 2022-23 in Parliament on Tuesday, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman announced the setting up of a digital university in the country as several children have suffered due to the Covid-19 pandemic-induced closure of educational institutions.

"A digital university will be established to provide access to the students across the country for world class quality universal education with personalised learning experience at their door steps," the Finance Minister said.

Sitharaman informed that the university will be built on a 'hub and spoke' model.

"The university will be built on our networked hub and spoke model with the hub building cutting edge ICT expertise," she said.

The Finance Minister further said education in this university will be made available in different Indian

languages and ICT formats. "The best public universities and institutions in our country will collaborate as a network of hub and spoke," she said.

Sitharaman said due to the pandemic-induced closure of schools, children particularly in the rural areas and those from Schedule Castes and Schedule Tribes and other weaker sections have lost almost two years of formal education.

She said that majority of the affected children were from government schools and the Centre recognises the need to impart supplementary teaching and to build a resilient mechanism for education delivery.

"For this purpose one class — one TV channel programme of PM e-Vidya will be expanded from 12 to 20 TV channels," Sitharaman said.

She added that this will enable all states to provide supplementary education in regional languages for classes 1 to 12.

National tele-mental health programme to be launched: Sitharaman

New Delhi, Feb 1 (IANS) Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday announced a National Tele-Mental Health Programme while presenting the Union Budget for 2022. The National Institute of Mental Health and Neuro-Sciences (NIMHANS), Bengaluru will be the nodal agency for this.

"The pandemic has accentuated mental health problems in people of all

Paradigm change in urban sector policies on cards

New Delhi, Feb 1 (IANS) Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday said the government is planning a paradigm change in making policies for the urban sector as nearly half of the country's population is expected to live in those areas by the time India turns 100.

"Urban planning cannot continue with a business-as-usual approach. We plan to steer a paradigm change," the Finance Minister said while presenting the Union Budget in the Parliament.

She informed that a high-level committee of reputed urban planners, urban economists and institutions will be formed to make recommendations on urban sector policies, capacity building, planning, implementation and governance. "By the time of India @100, nearly half our population is likely to be living in urban areas. To prepare for this, orderly urban development is of critical importance," she averred.

Cabinet gives nod to the Union Budget

New Delhi, Feb 1 (IANS) The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi met ahead of the Budget and gave final nod to it. Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman will present the Budget at 11 a.m. in the Lok Sabha.

This is the fourth budget of the Sitharaman at a crucial time when the nation is reeling under pandemic. The public is expecting a big relief and generation of employment opportunities for the government.

An IANS-CVoter nationwide tracker poll conducted on the eve of Budget presentation reveals some predictable results. According to the survey, an annual income of Rs 6,25,000 may become completely out of the income tax bracket. That

works out to an average monthly income of just above Rs 52,000.

Interestingly, way back in 2010 when the UPA was in power and had not yet been hit by scams and a faltering economy, respondents to the survey had stated that they wanted an annual income of Rs 5,65,000 or monthly income of Rs 47,260 to be out of the income tax bracket. That doesn't seem like a very steep rise in tax payer's expectations over a time period of 13 years.

But there are interesting changes in expectations in different years. For instance, in 2020, respondents to the survey wanted an annual income of Rs 3,80,000 or a monthly income of Rs 31,717 to be out of the income tax bracket. Soon after that, India was hit by the

Over 2 cr houses sanctioned, 1.69 cr completed under PMAY-G till Jan

New Delhi, Feb 1 (IANS) As on January 18, 2022, 2.17 crore houses have been sanctioned while 1.69 crore houses have been completed against a target of 2.63 crore houses till 2021-22 under the Pradhan Mantri Awas Yojana-Gramin (PMAY-G), showed the Economic Survey 2021-22 tabled in the Parliament on Monday. "As on January 18, 2022, the states and Union Territo-

ries have identified 4,46,058 landless beneficiaries in the permanent wait list of PMAY-G, out of which 2,05,847 (46 per cent) have been provided with land by the concerned states and UTs. Per-

formance of the scheme was impressive during the period between 2016-17 and 2021-22," the Survey noted. Under the scheme, landless beneficiaries are accorded highest priority in allotment of houses.

Surety bonds instead of bank guarantees in govt procurements: FM

New Delhi/Chennai, Feb 1 (IANS) Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman on Tuesday gave thumbs up for surety bonds as a substitute for bank guarantees in case of government procurement and also for gold imports.

Presenting the Union Budget 2022-23, she said that in order to reduce indirect cost for suppliers and work-contractors, the use of surety bonds as a substitute for bank guarantees will be made acceptable in government procurements. She said gold importers may also find this useful and the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDAI) has given the framework for issue of surety bonds by the insurers.

Recently, the IRDAI came out with the IRDAI (Surety Insurance Contracts) Guidelines 2022 laying down the norms for this line of business. It has capped the quantum of surety insurance contracts for an insurer at 10 per cent gross premium written subject to a maximum of Rs 500 crore per year. The IRDAI has also stipulated that the non-life insurers wanting to underwrite the surety insurance risks should have a solvency margin of 1.25. Non-life insurers are allowed to carry out this business from April 1 onwards. "The norms will help regulate/develop surety as a business in India which otherwise is an accepted norm in the western countries," said Vikash Khandelwal, CEO, Eqaro Guarantees, a Mumbai-based surety solutions provider. "However, it would have been ideal if the final norms had also provided for a specialist surety insurance company," he added.

According to Khandelwal, allowing the surety insurers to work alongside the banks and other financial institutions to share risk-related information and technical expertise will help foster a robust ecosystem and prevent contagion.
