After Baisoya foul-up, ABVP's Shakti Singh promoted as DUSU president

Citing a Delhi high court order, the Delhi University (DU) on Tuesday promoted DU Students' Union (DUSU) vice-president and a member of RSS-affiliated Akhil Bharatiya Vidyarthi Parishad's (ABVP) Shakti Singh as president.

According to a notice issued by the university election committee on Tuesday that was undersigned by six officials, including DU chief election officer VK Kaul: "In compliance with the order of the honourable Delhi High Court dated 18 December, 2018, the DUSU election committee 2018-19 declares the promotion of Mr Shakti Singh, vice president DUSU 2018-19 as president DUSU 2019-20."

The president's post fell



vacant in November last year after the DU administration cancelled the admission of former ABVP member Akiv Baisoya for using a 'forged' mark sheet to seek admission. The move comes after receiving confirmation from Tamil Nadu-based Thiruvalluvar University that an undergraduate marksheet submitted by Baisoya to seek admission to the DU was 'fake'. The University had also filed a police complaint against Baisoya.

Calling it a 'moral victory', Singh said that the students

union will now work for the cause of students under his leadership. "Half of the academic session is already over and DUSU could not do anything in the absence of a president. Now I will make sure ABVP will work to fulfill all the promises we made ahead of the DUSU elections," he said.

Soon after Baisoya's election as DUSU president on September 13, 2018, Congress-affiliated National Students' Union of India (NSUI) had accused him of submitting a fake mark sheet to secure admission in the DU. NSUI had later moved the Delhi High Court seeking fresh election on the post. However, the court had dismissed the plea.

NSUI, however, termed the development as "wrong interpretation" of the court's order. "The university has been hands in glove with the ABVP from the beginning. They first delayed the inquiry over and DUSU could not do anything in the absence of a president. Now I will make sure ABVP will work to fulfill all the promises we made ahead of the DUSU elections," he said.

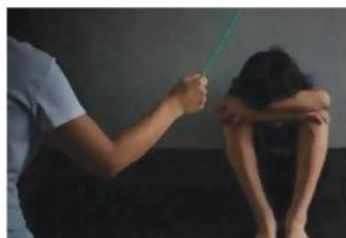
Members of left-backed All India Students Association (AISA) also criticised the move. "DU's order of promoting Shakti Singh is not at all surprising. It's an administration's gift to the ABVP. The student community will give a befitting reply to the ABVP in the next election," said Kawalpreet Kaur, AISA Delhi president.

Five-year-old in Delhi dies after alleged assault by mother's live-in partner

A five-year-old boy died after he was assaulted allegedly by his mother's live-in partner for failing to recite the numeric table at his home in southwest Delhi's Samalkha village near Kapashera, police said on Tuesday.

The incident took place on January 10. The child died during treatment at a private hospital two days later.

Police said the boy's mother, a private school teacher, and her live-in partner conspired the crime by allegedly claiming that the boy started feeling dizzy after eating a 'ladoo/sweet' and fell in the bathroom, because of which he suffered injuries in his head and other parts of the body. However, their claims fell flat when the boy's



autopsy report confirmed that he died of serious head injuries and physical assault, said police.

Deputy commissioner of police (southwest) Devendra Arya said a case of murder and criminal conspiracy with common intention was registered against the boy's mother and her live-in partner at the Kapashera police station.

"The case was registered on a complaint filed by the child's biological father. The woman's live-in partner, Narender, has been arrested. We are questioning the woman to ascertain his role in the entire crime. As of now we have established that she lied to the doctors by claiming that her son fell in the bathroom," said Arya.

"We interrogated Narender and he revealed

24-year-old forced to drink spiked juice, allegedly gangraped near Delhi mall

A 24-year-old woman has alleged that she was sexually assaulted by her friend and his two accomplices in a stationary car here after making her drink juice containing sedatives near a mall, a police officer said on Tuesday. The police said the incident occurred on Monday night when a passerby saw the woman crying near a car at Cross River Mall in east Delhi's Shalabam and informed the police. "The police reached the spot and arrested the victim's friend, later identified as Amit, 30. We are investigating the role of Amit's friends in the crime who are at large," Deputy Commissioner of Police Meghna Yadav told IANS. "During the investigation, we found that Amit, a businessman, who is a native of Uttar Pradesh's Baghpat, befriended the victim through a common friend some two months ago after he promised to get her home loan at a cheaper rate," the DCP said. "A resident of Seelampur in Delhi, the victim was called by Amit for a meeting on Monday near Cross River Mall. During the meeting, according to the statement of victim, Amit, accompanied by two friends, gave her juice with sedatives. As she fell unconscious, she was gang-raped by the three accused," Yadav added. The police have registered a case of rape against Amit on the complaint of victim and are interrogating him to establish the role and identify his two friends, she added.

Rajpath to be turned into boulevard; to get fountains, parking space

Rajpath will soon wear a new look. The New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) had two rounds of meeting with Union ministry of housing and urban affairs in past one-and-a-half months to finalise a plan to transform Rajpath into a boulevard.

The redevelopment plan included rejuvenation of water channel, installation of fountains, redevelopment of water bodies, building a parking facility for 1,000 vehicles, kiosks, water dispensers and other utilities.

Sharing details of the project in the 2019-20 budget presentation, NDMC chairman Naresh Kumar said, "Rajpath is the centre of attraction in the city and everyday thousands of people visit the area. We aim to give a modern look to the place. Though the CPWD is the maintenance agency for laws around India Gate, we proposed the idea to the MOUA secretary Durga Shanker Mishra few months back to redevelop the area.

Panic buttons, CCTVs in all NDMC schools to augment security

The New Delhi Municipal Council (NDMC) plans to install emergency buttons and close-circuit cameras in open areas of all schools to augment security of students, in its budget for financial year 2019-20. "We want to constantly monitor activities inside NDMC schools," said NDMC chairman Naresh Kumar. The smart safety buttons will work with the help of communication network developed by BATA and used by doctors for other services. The system has been installed at NP Bengali Girls Senior Secondary School, Gole Market on a pilot basis. "As soon as someone presses the emergency button, an alarm will sound in the principal's room and security kiosks of the school. Also, text messages will be sent to the pre-stored mobile numbers," said Kumar. Giving a push to sports and extra curricular activities, the civic agency aims to construct auditorium at 14 schools. "Further, last year we started football coaching for under-10 girls students at three schools. On the same lines, we aim to start football academy for under-10 boys at three schools," said Kumar. To simplify the process of issuing birth and death certificate, the New Delhi Municipal Council has announced 'block chain technology' for receiving birth and death certificates applications. "Under the scheme, a system — which can be accessed by hospitals and health department — will be developed. The system will help in feeding and accessing data related to birth and death of a person on real time basis," said an official. The civic agency plans to install health ATMs at four places — at Palika Kendra dispensary, Charak Palika Hospital, Dharam Marg Polyclinic and TB Polyclinic — for screening and detecting 40 health-related problems.

HC orders deferring MR vaccine campaign in Delhi after parents' objection

The Delhi High Court on Tuesday deferred the implementation of the 'Measles and Rubella vaccine immunisation campaign' (MR campaign) by the Delhi government stating that vaccination cannot be administered 'forcibly' and without the consent of parents.

The vaccination drive, which was to start Wednesday, would cover more than 35 lakh children — between the ages of 9 months and 15 years — within five weeks.

"For now, we have deferred the vaccination campaign till the next hearing scheduled on January 21. We are studying the order and looking at how to seek consent," said



Dr Nutan Mundeja, Delhi's director general of health services.

Justice Vibhu Bakhu said that the petitioner's contention that giving the vaccines without the consent of the parents is "merited", adding that consent is the precondition for vaccinations.

government, its standing counsel, Ramesh Singh, submitted that an 'opt out' option could be created for the parents who do not want their wards to get the vaccination, which was objected to by the petitioners.

"Since it is apparent that the consent of the parents is not obtained and respondent are proceeded on the basis that the consent is not necessary, the campaign for administering the MR campaign is deferred till further orders from the court," the court said.

At least 220 million children from 30 states and union territories have already been vaccinated under the nationwide campaign that started in 2017.

"The campaign in Delhi, as in the other states, was based

on implied consent. In case of public health programmes, consent is said to be implied unless a person wants to opt out. People can refuse the vaccine, of course, we will not be forcing anybody," said Dr Suresh Seth, Delhi's state programme officer for immunisation. The campaign is also underway in Madhya Pradesh and Bihar, with only three more states — West Bengal, Sikkim, and Rajasthan — remaining to be covered. "This is a unique situation; so far, none of the other states have had a petition filed against the campaign, except for Kerala where too the court quashed it," said Dr Pankaj Bhatnagar of the World Health Organisation's National Polio Surveillance Programme, which is
