

Haryana govt to come out with enterprises promotion policy

Haryana chief minister Manohar Lal Khattar says his government's focus is not just on enhancing the ease of doing business, but also on reducing the cost of doing business

To support enterprises, the Haryana government will soon come out with its Enterprises Promotion Policy 2020.

Speaking at the Haryana-Singapore Roundtable Virtual Conference organised by the Haryana government, Invest India and Enterprise Singapore on Friday, Haryana chief minister Manohar Lal Khattar said his government's focus was not just on enhancing ease of doing business, but also on reducing the cost of doing business. The CM said that Haryana has adopted a sector-focused approach to development and with a view to provide incentives to investors, Haryana last year also introduced five sector-specific policies for agribusiness and food processing, textile, warehousing-logistic retail, pharmaceutical and MSMEs.

Haryana has also emerged as a base for the knowledge industry destination for knowledge based and manufacturer

ing sectors, he said.

The CM said considering investors requirement and connecting global value chain and to handhold the investors through proactive facilitation to navigate business plans, the Haryana government has established a new "Foreign Cooperation Department". Khattar assured that the Foreign Cooperation Department would provide all necessary assistance to the Singaporean companies for their

upcoming businesses in Haryana. He offered full support and cooperation of the state government to leading enterprises of Singapore to further expand their base in Haryana.

On this occasion, top representatives of various leading companies of Singapore including Durapower, YCH Group, Agrocrop International, Transworld Terminals, Skill SG Ventures, Legend Logistics, Surbana Jurong etc showed

interest in expanding their units in the fields of logistics, warehousing, cold chain, transport hub, distribution facilities, and manufacturing of electrical gadgets. The CM said India and Singapore have a long-lasting relationship. The relationship between Haryana and Singapore has deepened in recent years with Singapore's involvement in smart cities, solid waste treatment, waste water treatment plants, and

health care units in Haryana. Khattar said Haryana is considered as an "industrial power house" with more than 250 fortune 500 companies based in the state. He said to ensure a seamless investment process, a single-roof clearance system has been set up in the state, wherein any investor or enterprises could obtain all state-related clearances through an online portal in a time-bound manner. All clearances are granted to investors in a maximum of 45 days. Over one lakh clearances from various departments have already been granted through this mechanism, Khattar added.

The CM also said that the state government was focusing on the creation of world class infrastructure. The state was also working on big ticket projects such as Integrated Multi-Modal Logistics Hub in Narnaul, Global City in Gurugram and an integrated Aviation Hub in Hisar. "Further, we are in the process of developing three smart cities at Faridabad, Gurgaon and Karnal," he added.

HP minister clears air over Central varsity campuses

Himachal Pradesh Revenue Minister Mahender Singh Thakur said here on Friday that the Government of India has given approval for setting up two campuses of the Central University Dharamshala, which includes the northern campus Jadarangali Tehsil Dharamshala and the southern campus Dehra, the mutation of which was done in 2010.

The state government had transferred 34.55 hectares of government land in 2010 to the Central University of Himachal Pradesh for the construction of the southern campus Dehra, the mutation of which was done in 2010.

He said that apart from this, the approval to divert 81.79 hectares of forest land under the Forest Conservation Act was received on December 11, 2018, in the name of User Agency Director Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh, but this included the condition that the land which has been granted permission to convert cannot be transferred in any case to another agency, department or any other person without the approval of the Central Government. There will be no change in the legal status of such diverted forest land. On the request of the Department of Revenue for this matter and some other mat-

ters, the Forest Department had requested the Union Ministry of Forest and Environment, Government of India, on 22 April, 2019 for the necessary clarification, whether the diverted forest land agency may or may not be transferred to user agency through mutation mode. The Revenue Department had also urged the Union Ministry of Forest and Environment, Government of India, whether the documents for possession of the converted forest land can be entered in the revenue records or not.

He said on this, the Union Ministry of Forest and Environment, through a letter on July 30, 2019, had clarified that the legal status of the forest land that is diverted under the Forest Protection Act 1980 will remain as forest land only. Such diverted land arrangement, the name of the user agency or user department cannot be transferred by the revenue department in the revenue records.

According to the clarification of the Ministry of Forest and Environment, Government of India, in the matter of Central University of Dharamshala as well as in 30 other cases, the forest land has not yet been given to the concerned user agency.

He said that the state government is taking necessary steps for getting approval for

the establishment of Central University and all other developmental projects by taking action under the Forest Conservation Act 1980, but in view of the clarification of the Ministry of Forest and Environment, the Central University and the works of many other important projects are getting delayed.

The Revenue Minister made it clear that the State Government has taken prompt action in converting forest land for the Central University under the Forest Conservation Act 1980. Necessary approval for this was also issued on December 11, 2018 and under Green Cover Plan, Rs. Five crore 60 lakh was deposited in Campa Head in November 2018. This amount was in addition to the previously deposited amount of Rs. 17 crore 27 lakh 53 thousand.

The Revenue Minister said that the state government has taken up the matter with the Ministry of Forest and Environment Government of India to reconsider the situation arising in this regard. He urged the Union Minister of State for Finance, Ministry of Forest and Environment, Government of India to redress these technical issues so that the construction work of Central University and the pending works of about 30 other projects could be started and the pace of development could be accelerated.

Himachal ramps up coronavirus testing

The Himachal Pradesh government's health secretary Amitabh Awasthi on Friday said that the government was taking all necessary preventive and remedial steps to contain the spread of corona pandemic in the state and that the capacity of testing has also been enhanced now.

Hesaid that till now 475263 persons have been screened for coronavirus in which 32197 persons were found positive. The rate of positive cases in the state is 6.5 percent.

He said that keeping in view the festive season it is necessary to be more cautious from getting COVID-19 infection.

He said that not adhering to the safety and preventive measures would be an invitation to coronavirus. He urged people to adopt regular safe practices to increase immunity and to ensure early screening of COVID-19 without panicking so that chances of infection could be controlled and if the report was found positive the person could be isolated on time. He urged people to contact helpline number-104 or avail e-Sanjeevani facility in case of fever, cough, cold or respiratory problems.

Awasthi said that to contain the spread of virus people should strictly follow the guidelines of central as well as state government issued from time to time.

He urged people to follow the social distancing norms, using face masks while going out of home and use of hand sanitizer. He said to avoid touching nose, eyes and mouth without washing hands properly.

Shoolini varsity researcher wins global laurels

Dr Gaurav Sharma of Shoolini University based in Himachal Pradesh's Solan has been recognised as a highly cited researcher for 2020 by Clarivate Analytics of Web of Science Group.

The list of highly cited researchers from the Web of Science Group identifies scientists and social scientists who have demonstrated significant broad influence, reflected through their publication of multiple papers and have been frequently cited by their peers during the last decade.

Dr Sharma is only among 20 researchers from India in the total list of 6167 top scientists from across the world.

Dr Sharma's research activity started in 2009 at Shoolini University as master of philosophy student, and then he continued his research work as PhD student. He is working on the preparation and characterization of diverse multifunctional nanomaterials and their composites, specially focused for their potential applications in

environmental remediation and biological field.

Researchers are selected for their exceptional influence and performance in one or more of 21 fields or across several fields. Dr Gaurav Sharma has been awarded highly cited researcher in across field category. The number of researchers selected in each field is based on the square root of the population of authors listed in the field's highly cited papers. The number of those with cross-field influence is determined by finding those who have influence equivalent to those identified in the 21 fields.

For the Highly Cited Researchers 2020 analysis, the papers surveyed were those published and cited during 2009-2019 and which at the end of 2019 ranked in the top one percent by citations for their field and year.

Dr Gaurav Sharma's achievement has been hailed by Shoolini University Vice Chancellor Professor P K Khosla, who described it as a "very proud moment for the university which has been laying special emphasis on research".
