DRDO successfully flight-tests RudraM-II missile from Su-30 MK-I off Odisha coast

New Delhi, May 29 (UNI) The Defence Research & Development Organisation (DRDO) on Wednesday successfully flight-tested the RudraM-II Air-to-Surface missile from Su-30 MK-I platform of the Indian Air Force (IAF) off the coast of Odisha at around 1130 hours. The flight-test met all the trial objectives, validating the propulsion system and control and guidance algorithm, a Defence Ministry statement said.

The performance of the missile has been validated from the flight data captured by range tracking instruments like electro-optical systems, radar and telemetry stations deployed by Integrated Test Range, Chandipur at various locations, including the on-board ship. RudraM-II is an indigenously-developed solid-propelled air-launched missile system meant for air-to-surface role to neutralise many types of enemy assets. A number of state-of-the-art indigenous technologies developed by various DRDO laboratories have been incorporated in the missile system.

Mizoram landslide death toll may rise to 34: Officials

Aizawl, May 29 (UNI) : The death toll in Aizawl landslides caused by cyclone Remal-induced heavy rains is expected to rise to 34, while 27 bodies have been recovered so far. Aizawl District Disaster Management Authority officials said that with the recovery of the body of 14-year-old Gloria MS Dawngliani in Melthum at around noon and a non-tribal in the adjoining Hlumen neighbourhood on Wednesday by search and rescue workers, the total number of dead bodies so far rose to 27.

The officials said that search for the remaining missing bodies ended at 6.23 p.m. and will be resumed from early Thursday morning by the highest toll in Tuesday's thundershowers happened at Melthum neighbourhood within Aizawl Municipal Corporation in the early morning, from where 15 dead bodies have been recovered. A stone mine collapsed due to a heavy rain-triggered massive landslide at the Melthum-Hlumen border at around 6 a.m. on Tuesday. Officials said that four bodies presumed to be dead, including those of Ramdinsanga (6 months),

Lalvenhima (8 years), and Deborah Lallawmawmi (11), are yet to be recovered.

Hlumen locality reportedly has six casualties, of which five bodies have been recovered as of Wednesday, while the body of a 38-year-old non-tribal (Santosh Manjhi) from Jharkhand is reported as still missing.

All the disasters happened on the southern outskirts of Aizawl City or in the in the southern part of Aizawl District. Three people belonging to a family died in Salem locality, located in the southern part of Aizawl city, when a landslide swept away a couple and their pregnant daughter.

Two bodies have also been recovered in Falkawn village, and one each in Kelsih and Lungsei villages, while four bodies are still missing in Melthum locality, two in Aibawk village, and one in Kelsih village. Local volunteers from nearby villages and from different neighbourhoods in Aizawl, as well as members of the State Disaster Response Force, have been engaged in search and rescue operations. Roadblocks at

different places, especially the southern part of Aizawl district, and disruptions of power supply and mobile services hindered the progress of the search operations.

Meanwhile, 57 families have so far been evacuated from Sairang village, around 28 kilometres west of Aizawl, as the river Tlawng inundated low-lying areas of the village. The buildings submerged in the swollen river included a Kali mandir, a mosque, and some schools. The evacuated people are being lodged in community halls, while a number of them have joined their relatives.

At least 21 families have also been evacuated to safer places in Bairabi town in Assam border Kolasib district after the Tlawng River submerged their homes. Ten families at Zawnuam in Mamit district were evacuated to safer places, while 18 were ready to be evacuated in case of more rainfall as the Mizoram-Tripura border river Langkaih has been submerging their homes. Mamit district was also devastated by gusty squalls since Monday night as the district bore the brunt of the cyclone.

SC Registry snubs Kejriwal's interim bail extension plea

New Delhi May 29, (UNI) The Supreme Court Registry Wednesday rejected Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal's plea for a seven-day extension of his interim bail, paving way for his scheduled return to Tihar Jail on June 2.

The Supreme Court registry refused to accept the application saying that since the Delhi chief minister was given the liberty to move the trial court for regular bail, the plea is not maintainable.

Kejriwal had got interim bail from an apex court bench comprising Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justice Dipankar Datta on May 10 and was asked to surrender to Tihar on June 2.

The bench on May 17 reserved a verdict on Kejriwal's plea challenging the validity of his arrest by the Enforcement Directorate in a money laundering (PMLA) case linked to the liquor scam following the formulation of a new excise policy for the national capital city.

Refusing to accept the application, the Supreme Court Registry said that since the verdict is already reserved on the challenge to arrest, Kejriwal's plea for extension of interim bail has no relation to the main petition. As the apex court has allowed Kejriwal to move the trial court for regular bail, this application is not maintainable, it said.

Schools to remain close till June 4

Shimla, May 29 (UNI) : District administration Solan on Wednesday ordered to keep all schools closed till June four during summer vacation in view of prevailing heat wave.

District Magistrate Manmohan Sharma has issued an order in this regard. In this order, he said that following warning of heat wave and dry weather, all schools would remain close from May 30 to June three. Earlier, the schools were scheduled to open by May 30. In view of this, deputy director Higher Education requested to keep schools on summer vacation closed from May 30 to June four.

Thousands of houses submerged by flood in Manipur

(Standard Post Bureau) Imphal, May 29 : Thousands of houses all over the state were inundated by flood as Cyclone Remal hit Manipur since Monday.

The historic Kangla fort was also flooded as police, volunteers took out the aged and children from the affected houses towards safe place.

Over a lakh people were taking shelters at relief centres according to a volunteer, who was taking out infants to safer places.

Cyclone Remal has left a trail of disaster, fallen trees, uprooted houses, landslides. All the rivers flowing in the state specially Nambul, Iri, Imphal were all flowing at the danger levels.

Manipur Governor Anusuiya Uikey said incessant rainfall due to cyclone Remal over the past 48 hours has severely disturbed the lives of people of Manipur.

The low-lying areas of Valley and Hill Districts have been heavily submerged. Additionally, landslides on state and National Highways 37 and 2 have disrupted the main routes for transporting

essential commodities, severely affecting their supply across the state.

She said, " deeply concerned and saddened by the damage to homes and properties in both the Valley and Hills Districts.

In light of these events, I urge all citizens to remain calm and refrain from panicking. The State Government is committed to taking all necessary measures to prevent the situation from worsening and to extend all possible assistance to those affected. All citizens are requested to stay informed through official channels for updates and follow the guidance provided by local authorities. Together, we will overcome these challenges."

A high alert has been sounded and all working in essential services were asked not to take leave to meet any eventuality. To maintain water level a gate of the Ethai Barrage was opened.

Chief Minister N Biren Singh said in a social media platform. "We are closely monitoring the situation, and any further openings will be done in consultation with the Water Resources

Department (WRD) and the National Hydroelectric Power Corporation (NHPC). Our official teams are working tirelessly around the clock to manage this situation effectively and ensure the safety of the people."

As the water levels of the rivers were increasing gradually, thousands of people living beside Imphal, Nambul, Iri rivers were evacuated to safer places. Local clubs and youth bodies arranged sandbags to protect the river walls from breaking.

Both national highways were completely cut off. The Imphal Mao was earlier cut off since May 2023 by various Kuki organizations while the other highway Imphal Jiribam was cut off on Tuesday due to landslide and a truck fell into a gorge as the highway was washed off at Sinam village. The driver had managed to jump down.

State highways connecting Imphal to the districts were also affected as landslides were reported in most parts of the state highways. The government has ordered closure of all educational institutes from May 29 to 31.

Goyal flays Cong Chandigarh candidate Tewary for not voting in 2019 polls

Chandigarh, May 29 (UNI) Describing INDI alliance's Chandigarh Lok Sabha seat candidate Manish Tewari as "careless" and irresponsible", Union Minister and BJP leader Piyush Goyal on Wednesday alleged the sitting Congress MP from Anand Sahib had not even bothered to vote in the 2019 general election.

Tewari, a seasoned Congress leader, is a voter in the Ludhiana LS constituency in Punjab.

Addressing a press conference here, Goyal wondered whether Tewari would vote for the Congress or AAP in Ludhiana.

"Which is his primary party? Who will he vote for?" asked Goyal.

Ponting out that Tewari had not voted in the previous LS election, he said "Think about a person who himself did not vote in the last election. He did not fulfill such an important responsibility of democracy. How will he do good to the people of Chandigarh? How will he tell the people of Chandigarh to go and vote? If he himself does not vote, how will anyone listen to him?"

"How will people trust him that he will be able to work honestly for Chandigarh when he himself is so careless," said Goyal. Goyal said Tewari probably did not know the importance of a vote. He referred to Congress leader CP Joshi losing from Nathdwara Assembly constituency in Rajasthan by one vote in 2008. The Atal Bihari Vajpayee government at the Centre also lost a vote of confidence by one vote in 1999. "If he does not go to Ludhiana and cast his vote, then it is possible that the Congress or AAP candidate may lose by one vote," said Goyal.

"After Chandigarh, I am going to Ludhiana

Smriti Irani lambasts Congress for "anti-national policies"

Hoshiarpur (Punjab), May 29 (UNI) Union Minister of Women and Child Development Smriti Irani on Wednesday rapped Congress for what she described as its "sympathy for Pakistan" and pursuit of "anti-national policies". Addressing an election rally at a private resort in Daghman village of Punjab's Hoshiarpur district in support of the BJP candidate from Shri Anandpur Sahib Lok Sabha constituency, Dr. Subhash Sharma, Irani condemned the Congress and its leaders for what she described as their "sympathy for Pakistan". Supporting her claims, Irani said, "A Congress leader claims that Pakistani terrorists were not responsible for killing our brave policemen. Their Chief Minister asks for proof of surgical strikes even after five

years. Another senior leader says that India should be cautious as Pakistan has nuclear bombs. Can anyone accept these statements made by Congress leaders during the election campaign?" Criticising Rahul Gandhi, Irani expressed her shame that he gave a ticket to the alleged leader of the "Tukde Tukde Gang," Kanhaiya Kumar, from North East Delhi (Lok Sabha constituency). Claiming that Congress divided Punjab in 1966, Irani claimed that now Congress supports "anti-national elements" and is intent on dividing the country. "Congress wants to see a repetition of the partition and wants our mothers, sisters, and daughters to experience the same trauma again. This is highly condemnable," she lamented.

Indian Army pays tribute to soldiers on 76th International Day of UN Peacekeepers

New Delhi, May 29 (UNI) On the 76th International Day of United Nations (UN) Peacekeepers, the Indian Army paid homage to the fallen comrades at the National War Memorial here on Wednesday.

Lieutenant General Rakesh Kapoor, Deputy Chief of the Army Staff (Information Systems & Coordination), officials of United Nations Organisation, staff from Ministries of Defence and External Affairs laid wreaths, an official statement said.

This is the day when in 1948 the first UN Peacekeeping Mission, "UN Truce Supervision Organisation (UNTSO)" began operations in Palestine.

India has contributed services of approximately 2,87,000 troops to peacekeeping missions, making it one of the largest contributors of troops. As many as 160 Indian Army soldiers have made the supreme sacrifice to ensure peace across the globe. Presently, Indian Armed Forces are deployed across nine countries in peacekeeping missions, namely UNDOF, UNIFIL, UNTSO, UNFICYP, MONUSCO, UNMISS, UNIFSA, MINUSCA and MINURSO.

The Indian Army has established a Centre for UN Peacekeeping (CUNPK) in New Delhi to impart niche training in peacekeeping operations. This Centre trains more than 12,000 troops every year.

The UN has set out mandated targets to increase the participation of women peacekeepers as part of its gender parity drive to better address the concerns of the local women population in the missions.

During the UN Peacekeeping Ministerial held at Accra, Ghana on 05-06 December 2023, India has re-affirmed its commitment towards future peacekeeping initiatives by the UN. During the meet, India has pledged an Infantry Battalion Group, various sub-groups, UN Pre-Deployment Training of Trainers Course and UN Military Observers Course for the next two years, to meet the requirements of the UN.
